

## DTI's 18th Bagsakan Project rolls out of NCR, sells in Tagaytay

**TAGAYTAY CITY, Cavite (PIA) -- The BAGSAKAN Special Project held its 18th activity here at La Bella Boutique Hotel last September 26, 2020, the first activity held outside the National Capital Region (NCR) since the COVID-19 outbreak on March.**

The activity is a project of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) through its Trade Promotions Group (TPG), Bureau of Domestic Trade and Promotion (BDTP) in coordination with DTI Regional and Provincial Offices which has been assisting MSMEs, local farmers, fruit growers and cooperatives sell their fresh produce and food products.

During the event, 14 micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) from the provinces of Cavite, Laguna, Batangas, Quezon and

Samar showcased their choicest products, which also supports the department's "Shop Local, Eat Local, Travel Local" campaign.


The La Bella Boutique Hotel, the activity's venue is a boutique hotel cum mixed-use residential and commercial area that promotes intergenerational wellness and "wellness in mind and body for a more prosperous and joyful life!" was the reason for which healthy foods and wellness products from the CALABARZON Region were featured.

Organic coconut products, special delicacies from the Southern Tagalog Region, and tikog bags from Samar were on sale during the event.

Through the DTI-BDTP, the Bagsakan project had assisted about 93 MSMEs, farmers, fruit growers, and cooperatives from eleven regions in the country namely, CAR, 1, 2, 3, 4A, 4B, 5, 6, 8, 9 and NCR with generated income of almost seven million pesos (Php7M) over the last since months.

## DTI brings Bagsakan Project to Bacoor City

**BACOR CITY, Cavite (PIA) --** The Department of Trade and Industry-Trade Promotions Group (DTI-TPG) on Thursday rolled out its second round of Bagsakan in the province at Main Square Mall here.

The three-day sale ran from Friday - Sunday (Oct. 3 - 5, 2020 9am - 3pm) with MSME participants from the provinces of Cavite, Laguna, Rizal, Quezon, Bataan, and Samar showcasing their fresh produce and processed food products, and other native handicrafts unique in their localities.

## Alfonso town's agri-tourism to open 1st strawberry farm in the south

An agri-tourism site, the farm will offer several leisure and educational activities like dine-in restaurants where delectable foods created and crafted with strawberries and other sumptuous dishes to indulge in, strawberry picking, learning modern and intensive farm-

and enjoying the view of lighted ponds and fountains and the cool breeze of the upland weather.

Sweden is very efficient in applying a single unified coherent strategy in protecting their country against COVID.

And there are many other countries recognized by the World Health Organization (WHO) for their response to COVID-19 including Thailand and Vietnam.

What are some of the best practices applied by our ASEAN neighbors?

A strong public health response led by identifying, isolating, treating cases, tracing and the quarantine of contacts.

There's also a network of local health volunteers including migrant workers who look after their respective communities.

These countries are also decades ahead in upgrading their health system in anticipation for a pandemic like this.

Lastly, there is a system of TRUST with the pandemic management led by a team of EXPERTS.

## How schools wrestle with demands of 'new normal' in education

MANILA – Saying that school year 2020-2021 is a big challenge for all stakeholders is an understatement.

In the midst of a raging pandemic, the government and all other stakeholders are scaling up efforts to ensure that children continue with their studies.

For starters, teachers were given trainings on how to discuss their lessons using the limited time effectively and efficiently during online classes, a daunting task due to internet connectivity issues in the country.

For students, it's a struggle whether their chosen system is through printed modules, blended learning, or online class.

Other pressing issues include the volume of transfers from private schools and the lack of teachers that will take this additional task.

Mrs. Edna V. Bañaga, principal at the San Francisco High School (SFHS) in Quezon City, said they continue to accept late enrollees because there are private schools near SFHS which announced their decision not to operate for this school year late.

From around 6,200 students in SY 2019-20, SFHS has around 8,955 enrolled students as of Sept. 25.

“That's why we are also looking for teachers who will fill this gap,” she told the Philippine News Agency.

While this has been a problem in the past, its enormity is significant now given the surge in the number of students in public schools.

Bañaga said while there are teacher-applicants for this school year, their number is not enough because of the spike

in the number of students.

“So we are encouraging those (teachers) from schools that closed to apply,” she said.

As of last school year, SFHS has around 220 teachers.

Bañaga said the SFHS has 30 vacant teaching positions but only five has been filled up so far, due in part to the community quarantine that the government is implementing.

With school opening finally pushing through on Oct. 5, Bañaga said they have readied their teachers and students -- with dry run of classes done before the supposed Aug. 24 opening as well as last week, from Sept. 28 to Oct. 2.

Books have also been distributed last week.

However, the distribution of tablets that the local government unit (LGU) will lend to students enrolled in online classes will only start on Oct. 6.

Bañaga said the distribution of tablets will be done for about a month to limit the number of persons in the school compound, in line with the government's health protocols.

She said about 8,031 of their students availed of the tablets while the others preferred not to borrow tablets or have chosen the printed module.

Overall, she said they are ready for the school year since they have prepared both the teachers and the students.

“I think, basically, we're ready. We're just preparing for the Oct. 5 opening with the prayer that internet connection will not give up on us,” she added. (PNA)

Ayon sa dermatologists, dapat itong iwasan lalo na kung marumi ang mga kamay kapag hinawakan ang pimples.

Hindi lang mag-iiwan ng peklat ang mga pinipisang mga pimples, maaari rin itong pagmulan ng impeksiyon na maaaring kumalat sa dugo papunta sa utak.

