

# Globe, Smart block scam numbers amid unabated spam messages



MANILA – The amount of blocked SMS (short messaging service or text) messages decreased by almost half in the first half of 2024 compared to the same period in 2023, Globe Telecom Inc. (Globe) reported Friday.

In a statement, Globe said a total of 2,740,012 bank-related spams and scam messages were blocked from January to June 2024 through anti-fraud measures and collaborations with major financial institutions.

# DPWH building more nat'l roads, flood control projects

MANILA – The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) will construct more national roads covering 30,000 kilometers and flood control projects along principal river basins throughout the country.

Secretary Manuel Bonoan said the DPWH goals are among President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s directives since his first State of the Nation Address (SONA) in 2022 under the Build Better More program.

"So, ito iyong pinag-uukulan namin talaga ng mga pansin sa ngayon (So, this is what we are really focusing on right now)," Bonoan said in a pre-SONA interview over People's Television on Friday.

He said the biggest road project the DPWH is looking to implement is the Daang Maharlika, the 3,000-km main trunk line of the Philippine National System from Laoag City to Zamboanga City that was started by President Marcos' father, the late President Ferdinand E.

"Dapat magkaroon tayo man lang ng tuluy-tuloy na pagbibiyaye along these roads. So, ito iyong tinatahak namin ngayon (So, our goal here is that we should at least have continuous travel along these roads. So, this is what we are going through now)," Bonoan said.

He said 74 of the Marcos administration-approved 175 flagship projects will be implemented under the stewardship of the DPWH.

The DPWH's target is to widen the congested roads not only in Metro Manila but in other regions' metropolises, Bonoan said.

"These collaborations have enabled vigorous and timely data and intelligence-sharing, aligning efforts to prevent and investigate fraud more effectively," it said.

Meanwhile, Smart Communications blacklisted at least 615,788 mobile numbers tied to illicit and fraudulent activities, including spamming and SMSing scams in the first six months of this year.

The numbers include fraudulently registered subscriber identity module (SIM) cards purged through Smart's validation process of all registrations.

Globe operates a 24/7 security operations center that filters out unwanted messages, including app-to-person and person-to-person SMS from international and domestic

# GSIS commits to ensuring affordable housing for gov't workers

MANILA – The Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) has expressed commitment to improving housing for government workers, as it ensures that affordable housing programs are available to public servants.

In an interview over PTV's Pre-SONA Special, GSIS President and General Manager Jose Arnulfo Veloso explained that the recently launched housing initiative "Maginhawang Pabahay sa Bagong Pilipinas" aims to address the housing needs of government employees, as directed by President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.

"Kapag makita mo ang ating mga kasamahan sa gobyerno at sila ay walang matinong nati-

rahan, mabigat sa puso sapagkat kapag umuulan, tumutulo ang mga bubong at sila ay naninilbihan nang tapat sa ating gobyerno. Dapat mabigyan natin ng kaukulang ginawa (When you see our colleagues in the government and they don't have a decent place to stay in, it is heavy on the heart because when it rains, the roofs leak and they serve our government that faithfully. We should give them the appropriate comfort)," he said.

Veloso noted that the program addresses the challenges government employees face, especially those in the lower salary grade level who could not afford hefty down payments.

The "Maginha-



wang Pabahay sa Bagong Pilipinas" program features a rent-to-own scheme with no down payment, allowing monthly payments that can be extended up to 25 years.

There will be an option to have a next of kin as a co-borrower for those nearing retirement age who will continue the payment later.

# DA expands P29 rice program to Southern Luzon vulnerable sectors



MANILA – The Department of Agriculture (DA) on Friday expanded the P29 Rice Program to two new Kadiwa sites in Southern Luzon.

The P29 program offers aging but good quality rice at PHP29 a kilo to the vulnerable sectors, including members of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program, senior citizens, solo parents and per-

sons with disabilities.

"Ngayong araw, nagsimula na tayo sa Bacoor at San Pedro, sa Laguna at sa Cavite. So, dire-diretso ito at sa buwan ng Agosto, magsisimula na tayo sa Visayas at Mindanao (Today, we started in Bacoor and San Pedro, in Laguna and Cavite, respectively. So, it will be continuous and in August, we will start in the Visayas and Mindanao)." Agriculture Assistant Secretary Arnel De Mesa said in an interview.

