

Cavite Animal Health Congress 2025 unites experts to strengthen animal disease

The Office of the Provincial Veterinarian (OPV), in coordination with the College of Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences of Cavite State University (CvSU), spearheaded the Cavite Animal Health Congress 2025 on October 15, held at the International Convention Center, CvSU Indang, Cavite. The event gathered veterinarians, researchers, and stakeholders to discuss updates and innovations in animal health management and disease prevention.

The program opened with an invocation and messages of support from Governor Francisco Gabriel D. Remulla, Dr. Constante J. Palabrica, Undersecretary for Livestock - Department of Agriculture, Dr. Ma. Agnes P. Nuestro, CvSU President, and Dr. Christian P. Dauqigan, OIC Director of the Bureau of Animal Industry. Dr. May M. Magno, MPA, Provincial Veterinarian, presented the rationale of the event, emphasizing the province's commitment

to ensuring animal health and food safety through video message.

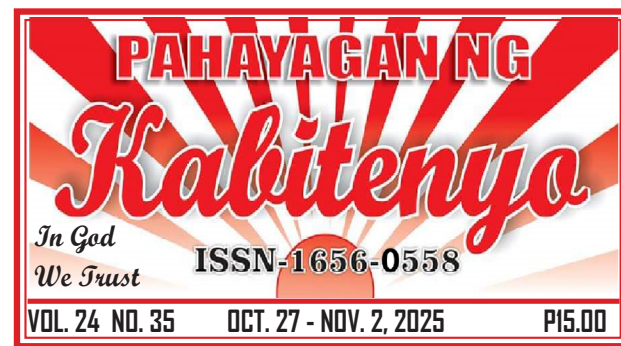

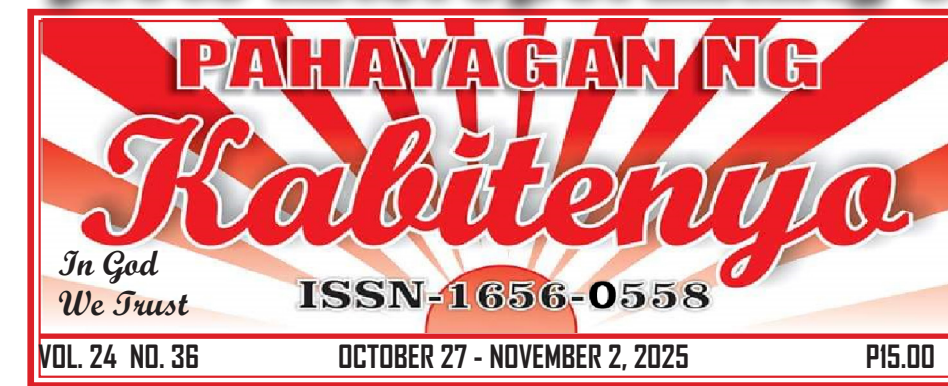

Cayetano: Stay focused, don't let distractions hide corruption masterminds

Senate Minority Leader Alan Peter Cayetano on Thursday urged Filipinos to stay focused on demanding accountability from the real masterminds of corruption instead of being distracted by political noise and side issues.



Cayetano said the government's anti-corruption drive has turned into a "circus" that damages the country's image abroad and diverts public attention from those who truly profit from corruption.

"Eyes on the ball tayo, liligawin tayo ng mga mastermind," Cayetano said in an interview with reporters on October 23, 2025.

"Hindi sustainable y'ung paraan kung paano natin na-address ang massive corruption. We have to be decisive, kailangan may major reforms, tunay na pagbabago. Kailangan may makulong," he added.

He warned that the way corruption cases are being handled has become selective and politicized, creating public confusion and mistrust.

"Napaglalaruan tayo and I am fed up with being played around with," he said.

Citing the issue of Senator Joel Villanueva's dismissed case as an example, Cayetano said this should not distract the Senate or the public from real corruption cases, noting it was likely just an inadvertence on the part of the Ombudsman's staff.

