Our own BCNOC member *James Tromba Jr* is an alumnus of this program.

The meeting itself revolved around the exchange programs of not only the students, but the representatives themselves, which BCNOC members **Lisa Forrest** and **Past President Kathy Dardas** have participated in. Also, I was pleasantly surprised by the number of our BCNOC member families that have participated over the years in the student exchange programs of various countries.

Now in its 64th year as being the Sister City of Ansbach, Germany, Bay City is currently in the planning stage of setting up another exchange program between the two cities. Ansbach is in Bavaria, and lies about 90 miles north of Munich.

In 2022 Bay City unveiled the "Two Cities Connect" sculpture in Uptown Bay City at the "Ansbach Plaz". The sculpture is made up of a split globe connected by a large metal arch, uniting Bay City and its sister city Ansbach, Germany together as one. Designed by the students of the Bay Arenac ISD, and spearheaded by the Leadership Bay County, Class of 2022, BCNOC is a long time supporter of Leadership Bay County, and has, and had, many graduates of the program as members.
