

600 COVID-19 HOME CARE KITS, IPINAMAHAGI NG DOH SA CAVITE

Ang Department of Health (DOH) ay nagbigay ng nasa 600 COVID-19 home care kits, na tinatawag na "Kalinga Kits" sa lokal na pamahalaan ng Cavite noong Biyernes.

Ang bawat kit ay naglalaman ng:

Paracetamol tablets, Vitamin C tablets, Hand sanitizers, Soap, Tissue, Face masks, Disinfectant spray, COVID-19 info sheet

"Ang mangunguna ay local chief executives para sa pagbibigay ng home care kits. Ang DOH we just complement," ani Health Secretary Francisco Duque III.

Sinabi rin ng Kalihim ng Kalusugan na ang Kalinga Kits ay hindi maaaring maglaman ng mga inireresetang gamot, ngunit sa halip ay naglalaman "symptomatic relief medication" at ilang mga "transmission control supplies".

"Kalinga Kits ay supportive and symptomatic treatment, maliban of course may kasamang mask, alcohol/gel, anti cough, lagundi, tablets, paracetamol, bitamina. Di pwedeng lagyan ng antivirals dahil ito ay kailangan ng prescription ng doktor," aniya.

Samantala, sinabi ni Bacoor City Mayor Lani Mercado-Revilla na ibibigay nila ang 600 kits sa Southern Tagalog Regional Hospital (STRH) para ipamahagi sa mga isolated patient, at mga residente na nasa home isolation at quarantine.



"Ang Kalinga Kits, iendorso natin sa STRH para sa mga pasyente nila at probably they can give some to constituents in the local isolation facility na may mild cases," pahayag ni Revilla. "Isasabay po namin sa

relief distribution ng naka-home isolation dahil marami sa kanila na kailangan gamot at di makalabas, yun ang ipaprioritize natin na naka home isolation," dagdag niya.



Cayetano calls for increased testing, tracing for Omicron

Former Speaker Alan Peter Cayetano on Tuesday called on the national government to ramp up its COVID-19 testing and contact tracing efforts and change its mindset towards the pandemic.

In a media interview on January 11, 2021, Cayetano said the national government needs to revisit its COVID-19 response and act as if the country is confronting an emergency everyday while the pandemic has not yet subsided.

"We have to act, kahit na matagal na, na it's an emergency. For example, yung testing at contact tracing, alam na nating gumagrabang ang sitwasyon, bakit 'di natin palawakin ito nang napakabilis?" he said.

"We have to change our mindset, na we're living with this pandemic. Hindi yung iniisip ng gobyerno parati, kailan ba matatapos ang pandemic?" he added.

