## FOUR DOST CWWTL STAFF PASS DOH CERTIFICATION COURSE FOR DRINKING WATER SAMPLER

Four laboratory staff of the DOST Cavite Water and Wastewater Testing Laboratory (CWWTL) completed the Certification Course for Drinking Water Sampler last 2 June 2022, facilitated online via the Zoom platform.

The Department of Health – National Reference Laboratory (DOH-NRL) conducted the one-day training covering lectures on standards for drinking-water quality, water sampling and evaluation results, and operational standards for water testing laboratories. DOH-NRL likewise tackled the Philippine National Standard for Drinking Water (PNSDW), consistent with the World Health Organization (WHO) frameworks for drinking-water safety. The DOST CWWTL is one of the government water testing laboratories

compliant to the policy.

All four staff from the DOST CWWTL namely Ms. Verjo Angelie M. Sisante (Registered Chemist and Laboratory Head), Ms. Joan Mae B. Acacio (Registered Medical Technologists and Laboratory Analyst for Microbiological Testing), Ms. Thea Mary Joyce M. Diloy (Registered Chemical Technician and Laboratory



Analyst for Physico-Chemical Testing) and Mr. Herbert Salas (Laboratory Staff) passed the post-lecture written examination, and were awarded with a Certificate of Proficiency by the DOH-NRL.

DOST CWWTL will continuously demonstrate its commitment in providing highest quality services in microbiological and chemical testing, and maintain its accreditation under PNS-ISO/IEC 17025:2005.

## EDITORIAL Itigil, quarrying sa Marikina Watershed

Wala pang pinapangalanan si president-elect Ferdinand Marcos Jr. na uupong Environment secretary. Maselan ang posisyon na ito sapagkat nakaatang sa balikat ng pinuno ang bigat nang dina-ranas na pagkasira ng mga bundok, watershed at iba pa dahil sa ilegal na pagmimina, quarrying, at iba pang salot sa kapaligiran. Ang pagkasira ng mga bundok ang dahilan ng grabeng baha na nararanasan ngayon. Maraming panot na bundok ang nabibiyak at uma-agos mula rito ang putik at mga bato at inilibing nang buhay ang mga residenteng nasa paanan.

Ganito ang problemang kinakaharap kapag hindi napigilan ang pagmimina, quarrying at resort construction sa Masungi Upper Marikina Watershed sa Baras, Rizal. Kapag hindi ipinatigil ang mga ginaga-wang ilegal na aktibidad sa nasabing protected area, babaha sa Metro Manila. Nakalulunus ang maaring mangyari kapag hindi naputol ang mga ginagawang paghuhukay sa reserve areas. Ang Marikina watershed ay napagkalooban ng proteksiyon sa ilalim ng Republic Act No. 7586 o ang National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS) Act of 1992.

Ang large scale quarrying sa lugar ang labis na pinangangambahan ngayon. Umaabot sa 1,300 ektarya ng watershed protected area ang nasakop na ng quarrying operations. Kamakailan, ang mga mayor ng Mari-kina, Quezon City, Muntinlupa at Pasig ay na-nawagan sa DENR na kanselahin ang mineral production sharing agreements (MPSA) na inisyu sa quarrying firms, su-balit walang pagkilos ang nasabing tanggapan.

Noong nakaraang Abril, ang Masungi Georeserve Foundation sa Baras ay umapela na kay President Duterte at kay DENR Sec. Jim Sapulna na kanselahin ang MPSA sa Upper Marikina Watershed upang mapi-gilan ang panganiib na idudulot ng mga ginagawang aktibidad sa lugar. Ang grupo ng Masungi ang nagpapanatili at nagre-rehabilitate sa portion ng watershed.

Payo ni Duterte sa Masungi Foundation, sampahan- ng kaso ang mga sumisira sa Marikina Watershed. Ipinag-utos niya ito sa kalihim ng DENR at sa Anti-illegal logging Task Force. Ayon sa Presidente, nangangamba sila sa nangyayaring illegal activities sa watershed.

Bagamat may direktiba na ang presidente, hindi rin kumilos ang DENR at iba pang ahensiya para mapigil ang quarrying operations sa lugar. Ayon sa report "malalaking pulitiko" ang may-ari ng quarrying kaya hindi maipatigil.

Malaking hamon sa bagong DENR secretary ang kalagayan ng Marikina Watershed. Ipatigil ang quarrying bago maging huli ang lahat.

## Incoming DOT chief vows to forge stronger links with LGUs

MANILA – Incoming Tourism Secretary Christina Frasco promised to be a "listening secretary" that values the inputs of local government units when creating national policies related to tourism and destinations under their jurisdictions.

In a speech, Frasco underscored the importance of strong coordination between the national government and the LGU as the latter is the one on the ground.

"There is the mandate by the local government code requiring prior coordination between the national and the local government and then there is the reality," she said.

"What I intend to bring to the Department of Tourism is the perspective of valuing the input of local government units in the

crafting of national policy, considering that the policies that are crafted nationally will be implemented by the local government units on the ground," she added.

Frasco visited the DOT Monday morning to meet with its officials and regional directors.

She will join the Cabinet of President-elect Ferdinand Marcos Jr. when the latter assumes office on June 30.

At a press briefing, Frasco said she "plans to work hard" to realize Marcos' vision of expanding countryside development, developing the Philippines's tourist sites, and giving equal opportunities to lesser-known destinations.

"[T]his means giving focus to all regions in the Philippines, including Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao to replicate best

practices in tourism that have already been proven successful in the various regions and to introduce innovations and digitalization where necessary," she said.

