

# CAVITE ELECTION OFFICE, NAGSIMULA SA PAGSASANAY SA MGA GURO



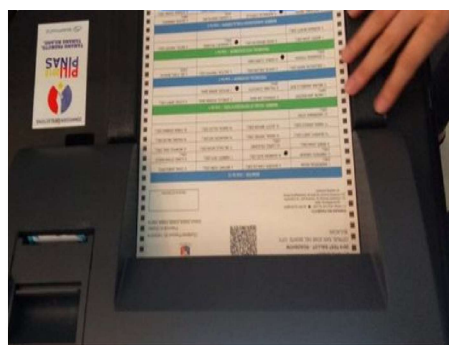

## Empowering women on Women's Day: MABLEA gets training on bread, pastry production

Members of the Mabini Tablea Food Producers (MABLEA), a women's association in Mabini, Batangas, were trained on bread and pastry production alongside with the celebration of the International Women's Day, March 8-10.

The training upskilled the women members of the association and provided them with additional product line aside from their tablea-based products developed by the Institute of Food Science and Technology - University of the Philippines Los Baños (IFST-UPLB) and the Department of Science and Technology (DOST)-Batangas in 2018. The association has been known in the locality as the sole producer of tablea-based products such as tablea chocolate spread, tablea-peanut bar or tabnut, tablea flan (tablea-flavored leche flan), tablea-peanut butter spread, and tablea chocolate candies, among others. Since then, they have also been braving to spearhead the revitalization of the tablea industry in the Municipality of Mabini, Batangas through their community enterprise supported by the Soroptimist International of Mabini (SI-Mabini), a volunteer service organization for women, the Local Government Unit of Mabini

(LGU-Mabini), and DOST-Batangas.

Their new venture on bread and pastry production is expected to generate additional income for the association since there is a



niche market demand for bread and pastries in the locality. Of course, the association's roasted, ground, and molded nibs of fermented pure (100%) cacao beans called "tablea" were still incorporated into some of the product outputs during the training to retain their distinctive market identity. Production technologies trained and transferred to MABLEA include pandesal, burger buns, chif (Turn to page 3)

6. Entries must show original footage. Music should be free from copyright.

7. The video content can be in vlog or documentary format. Language must be in English/Filipino or local dialect with English subtitles.

8. The length of the video must be at least 3 minutes and shall not exceed 5 minutes. It must be submitted in digital format (mp4, mov, or wmv) with at least 720p resolution.

9. Entries must not have been published online/in any media or submitted to any other competition prior to the start and during the competition.

10. Submit your entries through our Google Form ([bit.ly/DA4AVidCon](https://bit.ly/DA4AVidCon)) on or before March 30, 2022, 12 nn with the Title, flashed in the title card, as file name. Prepare a short description of your video and provide the following details in the form:

- Full name or association name
- Age
- Contact number
- Location of the video (village/town/

city/province)

11. The entries will be judged according to these criteria:

- Relevance and Content – 40%
- Creativity and Originality – 35%
- Audio and Video Quality – 25%
- Total – 100%

12. There will be three winners for this video contest: Regional Winner, 1st runner-up, and 2nd runner-up. They will be receiving prizes from the DA CALABARZON.

13. The Regional Winner's entry shall serve as the official entry of the CALABARZON region to the national level of the competition. The videos of the national finalists will be featured in the official Facebook page of the Department of Agriculture on April 8, 2022 for online viewing. ### Chief Justice Gesmundo to Judges: Be Exemplars of Effective, Efficient Administration of Justice

Chief Justice Alexander G. Gesmundo exhorts all judges to be exemplars of effective and efficient administration of justice, especially since they are the frontliners of the Judiciary. During a courtesy call on Chief Justice Gesmundo by the officers and members of the Philippine Trial Judges League, Inc. (PTJLI) on Friday, the Chief Justice reiterated that trial judges are the Judiciary's frontliners and are the base of the pyramid and foundation of the structure of the Judiciary. "The top stone of the pyramid, when you look at it, is the Supreme Court En Banc but the base and the strength of the pyramid lies on the first- and second-level courts. I want that base to be strong...to be exemplars of an effective, efficient administration of justice. You are as equally important as the members of the En Banc," he stressed. The Chief Justice has underscored on several occasions that as the Judiciary frontliners, the trial judges must assure that people transacting with the court involving cases must be satisfied because what they do will reflect on the entire Judiciary. The Chief Justice also reaffirmed the Supreme Court's commitment to protect the Judiciary, saying: "The first and foremost responsibility of the Chief Justice is to protect the Judiciary. But I cannot give protection without the support of the En Banc. The Court is a collaborative, participative, and consultative Court. Let us all bear in mind that the Chief Justice is not the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court are the 15 Justices as provided in the Constitution." **Israel to bring in smart technology to boost PH dairy sector**

MANILA—The Philippines and Israel are partnering to further boost the country's dairy sector.