The program's large-scale trial was initially launched in 10 sites in Metro Manila and Bulacan on July 5.

The first batch are the Bureau of Animal Industry Dome and National Irrigation Administration (NIA) in Quezon City; Bureau of Plant Industry in Malate, Manila; Food Terminal Inc. in Taguig City; Philippine Fiber Industry Development Authority in Las Piñas; Bayani Fernando Central Terminal and Barangay Fortune in Marikina; sites in Caloocan and Valenzuela; and City of San Jose del Monte, Bulacan.

# Inclusion of DOLE, DBM in Cabinet cluster on education pushed

MANILA – Senator Alan Peter Cayetano on Wednesday pushed for the inclusion of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) and the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) in the proposed creation of a new Cabinet Cluster focused on education.

Cayetano, co-chairperson of the Second Congressional Commission on Education (EDCOM II), and other commissioners submitted

the proposal to President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. last June 27.

He said this move aims to address the persistent learning crisis in the country by ensuring "strong coordination among key departments and agencies involved in education and workforce development."

Established by Republic Act 11899 in July 2022, EDCOM II is mandated to conduct a comprehensive evaluation of the Philippine education sys-



tem and propose transformative policies to address ongoing challenges in education and the labor market.

The proposal underscores the need for a dedicated Cabinet Cluster

### Sa May High Blood: Iwas Alat at Asin

#### Payo ni Doc Ong



Para maging malusog, ugaliin natin na bawasan ang alat sa pagkain. Ito ang payo ng mga eksperto. Maraming sakit ang maidudulot ng sobrang daming asin sa pagkain. Puwede ka magkasakit tulad ng high blood pressure, mahina ang puso (heart failure), sakit sa atay, sakit sa kidneys at manas sa paa.

Kapag maraming asin sa katawan, hindi mailalabas ng kidneys (bato) ang sobrang tubig sa katawan. Ito ang sanhi ng high blood pressure kung saan puwede humantong sa istrok at atake sa puso (stroke at heart attack).

Payo para mabawasan ang asin (o sodium) sa katawan, subukan ito:

1. Ang normal na diyeta ay may 7-15 grams ng asin bawat araw. Sa may high blood, dapat itong ibaba sa 2 grams ng sodium bawat araw lamang.
2. Huwag nang magdagdag ng asin sa iyong pagkain. Kung ano ang timpla, iyon na lang ang kainin.
3. Kung mahilig ka sa instant noodles, kalahating seasoning (nasa pakete) lang ang ilagay. Huwag din ubusin ang sabaw dahil andoon ang lahat ng asin.
4. Limitahan o iwasan ang pagkain ng maaalat na sitsirya tulad ng potato chips, chicharon, mani at cornicks.
5. Bawasan ang pagkain ng tuyo, daing, tinapa at bagoong alamang dahil napakaalat nito. Gulay, prutas at inihaw na isda ang piliin.
6. Bawasan ang paggamit ng asin, toyo, patis, bagoong at tausi sa niluluto o bilang sawsawan.
7. Suka at kalamansi na lang ang gawing kapalit na sawsawan.
8. Imbes na adobong manok, puwede din ang "sweet and sour sauce" sa manok.
9. Ang pagkaing Pinoy tulad ng adobo, beef steak at binagoongan ay madalas maalat ang pagkatimpla. Kapag maalat ang timpla, limitahan ang pagkain ng sarsa nito.

Tandaan: Piliin natin ang mga hindi maaalat na pagkain. Sa katagalan ay masasanay din ang ating panlasa sa masustansyang pagkain. Iyan ang sikreto para maging malusog tayo lagi.

since the program launch last Monday, the agency has received 1,000 queries about the program. He said the GSIS has identified more than 3,000 housing units in Bulacan, with plans to improve existing properties and offer options for renovation. Meanwhile, another GSIS initiative is the

GSIS properties that aim to provide government workers with dignified housing solutions. He cited the GSIS vacant properties and empty lots, such as those in Fairview in Quezon City and Cogo in Antipolo, Rizal, which are being developed to become government housing. (PNA)

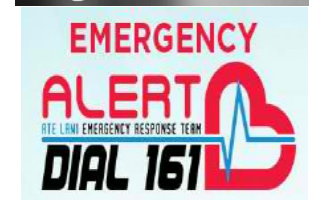

These were followed by three more Kadiwa sites in Malabon, Navotas and Marikina.

