In accordance with Republic Act No. 11037 or the Masustansiyang Pagkain Para sa Batang Pilipino Act – a law on the establishment of a national feeding program for undernourished children in public day care centers, kindergarten and elementary schools, the Cavite Provincial Council for the Protection of Children launched the first Milk Feeding Program in the City of Trece Martires on December 16, 2019 at Sunshine Ville Child Development Center, Barangay Cabuco.

Selected as pilot LGU of the newest program, Trece Martires City is one of the LGUs with high number of undernourished children due to the transfer of residences of former informal settlers from other cities. The PCPC aims to assist the Child Development Center (CDC) with high incidence of undernourished children by providing the Milk Feeding Program. With the target 100 beneficiaries from Sunshine Ville 1 & 2, the program will benefit the vulnerable group of children aged 2-4 years old.

Mayor Gemma Lubigan in her short message thanked the provincial government and the PCPC for selecting the City in the program launching. She urged the parents to give their full support to the program to improve the nutritional status of their children. Likewise, Ms. Nora de los Santos, City Social Welfare and Development Officer reminded the parents to avoid giving their children artificial drinks. The City government provided playpen, educational materials,



building blocks and rubber mats during the launching. On the other hand, Ms. Brendalyn Salazar, Social Welfare Officer IV of the PSWDO gave a brief orientation of the program from identifying a CDC with high prevalence of underweight children, initial weighing,

The difference between the poor and rich nations is not the age of the Nation.

This can be demonstrated by countries like India and Egypt (among others), which are more than

2000 years old and are still struggling (economically).

On the other hand, Canada, Australia and New Zealand, which 150 years back were insignificant, today are developed and rich countries.

The difference between the poor and rich nation does not also depend only on the available natural resources.

Japan has limited territory, 80% mountainous, unsuitable for agriculture or farming, but is second in the world's economy. The country is like an immense floating factory, importing raw materials from the whole world and exporting manufactured products.

Second example is Switzerland, it does not grow cocoa but produces the best chocolates in the world. In her small territory she rears animals and cultivates the land only for four months in a year, nevertheless manufactures the best milk products. A small country which is an image of security which has made it the strongest world bank.

Executives from rich countries who interact with their counterparts from poor countries show no significant intellectual differences.

The racial or color factors also do not evince importance: migrants heavy in laziness in their country of origin are forcefully productive in rich European countries.

What then is the difference?

The difference is the attitude of the people, molded for many years by education and culture (or in our case imposed by colonizers).

When we analyse the conduct of the people from the rich and developed countries, it is observed that a majority abide by the following principles of life:

1. Ethics, as basic principles.
2. Integrity.
3. Responsibility.
4. The respect for Laws and Regulations.
5. The respect from majority of citizens by right.
6. The love for work.
7. The effort to save and invest.
8. The will to be productive.
9. Punctuality.

In the poor countries a small minority follow these basic principles in their daily life.

We are not poor because we lack natural resources or because nature was cruel towards us.

We are poor because we lack attitude. We lack the will to follow and teach these principles of working of rich and developed societies.

A sheer act of arrogance

LUCERNE, Switzerland -- For a country that purports to be the foremost proponent of democracy, it does not stand to reason why the United States of America has the temerity to intrude into the sovereignty of other democratic countries like the Philippines which is about the longest surviving democracy in Southeast Asia.

The irony is sick. The Philippines has a functioning judicial system, a legislative and executive department the functions of which are defined by a constitution. It is, therefore, a classic paradox for US Congress to impose on the Philippine government its wishful order to free a person indicted by the Regional Trial Court and affirmed by the Supreme Court by sheer suspicion that the court ruling is an act of political oppression and retaliation.

The case in point is Sen. Leila de Lima who is accused in Court, not because of her dalliance with high profile inmates who had been convicted and imprisoned in the state penitentiary but her alleged involvement in one of the intricate drug distribution syndicates perpetrated within the confines of the prison cell at the time when she was the Secretary of the Department of Justice which has control and supervision of state penitentiaries.

De Lima had served as Chairperson of the Commission of Human Rights and for months subjected then Mayor Rodrigo Duterte to a probe on alleged extra-judicial killings carried out by the Davao Death Squads she claimed were organized by Duterte. While she claimed that there were thousands of EJK victims buried in a common burial ground she failed to produce a single piece of evidence. Not even when she was DOJ Secretary. Her failure is expected. DDS is non-existent as it was a phantom force conceptualized by the Integrated Nation Police as a psychological force against the communist liquidation forces way back in 1984. Duterte was a neophyte lawyer then and has no influence whatsoever in the local and national government. Any which way you look at it, DDS and the so-called EJK attributed to Duterte are farcical before as they are today.

Fast forward, de Lima ran for Senator and by a quirk of circumstance, so did Rodrigo Duterte for President. Both won De Lima by the skin of her teeth while Duterte a stunning victory over the well-oiled political machinery of his adversaries.

