

"The Jefferson Project is a plan to renovate and revitalize an often-forgotten area of Downtown Bay City. With an art and technology center, event space, and outdoor sculpture garden, The Jefferson Project will make Downtown Bay City a destination, and a place for people to invest in and foster their community."

This is the Mission Statement of the *Jefferson Project*, a plan, and a dream, of Commercial Photographer **Avram Golden** of Bay City. **Avram** is owner of *Golden Gallery*, located at 113 third Street in Bay City.

Our club met at the building located at 409 First Street in Bay City for lunch Tuesday to see first hand the plans that **Avram** has for the *Jefferson Project*. While the four-story building is not yet ready for public use, The Jefferson Project is a plan to remodel the space inside and out to create an art and technology hub in Downtown Bay City.

## These plans include:

A first-floor manufacturing and industrial space, as well as an outdoor patio and event space.

A second-floor photography studio and display space, with an outdoor balcony for events.

A third-floor innovation and technology lab, complete with 3D printers.

Fourth-floor studio housing for students in the area pursuing a Bachelor of Fine Arts undergraduate degree.

An interactive projection of art on the Bay County Courthouse building.

An outdoor night market lining Jefferson Street, connected to a sculpture park and garden.

While these plans are lofty, he has the backing of many of the local businesses in Bay City, City Council members, Universities, and colleges in the area. After touring the building, and seeing first hand what his plans are, this will truly add much to Bay City's future, and the retaining our youth after graduation.

The building at 409 First Street has been an important part of Bay City history for a long time. Originally built in 1902, the *Hammond Seed Company* used the space to send out seed orders. The building eventually became *Warehouse #3* for the *Jennison Hardware Store* located at 901 N Water Street. For a few years it served as the *Bay City Grocer Company*, before finally becoming the base for the *Riverside Trucking & Storage Company*. In 2021, *Golden Gallery* owner **Avram Golden** bought the building and surrounding property to jump-start his vision: The Jefferson Project.

	"No Kid Sleeps On The Floor In Our Town"

For those that were at one of our meetings a while back, you may recognize this as the *Mission Statement* of the organization "Sleep In Heavenly Peace" (SHP). Sleep in Heavenly Peace is a group of volunteers dedicated to finding those children who are sleeping on the floor or otherwise unwanted conditions and delivering hand-built bunk beds free of charge. Each bed that SHP delivers to a child sleeping on the floor offers comfort and safety. The local chapter, headquartered in Auburn, holds a bed build I believe about once a month, and I had the pleasure of joining 38 fellow volunteers in building beds this past Saturday, a first me. Among the 38 were veteran "Bed Builders", BCNOC Members Kim Offenbecker, and Becke Popour. I know Past President Roberta, and if have missed other BCNOC Members I apologize, has joined the "Bed Builders" in the past. The BCNOC supports this organization by buying linens for the beds. For myself, I felt It was a very satisfying few hours of work. There was something for everyone, from sanding, drilling, building, staining, and even branding irons.
