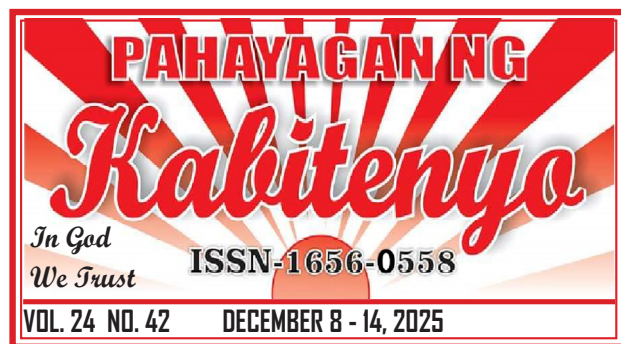

Cavite Career Caravan draws strong turnout at Trece Martires City College



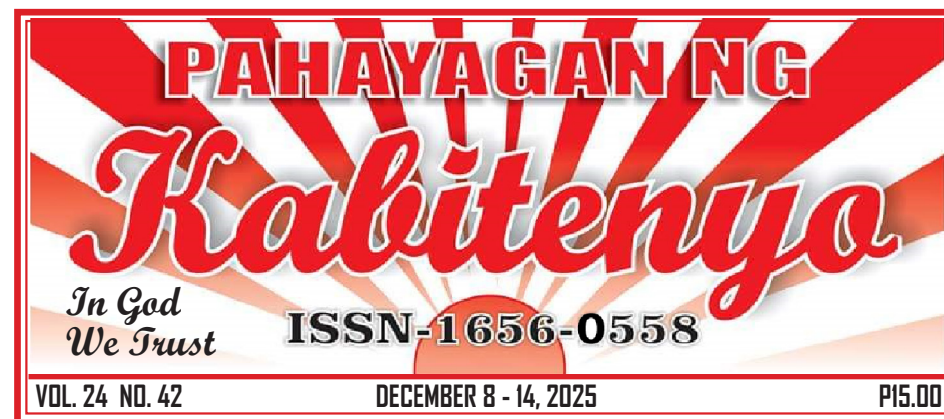
3,618 job vacancies across diverse fields and industries.

A total of 88 jobseekers participated in the activity, with 16 applicants successfully hired on the spot. Fourteen employers took part in the caravan – 12 local companies and 2 overseas recruitment agencies – collectively offering

In her opening message, CaSMEDC Chair Teresita Leabres underscored the importance of digitalization in sustaining business growth and ensuring long-term competitiveness. PH tourism gets boost with Perth-Manila direct flights

MANILA – Travel between the Philippines and Australia is expected to improve with the launch of Jetstar Airways' direct flights between Perth and Manila on Friday at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport Terminal 3.

Department of Tourism (DOT) Secretary Christina Frasco, in a news release on Monday, said the new service enhances air connectivity and is seen to support tourism, business and cultural exchanges between the two countries.

"This flight represents more than just travel; it symbolizes our commitment to offering opportunities for tourism and business, making it easier for travelers to fly to Manila and further connect the Philippines to the world," she said.

Jetstar's inaugural flight, which carried 169 passengers, arrived after six hours and 35 minutes of travel.

The airline will operate the route three times weekly — every Wednesday, Friday and Sunday — using a 232-seat aircraft.

Flight JQ80 departs Manila at 5:35 a.m. and lands in Perth at 1 p.m., while flight JQ81 leaves Perth at 9:10 p.m. and arrives in Manila at 4:15 a.m.

PLDT-Smart pilots robotic arm tech in cell towers to boost coverage

MANILA – PLDT and its wireless subsidiary Smart Communications Inc. (PLDT-Smart) began their pilot test on the use of remote-controlled robotic arms in their cell towers to enable real-time network optimization and coverage improvements, particularly in underserved areas.

In a statement on Tuesday, PLDT-Smart said the technology, dubbed the Optical Compass and Robot Arm (OCRA) system, will allow operators to remotely move antennas for real-time adjustments with the goal of boosting coverage in target areas, cutting costs, and enhancing overall network performance.

The pilot and proof of concept is a partnership between PLDT-Smart, OCRA manufacturer HUMAX Networks, and its system integrator Telkha.

For the pilot test, PLDT-Smart installed OCRA in an existing cell site to serve two locations: a hospital in San Juan and a nearby high-rise condominium.

"The system addresses long-standing issues in traditional wireless setups, where antennas are fixed in

place and adjustments require physical site visits—often costly and time-consuming," it said.

Paired with the Vega High Grain Antenna tested in Dipaculao, Aurora, the pilot test showed "significant improvements in signal strength, quality, and speed across both locations," it said.

"Enabling remote antenna adjustments also reduces the need for physical site visits and helps telcos avoid unnecessary base station installations, saving time and expense. These efficiencies allow Smart to reinvest in expanding and enhancing its network, ultimately benefiting consumers," it said.

The OCRA will support PLDT-Smart's foray into an artificial intelligence (AI)-driven network optimization by providing real-time visibility into antenna direction, a necessary capability for intelligent network management.

"This milestone strengthens Smart's leadership in 5G while laying the groundwork for future 6G advancements," it said. (PNA)

During the mission, 360 beneficiaries received medical consultations, while specialized diagnostic services were also made available, including 30 ECG procedures and 5 X-ray sessions. The

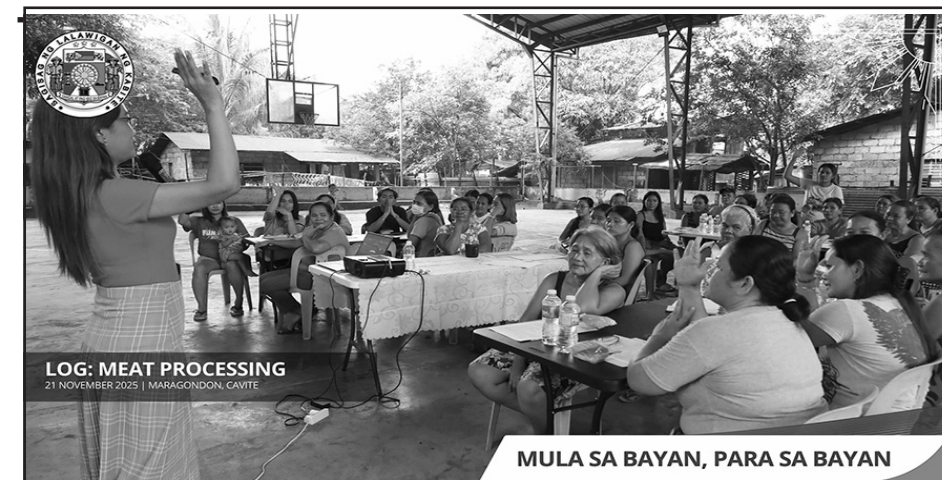


dental team provided essential oral healthcare, completing 79 dental extractions for patients in need.