In a signing ceremony on March 2, Department of Agriculture (DA) Secretary William Dar and Israel Ambassador to the Philippines Ilan Fluss signed a joint declaration that would jumpstart technical and economic partnerships between Filipino stakeholders and Israeli agri-food industry players.

“We aim to introduce smart and precision agriculture while using Israeli technology adjusted to local conditions to address the local challenges. Signing the joint declaration is a strong signal that MASHAV, Israel’s agency for development cooperation, will be happy to support the Philippines through technical assistance and capacity-building programs, especially in the dairy industry,” Fluss said.

In the proposed 2020-2025 Dairy Road Map, the government seeks to increase the country's dairy

input to provide milk for Filipino children and address malnutrition and poverty.

“Israel is a model to us. The Philippine government is eager to learn from Israel’s best dairy practices, we want to know more about the technologies. We have also watched with great interest the progress of the joint-dairy projects between Israel and Vietnam, and we wish to learn as much in the Philippines,” Dar said.

“I trust the joint declaration is only the first step to continuing mutual relationship and assistance,” he added.

The signing was followed by a virtual event, which featured best practices from Israel's dairy industry and leading technologies to increase farm productivity.

At the webinar, Dairy Fresh Asia’s chief dairy expert and co-founder Gonen Harel said his company plans to build a demo farm that can help change the dairy industry and its scale in the Philippines by training the local workforce and blending it with Israeli technologies that have proven its success in Vietnam.

Dr. William Medrano, DA Undersecretary for Live-

stock, for his part, acknowledged the need to attract more Israeli companies and utilize their technologies for the Philippine milk industry.

Ariane Blancia, commercial officer and sector lead for Agrotechnologies, said that about 1.5 billion liters of cow milk were produced in Israel last 2020 alone.

“There are many reasons why Israeli Holstein cow is a world leader in milk yields, but the real answer lies actually in the combination of the unique method of production and quotas, heat stress management, breeding among others that are used in Israel to manage and improve the dairy herd,” Blancia said.

Yoray Ofek, president of the Israel Chamber of Commerce in the Philippines as well as Israeli companies with leading dairy technologies in herd management, breeding and artificial insemination, milk equipment, and complementary technology also presented during the event.

**1.8M NA SENIOR CITIZEN, TARGET NA MABAKUNAHAN SA BAYANIHAN, BAKUNAHAN 4**

Inaasahan ng gobyerno na mabakunahan ang hindi bababa sa 1.8 milyong senior citizens sa buong bansa sa ikaapat na wave ng "Bayanihan, Bakunahan" national vaccination drive ngayong buwan, ayon sa isang opisyal ng Department of Health (DOH) Linggo.

Sa panayam ng Super Radyo dzBB, sinabi ni Health Undersecretary at National Vaccination Operations Center (NVOC) chairperson Dr. Myrna Cabotaje na magpapatuloy ang Bayanihan, Bakunahan 4 sa Marso 10, 11, at 12, at isasama rin ang mga tahanan at mga lugar ng trabaho sa pagkakataong ito.

Ang prioridad para sa round na ito ng nationwide inoculation drive ay



ang mga senior citizen na hindi pa nakakakumpleto ng kanilang primary dose series at ang mga nakatakda para sa booster shots.

“Ang total na second dose, ‘yung makamit na second dose ng ating A2 o senior citizens, tsaka mga booster, naglalaro sa 1.8 million ang tinitignan nating kayang kayang gawin dapat ng ating mga local government units (LGUs) katuwang ng lahat

ng ahensya at private sector,” ani Cabotaje.

Binigyang-diin ni Cabotaje na mas palalawigin nila ang pagbabakuna para sa primary series at booster shots bago magsimula ang campaign period ng mga kandidato para sa House of Representatives at local elective posts sa Marso 25.

“From now up to that time, bilis-bilisan natin. Ang gagawin nating

estrategiya starting with our NVD part 4 ay mas contextualized at granular ika nga. Ngayon, aaralin natin ano ba ang sitwasyon ng mga barangay, ng ating munisipyo, ng ating probinsya. Saan ba siya nagkukulang?” aniya.

“We have enough stocked vaccines. Ang kulang po tayo ay ‘yung [pang] five to 11 [years old]. Halos five million [doses] pa lang ang dumadating. Fifteen million [doses] po ang inorder natin and we are adding additional vaccines later. In tranches, hindi naman sabay-sabay ang dala niya. We will also need Pfizer and Moderna vaccines for our 12 to 17 [years old], kasi ayon lang naman ‘yung may EUA (emergency use authority),’ dagdag pa niya.

## Solid waste management tops DENR agenda

MANILA – The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) vowed that solid waste management will remain a top priority to reach its goal of approving the 10-year solid waste management plans (SWMPs) of more local government units (LGUs) nationwide.

The National Solid Waste Management Commission (NSWMC), chaired by the DENR, will focus on having 185 LGUs with approved 10-year SWMPs by the end of 2022 in compliance with Republic Act 9003 or the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000.

As of February 22, a total of 1,175 SWMPs out of the target 1,716 plans have been approved, according to a news release on Sunday.

