MEETING NOTES

Our program today was quite, and very interesting. Quite meaning if you like to keep up on what is happening in the community, and very if you have an interest in all things Fire Truck and memorabilia type things. Our program was on the Antique Toy and Fire Truck Museum located at 3456 Patterson Ave here in Bay City, with *Mike Snyder* presenting. Mike lead us through some of the history of the museum, from when it was a dream of founder *Jimmy Dobson*, to the unveiling and restoration of old *Firehouse #3*, located at 115 Washington Ave in Bay City. *Firehouse #3* is under a 2.5 million dollar renovation, and when it is completed it will serve as a year round education and event center. The original museum is located at 3456 Patterson Ave, here in Bay City, and it houses over 16,500 toys, some one of a kind, and 60 fire apparatus.

The original museum houses a very unique "Fire Truck", referred to by some as the "T-Rex of Fire Pumpers", and better known to others as the FDNY Super Pumper. The beast roamed the streets of New York from 1965 till 1982, and during its run it fought over 2200 fires. The pumper is basically a massive pump system powered by a locomotive engine on a flatbed trailer. The central pumping unit alone could draw water from eight hydrants at once, drop lines into bodies of water, supply a mind-boggling number of lines with water simultaneously, and flow over 10,000 gallons of water per minute at low pressures if the situation called for it. When the pressure was ramped up to 350 psi, it could move 8,800 gpm. The system was hauled around by a huge Mack semi tractor, and the price tag was over \$850,000 in 1960s dollars.
