

## Taal Volcano now under Alert Level 2 but threat remains

MANILA -- The Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs) on Friday lowered the status of Taal Volcano to Alert Level 2 (decreased unrest), three weeks after it was put under Alert Level 3 (decreased tendency towards hazardous eruption) on January 26.

Lowering its alert level status was due to fewer volcanic earthquakes and weak steam or gas emission at the

main crater for the past three weeks.

or volcanic gas, movement of magma, and degassing of magma, boiling of underground water by magma.

Phivolcs, meanwhile, noted that despite the lowering of the status of Taal Volcano, it does not mean that unrest has ceased, as there is still an imminent threat of an eruption.

In a previous interview with the Philippine News Agency (PNA), geologist Carlos Arcilla said that so long as there is presence of sulfur dioxide emissions, earthquakes, and volcanic inflammation, there is risk for an eruption.

Confirming that nobody can predict when an eruption could occur, Arcilla noted that even if an eruption subsides for one month, it would not mean that there is no risk for a hazardous explosive eruption.

Phivolcs said those residing within areas at high risk to base surges who have returned after the Alert Level 2 announcement must be prepared for a quick and organized evacuation.

Entry into Taal Volcano Island, Taal's permanent danger zone, must be strictly prohibited, it added. Local government units are likewise advised to additionally assess previously evacuated areas within the 7-km. radius for damage and road accessibility, and to strengthen preparedness, contingency, and communication measures in case of renewed unrest. # COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS AT SANGLEY AIRPORT

MANILA – Two aviation companies are set to use the Sangley Airport right after its official inauguration on February 15, the Department of Transportation (DOTr) said on Thursday.

DOTr Assistant Secretary Goddes Hope Libiran said Alphaland Aviation plans to transfer its Manila-Balesin flights to Sangley, with its inaugural flight taking off on Friday.

“Alphaland will have its first flight tomorrow (Friday) morning. Alphaland operates Balesin routes. Immediately after, they will transfer their operations from Manila and Clark to Sangley,” Libiran said.

Balesin is a private vacation island along the eastern coast of Luzon, 60 nautical miles east of Manila, which features its own private airport, white-sand beaches, and members-only access, according to Alphaland's website.

Libiran said Cebgo,

Cebu Pacific's budget airline, will also transfer cargo operations at the Sangley Airport.

Tugade was joined by Undersecretary for Finance Garry De Guzman, Assistant Secretary for Procurement and Project Implementation Giovanni Lopez, Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines Director General Jim Sydiongco, DOTr Project Manager Gil Pamatmat, Philippine Ports Authority Port Planning and Design Department Manager Reynald Parafina, and



Unimasters Conglomerate president Wilson Chan.

The revival of Sangley as a general aviation and turboprop cargo operations hub was made upon the directive from President Rodrigo Roa Duterte to utilize the airport and help ease air traffic at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA), according to DOTr.

Tugade has ordered round-the-clock construction

of the airport that started in June 2019 after Duterte directed to the DOTr to “immediately” start the operations amid reports of flight delays and cancellations last year.

He said the revived airport will provide more convenient air travel for the public as part of the department's “basket of solutions” to decongest NAIA. (PNA)