The DA aims to conduct its large-scale trial all year to assess the needs and challenges of a nationwide implementation.

"We want to get iyong (the) critical information and challenges of course on demand, supply, logistics, and administrative concern," De Mesa

said. He said the DA will also study the possible lowering of the PHP29 selling price, considering the expected decrease in global market prices.

Overall, the P29 program aims to benefit 6.9 million households nationwide with supplies coming from the stocks of the National Food Authority and harvest from contract growing programs of the NIA. (PNA)

to urgently tackle the learning crisis and formulate a cohesive national education and workforce development plan.

Cayetano, also chairperson of the Senate Committee on Higher, Technical and Vocational Education, emphasized the importance of DOLE and DBM's inclusion in ensuring sustained operational funding and alignment with workforce development goals. Drawing from historical precedent, EDCOM II referenced the 1991 EDCOM report, which led to significant reforms including establishment of the

Commission on Higher Education (CHED) and the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA).

The current proposal aims to build upon these past efforts by promoting coordinated planning, monitoring educational outcomes, aligning teacher education, and meeting the evolving needs of the job market.

Dedicated to bringing about meaningful change in the Philippine education system, Cayetano and EDCOM II hope the proposal garners the necessary support. (PNA)

sources. "Globe has allocated approximately USD20 million to enhance its spam and scam SMS detection and blocking systems to prevent fraudulent messages from reaching consumers," it said.

It called on mobile users to remain vigilant against emerging scams, especially those that evade cellular networks and are instead using chat apps and fake cell towers that can send messages without having to go through their networks.

Marikina (There is a bridge that will connect the north and south harbor, there is a bridge that will connect here near Makati, I think there are two there and three near Marikina)," he said.

He said the target is to finish the six bridges within the term of President Marcos.

Flood control Bonoan said the DPWH is likewise implementing 1,900 flood control projects throughout the country this year.

"Gumagawa po kami ng revetment walls para hindi umapaw iyong mga tubig kapag umuulan (We are building revetment walls so that your water does not overflow when it rains)," he said.

He said the DPWH also has other preventive measures like river dredging, particularly near areas prone to flooding.

Bonoan said the DPWH is implementing farm-to-market roads in coordination with the Department of Agriculture to boost the national food security program.

Convergence programs with the Department of Tourism, on the other hand, will build more access roads and other infrastructure projects

11934 or the SIM Registration Act that mandates the registration of newly bought SIM cards before activation was signed in October 2022.

Public telecommunication companies are likewise required to submit a verified list of their authorized dealers and agents nationwide to the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC), to be updated quarterly.

For the next 11 months or until September 2023, the NTC still received more than 45,000 complaints on text scams.

ects near the tourist destinations.

"Pinagtutulungan na nilalagan namin ng mga infrastructure requirements, particularly iyong mga access roads nila (We are working together to put infrastructure requirements, particularly their access roads) in many parts of the country," he said.

He said at least PHP1.4 trillion, or 6 percent of the gross domestic product, has been allocated for the construction of different infrastructure projects nationwide this year.

Bonoan emphasized the need to invest more on infrastructures, particularly on building roads, to lessen the impact of slow-moving traffic on the economy.

He cited a previous Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) study which revealed that the traffic congestion in Metro Manila alone is estimated to cost the Philippine economy at least PHP3.5 billion a day.

# 2-year PBBM admin: 138K agrarian beneficiaries receive land titles

MANILA – Over 138,000 agrarian reform beneficiaries (ARBs) have so far received land titles under the administration of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr., according to the Presidential Communications Office (PCO).

A day before Marcos delivers his third State of the Nation Address (SONA), the PCO said in a social media post that a total of 138,056 ARBs have already received land titles from July 2022 to July 10, 2024.

