

DA seizes P100-M worth of smuggled meat, agri goods in Cavite



(It's dangerous to release it to the market and the NMIS conducted an initial testing which indicated that most of the seized products are unfit for consumption)," De Mesa added.

The seized products include frozen meat like pork belly, boneless pork, and Peking ducks, as well as fishery products like pompano, giant lapu-lapu, ingredients for shabu-shabu (hot pot) and assorted meatballs, among others.

Chinese characters were used in the packaging of the seized products, which may have originated from China and Hong Kong, according to the BOC.

MANILA – The Department of Agriculture (DA) on Friday seized PHP100 million worth of smuggled frozen meat and agricultural products through a joint operation with the Bureau of Customs (BOC) in Kawit, Cavite.

In an interview, DA Assistant Secretary Arnel de Mesa said that besides the lack of sanitary and phytosanitary import clearances, the confiscated

goods were not properly packaged.

"The violation on food safety is very prominent. It is really for condemnation," he said.

to PHP55/kg. for imported well-milled rice.

Lowering rice retail price initiatives include DA programs with the National Irrigation Administration (NIA) and the National Food Authority (NFA) through the Kadiwa stores.

"Nagsimula na din ang trial selling ng bigas sa PHP29/kilo sa piling Kadiwa centers. According to the DA-Bantay presyo (price watch), the prevailing prices of local regular-milled rice in Metro Manila range from PHP45 per kilogram to PHP52/kg. and PHP48/kg. to PHP55/kg. for local well-milled rice; while imported regular-milled rice ranges from PHP48/kg. to PHP51/kg. and PHP52/kg.

Rice import tariff was reduced from 35 percent to 15 percent.

All traffic violation messages are scams, LTO reminds public

MANILA – The Land Transportation Office (LTO) again warned the public that messages about traffic violations in SMS or other messaging platforms are all scams and should be ignored. In a statement on Friday, LTO chief Assistant Secretary Vigor Mendoza II said these messages are online scams aimed at stealing personal information from victims, including their bank and e-wallet information.

"We would like to remind the public that the LTO does not send any traffic violations through text messages or any messaging app. If you receive one, that

means it came from scammers," Mendoza said.

These scam messages, he said, come with a link that once clicked, would redirect to a fake LTO site asking for the person's license plate and other personal information.

"Do not ever type in the license plates of your motor vehicles and give other personal information about your bank or e-wallet accounts. Better yet, ignore all of them because they are certainly scams," he said.

The LTO is coordinating with law enforcement agencies, including the Philippine National Police, and the Department



of Information and Communications Technology to catch the culprits behind these scams.

Mendoza also ordered all LTO regional directors and district office heads to intensify their information drive against such scams using their respective social media accounts and through their free theoretical driving course. (PNA)

DSWD welcomes 4Ps grant expansion

MANILA – The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) on Wednesday welcomed President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s approval of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program's (4Ps) expanded cash grant as "incentive" for poor pregnant and lactating women.

In a sectoral meeting in Malacañang on Tuesday, President Marcos gave his go-signal for the DSWD's proposal to include a First 1000 day-grant for the 4Ps beneficiaries who are pregnant, nursing, or those with two-year-old children.

"The President gave us instructions on how we can improve the lot of our pregnant and lactating mothers, especially our poorer mothers," Social Welfare Secretary Rex Gatchalian, who attended the sectoral meeting, said.

He added that the



additional grant for the 4Ps program will serve as an incentive for the target beneficiaries to avail of health services and will address malnutrition and stunting in the country.

"This will serve as an incentive for them to have this what we call health-seeking behavior which means they will be motivated to go to the health center, register, avail of pre-and post-natal care, and post-partum treatment, including immunization for their 0 to 2-year old children," he said.

Gatchalian added that the proposed grant will only be for 4Ps subset beneficiaries who are pregnant, nursing, or those with 0 to 2-year-old children and is just temporary until such time that they have passed

through the stage.

The DSWD serves as the chair of the Inter-Agency Task Force on Zero Hunger (IATF-ZH) which has been directed by the President to prioritize the implementation and monitoring of nutrition-specific and nutrition-sensitive programs to address food insecurity in the country.

