Camp Fish Tales is a barrier-free, wheelchair accessible **camp** located on 67 acres on the corner of Erickson and Old State Road between Linwood and **Pinconning**, **Michigan**. **Camp Fish Tales** provides a unique and exciting outdoor learning experience where individuals with special needs interact and develop skills that enhance their health, abilities, independence and quality of life.

There are eleven sessions of camp scheduled for summer 2020. For many of the campers it becomes one of the few opportunities to become more independent and to build social skills. For caregivers, Camp Fish Tales offers respite, a chance to renew, or even a chance to focus on other family members. The campers at Camp Fish Tales have a physical and/or developmental disability, and before accepting a camper, camp staff make sure that they can adequately meet the needs of the camper. Due to the high staffing ratio and 24-hour nursing staff, Camp Fish Tales is known for taking campers with more severe disabilities.


