The Children's Grief Center, whose mission is: "To provide a healing environment for children, teens and adults dealing with death", have been in Midland for 5 years, Saginaw for 3 years, Bay City since January 2019. There is no charge to attend these sessions and they meet September to May on the 2nd and 3rd Tuesdays at 6:30-8pm. In The Children's Grief Center provides a safe and healing environment for children, teens and their families as they grieve the death of a parent, sibling, close family member or friend. The Children's Grief Center creates an atmosphere that fosters healing through peer support and trained volunteers, where the participants use art, dance, theatre, story telling and writing to express their feelings and share their experiences with each other. As they travel this journey together, they know they are not alone and feel supported. Grief is an individual and unique process and each person is encouraged to allow themselves to grieve in the manner they choose. Bay City meets at the Bay County Community Center, 800 John F Kennedy Dr. on the 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month throughout the school year.

October 21: 22 members and guests today. Our guest was Cindy Tews, our speaker from <u>Families Against Marcotics</u> (FAN). Cindy shared a rather heart wrenching story about the loss of her son through Opioid Addiction, and a new project started by FAN called "Hope Not Handcuffs".

"Hope Not Handcuffs" is an initiative started by Families Against Narcotics (FAN), aimed at bringing law enforcement and community organizations together in an effort to find viable treatment options for individuals seeking help to reduce dependency with heroin, prescription drugs, and alcohol. It is a solution.

How It Works

A person struggling with any drug addiction can come to any of the participating police agencies and ask for help. They will be greeted with support, compassion, and respect. If accepted into the program, the individual will be guided through a brief intake process to ensure proper treatment.

If a person is uninsured or has Medicaid, we will work directly with the local Office of Substance Abuse Services for placement. If a person has private insurance, we will provide them with treatment options covered by their plan. Regardless, our team will work to get them into treatment as soon as possible. We have more than 600 volunteer Angels, and one of them will help with paperwork and provide compassionate support until a treatment option is found.

To think only of the best, to work only for the best and to expect only the best.


To be just as enthusiastic about the success of others as you are about your own