De Lima, who is still consumed by her motive to indict Duterte, renewed her personal agenda to implicate Duterte on EJK and other forms of human rights violation. Duterte,

on the other hand, initiated an unrelenting campaign against drug syndicates and other crimes that were practically institutionalized by the inept government of Benigno Aquino III which nearly pushed the country into narco and failed state. She had likewise extrapolated EJK death statistics from 246 to 10,000 plus using perjured witnesses in senate hearings. Indeed there were casualties in the unrelenting drive against drug syndicates but police records and hers do not match. De Lima also never took cognizance of more than 1-million drug pushers and drug dependents who had surrendered and rehabilitated.

Death statistics attributed to drugs in the Philippines are a drop in the bucket compared to that in the US and its next-door neighbor Mexico. It is therefore cryptic why American Congress would put to task President Duterte and order him to release de Lima from detention. Was there a conspiracy in the past that the US is now unabashedly compelled to get de Lima out of the calaboose?

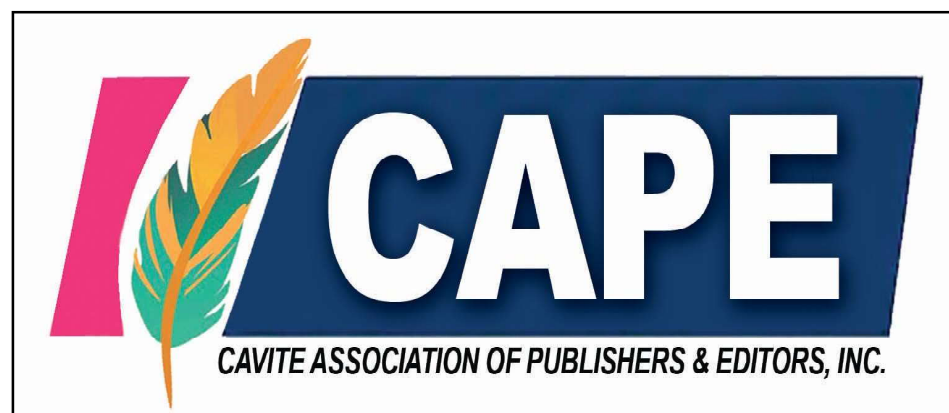

Casugay named 'Athlete of the Month'

MANILA – Southeast Asian Games surfing champion and hero Roger Casugay earned the distinction as the "Athlete of the Month" for December by the Tabloids Organization in Philippine Sports (TOPS).

Casugay, who was hailed by the international surfing community for his heroic act, captured one of the two gold medals in surfing competitions of the recent 30th SEA Games held at the Monalisa Point in San Juan, La Union Province.

The 25-year-old Filipino champion bagged the gold in the men's longboard category with a score of 14.50 in the overall round, only three points ahead of compatriot Rogelio "Jay-R" Esquivel Jr.

But Casugay made newspaper headlines and went viral in various social media sites for his heroic effort in saving his Indonesian opponent Arip Nurhidayat whose leash was detached from the surfboard during the competition. Unmindful of the battle for the gold, Casugay came to the rescue after observing that the Indonesian was getting hit by big waves.

"It was truly a class act by Casugay," said TOPS

president Ed Andaya of People's Tonight.

"Like many other outstanding athletes who excelled during the SEA Games in this merry month of December, Casugay made all of us proud to be Filipinos," added Andaya following deliberations with TOPS officers and members.

Andaya said that no less than Indonesian President Joko Widodo took to Twitter to express his appreciation for Casugay and his heroic effort "to save an Indonesian athlete from falling in the middle of the SEA Games 2019 men's longboard event".

Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) William "Butch" Ramirez also personally picked Casugay to serve as the Philippines' flag bearer in the SEAG closing ceremonies at the New Clark City Athletics Stadium last Dec. 11 in appreciation of his sportsmanship.

"The SEA Games are not only about medals. It is about character, resilience, love for one another and shoring up the faith of the person next to you, something that Casugay has exemplified," said Ramirez.

Casugay was also hailed as the "Fair Play Athlete" of the biennial meet

which the country hosted for the fourth time from Nov. 30 to Dec. 12 this year.

Casugay earned the nods of the officers and members of the country's leading tabloids over a long list of athletes who distinguished themselves during the 12-day, 12-nation biennial competition.

Casugay will join an elite list of monthly winners of TOPS.

Past TOPS monthly awardees are Manny Pacquiao (January), Jasmin Mikaela Mojdeh (February), Natalie Uy (March), Ernest John Obiena (April), June Mar Fajardo (May), the Philippine Canoe Kayak and Dragon Boat Federation team (June), Obiena (July), Antonella Berthe Racasa (August), Obiena (September), Caloy Yulo (October) and Margielyn Didal (November).

TOPS is also the presenter of the "Usapang Sports", a weekly forum held at the National Press Club and sponsored by the Philippine Sports Commission, National Press Club, PAGCOR, Community Basketball Association and HG Guyabano Tea Leaf Drink with livestreaming from Glitter Livestream. (PR)
