## Pagkaing Panlaban Sa Kanser (Part 1)

May mga pagkain bang panlaban sa kanser? Oo, ayon kay Dr. David Servan-Schreiber, pinuno ng Center of Integrative Medicine sa University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine at tanyag na autor ng librong Anticancer: A New Way of Life.

Ayon sa libro ni Dr. David, heto ang mga listahan ng mga panlaban sa kanser:

1. Green tea – Ang green tea ay may sangkap na catechins, na nagpapabagal sa paglaki ng tumor. Ayon kay Dr. David, painitin ang green tea ng 5-8 minuto, at uminom ng 2 basong green tea bawat araw. Piliin ang green tea na non-caffeinated, para walang side effect.

2. Pagkaing may curry – Ang dilaw na curry ay mabisang panlaban sa pamamaga ng ugat. Sa pagsusuri, nakatutulong ang curry sa mga taong nag-che-chemotherapy para mapabagal ang paglaki ng bukol.

3. Luya – Ang luya ay matagal nang ginagamit sa Asia para gamutin ang pagduduwal, pagsusuka, ubo, sipon sakit ng ulo, sakit ng tiyan at arthritis. Ang matinding amoy nito ay nangagaling sa sangkap na gingerols, na siyang nagpapagaling sa mga sintomas na nabanggit. May tulong din ang luya sa pagsugpo sa kanser.

4. Cabbages tulad ng bok choy, broccoli, cauliflower at brussels sprouts. Ang mga cabbages (repolyo) ay may sangkap na sulforaphane at indole-3-carbinols, na mabisang panlaban sa kanser. Sa pagluluto ng gulay, i-steam o lutuin lang ng bahagya na may kasamang olive oil. Huwag pakuluan ang gulay dahil mawawala ang bisa nito laban sa kanser.

5. Bawang, sibuyas at leeks – Sa pagsusuri, ang mga sibuyas ay malakas pumigil sa paglago ng cancer cells. Ang bawang ay may sangkap na allyl sulfides, na tumutulong sa pagsugpo ng kanser sa colon, suso, baga at prostate. Para maging epektibo, ang bawang ay kailangang durugin at prituhiin ng kaunti. Huwag sunugin! Puwede ring kainin ng hilaw ang bawang, pero mag-ingat lang at nakahahapdi ito ng sikhura.

6. Madilaw at mapulang gulay at prutas – Ang mga pagkaing ito ay sagana sa beta-carotene, vitamin A at lycopene, na maaaring makapigil sa kanser. Kumain ng maraming karots, kamote, kalabasa at kamatis (4 K's). Napakasustansya po nito. Sa isang pagsusuri ng breast cancer patients, napatunayan na ang mga pasyenteng malakas kumain nitong mga 4 K's ay mas humahaba ang buhay kumpara sa mga hindi kumakain nito. Sa susunod na linggo, ipapakita natin ang 6 pang mga pagkaing panlaban sa kanser. Abangan!

**Senate bill aims to create nationwide bike lanes, safety laws**

MANILA – These days, a bicycle is no longer just for exercise and recreation.

The two-wheeled vehicle has become a necessary means to go around – cheaper, easier to maintain, and can escape heavy traffic.

When the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19) pandemic broke out three years ago and movement was nearly at a standstill, bicycle imports saw a 112 percent increase at 2.1 million in 2020 as against about 1 million units shipped to the country in 2019, according to the National Economic and Development Authority.

A recent survey of the Social Weather Stations (SWS) showed 87 percent of Filipinos prefer bicycles and public transportation to be given priority over private vehicles.

As of April last year, 7.3 million households owned a bicycle, a million more since May 2021, when SWS counted 6.2 million households.

In filing Senate Bill 1698 or the Bicycle Act, Senator Raffy Tulfo said the government must create a local bikeways office (LBO) to head the establishment of bike-related infrastructures.

“The pandemic



boosted demand for bicycles, with people using them to commute, for exercise instead of going to gyms and to get some fresh air. Keen to stay fit and keep clear of infection, commuters around the world have turned to bicycles to get around during the coronavirus pandemic,” read the bill’s explanatory note.

The measure will update local ordinances, such as the one implemented in Marikina City in 1996 that allows the use of all streets, avenues, alleys, sidewalks, bridges, parks, and other public places as bicycle lanes.

Other cities and municipalities have since emulated Marikina, especially since the pandemic when the demand for bicycles soared.

The bill seeks to provide a framework for a bicycle law on a national level so that Filipino commuters may find a cheaper alternative to get to their destination while saving the environment from harmful emissions.

Under the bill, all main roads and highways shall be provided with bicycle lanes or bikeways identified by the LBO and under the supervision of the city or municipal engineering office.

