

Another highlight of the our weekly club meeting was a check presentation in the amount of \$7000 to **Mary Ida** "Mrs. Santa" **Doan.** This donation was our pledge to the Santa House here in Bay City, with the funds coming from a portion of this year's 6th Annual Camel Races net proceeds. 