Ombudsman Jesus Crispin Remulla had sought to enforce a 2016 dismissal order against Villanueva over the alleged misuse of his 2008 Priority Development Assistance Fund (PDAF) when he was still a congressman. But former Ombudsman Samuel Martires

Kamakailan, iiniit ni Ombudsman Jesus Crispin Remulla na ipatupad ang 2016 dismissal order laban kay Villanueva kaugnay ng umano'y maling paggamit ng kanyang 2008 Priority Development Assistance Fund (PDAF) noong kongresista pa ito.

Ngunit nilinaw ni dating Ombudsman Samuel Martires na ibinasura na ang kaso noong 2019 matapos aprubahan ang mosyon para sa reconsideration ni Villanueva.

"Klarong-klaro po iyan. Wala siyang (Remulla) isusu-

reputasyon ng bansa sa mga mamumuhunan at overseas Filipinos.

"The way we're doing it na parang circus araw-araw, lubusang naapektuhan ang image ng ating bansa," wika niya.

Hinimok ni Cayetano ang publiko na manatiling mapagmatyag at ituon ang panawagan sa tunay na pananagutan at reporma, hindi sa mga pampulitikang palabas.

"Hindi ako tumanda sa public service at pulitika para paglaruan ng mga corrupt. Let's not be distracted. Ang tunay na laban ay laban sa mga mastermind, hindi sa mga palabas," wika niya. ###

Ang apat na pagkain na lumalaban sa cancer cells

1. Bawang at sibuyas – Sa pagsusuri, ang mga sibuyas ay malakas pumigil sa paglago ng cancer cells. Ang bawang ay may sankap na ally sulfides, na tumutulong sa pagsugpo ng kanser sa colon, suso, baga at prostate. Para maging epektibo, ang bawang ay kailangang durugin at prituhin ng kaunti. Kapag malakas ang ating immune system, mas hindi tayo magkakasakit. Sa Japan, ang mga pasyeteng nagke-chemotherapy ay pinapakain ng Shiitake mushrooms para bumilis ang kanilang paggaling.

3. Carrots – Ang madilaw na prutas at gulay ay may taglay na vitamin A at lycopene na tumutulong makaiwas sa kanser. Kasama ang mga carrots, kamote, kalabasa at kamatis. Sa anim na taong pagsusuri sa breast cancer, napag-alaman na ang mga pasyenteng kumakain ng ganitong pagkain ay mas humaba ang buhay kumpara sa hindi kumakain nito.

4. Broccoli at cauliflower – Ang broccoli at cauliflower ay may sangkap na sulforaphane, na mabisang panlaban sa kanser. Sa pagluluto ng gulay, i-steam o lutuin lang ng bahagya na may kasamang olive oil. Huwag pakuluan ang gulay dahil mawawala ang bisa nito laban sa kanser. Paraan ng pagluluto:

1. Gamitan ng konting mantika lang. Igisa ang bawang at sibuyas.
2. Ilagay na ang half cup ng Shiitake mushrooms.
3. Pagkaraan ng dalawang minuto, ilagay ang one cup ng hiniwang carrots. Lagyan ng dalawang kutsarang oyster sauce at one-fourth na basong tubig.
4. Pagkaraan ng dalawang minuto, ilagay na ang two cups ng broccoli. Lagyan ng tubig kapag natutuyo na ang gulay. Maghintay ng limang minuto hanggang maluto na ang gulay.
5. Huwag i-overcook ang mga gulay para maiwan ang sustansiya. Huwag ding damihan ang sarsa para manatili ang bitamina sa gulay.

DTI 4-A honors top cacao producers.....