The PCO said it was in line with the promise of the President during his second SONA that he would continue to implement the agrarian reform program of the government.

## DHSUD, Meralco partner to energize 4PH projects

MANILA – President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s Pambansang Pabahay para sa Pilipino (4PH) Program gained further traction after the Manila Electric Co. (Meralco) signed an agreement with the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) to energize its projects.

DHSUD Secretary Jose Rizalino Acuzar and Meralco executive vice president and chief operations officer Ronnie Aperocho signed on July 17 a memorandum of understanding (MOU) on developing power infrastructure to efficiently deliver electric services to 4PH project sites within the company's areas of coverage, according to a press release on Saturday.

In his message, Acuzar noted that beyond constructing affordable and quality housing, 4PH seeks to enhance the living conditions of many Filipinos, particularly the underprivileged, by providing decent shelters in sustainable communities, complete with the basic services the residents would need.



PCO also noted how Marcos fulfilled his promise in his first SONA in 2022 to pass a law that will "emancipate the agrarian reform beneficiaries from the agrarian reform debt burden." Marcos signed into law the Republic Act No. 11953 or the New Agrarian Emancipation Act on July 7, 2023.

Marcos has promised to finish the agrarian reform program during his

term.

The program started in 1972 when Marcos' father and namesake, the late President Ferdinand E. Marcos Sr., issued Presidential Decree 2 that set a land reform program in the country.

The President is set to deliver his third SONA on Monday at the Batasang Pambansa in Quezon City before a joint session of Congress. (PNA)

"We view our collaboration with Meralco as a significant leap toward our mission. Meralco's commitment to provide reliable, safe, and efficient electric services to Metro Manila and nearby provinces directly contributes to the betterment of housing communities in major urban areas in the country," he said. Meanwhile, Meralco committed to fully supporting the ongoing rollout of the 4PH Program in the National Capital Region and nearby areas. It also pledged to educate and inform new homeowners about their rights and obligations as electric consumers.

The MOU includes creating a technical working group to deliver timely electrification services to 4PH projects of the DHSUD and implement mechanisms to provide the beneficiaries with a better customer experience.

Acuzar said the deal is a big push for the 4PH program to flourish even better and address previous power supply issues in government housing projects.

DHSUD is also looking forward to discussing the use of sustainable energy in its housing projects, citing Meralco's expertise and network in the power sector. (PR)

## DepEd chief: PBBM's SONA may bring delight to education sector



MANILA – President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s third State of the Nation Address (SONA) is likely to bring good news to the education sector, Education Secretary Juan Edgardo Angara said Monday.

"Hindi ko lang alam ano exactly sasabihin niya pero I think may sasabihin siya na matutuwa ang sektor (I don't know what he will say exactly but I think he will say something that the sector will be delighted)," the new education chief said in an ambush interview on the sidelines of his first flag-raising ceremony at the DepEd Central Office.

He added that his team has already submitted pressing issues in the education sector to the President.

Angara, however, stressed that Marcos' march-

ing orders remain clear, particularly on addressing challenges to teachers' and learners' welfare.

"The President is really awaiting results dito sa atin at klaro naman iyong marching order. Number one, sinabi niya alagaan natin mga teachers natin sila iyong puso ng (his marching order is clear. Number one, he said we need to take care of our teachers because they are the heart of our) education system," he said in a separate speech.

"Pangalawa, sabi niya... (Secondly, he said) let's improve the quality of our education sabi ng Presidente dahil nakikita niya sa mga achievement test international test, medyo nangungulelat po ang ating bansa (the President said because he's seeing the results

of achievement test, international test, our country is being left behind)," Angara added.

The education chief, meanwhile, expressed plans to coordinate with the Civil Service Commission (CSC) for the career progression of teachers.

He also mentioned the continuous rollout of the new MATATAG curriculum, launched by his predecessor Vice President Sara Duterte, to ensure a stable curriculum for learners.

The MATATAG Curriculum, piloted in September 2023, targets to decongest the curriculum and resolve misplaced learning competencies from Kinder to Grade 10.

