Gun Ban Exemption

During the election period, no person shall bear, carry or transport firearms or other deadly weapons in public places, including any building, street, park, private vehicle or public conveyance, even if licensed to possess or carry the same, unless authorized in writing by the Commission.

The Commission, through the Committee on the Ban on Firearms and Security Concerns (CBFSC), has the sole and exclusive authority issue Certificates of Authority authorizing the:

bearing, carrying or transporting of firearms or other deadly weapons; or employment, availability or engagement of the services of security personnel or bodyguards; or transport or delivery of firearms and/or its parts, ammunition and/or its components, and, explosives and/or its components.

Gun Ban Basic Information

PERIOD OF THE BAN

January 9, 2022 to June 8, 2022

PROHIBITED ACTS

Unless authorized by the CBFSC, the following are the prohibited acts during the election period:

To carry firearms and deadly weapons outside residence or place of business, and in all public places.

To engage the services of security personnel

To transport firearms and explosives, including its spare parts and components

PENALTIES

Imprisonment from one (1) to six (6) years

Permanent disqualification from public office and loss of right to vote

Deportation for foreigners, but only after prison term is served

NAHULI na ng National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) ang nasa likod ng “Mark Nagoyo” gang na nag-hacked sa BDO-Unibank accounts noong nakaraang Disyembre. Limang suspects ang nahuli na ang pinaka-mastermind ay nakilalang si Jherom Anthony Diawan Taupa. Si Taupa ang nagpakalat ng scam page ng banko na nakapanloko ng 700 kliyente. Sa pamamagitan ng pagklik sa link, nagawang mai-transfer via InstaPay ang P50,000 ng kliyente patungo sa UnionBank na ang account ay nagngangalang “Mark Nagoyo”.

Ang iba pang suspects ay nakilalang sina Ifesi-nachi Fountain Anaekwe alyas Daddy Champ at Chukwuemeka Peter Nwadi, kapwa Nigerians na nahuli sa Mabalacat, Pampanga. Nahuli rin sina Romelyn Panaligan at Clay Revillosa na umano’y mga nagdebelop ng scam page. Ayon sa NBI, ang grupo ay nagbebenta rin ng phishing websites at nag-ooperate ng scam pages upang ma-hack ang G-Cash wallets.

Sinabi pa ng NBI na may mga kasabwat pa ang “Mark Nagoyo” gang at babagsak din ang mga ito sa kanilang mga kamay sa lalong madaling panahon. Nabatid din ng NBI na isa pang banko umano ang tinatrabaho ng Nagoyo gang subalit hindi nila pinangalanan.

Aktibo ang mga cyber criminals lalo na ngayong nauso ang digital banking at naging popular pa mula nang manalasa ang pandemya. Mahigpit na pinaalala ng NBI at ng Banko Sentral ng Pilipinas sa bank depositors na huwag ibigay ang account details, user IDs, passwords at personal identification numbers sa sinuman. Mag-ingat at huwag sasagutin ang emails o texts messages na natatanggap. Idelete agad ang mga kahina-hinalang messages.

Narapat namang bagsikan pa ang batas laban sa mga cyber criminals. Higpitan din ang pagpasok ng mga dayuhan, lalo ang Nigerians na eksperto sa pag-hacked ng accounts. Parusahan nang mabigat ang mga sangkot sa phishing, smishing at iba pang uri ng electronic financial crimes. Dapat lipulin ang mga salot upang hindi na pamarisan.

Nasa 23,907 nang maliliit na magpapalay ang nakatanggap ng tiglimang libong piso (P5,000) tulong-pinansyal mula noong inimplimenta ang programang Rice Farmers Financial Assistance (RFFA) ng Department of Agriculture IV-CALABARZON (DA-4A) simula Oktubre ng nakaraang taon sa CALABARZON.

Towards inclusive socio-economic recovery after the 2020 Taal volcano eruption, members of the LGBTQIA+ (lesbian, gay, bisexuality, transgender, intersex, queer/questioning, asexual/aromantic (ace and aro), and all other sexual orientations, gender identities and physiological sex characteristics) community called "Sinag ng Kulay" in the Municipality of Talisay, Batangas were trained on fish processing as a prelude to the establishment of their

After the training, the Sinag ng Kulay is set to kick off their community enterprise on fish processing. Equipment and other necessary materials needed for the operations will be provided by DOST CALABARZON under the CEST Livelihood program. Also present during the activity were the Municipal Administrator of LGU-Talisay, Mr. Alano Lamano and Municipal Agriculturist, Ms. Zenaida Macatangay.

