Our guest from Sleep In Heavenly Peace was Brian Rueger. Sleep in Heavenly Peace is a national program where they build beds for families that need them. With there mission statement: NO KID SLEEPS ON THE FLOOR IN OUR TOWN!®, Founded in 2012 in Twin Falls, Idaho, and with over 200 chapters nationwide, Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) is a group of volunteers that builds and delivers beds to children who don't have beds to sleep in.. As of February 2022, the organization has 200 chapters around the United States and has built over 100,000 beds. Our local chapter has built over 1100 beds in the past 3 years, with materials, tool, and monies donated from local businesses. The average cost of a bed is \$450, bedding included. Our club has supported the SHP program for the last 3 years.

MEETING NOTES

Today was a very enjoyable field trip to the Delta College Planetarium Learning Center located in downtown Bay City with one of our own members Tim Murray being our presenter and tour leader Interesting facts about the planetarium:

The planetarium is one of two planetarium in the US built that was fully funded by NASA, the other being in Morgantown, WV.

The land, former location of the Wenona Hotel which burnt to the ground in 1976, was purchased and donated by General Motors to Delta College for the planetarium

BCNOC provided the seed money to start the *Big Universe Scholarship* program, a scholarship that helps schools provide bus transportation for students to attend the planetarium for programs

7,365 students attended programs at the planetarium in 2022

There are 7 classrooms, and a computer lab, and over 1,00 college students enroll in classes at the planetarium annually

29,403 visitors to the planetarium in 2023

The theater is one of the most sophisticated in the world. There is an observation deck which overlooks Bay City and the Saginaw River.

Unfortunately there is no telescope

There are shows weekly throughout the year, with cost of \$7, \$5 for seniors, \$3 for students. Cheep entertainment in my opinion More information can be had by visiting the website: http://delta.edu/planet