During a sectoral meeting last Feb. 20, President Marcos instructed the DSWD to work with concerned agencies, particularly with the National Economic and Development Authority and Philippine Statistics Authority, to sharpen the DSWD proposal.

6. Sakit – Ang pananakit ng leeg ay maaaring sintomas ng sakit gaya ng rheumatoid arthritis o meningitis.

Cell phone ban pushed for K-12 students, teachers in all schools

MANILA, Philippines — Sen. Sherwin Gatchalian has filed a bill that bans K-12 students and teachers in both public and private schools from using mobile devices and electronic gadgets during class hours.

Gatchalian, chair of the Senate committee on basic education, filed Senate Bill No. 2706, or the Electronic Gadget-Free Schools Act, which tasks the Department of Education (DepEd) to draft the guidelines for the measure.

The senator earlier said he believes mobile phones reduce the reading, study and social time of students, noting that they waste a lot of time on social media.

He added that his bill was in line with his bid to encourage more Filipinos to read books.

In SB 2706's explanatory note, Gatchalian acknowledged that mobile devices and electronic gadgets could be compelling learning tools used to enhance teaching and learning in education.

"Its usage ensures flexible course delivery and makes it possible for learn-

ers to access online learning platforms and course resources and interact digitally," he said.

However, he also pointed out how these technological advancements could become distractions that might adversely impact learning, especially among basic education students.

Gatchalian cited the results of the 2022 Programme for International Student Assessment (Pisa), which showed that 8 in 10 learners age 15 reported being distracted by smartphone use during class.

The Pisa results further revealed that distraction due to smartphone use during class was correlated with a decrease in performance of about 9.3 points in mathematics, 12.2 points in science and 15.04 points in reading.

"Aside from [a] decrease in learners' academic performance, access to such devices seems likely to mediate involvement in cyberbullying. Hence, the use of mobile devices and other electronic gad-

gets must be restricted, especially during class hours, in order to balance the use of technology and promote learning among learners," the senator said.

He likewise noted that in the 2023 Global Education Monitoring Report, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization recommended stricter regulations on mobile phone use in class.

Exemptions Gatchalian, however, provided some exceptions in his bill. These were learning-related exceptions, such as classroom presentations or class-based learning activities; health and well-being-related exceptions, such as learners with health conditions that require the use of mobile devices and electronic gadgets; and exceptions related to managing risks, such as emergencies, responses to perceived threats or dangers, and field trips or activities outside school premises. All covered public and private education institutions that violate the bill will be punished, with the penalties to be determined by the DepEd. Students,

on the other hand, will be sanctioned according to their schools' policies.

A similar bill—Senate Bill No. 1271—was filed in January 2020 by then Sen. Leila de Lima, who sought to regulate gadget use among students in all public K-12 institutions to improve their academic performance.

While acknowledging the educational benefits of using mobile phones and other electronic devices, De Lima cited the risks posed by their unrestrained use, such as lack of sleep and poor concentration and retention. The bill, however, was left pending at the committee level.

In November 2019, then San Jose del Monte City Rep. Rida Robes also filed House Bill No. 5542, which pushed for a ban on the use of mobile phones and other electronic devices among students aged 15 years and below in all public and private schools. The bill was referred to the House committee on the welfare of children, but no further action was taken. —with a report from Inquirer Research

DSWD chief asks META PH for swift action vs. online baby selling

MANILA – The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) officials, led by Secretary Rex Gatchalian, on Thursday met with the representatives of META Philippines, the mother company of the popular Facebook social media platform, at the Central Office in Quezon City.

The meeting was the result of the letter sent by the Office of the DSWD Secretary to META Philippines in connection with the proliferation of Facebook accounts being used in the online selling of babies in the guise of adoption.

"We have created a working relationship with META whether to report to them directly or through reporting channels to create a more robust mechanism. And to also work with them on developing a campaign against



human trafficking," Gatchalian said in a news release.