The Department of Trade and Industry Region 4-A successfully concluded the CALABARZON Cacao Quality Award (CCQA) 2025, a regional initiative recognizing excellence in fermented cacao bean production, through a two-part event held in Quezon Province this October. The initiative was carried out in partnership with the University of the Philippines Los Baños, the Department of Agriculture-Regional Field Office 4-A, the CALABARZON Cacao Industry Federation, Inc., the CALABARZON Cacao Industry Council, and the Offices of the Provincial Agriculturist (OPAs) of Batangas, Cavite, Laguna, Quezon, and Rizal.

The activity began with the Regional Technical Evaluation and Judging on October 7-8, 2025, at Flor and Daisy's Agricultural Farm in Sariaya, Quezon, followed by the Awarding Ceremony on October 22, 2025, at the Quezon Convention Center in Lucena City as one of the highlights of the CALABARZON Cacao Congress 2025. The two-day judging activity brought together cacao producers from across the region, with a total of 17 entries submitted from Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, and Quezon for a rigorous assessment based on internationally recognized grading protocols. All entries underwent coding and blind judging to ensure impartiality, with evaluations focusing on moisture content, fermentation level, bean defects, mold presence, and other quality parameters. The process was conducted under the supervision of Prof. Romel M. Felismino, Lead Technical Consultant from the UPLB Institute of Food Science and Technology. The judging activity also provided participants with valuable technical feedback to help improve their postharvest practices and prepare them for the Philippine Cacao Quality Award (PCQA) 2026.

The culmination of the process took place during the Awarding Ceremony on October 22. The four regional winners were: Florencio Flores, Romeo Manalo, Luz C. Gusto and Paulino Sulibit. They were formally recognized for producing the best fermented cacao beans in CALABARZON. The event honored the outstanding efforts of farmers, cooperatives, and associations who have demonstrated excellence and sustainability in cacao production.

Distinguished guests who graced the awarding included DTI 4-A Assistant Regional Director Revelyn A. Cortez, DA 4-A Regional Executive Director Fidel M. Libao, Quezon Provincial Administrator Manuel Butardo, RCFI President

Mr. Florencio A. Flores, Provincial Agriculturist Ana Clarissa S. Mariano, 2nd District Chairperson & Committee on Agriculture Hon. Vinnette E. Alcalá-Naca, and HVCDP Undersecretary Cheryl Marie N. Caballero.

The program featured congratulatory messages, the presentation of plaques and certificates to winners and partners, and a photo session to celebrate the region's milestone in advancing cacao quality. "Local cacao products are more than just ingredients for delicious chocolates - they hold a promise of a brighter sustainable future for our farmers and the entire cacao industry", shared ARD Revelyn Cortez.

This gathering celebrates not only the progress of the cacao industry but also the promising development of Calabarzon in shaping its bright future", said DA-HVCDP Usec Cheryl Marie N. Caballero.

Through the CALABARZON Cacao Quality Award, the DTI 4-A and its partners reaffirmed their commitment to promoting quality standards, fostering government-academe-industry collaboration, and building the competitiveness of local cacao farmers. The initiative marks another step toward positioning CALABARZON as leading contributor to the country's growing cacao industry.

