## OCD vows continued support to Bacoor quarantine efforts

**MANILA**— To address the concerns of Bacoor City Mayor Lani Mercado raised regarding difficulties in managing the quarantine of her Covid-19 affected constituents, Office of Civil Defense (OCD) head and National Disaster Risk Reduction Management Council (NDRRMC) executive director, Undersecretary Ricardo Jalad, on Thursday directed the provision of additional support to the city.

In a meeting done with OCD officials, OCD Calabarzon head Ma. Theresa Escolano reported that they have been closely working with the city in the management of their Covid-19 situation since the start of the pandemic operations.

During the meeting, Jalad directed Escolano to ensure that the additional positive cases in Bacoor will be housed in all available quarantine facilities in the region as well as provide other support such as the fuel for the transport vehicles and the needs of those in quarantine.

These will be done while the procurement process to engage the services of additional quarantine facili-

ties (hotels) is in progress. OCD Calabarzon reported that the temporary treatment and monitoring facilities (TTMFs) in the region can still accommodate more individuals. The Calabarzon TTMFs can house a total of 6,900 individuals with only 2,500 (35 percent) occupants currently admitted.

"The national government has opened these TTMFs to ensure that LGUs (local government units) will not be overwhelmed with the responsibility of taking care of their Covid-19 affected constituents. We will ensure that the Bacoor LGU and all other LGUs will be able to avail of this service," Jalad said.

"OCD-Calabarzon is in close communication with the office of Mayor Mercado so that we can continue supporting them while Bacoor is still preparing the proposal for the engagement of additional facilities," Escolano said.

Meanwhile, the Calabarzon Regional Inter-agency Task Force (RITF), through the Department of Social Welfare and Development, provided additional 4,000 family food packs earlier this August to the Bacoor to support the intensified granular lockdowns.

The Department of Education-Calabarzon, on the other hand, also committed the availability of their schools for conversion into isolation facilities if the need arises. The Department of Public Works and Highways is also building additional isolation facilities.

## EDITORIAL - Money properly spent

The country enters the so-called 'ber months, heralding the start of the long Christmas season, with the news that the government's debt has climbed further to P11.6 trillion as of end-July.

This is the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, which last year drove the country into its deepest recession since World War II. While there are hints of economic recovery this year, most businesses are still devastated and revenues sources are down, even as more funds are needed for the pandemic response.

So the government has resorted to borrowing heavily from both domestic and foreign sources. Since the start of the year, the total national debt has grown by P1.8 trillion or 18.5 percent, rising by four percent from June to July alone.

The heavy borrowing makes it all the more important to spend public funds judiciously and with transparency for proper accounting, especially for expenditures related to the pandemic response. Details emerging at the ongoing Senate probe on the procurement of pandemic supplies, however, do not inspire public confidence about government spending.

Malacañang has maintained that all procurements from certain lucky and well-connected companies are aboveboard. With proper documentation, this should be easy to prove. Answering the accusations through solid evidence is the best way to dispel suspicions raised in people's minds that emergency supplies procured by the government are overpriced and, worse, that crooks have profited from it.

The suspicions will not be dispelled by infantile name-calling. Even framing such probes as politicking will not wash. Who isn't politicking in the national leadership? If dirt is unearthed by rival politicians, the public will still welcome the opportunity to establish wrongdoing and hold the guilty accountable. And the public will welcome any effort to ensure that the trillions in debt that the next generations of Filipinos will have to repay will be money properly spent.

PH eyes Japan's help in protecting ozone layer, climate

MANILA – The Philippines aims to secure Japan's assistance on safely disposing hydrochlorofluorocarbons (HCFCs) and hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs) from various industries nationwide.

Such assistance will enable the country to destroy HCFCs and HFCs without releasing these substances' gases into the air -- protecting the ozone layer and climate, noted the Department of Environment and Natural Resources-Environmental Management Bureau (DENR-EMB) OIC Assistant Director Vizmina Osorio.

"At present, the Philippines is coordinating with Japan's Ministry of the Environment regarding the possibility of having a destruction facility here in our country," she said during this month's Ang Tinig Klima program aired on August 27 for the 2021 observance of the annual International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer (IDPOL) on Sept. 16.

Located in the atmosphere, she said the ozone layer is the mantle of ozone molecules shielding Earth from over-exposure to the sun's ultraviolet rays.

HCFCs are ozone-depleting substances (ODS) used in refrigeration and other applications but which the Philippines is phasing out in line with its commitment under the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer.

