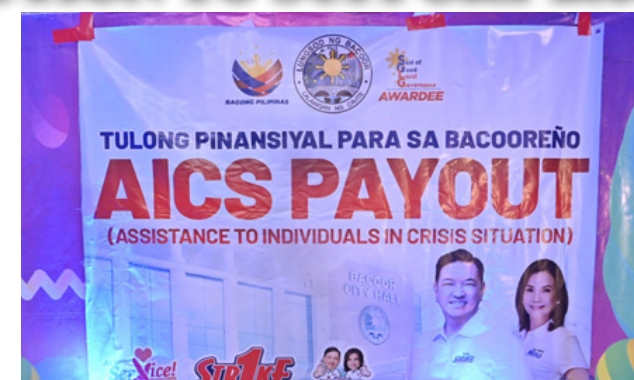

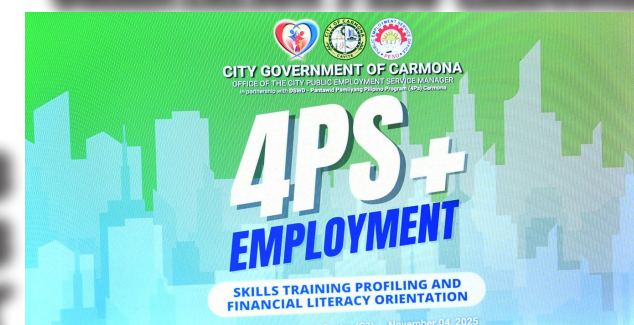


much-needed support to Bacoreños facing challenging circumstances. Mayor Strike personally oversaw the

Senate mobile clinic to boost public health services



MANILA – The Senate on Wednesday formally accepted a fully equipped mobile clinic from the Department of Health (DOH) to help deliver basic healthcare services to underserved communities.

Senate President Vicente Sotto III and Health Secretary Teodoro Herbosa led the turnover ceremony at the Senate Grounds. Sotto thanked the DOH, the Senate Public Assistance Office (SPA0) and the Senate Spouses Foundation, Inc. for making the project possible.

The initiative was first proposed by former Senate president Aquilino Pimentel III when he was Minority Leader.

“This project embodies our commitment to public service that goes beyond the walls of the Senate. The Senate Mobile Clinic will bring healthcare closer to the people, bringing hope, compassion, and assurance that public service is alive and mobile,” Sotto said.

The mobile clinic, equipped with an X-ray machine, blood testing facilities, and other diagnostic tools, will be supervised by the SPA0 and will be deployed to communities to provide preventive, diagnostic, and emergency health services free

of charge.

Sotto said the project symbolizes the Senate’s continuing effort to make social services more accessible.

“This is not just about bringing equipment closer to the people. It’s about bringing hope, compassion, and the assurance that public service is alive and mobile,” he said.

Also present were Kathryn Yu-Pimentel representing the former senator; DOH Undersecretaries Dr. Gregorio Murillo and Dr. Emmie Chiong; DOH Director Dr. Lester Tan; SSFI Executive Director Kath Pimentel; Senate Secretary Renato Bantug Jr.; SPA0 Director General Lino Ong; and Senate Medical Bureau Chief Dr. Renato Sison.

Ong said the mobile clinic would help extend healthcare to Filipinos who cannot easily access medical facilities.

“The mobile clinic will allow us to reach more Filipinos who may not have the means to seek medical help,” he said.

He added the Senate launched “Senate Assist,” an online platform that simplifies applications for medical and social services, allowing Filipinos anywhere in the world to request assistance. (PNA)

DepEd calls for full, sustained funding to ensure literacy recovery

MANILA – The Department of Education (DepEd) on Tuesday called for full and sustained funding to ensure recovery in learners’ literacy.

This is in line with President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.’s directive to ensure quality education in the country.

In a statement, the DepEd said it is prioritizing “foundational learning and literacy recovery” as it aligns resources and streamlines its functions.

“The Department of Education is calling for the full and sustained funding of all education mandates to address the country’s literacy challenges and give every learner a fair and equal chance to succeed,” it said.

The agency assured continuous collaboration with other government agencies and stakeholders to ensure good turnout in the government’s investment in the education sector.



Among the ongoing reforms are the revised and streamlined Kinder to Grade 10 (K-10) and Senior High School (SHS) curriculum, training for public school teachers, the DepEd Principals Academy, as well as the hiring and deployment of administrative officers to help reduce teachers’ workload.

Besides these, the DepEd has also expanded classroom construction and textbook procurement and strengthened the integration of education technology. (PNA)

Price watch system enforced to ensure abaca fair pricing



MANILA – The daily copra price watch system is now benchmarked to help ensure fair abaca pricing in the country, the Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA) reported on Thursday.

The Philippine Fiber Industry Development Authority (PhilFIDA) initiated the move to address long-standing concerns about the growing disparity between the farmgate and the selling prices of abaca.

In a statement, PCA Administrator Dexter Buted expressed support for data-driven monitoring of abaca prices.

“This is a step toward a more equitable pricing environment, farmer empowerment, and integrated fiber and coconut industry growth,” he said.

The PCA’s copra price monitoring system, managed by its Trade and Market Development Department, provides daily

comparative data on domestic copra prices per kilogram at both millgate and farmgate levels.

