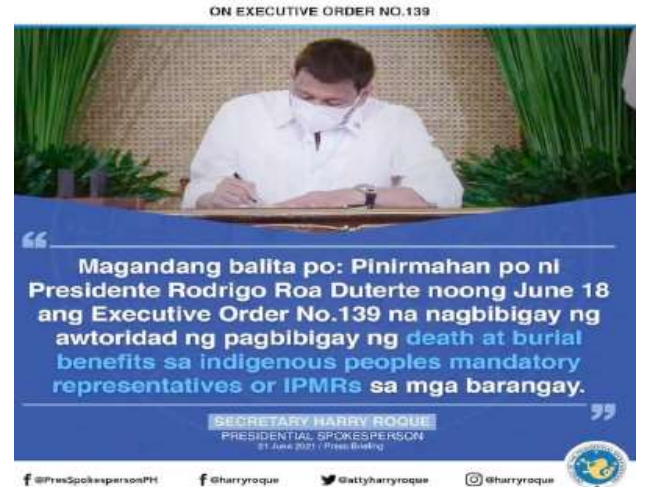

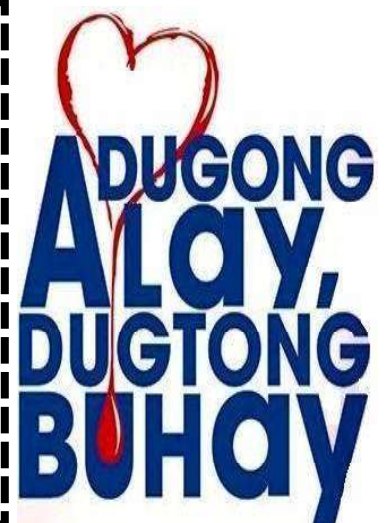

## PHILIPPINE SPACE AGENCY (PHILSA) TO SIGN AGREEMENT WITH THE UNOOSA FOR INTERNATIONAL SPACE COOPERATION

The Philippine Space Agency (PhilSA) will sign an agreement on space cooperation with the United Nations Office of Outer Space Affairs (UNOOSA) to strengthen the institutions' shared commitment to the peaceful uses of outer space.

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between PhilSA and the United Nations Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space (UNOOSA) will provide a framework for cooperation between the two parties to collaborate on various strategic areas, initiatives, and activities related to space science, technology, policy, law, education, and capacity-building. With the support of the Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA), the MOU aims to further strengthen the cooperation between PhilSA and UNOOSA in promoting the utilization of space for socioeconomic and sustainable development objectives.

Under the MOU, PhilSA and UNOOSA shall explore opportunities in the following areas: 1) joint capacity-building activities at the national level to enhance the use of space science and technology for socio-economic development, particularly in line with the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals; 2) using space-based information for disaster risk reduction and emergency response through the UN Platform for Space-based Information for Disaster Management and Emergency Response (UN SPIDER) program; 3) expanding mutual collaboration on activities related to international space law; and 4) securing collaboration for joint public awareness and education outreach initiatives on the importance of space science and technology for socio-economic development.

PhilSA Director General Joel Joseph S. Marciano, Jr. [formerly director of the Advanced Science and Technology Institute of the Department of Science and Technology] underscored the significance of the agreement to promote space science.

"The MOU is an important step for the country as we continue to build the local space ecosystem and cascade the benefits of space science, technology and applications to society. It signifies our desire to be an active participant and contributor within the community of nations committed to the peaceful uses of outer space," Marciano said.

The virtual signing ceremony will be held on Friday, 04 June 2021, at 1600 Philippine Standard Time (PhST) / 1000 AM Central European Time (CET). A joint press conference between PhilSA and UNOOSA will be held after the ceremony.

The MOU signing is considered as an official side event of the 60th Session of the Legal Subcommittee (LSC) of the United Nations Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space (UN COPUOS) that is currently being held in hybrid format from 31 May to 11 June 2021.

As the UN body dedicated to outer space, the UNOOSA serves as the Secretariat to the United Nations Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space (UN COPUOS). UNOOSA is instrumental in assisting the United Nations Member States to be able to strengthen their capacities in the use of space science technology and applications for socioeconomic development.

The Philippine Space Agency (PhilSA) was created by virtue of Republic Act 11363, "The Philippine Space Act", which was enacted into law on 08 August 2019. With its mandate as the primary policy, planning, coordinating, implementing, and administrative entity of the Executive Branch of the government that will plan, develop, and promote

the national space program, it is the central government agency addressing all national issues and activities related to space science and technology applications (SSTA). The Agency is directly attached to the Office of the President, which facilitates the promulgation of executive and administrative orders and formulation of regulatory and legislative proposals on matters pertaining to SSTA development. The PhilSA is headed by a Director General with the rank of a Cabinet Secretary, who also serves as the Presidential Adviser on Space Matters.

## Sinovac vaccine effective vs. severe Covid-19

MANILA – A health official said Friday the Sinovac vaccine remains effective against severe symptoms of Covid-19 and deaths from the infection, amid detection of more infectious variants of SARS-CoV-2.

During an online media forum, Health Undersecretary Maria Rosario Vergeire assured the public that Covid-19 vaccines are still one of the keys to ending the pandemic, dispelling people's concern over Sinovac's supposed inefficiency.

"So, let's get the vaccine. Let's not be doubtful. Let's give that confidence [on vaccines] kahit may lumalabas na mga ganitong

balita (even if there are reports like these)," Vergeire said.

Vergeire was referring to the cases in Indonesia where it was reported that more than 350 doctors have contracted Covid-19 despite being vaccinated with Sinovac and dozens have been hospitalized.