Montreal Protocol is

the international environmental agreement on preventing further ozone layer depletion by eliminating ODS use.

"It laid down mechanisms for control and phase-out of ODS," Osorio said.

HFCs are non-ODS alternatives to HCFCs but which have high global warming potential.

According to experts, there is a need for industry alternatives that will protect the ozone layer from further depletion without increasing global warming that is driving climate change.

Phasing down HFCs is aligned with Montreal Protocol's Kigali Amendment which the Philippines and other parties to this agreement approved in 2016, noted the Philippine Ozone Desk (POD).

POD facilitates and coordinates ODS phase-out projects and policies in the country.

The Kigali Amendment seeks to help boost the fight against climate change by requiring parties to the Montreal Protocol to gradually phase down HFC production and use, the POD added.

The Philippines has set its HFC phase-down in 2024.

Osorio said work is already underway to provide safe storage for HCFCs and HFCs in the country.

"EMB, with the help of Pollution Adjudication Board, is building a storage facility in San Mateo Rizal for such substances," she

said.

Recovered HCFCs and HFCs will be temporarily stored in that facility before being delivered to the destruction facility for these substances, she noted.

Industry stakeholders concerned regularly receive EMB's reminder to always properly manage and recover respective HCFCs and HFCs so these won't leak into the air, Osorio continued.

"We're also seeking alternatives that don't destroy the ozone layer and increase global warming," she said.

"Montreal Protocol - Keeping Us, our Food and Vaccines Cool" is the 2021 IDPOL theme, said UN Environment Programme.

In 1994, UN General Assembly designated Sept. 16 of every year as IDPOL to commemorate countries' signing of Montreal Protocol in 1987.

Scientists' discovery of a hole in the ozone layer has fueled international action on the matter, including the crafting of the Montreal Protocol.

Earlier, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres described the Montreal Protocol as "an inspirational example of how humanity is capable of cooperating to address a global challenge" and a "key instrument for tackling today's climate crisis".

As a result of international cooperation on the matter, he said the ozone layer "is healing". (PNA)

Fast missile boats seen to complement PH Navy's attack craft

MANILA – The Philippine Navy (PN) said the acquisition of eight units of fast attack interdiction craft-missile (FAIC-M) will complement its 12 multipurpose attack craft (MPAC) previously acquired to secure the country's coastal waters and maritime territories.

"This acquisition aims to strengthen the country's naval capability in terms of enhancing littoral defense and maritime interdiction operations as it will complement the previously acquired 12 MPAC of the PN," Navy spokesperson Commander Benjo Negranza said in a message to the Philippine News Agency Saturday night.

Three of the MPACs are armed with the Rafael Advanced Defense Ltd. Spike-ER (extended range) surface-to-surface missile system while three more are scheduled to be installed with the same weapon system.

Negranza said the acquisition of eight units of FAIC-M is among the 2019 projects approved by President Rodrigo Roa Duterte under the Horizon 2 List of the Revised Armed Forces of the Philippines Modernization Program.

"The first two units of the FAIC-M (are) estimated to arrive in-country around the last quarter of 2022," he said.

He also said the FAIC-M project was awarded to Israel Shipyards Ltd. and Rafael Advanced Defense Systems of Israel under a government-to-government procurement scheme and is divided into two lots.

"Lot 1 covers the delivery of nine platforms, four of which will be missile-capable, and the upgrading of the Naval Shipyard (NSY) for the establishment of a local production line as part of the Transfer of Technology (ToT). On the other hand, Lot 2 includes the integration of weapons and combat systems," Negranza said.

Former PN chief Vice Admiral Giovanni Carlo Bacordo earlier said the FAIC-M Project Contract was signed on Feb. 9, 2021 while the Notice to Proceed was signed last April 27.

The FAIC-M project, which is worth around PHP10 billion, had its Notice of Award issued on Jan. 5, 2021.

Reports said the Israeli shipbuilder will be supplying its Shaldag Mark V for the Navy's FAIC-M project.

Bacordo said successful negotiations with the Israeli shipbuilder resulted in the addition of one Shaldag Mark V unit to the eight boats initially ordered without any extra cost to the Philippine government.

Gilas drawn to Group A of FIBA World Cup Asian Qualifiers

MANILA – Gilas Pilipinas has been drawn into Group A of the FIBA World Cup Asian Qualifiers after the group draw at the FIBA head office in Lausanne, Switzerland on Tuesday.