The LBO will be an adjunct of the city or municipal engineering office and will manage the construction and maintenance of a bikeway network, including the identification of a bikeway roadmap; establish the provision of safe and strategic parking facilities, road signage, and maps, including the planting of trees in designated areas of the network; encourage partnership with local and foreign organizations to facilitate easy access to bicycles; conduct education and information drives on the benefits of using bicycles; and cause all bicycles operating on the bikeways to be registered and determine therefore the man-

ner of such registration.

The LBO must maintain and keep a bicycle registry within 60 days.

Each city or municipality must provide parking areas funded by the local government unit by allocating 30 percent of their revenues from miscellaneous activities, such as parking and license fees.

On the part of the cyclist, aside from following road regulations, the rider shall keep one hand on the handlebar at all times; always wear a helmet properly where the chin strap is securely fastened; not cling to another vehicle while in the designated bikeway; not park in areas other than those specifically designated; not ride the bicycle on a sidewalk or crosswalk; and not carry anything on the bicycle unless it is in a basket, bag, rack, or trailer designed for that purpose.

Prohibited under the measure are modified bicycles on the bikeways or that which make the hands higher than the shoulders when gripping the handlebars; ownership or custody of a bicycle, which has a destroyed, removed, altered, covered or defaced serial number; and operating a bicycle at a speed greater than is reasonable. ## Senators say GDP growth result of clear economic targets

MANILA – The Senate leadership on Friday recognized the Marcos administration's clear economic targets and "strong push" to sell the country as an investment hotspot that resulted in the gross domestic product (GDP) growth.



The country's GDP growth of 7.2 percent in the fourth quarter of 2022 and a 7.6 percent growth for the entire year marked the country's highest in 46 years, or since an 8.8 percent growth in 1976.

Senate President Juan Miguel Zubiri said the "remarkable success" is proof that the government's pandemic recovery efforts are working.

"Covid-19 has been a long nightmare, but our move to slowly and surely reopen our borders and our businesses has paid off," Zubiri said in a statement, noting that the Philippines currently holds the distinction of having the fastest GDP growth in Southeast Asia.

"I am hopeful that we will continue on an upward trajectory this 2023 and with the coordination between the executive and the legislative, we are committed to strengthening our economic measures and building on the gains that we have made so far," he added.

However, sectors that are still slowly recovering from the pandemic, such as trade, tourism and transport, need more support, according to Zubiri.

"We must work on cascading this GDP growth to the masses. For this growth to be a genuine triumph, it has to be felt in the lives of every Filipino, especially in terms of day-to-day expenses," he said.

To prepare for the threat of a global recession, Zubiri stressed the importance of making sure that the country's macroeconomic policies and fundamentals are kept in check to outstand its possible effects.

Senator Sonny Angara, who chairs the Committee on Finance, said in a previous statement that the GDP growth clearly shows the economy has "bounced back after the historic slump brought about by the pandemic.

He likewise pointed out that a lot more must be done to sustain the momentum.

"The 2022 growth data showed that it was buoyed by consumer spending. This is not ideal and sustainable. Prices of goods remain high and this, coupled with the hit on household savings will have an impact on spending in the first quarter this year," Angara explained.

"We, in Congress, will provide our support to its initiatives that will contribute to addressing inflation, creating jobs and pump priming the economy," he added.

Socioeconomic Planning Secretary Arsenio Balisacan said in a briefing with the Philippine Statistics Authority on Thursday that the country's GDP expanded faster than the pandemic-blighted 5.7 percent output in 2021.

He attributed the growth to labor market conditions, increased tourism, revenge and holiday spending, and resumption of face-to-face classes. (PNA)

## Online filing of tax returns proposed for overseas Filipinos

MANILA – The online filing of tax returns must include overseas Filipinos workers to enable them to fulfill their obligations even while out of the country.

Senator Win Gatchalian said payment of real estate and estate tax, among others, would be easier for non-residents or those working overseas if they would be accommodated under the Electronic Filing and Payment System of the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR).

"If we are to improve our efficiency in tax collection, we need to make it easier for our taxpayers to pay their taxes. Kailangan nating magkaroon ng maayos na sistema at mas maayos na pagtrato sa ating mga taxpayer upang mapataas natin ang (We need to fix our system and create a better means for our taxpayers to increase our) tax compliance," Gatchalian said in a news release on Friday.

The proposal is integrated into Gatchalian's Senate Bill 1346 or the Ease of Paying Tax, which introduces administrative tax reforms by amending certain provisions of the National Internal Revenue Code of 1997.

As per data from the BIR, only 43 percent of the total number of tax returns were filed electronically in 2015, rising sharply in 2020 to about 94 percent of the tax returns amid the global pandemic.

Aside from providing taxpayers the option of filing their returns and paying the taxes due through electronic means, the bill also seeks to allow the payment of taxes to any authorized agent bank (AAB), not just in AABs in the revenue district office where the taxpayer is registered. (PNA)
