Ilan sa mga essential workers na bahagi ng A4 priority group ang nabigyang bakuna kontra COVID-19 ay mga bus driver, janitor, food chain manager, business owner at iba pa na kabilang sa frontline sa gitna ng laban sa pandemya.

Paghihikayat ni DOH-CHD Assistant Regional Director Dr. Sydiongco, kahit na mayroong bakuna na ay mahalaga pa rin ang "preven-

tion" dahil bahagi na ito ng new normal na pamumuhay upang mapanatiling ligtas ang sarili sa sakit.

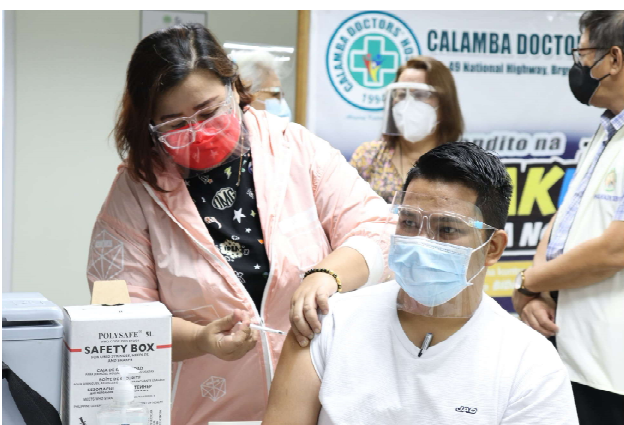

Ang mga lugar na ito ay Batangas, Bulacan, Cavite, Camarines Sur, Caloocan City, Marikina City, Quezon City, Taguig City, Mandaluyong City, Pateros, Sta. Rosa City sa Laguna, Antipolo City sa Rizal, at Ormoc City sa

Leyte.

Mag-ingat dahil marami ang may sakit sa kidneys. Narito ang ilang mahahalagang payo kung paano iingatan at mapapangalagaan ang ating kidneys o mga bato.

1. Ang nephrotic syndrome ay isang sakit kung saan ang isang tao ay naglalabas ng protina ang mga kidneys ng pasyente at puwedeng magmanas ang paa at mukha.

2. Kung may sakit sa kidneys, mag-ingat sa high-protein diet tulad ng Southbeach at Atkin's diet dahil ito'y magpapahirap sa trabaho ng kidneys.

3. May 2,000 Pilipino kada taon ang nangangailangan ng dialysis. Kalahati sa kanila ay walang pera para umpisahan ang dialysis.

4. Ang dialysis ay isa sa pinakamahal na gamutan. Aabot ng P3,000 bawat dialysis at P36,000 kada buwan ang gastos

5. Sa National Kidney Institute, 200 pasyente ang nag-hihintay ng kidney transplant. Ang kidney transplant ay nagkakahalaga ng P1.5 million para sa pribadong pa-syente at P500,000 sa charity case.

6. Huwag araw-arawin ang pag-inom ng pain relievers dahil ito'y makasisira ng kidneys.

7. Umiwas sa mga maaalat na pagkain at sawsawan, dahil nakasama ito sa kidneys. Bawasan ang pagkain ng toyo, patis, bagoong, alamang at tuyo.

8. Iwasan din ang pagkain ng junk

foods at sitsirya na maraming vetsin.

9. Kung mahilig sa instant noodles, bawasan ang alat (seasoning) na inilalagay dito. Kalahati lang ang ilagay para hindi mahirapan ang ating kidneys.

10. Tandaan, uminom ng walo hanggang 12 basong tubig sa maghapon para manatiling malinis ang ating ka-tawan. Kapag healthy pa, tubig ang gusto ng ating kidneys.

Marami ang may impeksyon sa ihi o Urinary Tract Infection (UTI). Narito ang ilang kaalaman sa UTI.

1. Ang simpleng UTI ay puwedeng umakyat sa kidneys at makasira nito. Puwede itong magdulot ng kidney failure na mangangailangan ng dialysis.

2. Mas madalas magkaroon ng UTI ang kababaihan dahil maiksi ang daanan ng ihi nila, hindi katulad ng mga kalalakihan.

3. Uminom ng dalawang basong tubig kada apat na oras para sa healthy kidneys. Mga walo hanggang 12 baso kada araw. Pero huwag din lalampas sa 16 na baso sa isang araw.

