

ALL SYSTEMS GO IN CAVITE FOR TAAL VOLCANIC ERUPTION RESPONSE OPERATIONS

Cavite Governor Jonvic Remulla convened an emergency meeting of the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council together with the mayors of the different cities and municipalities on January 16, 2020 at The Bayleaf Hotel in the City of Gen. Trias to discuss the impacts of Taal volcanic eruption and the current situation in the different LGUs with evacuees from the heavily affected municipalities of Batangas.

Alert Level 4 is still in effect based on PHIVOLCS Taal Volcano Bulletin and hazardous eruption is imminent. As of the situation report from the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office, at 8:00 AM of January 17, there are currently 19 LGUs in Cavite providing temporary shelter to some 6,472 families totaling to 28,461 individuals and still counting with the continuous waves of evacuees coming in.

Some issues have been identified in the different LGUs which are also affected by the volcanic eruption particularly in Tagaytay City, the municipalities of Alfonso, Amadeo, Silang and Indang including the disruption of water and power supply. Mayor Frederick Vida of Mendez reported that MERALCO has been conducting continuous cleaning operations for the restoration of power supply.

Health and sanitation concerns were also raised by Dr. Nelson Soriano, Chief Epidemiologist of the Provincial Office. Some of the

Cavite solon wants to probe gov't response to Taal eruption

MANILA – Cavite Rep. Elpidio Barzaga Jr. is calling for a congressional inquiry to look into the response of different government agencies to the recent Taal Volcano eruption.

Barzaga filed House Resolution No. 643, dated Jan. 13, which directs the appropriate committee to investigate reported lack of information drive regarding the hazards of Taal's volcanic activity to the general public, and more particularly to its nearby cities and municipalities of Cavite, Laguna, and Batangas.

A copy of the bill was sent to reporters on Tuesday.

Barzaga noted that there were "no news bulletins or SMS alerts" from the Philippine Institute of Volcanology (Phivolcs) and other concerned government agencies when the Taal Volcano manifested an increase in volcanic activity on Sunday morning.

"Filipinos were taken by surprise by the recent Taal Volcano eruption wherein the losses in terms of life and property are still unaccounted for," Barzaga said.

"Due to lack of information, in the afternoon of

the same day, while Taal Volcano is already manifesting increased volcanic activity, people still traveled towards it, while those who were already near Taal volcano were shocked to see the smoke spewing from it and had to immediately flee under the dangers of ashfall," Barzaga added.

Barzaga said there should be an investigation if Phivolcs has conducted comprehensive monitoring and if it has the technical expertise to make a timely forecast of the Taal volcano eruption.

He stressed the need to determine the necessary

improvements in the responses of the different government agencies, such as the Phivolcs, Philippine National Police, Department of Social Welfare and Development, National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, and local governments to reduce the risks of natural disasters in order to prevent loss of life and property.

The lawmaker also said appropriate charges need to be filed against those unscrupulous individuals who sold face masks and other supplies at an unreasonable cost during times of disaster. (PNA)

Peace talks, anyone?

MY objections on the peace talks are neither because I am on the hit list of the NPA nor because the New People's Army (NPA) had attacked an Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) detachment or Municipal Hall where the armed forces or police officers are posted. In the laws of war, I am a legitimate target of the NPA being the National Security Adviser and former Chief-of-Staff of the AFP. So to me, it is a fair game if I am in a hit list or if an AFP or PNP detachment or post is attacked.

What is objectionable is when the NPA, surely under the command of National Democratic Front (NDF) and Communist Party of the Philippines (CPP), attacks or ambushes civilians as they did in Barangay Libuton, Borongan City, Eastern Samar last December 13, 2019. In this NPA ambush, three civilians and a patrolman were killed, three kids (ages one, six and thirteen) were seriously wounded and eleven adults suffered less serious injuries. The NPA used roadside bombs or improvised explosive devices. This is in violation of the Comprehensive Agreement on Respect for Human Rights and International Humanitarian Law (CARHRIHL) which the CPP/NPA/NDF signed and bounded itself to.

I am not surprised that the NPA had no second thoughts about possibly hitting innocent children and civilians. After all, Jose Maria Sison had ordered them to go on the offensive. That is one clear character of the CPP/NPA/NDF - their pursuit of armed struggle to be victorious over the government at all costs. That is the true nature of their so-called National Democratic Revolution. Anything goes - blood-bath, duplicity, and deception as long as it contributes to their eventual victory.