MATATAG stands for "Make the curriculum relevant to produce job-ready, Active and responsible citizens; TAKE steps to accelerate the delivery of basic education services and provision facilities; TAKE good care of learners by promoting learner well-being, inclusiveness learning, and positive learning environment; and, Give support for teachers to teach better." (PNA)

# Filipinos urged to learn CPR

MANILA – The Department of Health (DOH) on Wednesday called on Filipinos to learn cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) to become first responders in times of emergency where every second counts.

In a media forum coinciding with the National CPR Day, DOH spokesperson Albert Domingo said CPR bridges the gap between life and the loss of it during a cardiac arrest as its administration causes the heart to beat again.

"In the high-income countries, the CPR training rate is up to 50 percent, still low if you think of it, but in other countries including the Philippines, it is much lower, maybe it is only two out of 10 people, 23 percent," he said.

He said cerebral perfusion or the delivery of blood to the brain is affected when the heart stops beating, causing brain damage.

Philippine Red Cross (PRC) Secretary General Gwendolyn Pang said about 70,000 out of 119 million Filipinos suffer from cardiac arrest and only 1 percent are given CPR.

"In 2014, Samboy Lim, a basketball player, while stretching, he collapsed. When he collapsed, no one, unfortunately was there, who was able to provide CPR to him," she said.

"He was brought to the hospital after 23 minutes, fortunately, he was



alive, but was in coma (comatose) for several years."

Pang said Lim's comatose period could have been shortened if he were given CPR within 5 minutes following his collapse.

Philippine Heart Association president Rodney Jimenez said they support the DOH and the PRC in promoting life-saving skills and CPR training.

He said the PHA has its CPR ready advocacy since 2015 and CPR Wings and Wheels where hands only CPR and automated external defibrillator (AED) skills are taught.

"We are trying to institutionalize BLS (basic life support) training with AED amongst the first responders, the police, the teachers, the barangay health workers. Also, with the help of our partners, we're trying to lobby the AED Law, now we're able to speak with Congressman Richard Gomez, Senator Bong Go, Senator Lito Lapid, Nancy Binay and Congressman Ciriaco Gado Jr.," he added. Citing that early CPR has increased

survival rate from 31 percent to 62 percent among out-of-the-hospital setting cardiac arrest cases in Southeast Asia, American Heart Association regional faculty Vicente de Lima Jr. said every Filipino could learn about CPR through the establishment training kiosks in strategic areas like schools and local government units.

Domingo said the DOH offers basic life support didactic e-course which can be accessed by anyone with internet connection.

"Magtipon-tipon siguro 'yung mga offices 'yung mga grupo-grupo sa mga barangay (Groups in offices and barangays may gather together). You can invite the DOH Health Emergency Management Bureau through email, that is free, service of the DOH, they have trainers," he said.

On March 27, President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. declared July 17 of every year as the National CPR Day under Proclamation 511 to promote national health awareness among Filipinos. (PNA)

# DSWD disburses P21.8-B in social pension for 3.7M indigent seniors

MANILA – Over 3.7 million indigent senior citizens nationwide have received their social pension in the first half of 2024, Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Assistant Secretary and Spokesperson Irene Dumlaog said on Wednesday.

"The DSWD has disbursed a total of PHP21.8 billion for the first half of 2024 to some 3,723,323 indigent senior citizens nationwide. This year, the department started to distribute the increased pension of PHP1,000 from PHP500," Dumlaog said in a news release.

The Social Pension (SocPen) is a program under Republic Act No. 9994 or the "Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010" which provides a monthly stipend amounting to PHP500 to indigent senior citizens to augment their

daily subsistence and medical needs.

As mandated by Republic Act 11916 also known as "An Act Increasing the Social Pension of Senior Citizens", which lapsed into law in July 2022, indigent senior citizens are now entitled to a monthly stipend of PHP1,000 from the previous PHP500 per month starting January 2024.

These SocPen are being distributed on a semi-monthly basis at PHP6,000 per semester or PHP1,000 per month for a period of



six months.

"Seniors who are qualified to receive social pension are any elderly, aged 60 years old and above who are frail, sickly or with disability and without any pension from other government agencies," Dumlaog said.