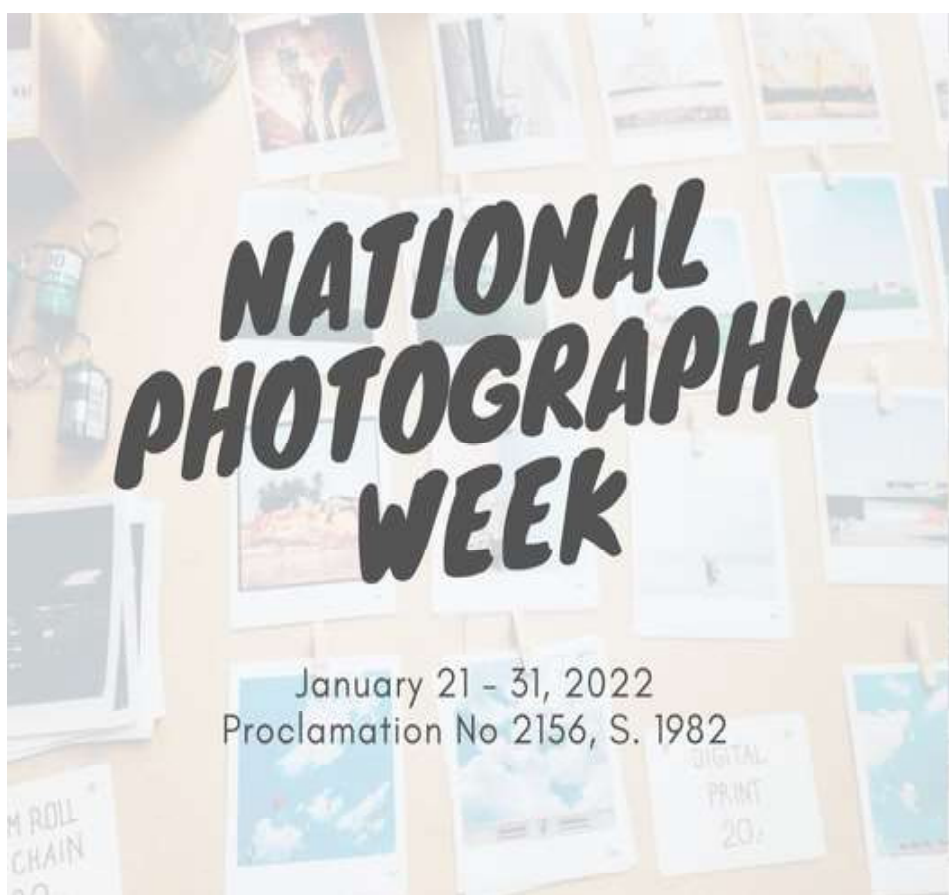

Panahon ng pamemeke

Nagsulputan ang mga namemeke ngayon ng iba't ibang produkto na may kinalaman sa pandemya. Sinasamantala ang pagkakataon para makakamal ng pera. Ginagawa ang lahat para maka-panloko ng kapwa.

Nang mag-panic buying ang mga tao sa mga gamot para sa ubo, sipon at lagnat, biglang naubos ang mga ito sa botika. Iglap naglabasan ang mga counterfeit medicines. Kahun-kahon na gamot para sa lagnat, sipon, ubo at diarrhea – pawang sintomas ng COVID-19 ang naglabasan. Kaparehung-kapareho ng mga gamot na mabibili sa botika kaya mahihi-kayat ang mga tao. At bukod doon, mas mura ang mga ito kaysa sa mga gamot na nasa lehitimong botika.

Noong nakaraang Lunes, nakakumpiska ang mga pulis ng mga pekeng gamot para sa lagnat at ubo sa Bgy. Holy Spirit, Quezon City na nagka-kahalaga ng P109,000. Dalawang lalaki ang nahuli sa isinagawang entrapment operation dakong alas nuwebe ng gabi. Nakatanggap ng sumbong ang mga pulis na dalawang lalaki ang nagbebenta ng mga pekeng gamot na kinabibilangan ng para-cetamol, mefenamic acid, solmux, amoxicillin tri-hy-drate, amlodipine besilate, losartan at loperamide. Ang mga gamot ay nakalagay sa 30 kahon. Kinumpiska rin ng mga pulis ang dalawang van ng mga suspect na pinagsakyan ng mga pekeng gamot. Sinampahan ng paglabag sa RA 8203 (Special Law on Counterfeit Drugs).

Nang araw ding iyon, nahuli rin ng mga pulis sa Bgy. Krus na Ligas, Quezon City ang dalawang lalaki na nagtitinda ng antigen rapid test kits na nagkakahalaga ng P2 milyon. Ang mga test kits ay nakalagay sa 300 boxes. Ang mga suspect ay kabilang sa mga sindikato na naka-base sa Sta. Cruz, Manila na noon ay nasangkot na sa illegal sale ng COVID-19 Clungene test kits. Sinampahan na ng kaso ang mga suspect.

Panahon ng pamemeke at tiyak na ang penepeke na ngayon ay ang vaccination cards. Mahigpit nang ipinatutupad ang “no vaccine, no ride” policy kaya sasamantalain ito ng mga namemeke. Madaling pekein ang vaccination cards kaya nararapat na maging alerto ang PNP.

Huwag hayaang mamayagpag ang mga name-meke sa panahong ito. Kakalat ang virus dahil sa masamang gawaing ito.

COMMON MEDS FOR FLU

- Paracetamol**
FOR: Pain relief and fever reducer
NOTE: Maximum within 24 hours is 8 tablets
- Carbocisteine**
FOR: cough with mucus
WHAT IT DOES: Loosens mucus in lungs to relieve tight feeling
- Phenylephrine hydrochloride (decongestant)**
WHAT IT DOES: Relieves symptoms of blocked nose. Can also be used to relieve runny nose, watery eyes, and sneezing.
NOTE: Only relieves symptoms. Not for treatment and fast recovery. Do not consume alcohol while on this medication.
- Chlorphenamine maleate**
FOR: Relief of runny nose, sneezing, itchy and watery eyes.
DRINK: Usually taken at night at least 30mins-1hour before bed because of its sedative effect.
NOTE: Do not consume alcohol while on this medication.