The meeting was attended by Undersecretary for International Affairs, Attached and Supervised Agencies (ASAs) Emmeline Aglipay Villar, Assistant Secretary Elaine Fallacurna and Undersecretary Janella Estrada, executive director of the Na-

tional Authority for Child Care (NACC). "We have to treat this (online illegal adoption) with the same severity on how META takes immediate action on the violations of the Anti-OSAEC (Online Sexual Abuse or Exploitation of Children) law," Gatchalian told the META representatives.

Estrada informed META that 16 of the 23 reported Facebook pages were already taken down but new pages were being created by those behind the online selling of infants.

Estrada asked META Philippines Director for Public Policy Clare Amador, who expressed their full cooperation, for the immediate taking down of the Facebook pages that clearly engage in the illegal selling of babies online.

To make sure that this problem of baby selling would be addressed seriously, Gatchalian instructed Estrada to create a team in NACC that will monitor these Facebook pages and work with META to create a more robust mechanism that will be beneficial in fighting this form of human trafficking. (PNA)

MANILA – The Second Congressional Commission on Education (EDCOM 2), together with the Department of Education (DepEd) and other basic education stakeholders, has formed a technical working group (TWG) that will review and propose reforms to the Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act 1067 or the Anti-Bullying Act of 2013.

In a news release on Thursday, EDCOM 2 co-chairperson, Pasig City Rep. Roman Romulo, said the review seeks to strengthen the Child Protection Committee, improve bullying case reporting systems, clarify DepEd's anti-bullying structures, and ensure effective implementation of the law. "Kahit na matagal na 'yung batas, sa totoo, last year lang talaga natutukan ng DepEd (Even though the law has been around for some time, in truth, it was only last year that DepEd focused on it), by creating an ad hoc office and by asking for personnel. So right now, we don't actually know the depth of the problem, 'yung dimensions ng problema ng bullying kasi last year lang pala naumpisahan 'yung Learners' Rights Protection Office (the dimensions of the problem of bullying because the LRPO only began last year)," Romulo said.

The LRPO is an office created by Vice President and Education Secretary Sara Z. Duterte that focuses on assisting victims of bullying and abuses within or outside school premises. "Let's not disappoint – because madama talagang good plans, but hindi talaga na-i-implement (we had a lot of good plans but were not implemented), and we end up disappointing our teachers, our students, and the DepEd family itself," Romulo said.

The TWG was formed after a recent meeting of the EDCOM 2 Sub-committee on Basic Education where a series of studies on Bullying and Home and School Environment were presented. One of these is a study conducted by De La Salle University, which showed that bullying is more common in public schools with large class sizes, discriminatory teachers, and lower competition and discipline.

The study also found that bullying is more prevalent in schools with a higher percentage of students from lower socioeconomic backgrounds, with Caraga and Mimaropa regions having the highest bullying incidence. (PNA)

DepEd: TEC Secretariat appointment, teacher education still priority

MANILA – The Department of Education (DepEd) on Wednesday assured the public that teachers' education and appointments for the Teachers Education Council (TEC) Secretariat remain its priority.

DepEd released its official statement following "insinuations of delay from advocacy groups."

"DepEd has always held the highest regard for teacher quality and has consistently made teacher education a top priority. As chairperson, Vice President and Secretary of the Department of Education Sara Duterte spearheaded multiple meetings of the TEC," it said.

It also underscored the importance of the TEC's function in terms of enhancing training for teachers. "We assure our

education stakeholders that the appointments will be completed in due course and in accordance with existing rules, as the TEC embarks on its critical work for the benefit of our Filipino teachers," the DepEd said.

Duterte earlier led the regular meetings for the "creation, selection, and appointments" of those qualified for the TEC Secretariat, with the submission of its proposed organizational structure and staffing pattern (OSSP) to the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) on March 25.

The DBM approved the OSSP on May 21 including the approval of the creation of 25 permanent positions for the TEC Secretariat.

As support to the council, four units were



also included: the Office of the Executive Director, the Student Incentives Support Office, the Quality Pre-Service Teacher Education Office, and the Quality Teaching Office.