4. Ang tinatawag na Honeymoon Cystitis ay ang pagkakaroon ng impeksiyon sa ihi na nangyayari pagkatapos ng unang pagtatalik.

5. Pagkatapos magtalik, pilinging umihi at maglinis din ng puwerta para hindi magkaroon ng impeksiyon.

6. Isa sa apat na mag-aaral sa public school ay may problema sa pag-ihi o may impeksyon sa ihi.

Daming matigas ang ulo

MARAMING beses nang nagbabala ang pamahalaan sa mga pasaway o matitigas ang ulo na hindi nagsusuot ng face mask o kung nagsusuot man ay nakalabas ang bibig at ilong, pero sa kabila nito marami pa rin ang hindi sumusunod. TESDA bats for special training for Filipino virtual assistants

Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) Deputy Director General Aniceto "John" Bertiz III has pushed for a training program to make Filipino virtual assistants globally competitive.

Bertiz, a former lawmaker, made the proposal in response to the growing demand for Filipino virtual assistants (Vas) among companies here and abroad due to the adaption to the "new normal" brought by the pandemic.

"As the world adapts to the new normal precipitated by the global pandemic, there has been a growing demand for Virtual Assistant (VA) among companies here and abroad," he said.

"This demand for VAs around the world opens up an opportunity for skilled Filipino workers, many of whom are considered freelancers while others are hired by virtual assistant companies based in US and Canada with branches here in the Philippines," he added.

Businesses are expected to double down on new technologies and remote work will rise to 300 percent. The Philippine outsourcing services are expected to cover 15 percent of the total global outsourcing market by 2022.

Since 2003, the Philippines' outsourcing industry has maintained its impressive 20 percent annual growth rate largely due to the ability of Filipinos to consistently pro-

duce world-class products and services.

Bertiz, however, pointed out that despite the growing demand of Filipino Vas abroad, there is a little attention given to providing adequate training for them.

"Sadly, there is only one training school for VAs in the country, which offers online courses, such as social media management, digital marketing course, SEO, online booking, among many others," he said.

"A many companies and businesses are struggling to stay afloat and facing the hurdles in paying establishment rentals and huge operational costs, there is a need for the government to come up with a special training program for certified virtual assistants," he added.

Bertiz said he will push for a training program tailor-fit for Filipino Vas based on a specific industry and skills set required and/or currently in-demand by a company, stakeholders, and industry partners in local and overseas.

Filipino VAs are the most preferred and in-demand hard skills in foreign countries, such as Australia, China, Canada, Eastern Europe, United Kingdom, New Zealand, and Germany. (TESDA)



TESDA seeks private sector partners under Enterprise-Based Training programs

The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) has pushed for a more proactive promotion of its Enterprise-Based Training (EBT) program among industry partners to better prepare workers and learners in their respective regions.

TESDA Deputy Director General Aniceto "John" Bertiz III called on the agency's industry coordinators and administrators of TESDA Technical Institutes (TTI) to ensure active participation of private sector in the EBT Program.

"In the implementation of EBT programs, promotion and advocacy play a vital role in achieving the targeted increase in the number of implementers. We encourage you to intensify the promotion and marketing of EBT and focus on nurturing the existing partnerships," he said.

"The Industry has been our partners in implementing our TVET programs. Now, we want to utilize this platform to set a strategic direction and enable you, as our frontliners in TVET, to be the advocates in making EBT the more preferred training modality in TVET," he added.

Bertiz who oversees the partnerships and linkages at TESDA made the call during his opening remarks at the first-ever Capacity-Building Program for EBT Industry Coordinators and TTI Administration held last April 22.

This capacity-building program is in line with the agency's goal to strengthen and expand the implementation of EBT in the country and in support of the second phase of the "EBT to the Max" Implementation Plan, particularly in equipping EBT implementers.

EBT Program covers the Dual Training System (DTS)/Dualized Training Program (DTP), Supervised Industry Learning (SIL), Apprenticeship, Learnership, Program on Accelerating Farm School Establishment (PAFSE), and In-Company or on-site training arrangements, including other industry-based training programs.

