January 21: 16 members and guests today. Our guest today was our speaker Katie Bell, *Community Engagement Manager*, from the *CAN Council of the Great Lakes Bay* region. The mission of the *CAN Council* (*Child Abuse and Neglect*) is to prevent child abuse and neglect of children in the Great Lakes Bay Region.

There are three pillars of the council:

CAC: <u>Child</u> <u>A</u>dvocacy <u>C</u>enter. The child is interviewed only once by all the professionals in a safe environment in an effort to streamline the process of a traumatic event so the child doesn't have to repeat the story

CASA: <u>C</u>ourt <u>A</u>ppointed <u>S</u>pecial <u>A</u>dvocates. Highly trained volunteers serving as the voice of the child. After researching the case of the child, they attend hearings, and submit a court report recommending an action to the court.

CAPE: <u>Child Abuse Prevention Education</u>. Prevention program for all ages, providing education appropriate for that age group, and also provides free parenting classes open to the public