The TEC Secretariat's function includes providing technical and administrative assistance to the TEC for policy and program recommendations, execution, and coordination, as prescribed in Republic Act 7784 or An Act to strengthen teacher education in the Philippines. (PNA)

Add'l grant only for 4Ps households with pregnant, nursing mothers

MANILA – Only pregnant and nursing mothers who are enrolled and registered as beneficiaries of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) can receive the expanded cash grant under the "1st 1000 Days" initiative of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), according to the 4Ps national program manager on Thursday.

"Talagang kailangan linawin natin kasi marami na pong nagpapalista na mga buntis at may 0 to 2 years old. Liwanagin lang po natin. So, ngayon kailangan maliwanag na ang magiging beneficiaries nito ay iyong talagang existing na beneficiaries ng 4Ps. Hindi siya outside ng 4Ps (We need to clarify this because there are already a lot of pregnant women and those with 0 to 2-year-old children who want to enlist. Let us make this clear. We need to clarify that the beneficiaries of this are the existing beneficiaries of 4Ps, not outside 4Ps)," 4Ps National Program Manager Gemma Gabuya told reporters during the Thursday Media Forum at the DSWD Central Office's New Press Center in Quezon City.

Gabuya explained that the additional grant, which

is proposed at PHP400 per month, is also subject to the beneficiaries' compliance with the program conditions.

"Nais nating linawin na ito ay dagdag grants lamang sa existing na health grants na nakukuha nila (We want to clarify that this is an additional grant to the existing health grants they are already receiving)," she said.

She said the DSWD is currently coordinating with the National Economic Development Authority (NEDA) to identify the target number of beneficiaries of the expanded cash grants and the budget needed for its implementation. "Nag-uusap-usap na po ang NEDA, kami sa DSWD para linasin ang data. Syempre we really need to come up with accurate data, kung ilan talaga. Kasi it will require also budget (NEDA and we at the DSWD are already discussing to come up with a clean data. Of course, we really need to come up with accurate data on how many should be included. Because it will also require a budget), how much it will entail," the DSWD official pointed out.

Currently, 4Ps households are receiving cash grants for the education, nutrition, and health of the monitored children.

Under the DSWD's 4Ps program, household-beneficiaries receive grants on the condition that their children attend school and are brought to health centers for their monthly medical check-up.

Household beneficiaries of 4Ps with elementary students receive PHP300 per child per month for 10 months; PHP500 per child per month for 10 months for junior high school; and PHP700 per child per month for 10 months for senior high school.

Household-beneficiaries also get PHP750 per month in health grants for 12 months provided that their children aged two to 14 years old undergo a growth development and monitoring program and deworming. The 4Ps, implemented by the DSWD, is a national poverty reduction strategy institutionalized under Republic Act No. 11310 or "An Act Institutionalizing Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps)".

It puts a premium on giving indigent families the means to break-away from the intergenerational cycle of poverty through human capital investments. (PNA)

of 98,000 kilograms, were hidden in 10 cold storage facilities.

De Mesa said the facilities are also illegal as they're not registered with the NMIS.

The facilities are located behind a property leased under a certain Vigour Global Logistic Corp. and appear to be operating as a parcel sorting center as a front.

De Mesa said no property owner or consignee has come forward yet, but the seized items will be subject to condemnation following the issuance of a warrant of seizure.

Violators may face charges for violation of Republic Act 10611 or Food Safety Act of 2013.

The DA, meanwhile, vowed to continue similar operations to crack down on agricultural smuggling.

"This should serve as a stern warning to unscrupulous traders that we will not stop going after these illicit activities. We want to ensure that our farmers are not disadvantaged by these unfair and often illegal trade practices," DA Secretary Francisco Tiu Laurel Jr. said in a separate statement.

Besides the BOC and NMIS, the DA also collaborates with the intelligence, surveillance, and enforcement teams of the Philippine Coast Guard and the Bureau of Animal Industry in running after smugglers of agricultural products. (PNA)

while, said lowering retail prices of the country's staple remains a key target of the administration despite the overall effects of the El Niño phenomenon.