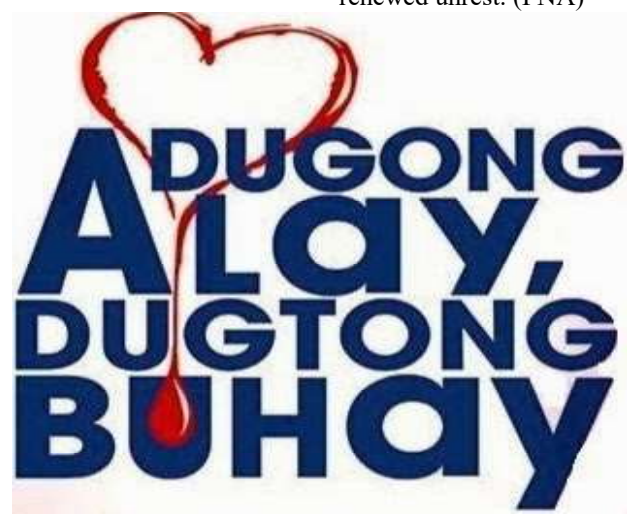

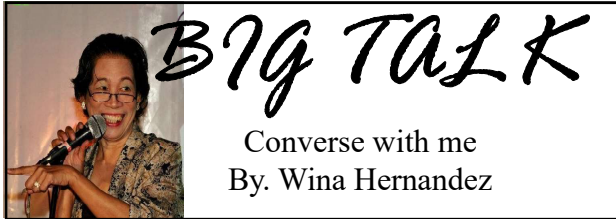

**Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS-DOST)**

Activity in the Main Crater in the past 24 hours has been characterized by weak emission of steam-laden plumes 50 to 100 meters high before drifting southwest. Sulfur dioxide (SO2) emission was below instrumental detection. The Taal Volcano Network recorded one hundred thirty-two (132) volcanic earthquakes including three (3) low-frequency events and eleven (11) harmonic tremors having durations of two (2) to three (3) minutes. These earthquakes signify magmatic activity beneath the Taal edifice that could lead to eruptive activity at the Main Crater.

Alert Level 3 is maintained over Taal Volcano. DOST-PHIVOLCS reminds the public that sudden steam-driven and even weak phreatomagmatic explosions, volcanic earthquakes, ashfall, and lethal volcanic gas expulsions can still occur and threaten areas within Taal Volcano Island and nearby lakeshores. DOST-PHIVOLCS recommends that entry into the Taal Volcano Island as well as into areas over Taal Lake and communities west of the island within a seven

(7) km radius from the Main Crater must be strictly prohibited. Local government units are advised to assess areas outside the seven-kilometer radius for damages and road accessibilities and to strengthen preparedness, contingency and communication measures in case of renewed unrest. People are also advised to observe precautions due to ground displacement across fissures, frequent ashfall and minor earthquakes. Communities beside active river channels particularly where ash from the main eruption phase has been thickly deposited should increase vigilance when there is heavy and prolonged rainfall since the ash can be washed away and form lahars along the channels. Civil aviation authorities must advise pilots to avoid flying close to the volcano as airborne ash and ballistic fragments from sudden explosions and wind-remobilized ash may pose hazards to aircraft. DOST-PHIVOLCS is closely monitoring Taal Volcano's activity and any new significant development will be immediately communicated to all stakeholders.

**Developer commits to Manila Bay rehab via waterways cleanup**

MANILA --As part of the company's efforts of promoting environmental protection and sustainable eco-development, Quadruple-A developer DMCI Homes has reaffirmed its commitment to support the government's Manila Bay rehabilitation project through the cleanup of Metro Manila's waterways.

DMCI Homes recently helped in the installation of a floating trash trap in a 1.63-kilometer segment of Pasong Tamo Creek in Quezon City which is part of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources' (DENR) Enhanced Adopt-an-Estero campaign with the Rotary Club of Diliman Silangan (RCDS); Rotary International District 3780; the Quezon City Council of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines; and barangays Culiat, Pasong Tamo, and Bahay Toro in Quezon City.

"On behalf of the DENR and Tayo ang Kalikasan, I'd like to thank all our partners in this campaign for helping us in our effort to clean all the waterways in Quezon City that leads to the Manila Bay," said Roberto Feliciano, technical assistant of DENR'S Task Force Tayo ang Kalikasan.

Feliciano underscored the importance of the campaign as studies have shown that the root cause of the trash problem in Manila Bay is the garbage emanating from the upstream areas and communities.

"This will be a convenient model for other barangays and other Rotary Clubs on how to install the trash trap in their respective areas," Feliciano added.

Meanwhile, RCDS charter president Rod Bernardo lauded the contribution and support of private companies such as DMCI Homes for this campaign noting that the enormous task

of cleaning the Manila Bay entails a multi-sector approach.

"DMCI Homes has been our partner for the last seven years, initiated as early as 2012 by past president Bobby Sheen, with then

## PH hopes for China's recovery from Covid-19 outbreak: Nograles

MANILA – The Philippines expressed hope that China will be able to recover from the epidemic of the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19), Cabinet Secretary Karlo Nograles said Friday.

“We obviously recognize China as one of the leading trade partners of the Philippines. And we hope that China will be able to get back to its usual business, even given the challenges that your country is facing right now,” Nograles told reporters in a Laging Handa press briefing.

More than 1,000 people have died due to Covid-19 that originated in Wuhan City, China, while nearly 60,000 others have already been infected by the virus.

To date, the virus has spread to more than 20 countries.

China's economic growth is seen to be at its slowest pace from January to April 2020 period due to the Covid-19 outbreak, according to the Feb. 7 to 13 Reuters poll of 40 economists based in mainland China, Hong Kong, Singapore, Europe, and the United States.