LGU-Talisay is one of the identified sites for the implementation of CEST project entitled "Community Empowerment thru Science and Technology (CEST) for Disaster-Stricken Areas in Batangas Province". Interventions already provided to the LGU were bottom-set gillnets to 60 fisherfolk, training on layered maps generation using Geographical Information System mapping, enhanced nutribun feeding program in partnership with CDO Foodsphere Inc. and Odyssey Foundation, Inc., and water testing.

Animal Shelter facility to care for stray animals

Trece Martires, Cavite (PIA) – The Alfonso Municipal Government is set to establish an animal shelter facility to address the perennial problem on stray animals particularly dogs and cats spreading rabies in the locality.

Mayor Randy Salamat



signified the importance of caring for the animals thru the facility instead of an impounding area to lock up stray dogs.

“Dogs have lives and whether they are street dogs or not, we need to take care of them so instead of building an impounding area as facility (for them), we are preparing for an animal shelter facility during the first

quarter of 2022,” said Mayor Salamat.

More than a dozen steel cages were recently completed on May 17, 2021 which according to mayor Salamat will now be distributed to every barangay in the municipality for the temporary holding of stray dogs.

“Sa totoo lang ay ‘sinosolusyunan’ na naman po. May mga hakbang na tayong nagawa. May ordinansa, Animal Control Officers’ training, may kulungan na para sa bawat barangay at may budget na para ngayong taon,” said Mayor Salamat.

(Actually, it’s “being solved”. We have taken steps. There is an ordinance,

Animal Control Officers’ training, there is an animal cage for each barangay and there is a budget for this year.)

The local government for years had been taking steps in preparation for the program with the training of personnel of the Municipal Agriculture Office on Rabies Awareness, Animal Impounding and Management of Dog Pound for the Animal Control Officers of LGU on August 2019.

Subsequently, on March 27, 2021 the Municipal Ordinance no. 02-2021 or the Anti-Rabies Ordinance was passed and approved by the LGU which provided for the pertinent guidelines to protect human and animal inhabitants of the municipality from rabies infection pursuant to the Anti-Rabies Act of 2007.

Additional steps for the full implementation of this program are the skills enhancement of Animal Control Officers for the proper and safe handling of animals and the procurement of an Animal Control Vehicle. (Ruel Francisco with reports from Alfonso LGU)

OMICRON WAVE, MAY POSIBILIDAD NA MATAPOS SA MARSO O ABRIL - OCTA

Sinabi ng independent monitoring group na OCTA Research noong Lunes na umaasa sila na ang Omicron COVID-19 variant surge ay magtatapos sa Marso o Abril ngayong taon.

Batay sa naganap na Laging Handa briefing, sinabi ni Dr. Guido David mula sa OCTA Research group na maaaring tumagal ang Omicron wave dahil nagsisimula pa lamang ito sa ibang mga rehiyon kumpara sa National Capital Region (NCR) kung saan bumaba na ang rate ng paglaki at pagpaparami.

“Medyo matatagalan ‘yung Omicron wave kasi kahit na medyo bumababa na sa NCR, Cavite, Rizal, pataas pa lang sa ibang lugar at may mga lugar na hindi pa nagkakaroon ng pagtaas eh,” aniya.

“We are hoping na by around March to April ay tapos na ‘yung Omicron wave sa buong bansa natin, which means baka makikita natin na less than 1,000 cases per day, pero hindi pa guaranteed ‘yon,” pahayag pa ni David.

Samantala, ayon kay Health Secretary Francisco

Duque III, maaari nang ibaba o i-downgrade ang Alert Level sa NCR sakaling matugunan nito ang pamantayang itinakda ng gobyerno.

Ayon naman kay David, maaari itong mangyari kung magpapatuloy ang pagbaba ng mga kaso sa kalagitnaan ng buwan ng Pebrero.