"Mataas pa rin ang presyo ng bigas sa global market dahil sa epekto ng El Niño. Prayoridad ng Pangulo na gawing mas abot-kaya ang presyo ng bigas upang matulungan ang ating mga kababayan (The price of rice in the global market remains high due to the effects of El Niño. It is the priority of President [Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.] to make rice more affordable to help our people)," he said.

To date, the country has sustained PHP9.89 billion worth of agricultural damage due to the effects

of El Niño, with the rice sector incurring PHP4.75 billion in losses.

Agri exports Meanwhile, Tiu sought help from Japan's new Ambassador to Manila Endo Kazuya to boost Philippine agricultural exports to Japan.

In particular, the agriculture chief reiterated the country's request for a tariff cut for Philippine bananas, the revival of mango exports, and market access of fresh Hass avocados.

For banana exports, the country is ready to increase its volume delivery – which reached 3.4 million metric tons (MT) from 2021 to 2023 – with a tariff reduction.

Based on data, banana exports from the Philippines to Japan reached

Dealers delaying release of license plates, OR/CR face suspension



MANILA – At least 28 motorcycle and car dealerships face fines between PHP20,000 and PHP500,000 and suspension of accreditation up to six months for defying the Land Transportation Office (LTO) guidelines to release license plates and Official Receipt/Certificate of Registration (OR/CR) on time.

Assistant Secretary Vigor Mendoza II, LTO chief, said the agency has initiated measures against the erring dealers.

“We already have an initial list of the agents and their dealerships that were recommended for sanctions, including fines and suspension of accreditation,” Mendoza said in a news release on Sunday.

All LTO offices must release the license plates and OR/CR to the motor vehicle dealerships within five days after all the documentary requirements are submitted.

On the other hand, motor vehicle dealers have six days to release them to their clients, for a maximum total of 11 days.

In an earlier memorandum issued to the Department of Transportation, Malacañang emphasized that all vehicle dealers must comply with the LTO’s prescribed processing timelines for the release of motor vehicles plates.

Included in the

memorandum is the imposition of “the necessary penalties, such as termination of dealership, on dealers who fail to comply.”

“Let this serve as a strong message to all agents and dealerships to do their part, their obligation to their clients. Kasama sa trabaho ninyo ay tiyakin na sumusunod kayo sa regulasyon ng LTO patungkol sa release ng plaka at (It is part of your job to make sure you comply with LTO regulations on release of license plates and) OR/CR on time,” Mendoza said.

He urged owners of newly bought motor vehicles to immediately report to the LTO errant agents and car and motorcycle dealerships that would fail to release their license plates and OR/CR on time.

Complaints could be sent to LTO’s social media accounts and hotline 0929-2920865.

The LTO reiterated that the license plate backlog for all four-wheel motor vehicles will be wiped out by June 2025 following the production of one million license plates per month.

New motorcycles, meanwhile, will be prioritized in the distribution of license plates so as not to add to the backlog. (PR/PNA)

LGUs pressed to pass ordinance banning Pogo

MANILA, Philippines — Local government units (LGUs) have been urged by a senator to pass an ordinance banning Philippine offshore gaming operators (Pogos) within their jurisdictions.

Senator Sherwin Gatchalian on Friday offered this unsolicited advice to local chief executives as recent raids sparked speculations that local leaders may have been allowing the operations of illegal offshore gaming firms.

“Ang payo ko sa ating mga local chief executives ay gumawa na ng ordinance para i-ban na ‘yung Pogos ng mga local government units dahil malalagay sila sa alanganin ‘pag nag-operate itong Pogo sa kanila eh,” he said in an interview over Radyo 630.

(My advice to our local chief executives is to pass an ordinance to ban Pogos as this will put them in a precarious situation



once the Pogos start operating in their areas.)

“Bigyan kayo ng halimbawa, itong sa Porac napakadaling gamitin na dahilan na ‘hindi ko alam ‘yung nangyayari dun’ pero mayor ka eh, kung hindi mo alam ‘yan malaking problema tayo sa patakbo sa iyong lugar,” the senator added.