REMEMBER: Bioflu and Alaxan already have paracetamol components. Not advisable to take Biogesic/paracetamol + Bioflu + Alaxan.

DRUG DEN SA BACCOOR, NADISKUBRE SA ISANG DRUG OPS

Isang hinihinalang drug den ang natagpuan kamakailan ng mga awtoridad sa isinagawang drug operation sa lungsod ng Bacoor, kung saan nasakote ang pitong indibidwal kasama ng tatlong misis na naakuhang bumabatak ng droga.

Ayon sa ulat ng Pilipino Star Ngayon, ang mga suspek ay kinilala bilang sina Manuel Villanueva Aquino Jr. alias "Boy Tawa", 52-anyos na target sa buy-bust operation; Jayson Caeg Alperto, 52,

taxi driver, na suki na sa drug den; Jonjip Aquino Arquinez, 42; Guil-lermo Licauan Lorca, 50, tubero; Loida Intena Batal, 36; Mylene Ruda Navarro, 40, salon stylist, at Rachelle Santiago Diocaresa, 37; pawang mga residente ng Brgy. Molino 4.

Sinalakay ng pinagsamang puwersa- ng Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) IV-A, Bacoor Police at Cavite Provincial Drug Enforcement Unit ang bahay ng kanilang target sus-

pect na si Aquino matapos mapag-alamang araw-araw ay maraming itong kliyente na bumabatak pa ng libre sa kaniyang tahanan.

Nakuha mula sa kanila ang 8-transparent plastic-sachet na naglalaman ng 15 gramo ng shabu at nagkakahalaga ng P100,000, tatlong nakabukas na plastic sachet na may mga bakas pa ng shabu, drug pa-raphernalia, isang cellphone at buy-bust money.

FDA, NAGBABALA SA MGA BUMIBILI NG HOME ANTIGEN KITS

Nagbigay babala ang Food and Drug Administration (FDA) at ang ilang mga eksperto sa publiko dahil sa nauusong pagbili ng mga self-administered antigen test kit online.

Ang nasabing paalala ay inilabas sa gitna ng mga accreditation process na ginagawa ng FDA upang maaprubahan ang ilang mga brand ng mga test kit.

Ayon pa kay FDA Director General Oscar Gutierrez, malaki ang tyansa na mali rin ang makuhang resulta sa maling paggamit ng mga ito.

"Kapag false negative, false sense of security ang mangyayari. Akala mo ikaw ay hindi ka puwede



makahawa. Kapag false positive naman, unnecessary panic naman po from the part of the patient," ani Gutierrez.

Sa kasalukuyan ay nasa proseso pa ng pag-apruba sa dalawang manufacturer ang FDA.

Payo naman ng biotechnology consultant na si Paolo Cagalingan, kailangang tingnan maigi kung maayos pa ang dessicant o ang maliit na pakete sa loob na may lamang silica gel.

"Pag yellow pa, nakalagay naman. Kung okay, yellow. Kapag green, hindi na. Maraming tao na hindi nakakaalam diyan kasi hindi natin alam kung maaaring nabasa na 'yung kit o na-expose na sa init kasi dapat nasa 20-30 degrees lang most of the kits," pahayag ni Cagalingan.

GOV'T EYES NATIONWIDE LAUNCH OF 'RESBAKUNA SA BOTIKA'

The national government aims to expand the "Resbakuna sa Botika" COVID-19 vaccination program nationwide by mid-February, National Task Force (NTF) against COVID-19 special adviser Teodoro "Ted" Herbosa said on Saturday, Jan. 22.

"Resbakuna sa Botika" or COVID-19 vaccinations in selected Metro Manila drugstores, is an initiative of the government in hopes of ramping up the country's inoculation drive, making the vaccines accessible for Filipinos.

"One week itong trial. Sa first week, ang hope namin ay i-expand sa buong National Capital Region (NCR) so lahat ng branches nila [partner drugstores] sa NCR, at by the middle of February ay hopefully, ma-launch na nationwide," said Herbosa in an interview over DZBB.

The National Vaccination Operations Center (NVOC) initially partnered with seven drug stores and clinic networks located in



Metro Manila namely Generika, Healthway, Mercury Drug, QualiMed Health network, Southstar Drug, TGP (The Generics Pharmacy), and Watsons.