Reuters' poll revealed that China's annual economic growth in the first quarter in 2020 is predicted to decline to 4.5 percent from six percent in the fourth quarter of 2019.

“The drop was expected to drag down the full-year growth rate in 2020 to 5.5 percent from 6.1 percent in 2019, its weakest since at least 1900 when comparable records began,” the report read.

Reuters, however, noted that economists remain optimistic that China's economy would bounce back by the second quarter of the year, which is forecast

to have a 5.7 percent growth rate.

Nograles said the Duterte government was confident that China will overcome the challenges brought about by the Covid-19 outbreak.

He stressed that the sooner that China overcomes the challenges, the “better” for the rest of the world because “China is the leading trade partner for the different countries as well, not just the Philippines.”

“And speaking for the Philippines, I think it's important that we all support China getting back on its feet. It's also important that we continue our good relations in terms of economic trade and beneficial relations for both of the countries,” Nograles said.

The Philippines' relationship with China has improved under the watch of President Rodrigo Duterte. (PNA)

## Safe to conduct festivals, public events in PH: DOT

MANILA – It is safe to conduct festivals and public gatherings in the country, despite the threat of the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19), the Department of Tourism (DOT) guaranteed on Friday.

Tourism Secretary Bernadette Romulo-Puyat made the remarks after the Department of Health (DOH) earlier recommended the cancellation of big events and other mass gatherings amid the threats posed by the new coronavirus.

Romulo-Puyat said a joint memorandum circular by the DOT, DOH, and the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) would be released to encourage local governments to pursue events despite public fears over Covid-19.

“We also agreed among the DOH and the DILG regarding the fiestas, events, celebrations. We

agreed we'll be implementing a joint circular among the three agencies that it is all right to conduct such activity as long as precautionary measures are implemented,” she said. “And we want to assure you that all our stakeholders in the tourism industry have already implemented all these precautionary measures even before the temporary ban. So it's safe.”

Several local government units and other groups have decided to forgo activities with large crowds to reduce the risk of virus transmission.

Filipinos have expressed fear over a possible Covid-19 epidemic in the country after the government earlier confirmed three cases of the new coronavirus.

Three Chinese nationals from Wuhan, China, the epicenter of the virus outbreak, who traveled to the Philippines had tested positive for Covid-19. One died

while the other two have already recovered.

Despite this, President Rodrigo Duterte encouraged his fellow countrymen to travel with him around the Philippines.

In a video message uploaded by Radio Television Malacañang on Friday morning, Duterte assured the public that it is still “safe” to visit the country's beautiful places.

“To my fellow Filipinos, I encourage you to travel with me around the Philippines. I assure you that everything is safe in our country, be it an issue of health, be it an issue of law and order, and be it an issue of accessibility,” he said. (PNA)

## Fewer volcanic quakes, sulfur emissions observed in Taal

MANILA -- Both the volcanic quakes and sulfur dioxide (SO2) emissions recorded in Taal declined in the past 24 hours, the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs) said Thursday.

There were 71 volcanic quakes recorded, fewer than the 101 volcanic quakes the previous day.

Volcanic earthquakes are caused by movements or eruption of magma from the volcano, Phivolcs executive director Renato Solidum Jr. earlier explained.

Since earthquakes signify magmatic activity beneath the Taal edifice, this could lead to eruptive activity at the main crater.

Alert Level 3 is maintained over Taal Volcano.

“Magmatic activity means processes involving magma, which include breaking of rocks and filling of cracks by magma or vol-

canic gas, movement of magma, and degassing of magma, boiling of underground water by magma,” Solidum said.

Sulfur dioxide emissions, meanwhile, measured 59 tonnes on February 12, still lower than the average 67 tonnes the previous day.

Weak emission of plumes 50 to 100 meters tall has been observed for the third consecutive day.

A weaker eruption, according to Solidum, is based on the height of the plume coming out of the cra-

ter. Volcanic plume or eruption plume is a column of hot volcanic ash and gas emitted into the atmosphere during an explosive volcanic eruption.

Phivolcs maintains that entry into the Taal Volcano Island, as well as into areas over Taal Lake and communities west of the island within a seven-kilometer radius from the main crater is still strictly prohibited.

People are also advised to observe precautions due to ground displacement across fissures, frequent ashfall and minor earthquakes, it added.

The magma intrusion from below causes the fissures or cracks to form, Solidum said. (PNA)