(I’ll give you an example, in Porac, it’s very easy to use an excuse that you don’t know what’s happening there but you’re the mayor and you don’t know? Then we have a big

problem on how you run your area)

The raid in Porac town in Pampanga province last June 4 was prompted by reports that Pogo firm Lucky South 99 Outsourcing Inc. was being used for human trafficking. More than 190 Filipino and foreign workers were rescued from that raid.

But Porac Mayor Jaime Capil was quick to dismiss speculations that he is a protector of the offshore gaming firm.

Meanwhile, Tarlac’s Bamban town Mayor

Alice Guo was implicated in another illegal Pogo firm raided by authorities in March this year.

Documentary evidence supposedly linking Guo to Zuan Yuan Technology Inc were reportedly found during the raid. Guo, however, repeatedly denied involvement in Pogo.

According to Gatchalian, LGUs may prohibit Pogos in their areas just like what his brother, Mayor Wes Gatchalian, did in Valenzuela City.

“Meron kaming Pogo ban ordinance dito sa Valenzuela,” he pointed out in a Viber message.

As chairman of the Senate committee on ways and means, the senator conducted a probe into the impact of offshore gaming operations in the country.

His committee later recommended the permanent banning of Pogos nationwide.

household beneficiary receives cash aid on the condition that their children attend school and are brought to health centers for their monthly medical check-up.

Household beneficiaries of 4Ps with elementary students receive PHP300 per child per month for 10 months; PHP500 per child per month for 10 months for junior high school; and PHP700 per child per month for 10 months for senior high school.

Households also get PHP750 per month for 12 months provided that their children aged two to 14 years old undergo a growth development and monitoring program and deworming. Families are also required to attend the monthly family development sessions (FDS).

The Malusog at

Matalinong Bata Coalition (MMB Coalition), an alliance of advocacy groups, academics, and nutrition advocates committed to fighting stunting in the Philippines through policy reforms, has expressed its support for the DSWD proposal.

The MMB Coalition described stunting as a critical condition where children suffer from restricted growth and cognitive development due to malnutrition. Its more profound impact is on cerebral development, with 80 percent of brain growth occurring by the age of two and 90 percent by the age of five.

The group also cited that stunting currently affects approximately 26.7 percent of Filipino children between infancy and five years of age. (PR)

DBM OKs creation of 89 plantilla positions in National Museum



MANILA – The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) has approved the request of the National Museum of the Philippines (NMP) for organizational and staffing changes, including the creation of 89 additional permanent positions.

In a news release Tuesday, the DBM said the approval is in recognition of the significant role of cultural heritage and history in the country’s economic development and to help augment the operations of the National Museum.

“We believe that these organizational and staffing changes will significantly enhance the National Museum’s operations, allowing the agency to better serve the public and fulfill its mission to preserve and promote our cultural heritage,” Budget Secretary Amenah Pangan-daman said.

“Nais po ni Pangulong Bongbong Marcos na kasama sa ating national agenda ang pagpapalakas sa turismo at pangangalaga sa ating pagkakakilanlan. Kaya naman po patuloy pong bibigyang suporta ng DBM ang NMP at mga programa nito (President Bongbong Marcos wants to include tourism and cultural heritage in our national agenda. That’s why the DBM is in full support of the NMP and its programs),” she added.

Under Republic Act (RA) No. 11333 or the

National Museum of the Philippines Act, the NMP is regarded as the primary institution for the management and development of museums and collections of national scope or significance in the areas of arts, cultural heritage, and natural history, to protect, preserve, study, and promote national patrimony.

The creation of 89 plantilla positions in various units of the NMP across the country will support the existing staff of the agency, as well as further enhance its operations, the budget department said.

Other organizational modifications approved by the DBM include the changes in the nomenclature of a certain unit to clearly indicate its specific roles, functions, and activities, as well as the reclassification and conversion of certain positions to support the NMP in performing essential functions, such as providing lectures/gallery talks, preparation of reports and other documents, and undertaking of other technical and general support-related tasks.

Meanwhile, the transfer of several positions from one unit to another was also approved.

The museum’s approved organizational and staffing modifications are contained in the Notice of Organization, Staffing and Compensation Action the DBM issued on May 21, 2024. (PNA)