Amidst the mourning and suffering of the victims' families, all of a sudden the CPP/NPA/NDF and its front organizations called for a resumption of the traditional peace talks. Moreover, as soon as a coordinated unilateral ceasefire was established midnight of Dec 22, the CTG struck in the morning of Dec 23 at AFP troops in Labo, Camarines Norte, resulting to 1 soldier killed and 5 wounded and in Tubungan, Iloilo resulting to 2 policemen wounded. In both instances, IED was used.

So are we going to trust the CPP/NPA/NDF or the Communist Terrorist Group (CTG) in another peace talks? Are they sincere? Do they have control over their fighters?

What is actually the peace talks to the CTG?

Let me answer it from the words of Luis Jalandoni, a ranking CTG leader:

"We see that peace negotiations are another form of legal struggle which is possible to be used by the revolutionary forces in order to advance the revolutionary armed struggle and the revolutionary mass movement. This other form of legal struggle, the peace negotiation, does not replace the revolutionary armed struggle nor the revolutionary mass movement. In fact, it should advance the revolutionary armed struggle and the revolutionary mass movement which is a more important struggle than peace negotiations."

Likewise, let me also quote the late Fr. Conrado Balweg, the former Cordillera People's Liberation Army (CPLA) and Cordillera Bodong Association Chairman:

"They are organized to take political power, to become the government, to be the ones in Malacañang. Iyon ang issue sa kanila, hindi peace. Sa peace talks, we are not

addressing the problem because we are talking something beyond the point. The NPA is created in order for the CPP to be the ones in government. That is the issue."

If indeed Joma Sison and the CTG, as well as the 131 Honorable Congressmen who are in favor of peace talks as reported, then let us be clear on what the objectives of the peace talks are. Are we going to hand over governance to the CTG or at least be in a coalition government with them? Are we going to demobilize and demilitarize the NPA or let them become part of the new government armed forces?

Perhaps the answers lie in why the CTGs had been bannered - the so-called Comprehensive Agreement on Social and Economic Reforms (CASER) as a document to be signed prior to the signing of an Interim Peace Agreement.

Let us, therefore, examine their Comprehensive Agreement on Social and Economic Reforms (CASER). They claim that their CASER contains "concrete and doable steps towards liberating the Filipino people from poverty, exploitation, and underdevelopment."

At first glance, this may appear to be pro-masses as it promises to benefit the majority, if not all, but if we look at it closely, the duplicitous character and self-interest of the CTG become evident, as the provisions do not directly reflect the best interest of the nation, but their own.

For one, their CASER was crafted with the goal of turning the Philippine eco-

nomie model to nationalist and socialist. This means dismantling the effects of globalization which the CTG views as the source of the country's continued underdevelopment.

However, dismantling the current economic model means reversing all economic reforms in the past several decades implemented through laws passed by previous administrations. Such move would be an arduous, costly, and extensive process. The Philippines might not only find itself worse off economically if it lets go of the advantages of the current system but also face ostracism and isolation in the community of nations after such a radical shift.

Second, their CASER binds not only the current administration and the CTG, but also ALL THEIR SUCCESSORS. We believe that future conditions merit suitable responses. It would be unreasonable for the current administration to commit to something that would be irrevocable and might present challenges for the next administrations.

Third, the NDF demands that the Agreement shall remain in force and in effect irrespective of the course and outcome of the peace negotiations. This robs the Philippine government of its ability to negotiate on equal footing with the CTG and therefore might sabotage our efforts in attaining a genuine and lasting peace with the rebels.

Their CASER also wants to demobilize the Philippine military personnel by reducing their functions only for civil works and infrastructure construction. On the other hand, under the CASER, the NPA is designated to play a key role in implementing agrarian reform. This will be hugely detrimental to the Philippine government because the

military must be able to retain its mandate to protect the people and the nation under various kinds of threats.

Moreover, conceding to their CASER version will not only be an act of admission of their accusations but an act of disregard to the efforts of our leaders and lawmakers in addressing pressing societal issues. The President under his administration labored for the passage of fundamental policy reforms and laws that address the root causes of armed conflict.

These policy reforms include the aggressive implementation of land reform, free irrigation, Free Tertiary Education, Universal Health Care, Expanded 4Ps, and the Build, Build, Build Program.