The officials said the outbreak may have been driven by the more transmissible Delta variant, first detected in India.

"Hindi po natin ikakaila na mayroon (We cannot deny that there's) breakthrough infections, that's what you call it when you're fully-vaccinated and you get infection," Vergeire said.

"Pero kailangan pa rin po natin malaman ang mga kumpletong datos para ma-analyze natin nang maigi (But we still need the complete data so we can analyze properly)," she added.

Vergeire noted that the report did not mention if the study has a control group.

Citing that there are 5,000 healthcare workers in the Indonesian hospital, Vergeire said 350 out of 5,000 workers would be only about 2 to 3 percent of the population.

"And that still leaves you with 97 percent effectiveness of this vaccine (Sinovac)," she said.

The Department of Health has emphasized that real-world studies show that all Covid-19 vaccines are effective in preventing severe infections and hospitalizations.

While some manufacturers have already reported on the effect of the new variants on the efficacy of their vaccines, there are companies, such as Sinovac Biotech, that are yet to release such information.

"But we know kasama na siya sa EUL [emergency use listing], maglalabas po 'yan (it is included in the EUL, it will release a report) in the coming days regarding its effectiveness against these variants," Vergeire said. (PNA)

## Expert told public not to hurry to get 3rd Covid vax dose

A vaccine expert on Friday advised the public "not to hurry" to get a third dose or the second platform of coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) vaccine amid a limited supply of jabs in the country.

In an online media health department forum, Vaccine Expert Panel member Dr. Rontgene Solante urged the public to wait for an official recommendation for booster Covid-19 shots.

Earlier, the United States was reported to be preparing for a possible need for a booster shot nine to 12 weeks after an individual gets fully vaccinated.

This, after initial studies have shown that Moderna and Pfizer jabs retain their effectiveness only for six months.

Solante stressed the goal of the government's vaccination drive is to fully inoculate as many Filipinos as possible to achieve population protection against new and more transmissible variants of coronavirus.

"That's the importance of vaccine equity, for us to move on with this pandemic. Let's first ensure everyone is vaccinated rather than thinking of getting the second platform of a vaccine because I can afford [it]," he said.

Concerning protection against the highly transmissible Delta variant, Solante said strict implementation of border control measures and quarantine protocols must be observed.

According to the report of the National Task Force Against Covid-19, as of June 23, a total of 8,928,249 vaccine doses were administered.

Of this number 2,246,897 have been fully vaccinated and 6,253,400 have received their first dose.

A total of 1,067,630 health care workers have completed two doses while 1,569,561 have received their first dose.

Some 553,527 senior citizens are fully vaccinated while 2,001,758 have been inoculated with the first dose.

For persons with comorbidities, 2,088,000 got a single dose while 524,699 already completed two doses. (PNA)

## DEPED: Private school may now start classes for school year 2021-2022

Private schools and non-Department of Education (DepEd) public schools may already start their classes for school year 2021-2022, the education department announced Friday.

DepEd made the announcement through an advisory dated June 23 and signed by Education Secretary Leonor Briones. A copy of the advisory was shared with the media

The advisory, however, stressed that only distance learning mode is allowed and that face-to-face classes are still prohibited.

"The Department of Education announces that pending the approval of the new general school opening and school calendar, private schools and non-DepEd public schools may already start their classes for SY 2021-2022, provided that there are

no face-to-face classes, and that the school will be strictly implementing only distance learning modalities," DepEd said.

DepEd earlier said it is eyeing to open classes for this school year on August 23, September 6, or September 13.

The final school calendar, however, still depends on President Rodrigo Duterte, DepEd said.

## STORAGE SITE PARA SA COVID-19 VACCINES, PINAGHAHANDAAN NA

## CALABARZON, makakatanggap ng 400,000 doses ng bakunang PFIZER

Ngayong Hunyo, nakatakdang matanggap ng rehiyon ng CALABARZON ang mahigit kumulang na 400,000 doses ng bakuna kontra COVID-19 na Pfizer-BioNtech. Ayon sa DOH-4A, CALABARZON ang nakatanggap ng pinakamalaking alokasyon ng naturang bakuna.

Dagdag pa ng DOH-4A, saklaw na nito ang bakunang ilalaan para sa una at ikalawang doses ng bakuna para sa mga mamamayan ng rehiyon. Sinimulang ipamahagi ang bakuna kontra COVID-19 noong Hunyo 10, at 15.

Sa darating na Hunyo 25 nakatakdang matanggap ng bayan ng Carmona sa Cavite ang unang batch ng kanilang bakuna. Makakatanggap ng 140,400 na dose ng bakuna ang Cavite, 105,300 naman ang naka-allocate para sa Laguna at 70,200 naman ay para sa Batangas.

Samantala ang mga lugar naman na malapit sa Metro Manila ay humiling ng karagdagang suplay ng

City. Matatandaang nitong Lunes lamang, nakapagtala ng 1,254 na bagong kaso ng COVID-19 ang rehiyon. Sa



bakuna dahil sa patuloy na pagtaas ng COVID-19 sa kanilang lugar noong nakaraang araw. Kabilang dito ang probinsya ng Rizal na makakatanggap ng karagdagang 84,240 na bakuna at 35,100 dito ay nakalaan para sa Antipolo

kabuuan, 15,101 na ang aktibong kaso sa CALABARZON.

Noong Hunyo 10, nakatanggap ang Pilipinas ng 2.28 na milyon na suplay ng Pfizer - pinakamalaking bilang ng suplay ng naturang brand ng bakuna.
