The ALICE (<u>Asset Limited</u>, <u>Income Constrained</u>, <u>Employed</u>) project raises awareness about a huge but hidden segment of our community that is struggling to afford basic necessities. The men and women of all ages and races who get up each day to go to work, but who face tough financial choices are known as **ALICE**.

Rent or electric bill? Food or prescription drug? For too many hardworking households, impossible decisions such as these are a way of life *ALICE* is not an individual, but a conceptual blending of all those in our community who bring home a paycheck that doesn't stretch to cover basic household needs. *ALICE* is glad to have a job, proud of their work, and happy to contribute to the community. *ALICE* has no cushion, their assets are limited, and their income is constrained. ALICE is one crisis away from poverty.. When ALICE is forced to make difficult choices, the entire community faces consequences. The project provides a framework and language for stakeholders to reassess public and corporate policies and implement changes that improve the lives of ALICE and their communities.