Also eligible to receive social pensions are seniors without a permanent source of income and source of financial assistance or compensation to support their basic needs, Dumlaog added. (PNA)

MANILA – The National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP) has intensified efforts to help indigenous peoples and their communities to become more sufficient through "Hapag Katutubo" (indigenous table) Project.

In a news release on Wednesday, NCIP Chairperson Bo-i Jennifer Pia Sibug-las said the project would also help promote IP culture, especially in agriculture.

"Nandito po ang Hapag Katutubo Project, hindi lamang para itaas ang kamalayan ng mga Pilipino patungkol sa mga katutubong Pilipino, bagkus binibigyan tayo ng pagkakataon para gamitin ang mga katutubong gawi, kaugalian at kultura sa pagtatanim para itaataas ang antas ng inyong pamumuhay (We are here, the Hapag Katutubo Project is here, not only to raise the awareness of Filipinos about our indigenous Filipinos, but to give us the opportunity to use indigenous habits, customs and culture in planting, and raise your standard of living)," she said.

The NCIP, together with the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the local government of Tanay, Rizal, launched the project on Tuesday in Brgy. Lai-ban, Tanay.

The NCIP said the "Hapag Katutubo Project" is anchored in the principles of inclusive development. The project, themed "Katutubo, Katuwang sa pag-unlad para sa Masaganang Bagong Pilipinas", is a step towards the realization and institutionalization of the convergence between various stakeholders from national government agencies (NGAs), civil society organizations (CSOs), academe, and private institutions.

"The goal of the project is to holistically support the indigenous cultural communities/indigenous peoples by increasing their agricultural productivity and the creation of sustainable opportunities for income generation and self-sufficiency," the NCIP said.

Sibug-las said the project is in line with President Ferdinand Marcos Jr.'s 8-point Socio-economic Agenda, and promotes Open Government Partnerships as stipulated in Executive Order No. 31 s. 2023. Meanwhile, DILG Secretary Benjamin Abalos Jr. expressed full support for the project, which he said would support the welfare and well-being of IPs and the IP communities nationwide.

SSS warns public vs.
fake text alerts

MANILA – The Social Security System (SSS) on Thursday warned the public against text providing claims updates.

Normita Doctor, SSS Senior Vice President for Member Services and Support Group, said the agency has been receiving reports from members who get text alerts, instructing them to click a link to avoid expiration of contribution payments or to register to My.SSS.

"Do not click the link in the message of these fake text alerts. It will lead to a phishing site that will steal personal information such as SS numbers and login credentials from My.SSS account," Doctor said in an advisory.

Recipients of such text alerts could "easily identify" scam messages by checking the sender details, she said.

"The SMS sender should be 'SSS' and the official SSS website is www.sss.gov.ph. If it is an unidentified mobile number, it is a text message from scammers purposely sent to deceive its receiver," she said.

DSWD boosts fight vs
food insecurity with
innovative programs

MANILA – The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) will continue to fight food insecurity with innovative programs, Assistant Secretary and spokesperson Irene Dumlaog said on Friday.

Dumlaog issued the reaction on the National Nutrition Council's (NNC) report that one out of three households in the country experiences food insecurity and malnutrition.

"Secretary Rex Gatchalian has always been firm and clear that he will prioritize fighting hunger as the head of the DSWD. In fact, he reiterated it in his recent interview that this is one of the dreams of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. -- to end hunger in the country," Dumlaog said in a statement.

She noted that part of the NNC report shows that food insecurity and malnutrition are also among the causes of low intelligence quotient and stunted growth among poor Filipino households.

"One of the programs implemented by the Department to address hunger and food insecurity is the Walang Gutom 2027: Food Stamp Program (FSP), which has been made a priority program by the Office of the President," Dumlaog said.

The flagship FSP program provides food augmentation to the bottom one million households who are classified as belonging to the food-poor criteria as defined by the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), including pregnant and nursing mothers.

The FSP provides beneficiaries with access to monetary-based assistance and nutrition education to teach them how to prepare healthy and safe meals for the family.

"By teaching FSP beneficiaries to start consuming delicious types of food that are affordable and nutritious, the agency, in turn, helps them to form healthy eating habits that may lead to decreasing the malnutrition rate in the country," Dumlaog said.