We have had many attempts to end the conflict with the CTG since 1986 with over 40 rounds of peace talks conducted and with the same people as negotiators. But for the longest time, the peace talks were only used as a period to rest when badly beaten, seek reinforcements, and initiate recruitment. Engaging in another round of peace talks after all these years and all our efforts without significant changes is therefore pointless.

After presenting the objectionable provisions of their proposed CASER, would it be beneficial to the nation that we engage the CTG in another round of peace talks?

We have alternatives to peace talks. We are now pursuing local peace engagements which have resulted in understanding and the mainstreaming of rebels.

Moreover, the government has the capacity to fulfill its obligations for social justice and development. Who needs the CPP/NPA/NDF?

IMUS MARKET TO OPEN P200M ELEVATED CAR PARK

IMUS CITY, Cavite — The opening of the P200 million multi-elevated parking areas at the Imus public market was moved from December to February this year.

Imus City Engineer Christian Mervin S. Sarno confirmed this as he revealed that a P100 million three-story commercial building was also lanned to be built this year in the three-hectare market area.

The decades-old market was having a major face lift in the last few years. With the construction of the market's covered concrete stalls in 2018, the elevated car park and the new building will be added features in the market area.

Imus has two public markets, one is at Bahayang Pag-asa. The city has also small "talipapa" (flee markets) in some city's barangays (villages).

The new parking levels, each about 1,470 square meters or a total 5,880 square meters, is at the right wing of the market which has been operating for about four decades.

Officials said that the elevated parking area, which construction started in mid-2018, was deemed as a must

considering the number of vehicles that parked every day within the market area and nearby roads.

The vehicles, mostly cars, jeeps and delivery trucks, have been using the roads and other spaces at the front and side of the market as parking areas for years.

The elevated parking areas will help boost the local government's ongoing road clearing operations against obstructions within the market area.

Sarno said that only a minimal fee will be charged for owners of vehicles once the market vehicle parking levels are operational.

The market's elevated parking areas can accommodate about 140 vehicles.

The two floor areas has a drive-through lane and

wide spaces for parking. The first and second floor areas were built with side concrete stalls for business. The top floor will be the open rooftop.

The elevated lane entrance lead-ing to the second and upper parking levels is at the market's right corner portion beside a mall fronting Nueno Avenue.

The market's planned building may start construction in mid-2020 and was targeted to be finished by 2021, according to Sarno.

The new building will be put up at the market front, replacing the old, one to two story row that houses the city fire station, city market ad-ministration office and other com-mercial establishments.

"The old building fronting the market and near the elevated parking areas would have to be demolished for the building to be constructed. The fire station and others that will be affected will have to be transferred to another site," Sarno told this reporter.



Taal eruption casualty remains zero: Batangas prov'l gov't

MANILA-- There is no recorded casualty in Batangas province amid the volcanic eruption of Taal Volcano so far, a provincial government official said on Tuesday.

In an interview with Radyo Pilipinas, Batangas provincial administrator Levi Dimaunahan said they have yet to record or monitor any casualty in the province due to the volcanic eruption.

"We are now in the relief operations stage as many residents from different towns in Batangas have been evacuated," he added.

He attributed the early warnings for residents near living Taal island resulted in zero casualties, noting that being prepared has helped to keep their constituents out of harm's way.

He said the Taal volcano remains at alert level 4.

"Most of the residents from Agoncillo, San Nicolas, Laurel and Talisay have already been evacuated from their homes", he said.

He said some of the evacuees are staying with their relatives and friends in different places while some

are in the neighboring provinces of Batangas and in Metro Manila, which decongested most of the evacuation centers in the area.

Castro added the relief goods continue to pour in from the national agencies and donations from private groups and individuals.

He also thanked the Pampanga provincial government for providing medical assistance, heavy equipment for the clearing roads of ashes, trucks to evacuate residents to safer grounds. (PNA)

CARRYING HEALTH CARE ASSISTANCE TO GENERAL EMILIO AGUINALDO RESIDENTS:

Mayor Nelia Angeles and Vice Mayor Louel Gloriani Golfo acknowledged the efforts of the Provincial Government's medical mission team as another health care services were given to the residents of General Emilio Aguinaldo held at Barangay Castaños Lejos on January 8, 2020 as



part of the medical and dental mission program of the Remulla Administration. Three hundred fifty-seven residents have availed free consultations and tooth extraction rendered by volunteer medical professionals from General Emilio Aguinaldo Memorial Hospital (GEAMH). Residents were also given free medicines and vitamins.