Only booster doses for individuals 18 years old and above, except for senior citizens and individuals with comorbidities, were administered in the pharmacies. Pre-registration is required to avoid mass gatherings, said Herbosa.

Meanwhile, Herbosa added that in the near future, an 'administration fee' may be placed when availing COVID-19 vaccinations at drugstores.

"Sa ngayon ay okay sa kanila [partner drugstores] na libre itong proseso na ito, in fact may discount card pa nga kapag nagpabakuna ka sa kanila. Pero may usapan din na kapag dumami na yan [mga magpabakuna] ay syempre... naging usapan din na baka in the future ay maari bang magpatong ng administration fee," Herbosa said.

11 MANUFACTURER NG SELF-ADMINISTERED ANTIGEN TEST KITS, NAGSUMITE NA NG APLIKASYON SA FDA

Naghain na ng aplikasyon sa Food and Drug Authority (FDA) ang 11 na manufacturers ng self-administered antigen test kits ayon sa Department of Health (DOH).

"Meron na pong nag apply sa Food and Drug Administration ng mga home administered kits. Ito po ay



mga manufacturers, 11 na po ang nakapag apply," pahayag ni Undersecretary Maria Rosario Vergeire sa isang media briefing.

Kasalukuyan umanong ine-evaluate ng FDA ang mga testing kits at pagkatapos ay ipapadala ito sa Research Institute for Tropical Medicine (RITM) para sa isang performance validation.

Posible umanong umabot sa 2 araw ang isasagawang validation sa RITM saka ito muling ibabalik sa FDA.

"Usually based on the load of work ng RITM, al-

though they were instructed to prioritize this, it will take them about two days no, or 48 hours for them to finish a performance validation for a specific kit," ani Vergeire.

"Sabihin po natin that within seven to ten days lalabas ang registration o certification nitong mga home administered test kits na napapasa sa standards ng RITM at saka ng FDA," dagdag pa nito.

Samantala, sinabi rin ni Vergeire na pinaplano ng pamahalaan na mapababa ang presyo ng mga self-administered antigen test kits sa pamamagitan ng pagtatakda ng price cap sa mga ito.

Aniya, nakikipag-ugnayan na ang DOH sa DTI kaugnay ng itatakdang price cap.

PRIVATE SCHOOLS APPEAL TO GOV'T: WE NEED DOLE 'AYUDA' NOW

An association appealed to the government to allow private schools to benefit from "ayuda" offered by the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE).

Federation of Associations of Private Schools & Administrators (FAPSA) President Eleazardo S. Kasilag on Saturday, Jan. 22, said that while the group lauds the P1-billion COVID Adjustment Measure Program (CAMP) of DOLE, more consideration should be given to private schools that continue to feel the impact of the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic.

Under Department Order No. 232, CAMP is considered as a "safety net program that provides a one-time financial assistance to affected workers in the formal sector due to the COVID-19 pandemic and declaration of Alert Level 3 or higher in various areas in the country."

Citing DOLE Assistant Secretary for the Employment and General Administration Cluster Dominique Tutay, Kasilag noted that those who already benefited from the CAMP during the implementation of Bayanihan 1 and 2 are "excluded" from the CAMP 2022.

DOLE, however, is open to "evaluating" if a worker who previously received a one-time P5,000 cash can still avail of the latest cash assistance.

Kasilag said that FAPSA is aware that DOLE

exempts private schools from being recipients in November 2022. "But it has to be understood that small private schools are in the worst situation now," he explained.

"The school owners had been operating in a bankrupt position but had to hang on to dear life to save teachers, who also have nothing to cling to," Kasilag said. "We need this DOLE 'ayuda' now," he added.

However, Kasilag pointed out that big schools under FAPSA are "not included" in this appeal.



"FAPSA schools are the small and medium-sized schools and do not charge high fees," Kasilag said.

He noted that big schools, even at this time, are still able to make both ends meet. However, Kasilag added that "small schools live on fees and there are only around 2,000 of us in the NCR [National Capital Region] but as many as 6,000 in the country."

Kasilag said that "so

many schools now implement a no work, no pay policy as a last-ditch effort because of an already entrenched working arrangement to avoid school permanent closure."

He added that parents from small schools have "stopped paying" because they have been laid off while teachers slashed pay is also at its "worst."

Kasilag lamented that schools in the NCR have suspended operations temporarily for weeks this January as a health break because

teachers and students have been sick.