The system also tracks price variations by day, week, month, and region, and includes information on the value of coconut products in local and international markets.

Besides the adoption of the price watch system, the PCA and PhilFIDA also discussed a proposed partnership for abaca-coconut intercropping.

It also covered the proposed comparative income study between abaca monocropping and abaca-coconut intercrop systems.

As a potential support for farmers who will be trying on mixed-crop systems, funding options were also discussed through the Department of Agriculture’s High Value Crops Development Program (DA-HVCDP). (PNA)

P1.66-B fund OK'd to strengthen rice seed program for farmers



MANILA – The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) has approved the release of PHP1.66 billion to support the government's Rice Seed Program, aimed at boosting rice production and helping Filipino farmers improve their livelihoods.

Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said the fund release fulfills President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s commitment to support the agricultural sector and strengthen food security.

The program, implemented by the Department of Agriculture (DA) through the Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice), aims to develop, propagate and distribute high-quality inbred rice seeds and reinforce seed growers' cooperatives.

According to Budget Secretary Amenah Pangandaman, the funds will cover the purchase, delivery and distribution of inbred-certified seeds for the 2026 dry season, as well as vehicles and farm

machinery to improve the efficiency of production support services.

The seeds will be distributed across 12 regions, including Central Luzon, the country's top rice-producing area.

"Ang layunin po ng ating Pangulo ay mapataas 'yung produksyon at kita ng ating mga magsasaka sa pamamagitan ng pagbibigay sa kanila ng nararapat na suporta (The President's goal is to increase the productivity and income of our farmers by giving them proper support)," Pangandaman said.

The program complements previous allocations under the FY 2025 General Appropriations Act, which set aside PHP4 billion for PhilRice to supply 2.5 million 20-kg bags of inbred-certified seeds for the 2025 wet season.

The DBM said the latest funding ensures farmers can access quality seeds on time, helping them maximize yields and align with early planting schedules. (PNA)

"Pag-IBIG Fund remains the largest home financier in the country. We continue to make homeownership easier through our 3-percent interest rate for socialized housing under the Expanded 4PH Program," Acosta said.

She noted that Pag-IBIG recently reduced its interest rate to 4.5 percent per annum for properties worth up to PHP1.8 million, available to the first 10,000 local workers and 1,000 overseas Filipino workers.

The Pag-IBIG Acquired Assets Super Sale,

which offers ready-to-occupy homes at discounted prices, runs until December. Meanwhile, members seeking to upgrade their homes may avail of the Home Improvement Loan Program, which provides up to PHP300,000 for repairs or renovations.

Acosta said the fund's strong financial position allows it to support every Filipino worker in their journey to homeownership.

GSIS leads ASEAN push for unified, trust-based social protection



MANILA – The Government Service Insurance System (GSIS) on Tuesday led a regional call to strengthen trust and unity among social security institutions across Southeast Asia, as its President and General Manager Jose Arnulfo “Wick” Veloso assumed chairship of the ASEAN Social Security Association (ASSA).

Delivering his keynote address at the 42nd ASSA Board Meeting held in Brunei, Veloso urged his counterparts to act as “master architects of trust” in shaping social protection systems that are transparent, accountable and built on integrity.

“In the world of social security, trust is our currency. It is the invisible foundation upon which every contribution, every claim, and every policy rests,” he said.

Veloso introduced “The Architecture of Trust” as the association’s guiding theme, describing integrity as its foundation, transparency and accountability as its pillars, and solidarity as the roof that shelters the region’s workers and pensioners.

He said the Brunei meeting builds on the gains of previous ASSA conference in Manila where members renewed their cooperation through the signing of the ASSA Sustainability Pledge.

“If we were to visualize the Architecture of Trust, its foundation would be integrity; doing what is right even when no one is watching,” Veloso explained.

He encouraged regional leaders to see themselves not merely as fund administrators but as “custodians of hope” who design systems that inspire confidence and provide citizens with lasting security.

“Let us continue to be architects of trust, building structures that last beyond our tenures, beyond our lifetimes, and for the generations who will one day thank us for believing in them first,” he said.

The two-day meeting gathers heads of pension and social insurance institutions from ASEAN member-states to discuss strategies that will harmonize policies and reinforce collaboration under a shared vision of trust and resilience. (PNA)

Palace bullish on PH economic recovery as peso stabi-lizes

MANILA – Malacañang on Tuesday expressed confidence in the country’s economic fundamentals despite the reported decline in the local stock market and the Philippine peso’s temporary depreciation.

In a press briefing, Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said the value of the peso has started to stabilize.

Castro said the administration remains optimistic about the country’s swift recovery, citing continued support from key economic drivers such as overseas Filipino workers (OFWs), business process outsourcing (BPO) companies, and local tourism.

“Confident pa rin po na ito ay malalagpasan ng ating goyberno (We are still confident that our government will overcome

this),” Castro said, when asked if the Palace is confident to restore investor confidence despite the recent developments.

“Unang-una po dahil nandyan din ang tulong ng mga BPO, nandyan din po ang tulong ng OFW, ang tourism, pati po ‘yung fast economic growth natin (First of all, there is also support from the BPOs, from the OFWs,

from tourism, and our fast economic growth),” she added.

Castro also noted that short-term fluctuations in currency and market performance are normal.

She said the economic team will continue to monitor the situation and implement measures to sustain growth and maintain investor confidence.
