**By-laws:** By-laws are the internal rules that govern the overall management and operation of a nonprofit organization. They provide a framework for how the organization is structured and how it functions. They are voted on by the Board, approved by the membership, and approved by the governing organization, in our case Optimist International.

**Policies:** Policies are specific guidelines and procedures that address various operational and administrative aspects of the nonprofit. Unlike bylaws, which provide a broad framework, policies are more detailed and focus on particular areas of the organization's activities. Like Procedures, they do not have to be approved by the membership

**Procedures:** A procedure is a description of the operational processes necessary to implement policy.

President Kathy had the members present break up into groups and work on, and ,record what the Procedure Manuel should say.