"Our teachers are aware that this is a 'no-work, no-pay' scenario," he said.

Despite this, Kasilag said that some local government units (LGUs) also declared suspension for additional weeks.

"Public school teachers are luckier because the government continues to pay them," Kasilag said. "But

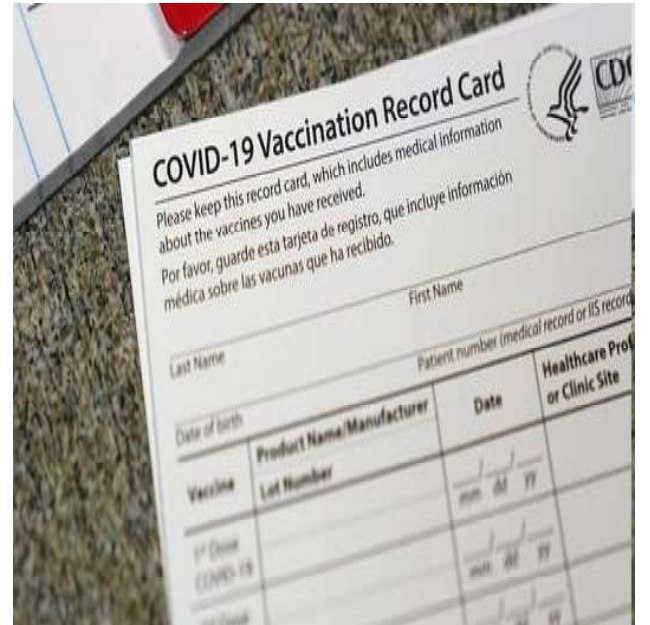

SOUTH KOREA OFFERS SCHOLARSHIP, EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

The South Korean Government has expressed its intention to pursue scholarship and exchange programs for the descendants of Korean war veterans in the Philippines.

In a meeting in Seoul, South Korea on Jan. 17 with Philippine Ambassador to South Korea Ma. Theresa Dizon-De Vega, Minister Hwang Ki-Chul of the Ministry of Patriots and Veterans Affairs (MPVA) expressed hopes in carrying out their program that will benefit descendants of Philippine Expeditionary Force to Korea (PEFTOK) veterans.

According to De Vega, Hwang “is very fond of the Filipino people, especially Korean War veterans and takes great interest in the education and welfare of their descendants.”

“As part of their pro-

gram, the MPVA hopes to visit the Philippines to pursue scholarship and exchange programs for the descendants of PEFTOK veterans, as well as provide medical supplies and equipment to hospitals established for veterans and the military,” De Vega said.

Hwang stated their intention to implement such initiative as he paid tribute to the contributions of Filipinos during the Korean War and highlighted the enduring and historic partnership between the Philippines and the Republic of Korea and the shared values between their peoples.



De Vega also conveyed her appreciation to the MPVA for their “strong and consistent support for the Philippines-Republic of Korea defense and security partnership.”

The Philippines was the first Asian country to respond to the call by the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) to send combat troops in the defense of South Korea from the invasion of the North. PEFTOK was composed of 7,420 soldiers and their bravery and combat proficiency stood out especially during the Battle of Yuldong and the Battle of Eerie Hill. PEFTOK casualties included 116 killed in action, 299 wounded in action, 57 missing in action and 41 repatriated prisoners of war.

DEPED TO INCLUDE MORE GRADE LEVELS IN EXPANDED FACE-TO-FACE CLASSES

As it prepares for the expansion phase of limited face-to-face classes in basic education, the Department of Education (DepEd) is planning to include learners in other grade levels in the limited in-person sessions.

In an interview over dzBB, DepEd Undersecretary Nepomuceno Malaluan gave updates on the planned expansion of limited face-to-face classes amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

He mentioned that among the possible features of the expanded face-to-face classes is the inclusion of students coming from different grade levels.

“Ibubukas na ito sa (this will be opened) to more grade levels and more geographic areas,” Malaluan said.

When DepEd imple-

mented the pilot run of limited face-to-face classes in November, Malaluan said that only Kinder to Grade 3 learners for Elementary and those who need laboratory in Senior High School (SHS) under technical-vocational livelihood (TVL) track were allowed to participate.

Learners in Grades 4 to 6 (Elementary) and those in Grades 7, 8, 9, and 10 (Junior High School) were not included in the pilot implementation of limited face-to-face classes.