The NSWMC recently approved the SWMPs of Magallanes, Sorsogon; Balbalan, Kalinga; Pontevedra, Negros Occidental; and Abra.

The 10-year SWMP is a requirement under RA 9003 for the effective management of solid waste in cities and municipalities.

It contains strategies on proper waste collection, diversion, and disposal, as



well as proper operation and maintenance of solid waste equipment and facility.

It also specifies actions such as information dissemination strategies to residents, the presence of materials recovery facility and sanitary landfill, biodegradable waste process, and partnership with organizations for their recycling.

The Covid-19 waste management plan is included among the strategies to avoid possible contamination caused by common medical wastes such as used face mask and other medical protective equipment.

An LGU with a drafted 10-year SWMP will undergo screening by the DENR-Environmental Management Bureau regional offices, while further validations will be conducted by the central office.

Lastly, it will go through deliberations and approval from the NSWMC members.

"Our battle against solid waste continues and we will not stop until all our LGUs have their approved SWMPs and have implemented these. We will continue to act fast on the problems of unsegregated wastes ending up in sanitary landfills, Covid-19 health care wastes, and the unchanged behavior of the majority of the Filipinos towards solid waste disposal," DENR Acting Secretary Jim Sampulna said.

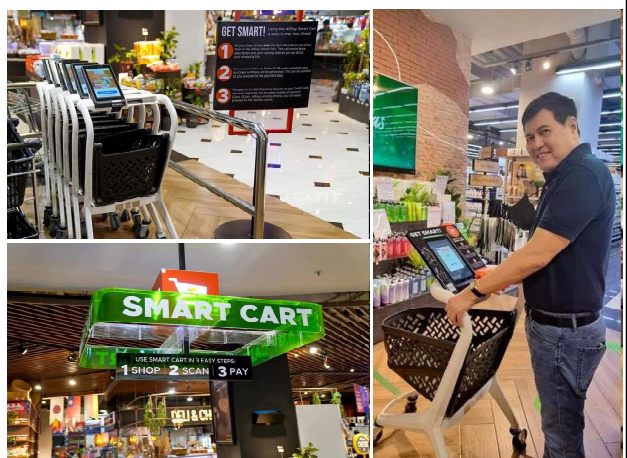
"The Commission commits to assist LGUs towards the approval of their solid waste management plans. We will not stop until we reach 100 percent approved SWMPs to have an environmentally-sound management of solid waste," he added. (PR)

Ang nasabing grocery store ay matatagpuan sa Evia Lifestyle Center, Las Piñas City.

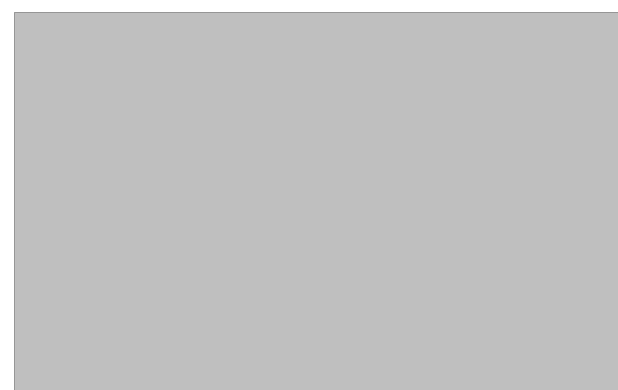


## MGA UWING OFWS MULA UKRAINE, MAKAKATANGGAP NG TULONG MULA SA PAMAHALAAN

Inihayag ng Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA) nitong nagdaang Martes, ika-8 ng Marso, na makakatanggap ng tulong pinansyal at pangkabuhayan ang mga returning OFWs mula sa bansang Ukraine.

Sinabi rin ni OWWA Administrator Hans Cacdac sa isang panayam sa PTV na maaari umanong makatanggap din ng scholarship program ang mga dependents ng OFW na kasalukuyang nag-aaral sa kolehiyo.

"Pagdating po nila, yun po ang role natin. May financial assistance sa OFWs, livelihood na io-offer. Nandiyan din po ang DOLE-POEA family na magbibigay ng trabaho, whether local or overseas sa ating mga OFWs," paliwanag ni Cacdac.



"Kami naman po sa OWWA ay mayroong livelihood at scholarship support para sa dependents... ay tutulong po tayo," dagdag pa nito.

Inaasahang marami pang Pinoy ang magsisiuwi sa bansa matapos ipatupad ng Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) ang mandatory repatriation kaugnay ng lumalalang tensyon sa pagitan ng Ukraine at Russia.

Bukod sa mga repatri-

ated OFWs, mayroon na rin 21 Pinoy seafarers ang lumapag sa bansa mula sa Port of Odessa.

"Bibigyan natin sila ng tulong lalo na sa aspeto ng pangkabuhayan... sa tingin ko, kapag trabaho, wala masyadong problema kasi sila yung mga marinos they will always be in demand kahit ano ang mangyari." pahayag ni Cacdac tungkol sa isyu ng re-employment ng mga seafarers.