The former lawmaker also pointed out that the TVET sector is also affected by the pandemic which is evident to the downward trend in the number of participating establishments in EBT programs.

He encouraged everyone, especially those in charge of promoting the agency's programs, projects, and services, to reinvigorate their efforts in building a stronger TVET amid the challenges of the "new normal" environment.

"No one is spared from the effects of the pandemic, TVET, likewise, experienced the dent in the nation's socio-economic activities. A year after, we are all into rebuilding and reconstructing our individual and corporate lives gravely affected by the pandemic.

We've seen the potential of EBT programs as catalysts to economic activities in the pre-pandemic times," he said.

"We can help each other get back to where we left prior to this health pandemic," he said, as he reminded industry coordinators and administrators of training institutes to set their targets this year.

As to the implementation of EBT programs, Bertiz pointed out that the set target for EBT enrollees is 56,738 while the target for EBT graduates is 51,064.

Bertiz also shared some updates on the implementation of other Technical Vocational Education and Training (TVET) programs to the local industries and sectors in the regional and provincial levels. (TESDA)

Bayanihan inspired community pantries sprout in Cavite

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite (PIA) -- The Bayanihan spirit inspired by the community pantry in Maginhawa Street in Quezon City had spread like wildfire across the province with private individuals and organizations donating food to help those who are heavily affected by the quarantine. Community pantries sprouted like mushroom in the province especially in the upland towns of Magallanes, Amadeo, and Ternate thru the efforts of Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) youth councils and other volunteers.

Fruit stand owners in the city of Tagaytay give out fruits and vegetables while a group called 'Tropang Pugon' continue to receive donations of vegetables, rice, and other food items for the weekly visit of their mobile community pantry in the different barangays in Tagaytay.

In Alfonso town, the The Sharing Table (TST) initiated by the Sahagun-Nuestro family in Barangay Sulsugin during the height of the pandemic last year was reopened. A TST will be set up in each barangay to give easy access to the residents while properly observing the minimum health protocols.

The LGU Alfonso, Liga ng mga Barangay, SK Federation, Alfonso Municipal Police Station, Samahan ng mga Barangay Kagawad, and other non-government organizations, farmers cooperative, and market vendors association in the municipality fully supported the TST.

To give back to the people for their free education as scholars, a group of students and new graduates from the Cavite State University and PUP Maragondon asked for support for contributions and

donations for food items to be shared in the community pantry they set up in Barangays Halayhay and Julugan catering to fisherfolks.

"Pinag-aral kami gamit ang buwis ng taong bayan kaya oras na para magbalik ng tulong sa mamamayan," saad nila.

(We have been educated using the tax paid by the people so it's time to return the favor to them.)

Likewise, a community pantry in the City of General Trias was set up by a group of volunteers to help the local farmers of the city. A FB post by group member Xian Lozares that says "BayANIhan mula sa anihan hanggang sa hapagkainan," implied the intention of the group to help the local farmers with the purchase of their farm harvests which in turn will be shared in their community pantry.

"This way we are able to help the farmers with their livelihood and help others as well thru sharing of the farm produce," Lozares said.

Meanwhile, the stock box community pantry in the municipality of Silang put up by Marvin Garcia caught the

attention of netizens with the comic tag lines that remind people to take as they need.

"We don't mean to offend anyone. So we thought of a fun way to tell them," Garcia explained.

Government agencies also joined the bandwagon of goodhearted citizens such as the BARANGAYanihan Community Pantry of the Trece Martires Component Police Station (CPS) headed by PLtCol. Jose Junar Alamo together with the Sangguniang Barangay Conchu as they gave out noodles, rice, coffee, and sardines to the residents in need.

Aside from food sharing, LTO Carmona employees distributed road safety flyers and leaflets in their Hapag Damayan Community Pantry as part of its continuing efforts to keep the road safe for all.

A notable version is the Community PlanTree of Carlo Gonzales, owner of C&K's Garden in Cavite City. His pantry offered free ornamental plants, Humic Plus Fertilizer, osmocote, hanging baskets, and even succulents to give the residents a productive and healthy hobby and keep their minds off the anxiety and depression brought by the pandemic.