“Ang ating rekomendasyon dito sa expanded face-to-face classes ay nakabatay sa naging resulta ng ating pilot face-to-face,” Malaluan said.

He explained that areas under Level 3 — which include Metro Manila, among others — will not be allowed to expand face-to-

face classes yet.

Malaluan explained that there are two parameters on the expanded face-to-face classes.

“Una ay ang aspect ng readiness ng paaralan na tumupad sa protocols batay doon sa guidelines ng DepEd at DOH at iyon ay makitain na it is working during the pilot phase,” he said.

The second parameter, Malaluan said, is the COVID-19 risk assessment which is based on the alert level system.

DepEd said that the pilot run, which included 100 public schools and 20 private schools, was designed to focus on younger children as advised by health experts and the Department of Health (DOH).

The pilot run of limited face-to-face classes was participated by 15,683 learners in 287 public and private schools nationwide from Nov. 15 to Dec. 20, 2021.

Last year, DepEd said

that the expansion phase of face-to-face classes will start this month.

However, due to the surge in coronavirus disease (COVID-19) cases driven by the Omicron variant, DepEd was advised by the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) and DOH to put its expansion plans on hold.

During President Duterte’s Talk to the People early this week, Education Secretary Leonor Briones reported to the President the “successful implementation” of the pilot face-to-face classes.

Briones also reiterated the plan of DepEd to push through with its expansion phase in February but only in Levels 1 and 2 areas. DepEd said that only vaccinated learners and teachers against COVID-19 would be allowed to participate.

HOUSE OKS DISCOUNTS IN WATER, ELECTRIC BILLS FOR ELDERLY

The House of Representatives on Monday unanimously approved on final reading a measure increasing the discount granted to senior citizens on their monthly electric and water consumption and exempting such bills from value-added tax.

Albay Rep. Joey Salceda, chair of the House Committee on Ways and Means, said the exemption would still be subject to a cap on consumption, but for electricity consumption, the limit is also increased in the

with the Energy Regulatory Commission, Metropolitan Waterworks and Sewerage System and other concerned utility regulatory agencies, as well as national organizations of senior citizens, to promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for the measure.

Senior Citizens Party-list Rep. Rodolfo Ordanes, meanwhile, urged his colleagues to continue giving the country's 10 million elderly institutionalized relief in basic social services.

"This is our continuing response on rising to the challenge of coming up with important legislative initiatives that will significantly affect the lives of our marginalized elderly, and bridge their participation and access to the benefits of a sustained and improved quality of life," he said.

Ordanes said aside from the bigger discounts, the proposal would remove the value-added tax on electricity and water bills that are registered under the name of senior citizens.

With 203 affirmative votes, zero negative votes, and no abstention, the chamber passed on third and final reading House Bill 10568, which would amend Republic Act 7432 or the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010.

The bill proposes to raise the rate of discount granted to senior citizens on their monthly electric and water consumption from the present 5 percent to 10 per-

Salceda said the measure contains a safeguard against abuse.

"The measure explicitly states that the senior has to be living in the household subject to the exemptions and discounts," he added.

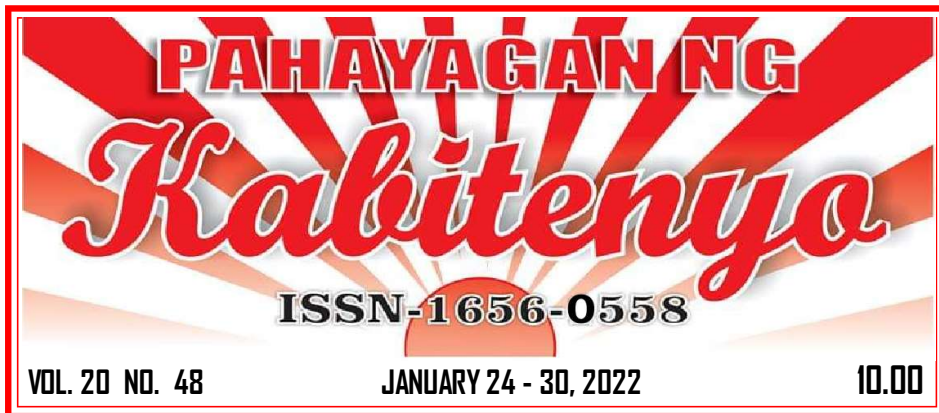