Dahil ang ilong ay nasa "danger triangle", posibleng makapunta ang mikrobyo sa iyong utak at magdulot ng impeksiyon doon.

**Balakubak o dandruff**

Ang balakubak ay isang kondisyon sa anit na may kasamang sobrang pangangati at pagkatuklap ng balat. Ito ay hindi naman nakahahawa at hindi seryosong sakit, ngunit ang pagkakaroon ng balakubak ay nakababahala sa iba.

Maraming posibleng dahilan ng balakubak gaya ng: (1) dry skin, (2) iritasyon, (3) seborrheic dermatitis, (4) psoriasis, (5) eczema, (6) yeast-like fungus o malassezia, (7) hindi madalas na pagsa-shampoo, at (8) sensitibo ang anit sa mga ginagamit na hair products.

Paano ang paggamot sa balakubak:

1. Mag-shampoo ng regular – Gumamit ng mild shampoo o non-medicated shampoo. Dahan-dahan itong imasahe sa anit para matanggal ang mga natuklap na balat. Banlawan itong mabuti.

2. Gumamit ng medicated shampoo kung malala ang kaso ng balakubak – Hanapin ang shampoo na naglalaman ng zinc pyrithione, salicylic acid, coal tar o selenium sulfide. Ang medicated shampoo na Nizoral 1% ay nakapupukso ng balakubak sanhi ng fungi na naninirahan sa anit. Ang shampoo na ito ay mabibili sa botika over-the-counter o minsan kailangan pa nito ng reseta.

3. Itigil ang paggamit ng mga styling products – Ang hair sprays, styling gels, mousses at hair waxes ay nagiging dahilan para maging malangis o oily ang buhok at anit.

4. Kumain ng masusustansyang pagkain – Kumain ng mga pagkain na nagbibigay ng sapat na Zinc at B Vitamins na makatutulong maiwasan ang balakubak.

5. Subukang gumamit ng tea tree oil. Ang herbal na ito ay nakatutulong mabawasan ang balakubak. Ang langis ng tea tree oil ay nakukuha sa dahon at ito ay ginagamit na antiseptic, antibiotic, at antifungal.

Kung ang balakubak ay lumala o ang anit ay nagkaroon ng iritasyon o sobrang pangangati, kumunsulta sa iyong doktor.

## Micro entrepreneurs in Cavite town receive livelihood kits from DTI

TERNATE, Cavite, (PIA) – A total of 25 micro and small-scale entrepreneurs in Ternate, Cavite received livelihood starter kits from the Department of Trade and Industry - CALABARZON (DTI-4A), through the Livelihood Seeding Program - Negosyo Serbisyo sa Barangay (LSP-NSB), last September 24.

With the help of Barangay Development Councils (BDCs), the LSP-NSB aims for a more inclusive development by delivering the DTI's business development assistance services to help MSMEs in poor barangays expand their operations.

The beneficiaries were given P200,000 worth of starter kits, which include 22 sari-sari store packages, one (1) auto repair package, one (1) goto and tapsi food house

package, and one (1) eatery package.

"We have our Negosyo Centers all over the province of Cavite to inform our beneficiaries and the public about our programs and projects. Our Business Counsellors will be able to assist and guide them [on] how to start, sustain, and level up their business," DTI 4-A Regional Director Marilou Q. Toledo said.

Meanwhile, Mayor Lamberto Bambao ex-

pressed his gratitude to the DTI-4A for the project, saying that he is looking forward to more livelihood projects for the Municipality of Ternate.

As of September, the provincial trade office has already distributed starter kits to 135 beneficiaries in the province of Cavite, meeting their target of LSP-NSB beneficiaries for 2020.

The DTI plans to further expand the LSP-NSB Program to complement the Negosyo Centers, which provides various assistance to MSMEs, ranging from business registration to product development.



## MOA signed to revolutionize transport system in Kawit town

KAWIT, Cavite, (PIA) -- The Municipal Government here led by Mayor Angelo Aguinaldo recently entered into a partnership with Global Electric Transport (GET) Philippines to launch a modern public transportation in the town.

**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 36- SERIES 2020**

**AN ORDER AMENDING EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 31 - SERIES 2020, "AN ORDER PROVIDING GUIDELINES ON THE OPERATION OF MALLS DURING THE MODIFIED GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE IN THE PROVINCE OF CAVITE"**

1. **Malls shall allow entrance of patrons from 9:00 AM to 7:30 PM only and shall ensure no patrons are inside mall premises by 8:00 PM. However, groceries/supermarkets, pharmacies/drug stores, and banks inside malls may open at 8:00 AM;**
2. **Mall patrons shall be allowed inside mall premises only upon presentation of a Quarantine Pass (Quarantine Passes shall be transferable to other members of the same household);**
3. **Each patron shall be allowed inside mall premises for a maximum period of three (3) hours only, except in supermarkets where no time limit shall be imposed;**
4. **Holders of Quarantine Passes issued by a local government unit in Cavite may be allowed to enter malls outside the city/municipality where they reside;**
5. **Mall entrances shall have a priority lane for frontline workers;**
6. **Temperature inside the mall shall be regulated at 25 degrees Celsius;**
7. **Malls shall ensure one-way flow for customer movement and strict observance of physical distancing inside mall premises;**
8. **Malls may open such entrances/exits as may be convenient for patrons, provided that the one-way flow of customer movement and physical distancing are maintained.**
9. **Music may be played through the mall's public announcement (PA)/sound system; and**
10. **Food and drinks shall not be allowed inside cinemas/theaters**