Just like in the FIBA Asia Cup Qualifiers, Gilas and South Korea will be in one group again, this time being joined by New Zealand and India in Group A.

Group B, however, offers something interesting for basketball fans as a "group of death" has been formed there with Australia, China, Japan, and Chinese Taipei in it.

Despite being geographically part of the East Zone, Indonesia has been placed in the West Zone, joining Jordan, Lebanon, and Saudi Arabia in Group C.

The other west group, Group D, consists of Iran, Kazakhstan, Syria, and Bahrain.

For the first round of the qualifiers, which will begin with an 11-day window from November 20 to 30, teams will play a double round-robin tournament within their groups.

The next windows have been scheduled from February 2 to March 1 and June 27 to July 5 in 2022.

The top three teams per group will move on for the second round of the qualifiers scheduled for the windows of August 22 to 30 and November 7 to 15 next year and February 20 to 28, 2023.

The top two teams from each second-round group plus the best third placer will join Gilas and Japan as Asia's representatives to the FIBA World Cup that the Philippines, Japan, and Indonesia will co-host.

However, if Indonesia fails to enter the FIBA Asia Cup quarterfinals next year, the other third placer will qualify. (PNA)



## FDA approves Moderna vaccine for 12-17 year olds

MANILA—The Philippine Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has officially approved the use of the Moderna Covid-19 vaccine for adolescents, allowing it to be administered to those aged 12 and up.

In a Laging Handa briefing on Friday, FDA Director General Undersecretary Eric Domingo said Moderna applied for an amendment on the emergency use authority (EUA) on their vaccine two weeks ago and has since been approved by vaccine experts and the FDA's regulatory body.

"In-approve na namin ngayong araw na ito ang paggamit—under EUA—ng Moderna vaccine aged 12 to 17 (We have approved this day the use—under EUA—of the Moderna vaccine for those aged 12 to 17)," Domingo said.

Domingo urged health professionals responsible for administering the vaccine to watch out for "very rare" occurrence of myocarditis—or heart inflammation, similar to other

mRNA vaccines like the Pfizer BioNTech.

"Nakikita sa mga very few, very rarely, siguro few in several million, at mas nakikita sa mga younger males. So ito lamang ang dapat bantayan (It can be found in very few, very rarely, maybe few instances in several million and more common in younger males. So, this is what we need to watch out for)," Domingo said.

With the increasing cases and the community transmission of the highly infectious Delta variant of the coronavirus, he said experts have found that the benefits of the vaccine "outweighs the risk".

He noted that Moderna has applied for full approval with the US FDA and results are expected to be released within the month.

Not contaminated

He said the batches of the Moderna vaccine available in the country are safe to use despite reports that Japan has suspended its administration of the vaccine due to contamination.

"Kinonfirm naman natin 'yung mga doses na dineliver sa Pilipinas ay hindi po kasama sa batches under investigation (We have confirmed that the doses delivered to the Philippines are not included in the batches under investigation)," Domingo said.

He said at least three batches of the vaccine are currently being investigated for having stainless steel particles possibly caused by damaged machinery in its assembly line.

He noted that the findings on the contaminated batches have so far shown no effects on the vaccine's safety and efficacy.

"Dito po satin ay tuloy po ang paggamit ng Moderna vaccine (Here in our country, we will continue using the Moderna vaccine). At this time, there's no reason to stop it," Domingo said.

He also reminded vaccinators on the importance of inspecting vaccine vials prior to aspiration and injection to ensure its safety. (PNA)

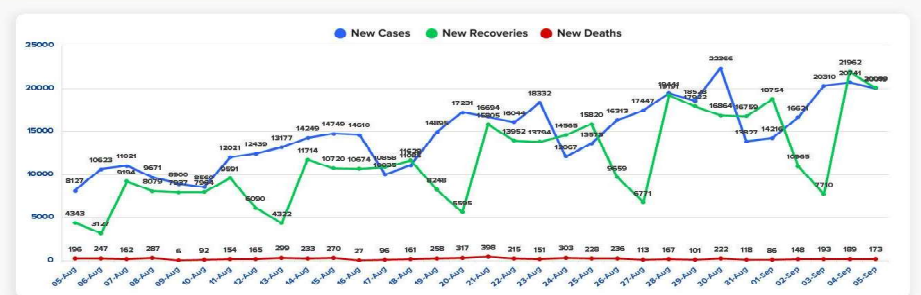