Frasco said she would also push with her plans to develop Mindanao as a tourist spot while supporting efforts to achieve peace and order in the region.

"[I will] work with the people of Mindanao to prove to the world that they are fully deserving of the attention that they have so needed and deserve," she said.

She said the DOT with her at the helm would extend necessary assistance and ensure that tourism workers in the region receive appropriate training. (PNA)

## 18M Filipinos suffering from, at risk of fatty liver disease

MANILA – At least 18 million Filipinos are either suffering from or at risk of fatty liver disease, a sickness considered a "silent epidemic."

This is one of the alarming pieces of information presented at the recent online press conference titled "Fatty Liver Facts: What You Need to Know About This Silent Epidemic," organized by the Hepatology Society of the Philippines (HSP).

The "silent epidemic" is called fatty liver disease, which affects millions around the world. It has no symptoms at the early stages, which is why many people are unaware that they have it until it's too late.

"Fatty liver disease is a little-known, potentially fatal condition affecting many people. The public can learn about it by listening to experts," said Dr. Allan Policarpio, president of the Philippine Society of Gastroenterology.

There are two types of non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD) -- non-alcoholic fatty liver (NAFL) and its more advanced type, the non-alcoholic steatohepatitis (NASH).

The main characteristic of both is too much fat stored in liver cells. Having small amounts of fat in the liver is normal, but it becomes a problem if more than 5 percent to 10 percent of the liver's weight is fat.

Dr. Edhel S. Tripon of HSP stated that fatty liver is the fastest rising cause of liver cancer and cirrhosis worldwide. "People who are overweight, diabetic, or hypertensive are prone to developing fatty liver," he said.

The Philippines has over 18 million obese and overweight people. They are all susceptible to NAFLD, said Dr. Diana Alcantara-Payawal, president of the Philippine College of Physicians. "Some of them may already have fatty liver disease but are unaware of it," she added.



Tripon stressed the importance of keeping the liver healthy. "The liver is a multitasking hard worker, so it is important to keep this organ as healthy as possible. A healthy liver is fundamental to wellness."

To lower the risk of developing fatty liver disease, HSP vice president Dr. Wendell Z. Espinosa said "we need to raise awareness about how to avoid modifiable risk factors among adolescents and young adults. We need to increase the public awareness about nonalcoholic fatty liver disease, which would likely lead to better prevention, early detection, and treatment of the disorder."

The Hepatology Society of the Philippines is the lead organization in the study and care of liver health and disease among Filipinos. HSP provides research, education, and advocacy on liver health and liver-related diseases. Part of its mission is to share information, services, and expertise with the global community towards the prevention and treatment of liver diseases. (PR)

# DA chief calls for unified action to address food crisis

Department of Agriculture (DA) Secretary William D. Dar reiterated the importance of organizing farms under the Farm and Fisheries Clustering and Consolidation (F2C2) program during the last day of the DA-F2C2 Island-Wide Cluster Summit for MIMAROPA, CALABARZON, and Bicol Regions on June 24, 2022.

As per the Administrative Order No. 27, s. 2020 signed by Secretary Dar, the F2C2 Program reinforces the country's small farmers and fishers through clustering and consolidation of their production, processing, and marketing activities, as well as the pooling of all forms of available resources, as community business enterprises.

The F2C2 Program, the Secretary explained, is capable of capacitating members, conducting technology transfers, and leveraging the economies of scale to conduct business.

"We are hoping that this social engineering that we are doing-consolidation and clustering-will start the process of collective action," he added.

To further enhance the potentials of the said program, the DA chief called for the following measures:

the increasing of al-



lowed agricultural land ownership to four (4) hectares per individual through legislation;

the creation of the Bureau of Agri-Industry Cooperatives under the DA to promote institutional development of agri-fishery cooperatives and associations;

the Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) to perform more in capacitating and developing the country's agricultural cooperatives and associations;

the local government units (LGUs) to take more initiative in accomplishing the DA's devolved functions; and

the return of the agricultural extension units of local government units back to the DA.

In his message, Secretary Dar called for unified actions to combat the cur-

rent food crisis, which was compounded by the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and the Russia-Ukraine crisis.

"Tumataas na lahat ng presyo ng agricultural inputs at lahat ng pagkain. Talagang magbanat-buto po tayo dapat. Let's be one again in saving this country. Let's be one in protecting our farmers. Let's produce as much food as we can during this period of crisis," the DA chief urged.

The Summit, which was held from June 20-24, 2022 at the Queen Margaret Hotel in Lucena City, was attended by 200 representatives from various farmers' cooperatives and associations (FCAs), the academe, the private sector, and local government units from the CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, and Bicol Regions.

Sa kanyang inaugural speech, nagpasalamat si Anarna sa mga Silangueno at nangako sa kanila ng malalaking pagbabago sa pagpapatakbo ng lokal na pamahalaan at sa paghahatid ng serbisyong panlipunan sa mga mamamayan.

"Malaki ang aking pasasalamat sa mga minamahal kong kapwa Silangueno dahil pinayagan nila akong manguna para sa pagbabago dito sa Silang. Ang pagkapanalo ko sa



nakaraang halalaan ang isang malakas na mensahe ng aking mga kababayan na gusto nila ng galing, husay, talino at malasakit," aniya.

"Sa ilalim po ng aking pamumuno, wala na pong kulay ang pulitika - walang blue or pink o kung ano pa mang political affiliation. Puti na lang ang kulay natin para walang bias at tayo as iisa.