“Sa nakikita ko ngayon, kung nasa 2,000 cases per day pa tayo by first week of February, baka

masyadong pang premature naibaba agad to Alert Level 2. Siguro baka mid-February earliest ma-consider seriously na ibaba to Alert Level 2,” saad ni David.

“Mas mabuting siguraduhin na nating bumaba at bumagsak ‘yung bilang ng kaso katulad nung nakita natin nung October, November to December siguro bago tayo magluwag,” dagdag pa niya.

COMELEC’S GUANZON VOTES TO DO BONG BONG MARCOS; HITS BACK PROBE ‘THREATS’ FROM PARTIDO FEDERAL: ‘LALABANAN KO ANG MALI’

Commission on Elections (COMELEC) Commissioner Rowena Guanzon on Thursday revealed she voted to disqualify presidential aspirant Ferdinand 'Bongbong' Marcos Jr. in the 2022 national elections.

She voted in favor of a consolidated case involving 3 petitions to disqualify the said presidential aspirant in an exclusive interview with GMA News.

"Kaya nga ito nangyayari lahat eh dahil ang boto ko is DQ (disqualified) si Marcos Jr. Sa tingin ko may moral turpitude talaga based on evidence and the law. I will not keep it a secret. That is the reason why this is happening," she said. Guanzon is part of the three-member Comelec First Division before which the consolidated petitions for Marcos' disqualification from the presidential race over a 1995 tax evasion conviction are pending.

The Comelec commissioner also said that she had received information on the possible political interference in the delay of the decision of the consolidated disqualification cases.

"Parang unreasonable

na yung delay. Ang kutob ko talaga may nakikialam na eh. May nakikialam na. Some people are trying to influence the commissioners. Iyon ang ayaw ko," Guanzon noted.

Even the commissioner is set to retire on February 2, she assured that her vote would still be counted if ever the resolution would be out after the retirement.

But the Partido Federal ng Pilipinas (PFP) said Guanzon's "haste" and claims of "double hearsay" made her "unworthy of a sitting Commissioner of the Comelec."

Guanzon said "It is Atty. George S. Briones who should be disbarred for attacking me, the Presiding Commissioner while the case of their candidate is still pending."

"Kahit magdildil ako ng asin lalabanan ko ang masasama at mali. Honor and excellence. Fight," she said.

The commissioner also hits back at the PFP for supposedly being vindictive, "Ang mga Marcos hindi vindictive. Bakit ang Partido ni BBM vindictive? Utos ba ni BBM yan?"

Sought for comment, Vic Rodriguez, Marcos' spokesperson refused to make a statement.

The said petitions were separately filed by martial law survivors, led by Bonifacio Ilagan; Akbayan party-list; and Abubakar Mangelen. To grant or junk the petitions, a majority vote is needed.

ROXAS BLVD, CLOSED FOR LRT 1 CAVITE EXTENSION PROJECT

On Sunday, a portion of the northbound lane of Roxas Boulevard was closed for the P64.9-billion LRT1 Cavite Extension construction.

Due to the road closure, a lot of motorists and commuters have been inconvenienced by the extension project.

"Nagkanda ligaw-ligaw na kami sa mga saradong kalsada. Nakatlong ikot na 'ko. Pagdating ko dito, sarado din. 'Yung Waze ko, pinapa U-turn ako, I don't know sarado din pala," an irate motorist said.

A commuter also stated that the road closure inconvenienced the public as they could not get a ride home.

"Biglaan lang 'yung ginawa nila. Minsan perwisyo. Kaninang umaga, walang masakyan papuntang



Las Piñas kasi sinara nila doon,"

Authorities announced that the road would again be closed on Monday from 10 pm to 6:30 am.

In the meantime, alternative routes are open for vehicles and pedestrians walking to Manila and Pasay.

Light Rail Manila Corporation Spokesperson Jacqueline Gorospe apologized for the inconvenience, stressing that they needed one lane to secure enough space in the area for their personnel.

PH, US ARMIES PREPARE FOR WAR GAMES IN MARCH

The Philippine Army and the United States Army Pacific (USARPAC) will hold a month-long military drill in various areas in Central Luzon in March to enhance their interoperability and as part of their commitment to help each other in times of need.