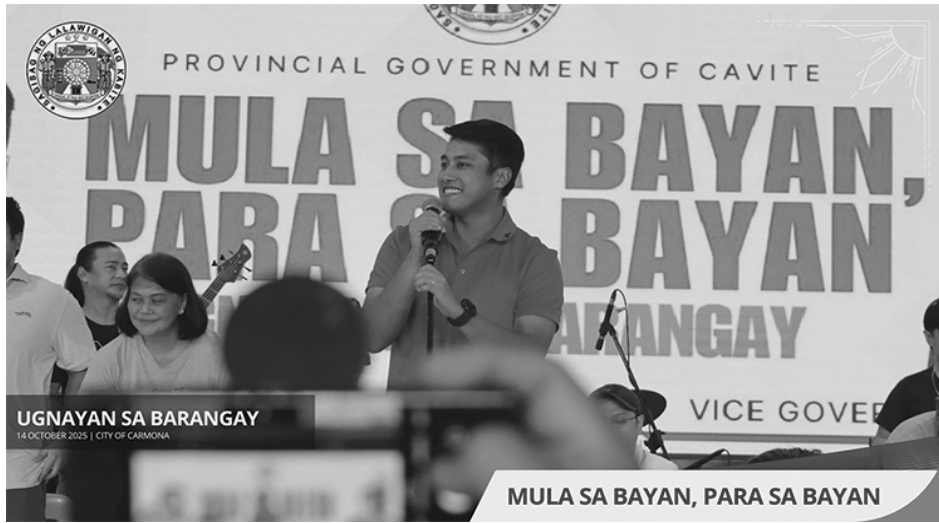

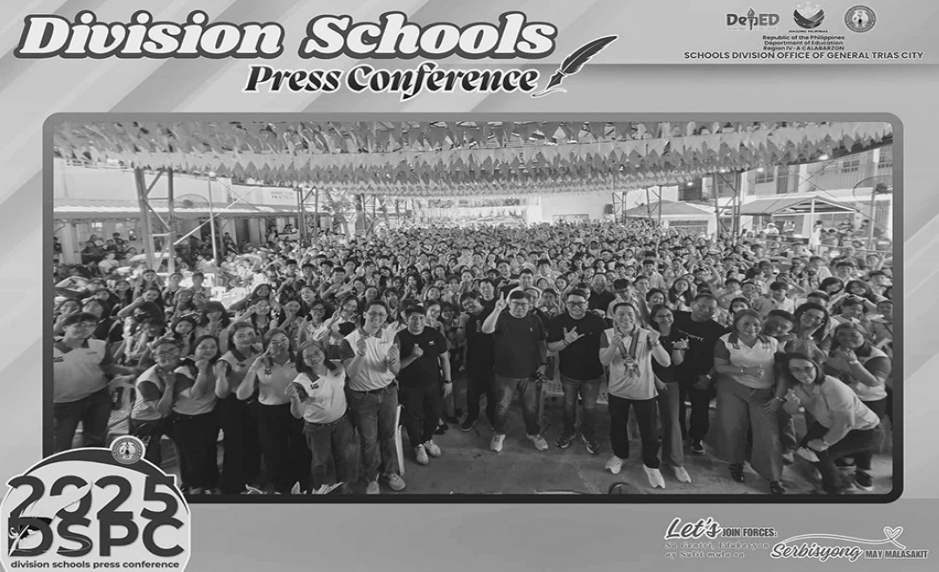

This latest feature will directly benefit motorists who will register for a new ETC account, as they will only need one radio frequency identification (RFID) and account to travel seamlessly across the Luzon expressway network,” both companies said in a joint statement.

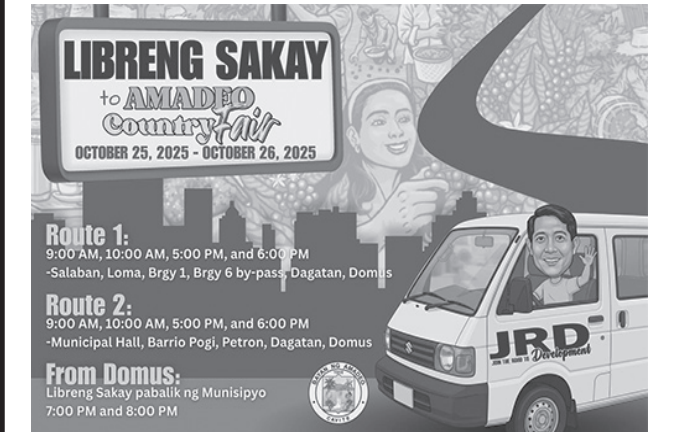
The senator warned that turning corruption issues into a daily political spectacle weakens institutions and hurts the country's reputation among investors and overseas Filipinos.
