November 26: 16 members and 2 guests today. Our guests were our speaker **Ryan LaBean**, *Foster Care Licensing Worker*, from *Wellspring Lutheran Services*, and past **BCNOC** member Joyce Walker.

Our program was on the Wellspring Foster Care system. Wellspring, a501(c)3, has been around for 125 years, and serves 53 of the 83 counties in the state of Michigan. Providing services to seniors, children and families.

Today **Ryan** focused on the foster care services they offer. With over 13,500 kids in Michigan Foster Care, the needs are great. Wellspring has but 230+ licensed homes in Michigan and they accept 7% of those kids in need. They are always in need of more Foster Care licensed homes

When we think of family, we think of the people who can support and encourage us to be and do our best. Yet, there are so many external forces working against families today – things like generational poverty, lack of education, abuse, neglect or addictions.

Every family has a story, and sometimes those stories take unexpected twists and turns. That's when families are forced to make difficult decisions in times of crisis. Without the proper support network and resources, these conditions bring families to the edge, and may create unsafe living conditions for everyone involved.






The Optimist Creed