Lt. Gen. Romeo Brawner Jr., PA Commanding General, said a thorough planning of the “Salaknib” exercise is now being conducted by Filipino soldiers and their American counterparts.

“Salaknib, which means shield in Ilocano, is a testament to our enduring ties with the US Army. It is anchored on the Philippine-US Mutual Defense Treaty and has been ongoing since 2015,” he said in a statement Saturday, Jan. 22.

Salaknib is an annual exercise sponsored by the USARPAC and hosted by the Philippine Army. It aims to enhance Philippine and US defense readiness by “developing tactical interoperability and at the same time, showcase the US government’s resolve to fulfill its alliance obligations in the region.”

This year’s iteration of the Salaknib drills will take place from March 5 to 24. A three-day inspection of Salaknib Exercise training areas in different Central Luzon sites was concluded last Friday.

Brawner said Philippine Army and USARPAC teams inspected the pro-

Light Reaction Regiment, Special Forces Regiment, and First Scout Ranger Regiment, training side-by-side with their USARPAC counterparts.

Brawner commended the Salaknib planning team for carrying out a thorough planning process aimed at ensuring the success of the



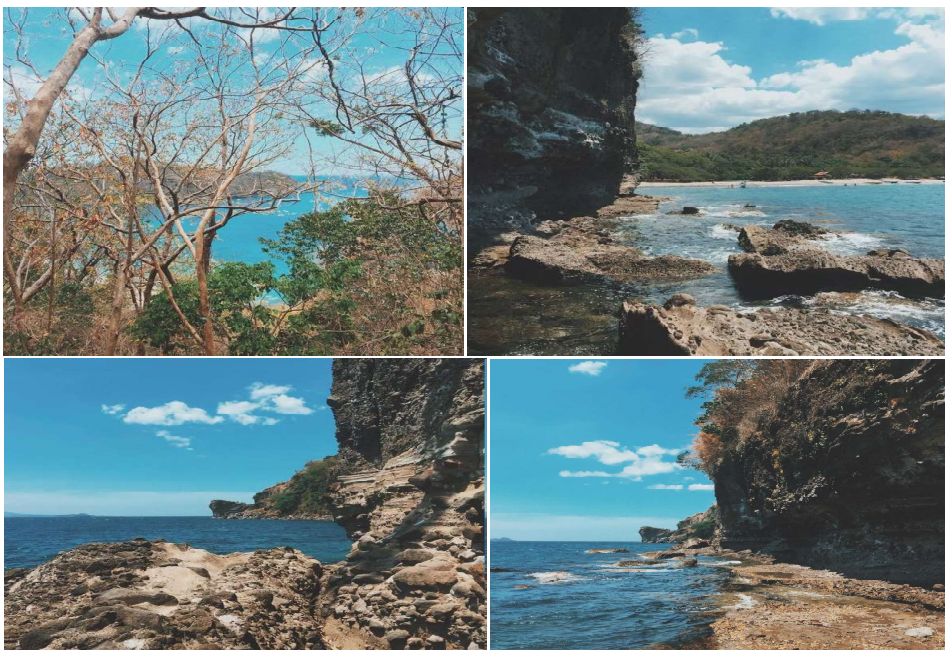
posed training sites to ensure their availability, suitability, and training-worthiness.

BSP warns of fake bills from ATMs

The central bank reminded the public to regularly inspect banknotes for authenticity through the “feel, look, tilt” approach as a precautionary measure against counterfeiting.

MANILA, Philippines — The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) yesterday urged Filipinos to carefully inspect bills dispensed by automated teller machines (ATMs).

The central bank reminded the public to regularly inspect banknotes for authenticity through the “feel, look, tilt” approach as a precautionary measure against counterfeiting.

“Should a banknote dispensed by an ATM be suspected as a counterfeit, the

holder is advised to immediately report it to the bank that owns the machine,” the BSP said.

According to the regulator, the bank that owns the ATM would conduct a thorough investigation to verify



whether the banknote was indeed dispensed by the bank’s ATM.

If the holder’s claim is verified, the BSP said the bank should replace the banknote in question.

According to the BSP, all banks employ adequate risk management measures to prevent such incidents.

“Aside from the installation of cameras at ATM areas, cash handlers and service providers tasked to refill ATMs are trained to detect counterfeit banknotes or verify their genuineness before placing them in ATMs,” it added.

