February 9

Our program speaker today was **Brad Warju** from *Versiti Blood Center of Michigan*. Based in Grand Rapids, Mi, they are the 4th largest blood bank nationwide. drawing 120,000 units of blood annually, falling just shy of the 500 units needed everyday in Michigan. Blood given locally, stays local at first, then dispersed to the 70 hospitals affiliated with *Versity*, with 98% of the blood donated staying in Michigan. Most of their donations come through Blood Drives. While they have a "Blood Bus" that they can use, they would prefer to do it inside of a location. The bus has 4 beds, but only 2 can be used right now due to COVID. They are still able to collect blood right now, even with COVID. When you donate blood, they do test you for COVID antibodies, and you are told if you are positive. For every unit you donate, you save 3 lives! You can donate every 56 days, and you are never too old to donate. You can begin donating with parental consent at age 16, and without at 17

There will be a blood drive on February 24th from 9am-12pm at Sunrise Family Credit Union on Euclid. You can sign up online for an appointment and it takes about an hour.

Locally, the Versity Blood Center is located on Johnson Street in Bay City

In 1993 Camp Fish Tales opened a one-week, overnight, camp at Saginaw Valley State University. It was a good start, but parents and volunteers had a dream in which one day their children and friends would enjoy a true camping experience. A camping experience which would include healthy, fun activities outdoors...the chance to meet new friends and develop social skills in a completely new and safe environment... the "confidence-building" experience of being away from home. Hundreds of volunteers pitched in, and in 1996, Camp Fish Tales opened near Pinconning in mid-Michigan