Under Republic Act 10951, counterfeiters of Philippine currency are subject to the penalty of at least 12 years in prison and a fine not exceeding P2 million.

From January to September last year, the BSP seized more than 500 fake banknotes with a notional value of P480,000. Its seven enforcement operations also resulted in the arrest of 16 suspects, 14 of whom were members of crime syndicates.

Vaccine czar: Gov’t to roll out vaccination for minors aged 5 to 11 years next month

The government will begin administering COVID-19 jabs to children aged five to 11 years next month as the country intensifies its fight against the coronavirus particularly after the emergence of the more contagious Omicron variant, the country’s vaccine czar said Monday.

In his report to President Rodrigo Roa Duterte during a meeting on government’s COVID-19 interventions, Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr. said pediatric vaccination could start on February 4 as the government expects the delivery of vaccines for minors next week.

A memorandum guidance will be issued this week and town hall meetings, as well as series of trainings will also be conducted by the Department of Health (DOH) in preparation for immunizing minors five to 11 years old, according to Galvez.

“Mr. President, prepared na po tayo sa vaccination ng five to 11 years old. Last January ay nagkaroon po tayo ng live orientation ng pagbabakuna ang US Embassy ng mga bata sa ganitong edad,” he said, add-

ing similar orientations will be held in other regions.

Galvez assured that the pediatric vaccination is “very safe,” noting that a lower dosage will be given to children.

“Makaka-assure po tayo sa ating mga magulang na very safe ang ating gagamitin na bakuna dahil ito ay mas mababa ang formulation na angkop para sa mga bata. Kaya kung makikita po natin sa vials may color coding, ‘yung orange at saka po ‘yung purple. Iyong orange po para po sa five to 11 years old,” he said.

The first leg of pediatric vaccination, which was for children aged 12 to 17, has also made the country more prepared and more experienced in handling vaccine rollout for minors, Galvez noted.

Capacity building of vaccination teams, vaccination site preparation, and

vaccine site inspections also form part of the country’s preparation for the pediatric vaccine rollout, he said.

To expedite the vaccination of minors, the vaccine czar said two vaccination sites will be opened immediately in Metro Manila and gradually expand throughout the country by opening both hospital and non-hospital vaccination sites in different regions.

The Philippines aims to inoculate around 39 million minors aged zero to 17 years, he said.

Galvez, who is also the National Task Force Against COVID-19 chief implementer, said pediatric vaccination is part of the Duterte administration’s strategy to acquire a “wall of protection” against the deadly coronavirus disease that will ensure population immunity against any COVID-19 strain or muta-

tion. Other strategies include the booster shot program and vaccine rollout in pharmacies, he said.

The administration of boosters, which has a three-month interval between doses, will prevent the vaccine’s efficacy from waning, while vaccine rollout in pharmacies and clinics will expand the vaccination even in far-flung locations where pharmacists will be authorized to administer the jabs for walk-in vaccination, he explained.

Sen. Christopher Lawrence “Bong” Go, who was present during the meeting, wants the government to incentivize pharmacies and clinics participating in the vaccination drive to entice more establishments to join. Senator Go is the chairman of the Senate Committee on Health.

As of January 24, at least 59.7 million Filipinos or 76.2 percent of the target population have received the first dose of COVID-19 jab, while 57.2 million individuals or 73.33 percent of the target population are fully vaccinated.

On the other hand, 8.72 percent of the target population have received booster shots. PND

DA to implement fuel discount program for farmers, fishers

The Department of Agriculture (DA) is set to implement the "Fuel Discount for Farmers and Fisherfolk Program," as provided under the Special Provision No. 20 of the General Appropriations Act (GAA) for Fiscal Year 2022 or Republic Act (RA) 11639.

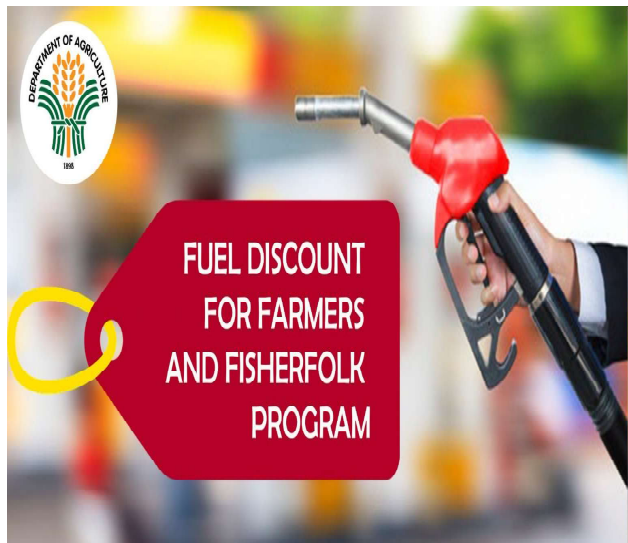
"We sincerely thank President Rodrigo Roa Duterte and the honorable members of the Senate and House of Representatives for approving and appropriating P500 million for the fuel subsidy program that will benefit millions of Filipino farmers, fishers, and con-

and other operational expenses.

"The DA shall furnish the Oversight Committee on Agriculture a copy of the implementing guidelines and submit quarterly reports on the implementation of the program."

For his part, DA Undersecretary for Operations Ariel Cayanan said that the targeted beneficiaries for the provision of fuel discount must be registered under the DA's Registry System for Basic Sectors in Agriculture (RSBSA) and BFAR's fisherfolk registry system.

Last week, he chaired a meeting of officials from the DA Regional Operations Group, national rice and corn program directorates, and Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources to flesh out the implementing guidelines of the fuel discount program that include the prioritization criteria, amount of discount voucher to be provided to qualified beneficiaries, and creation of a technical working group (TWG) that will oversee the crafting and finalization of the guidelines and program implementation. The TWG will issue regular updates on the matter. ### (DA StratComms)

The 2022 GAA Special Provision No. 20 on Fuel Discount to Farmers and Fisherfolk, states that:

"The amount of Five Hundred Million Pesos (P500,000,000) appropriated herein shall be used to provide fuel discount to farmers and fisherfolk when the average Dubai crude oil price based on Mean of Platts Singapore (MOPS) for three months reaches or exceeds Eighty Dollars (USD 80) per barrel: Provided, that the farmer or fisherfolk beneficiary owns and operates an agricultural and fishery machinery individually or through a farmer organization, cooperative or association: Provided, further, that in the case of fisherfolk, their fishing vessels are registered in the Integrated Boat Registry System or DA-BFAR's BOATR: Provided, finally,

that for the farm machinery owned and/or operated by individual farmers or farmers' organization, proof of ownership shall be provided.

"The DA Regional Field Units and BFAR Regional Offices shall issue fuel vouchers to qualified beneficiaries to claim the fuel discount, and likewise authorized to deduct one and half percent (1.5%) of said amount for administrative

PH GDP up 7.7% in Q4 2021

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) announced Thursday (Jan. 27) a 7.7% growth in the country's gross domestic product (GDP) in the fourth quarter of 2021, bringing the full year economic growth to 5.6%.

The PSA said among the main contributors of the fourth quarter growth are manufacturing, wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles, and construction.

"The same industries also contributed the most to the annual growth," PSA said, noting that manufacturing had an 8.6% contribution, wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles with 4.3%; and construction with 9.8%.

"Among the major economic sectors, agriculture, forestry and fishing, industry and services all posted positive growths in the fourth quarter," it added.

Moreover, Household Final Consumption Expenditure (HFCE) grew by 7.5% in the last quarter.

In a statement, Malacañang said it views the recent development in the GDP figures "as evidence of the strength and resilience of the Philippine economy, which continues to beat expectations despite the challenges brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic and natural calamities like Typhoon Odette."

The Palace commended the country's economic team for its economic management "through these

turbulent times" and expressed appreciation to the public's contribution "and faith in the leadership of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte during this challenging period."

"We will continue to pursue policies and reforms as we rebuild a stronger economy, one wherein every Filipino enjoys a safe, healthy and comfortable life," Cabinet Secretary Karlo Nograles said in his statement.

Meanwhile, the official reiterated the call for the passage of the Public Service Act, the need to support the proposed Livestock Development and Competitiveness Bill, and the implementation of the Philippine Innovation Act. -ag
