"To Put Christian Principles Into Practice Through Programs That Build A Healthy Spirit. Mind. And Body For All"

This is the Mission Statement of the YMCA. Our program today was lunch and a walking tour of the Dow Bay Area Family YMCA, with our presenter, BCNOC member Jessica Gohs, Accounting Director for the YMCA.

The Young Men's Christian Association arrived in the United States in 1851 in Boston, MA, and it didn't take long to spread across the country, with the first YMCA being founded in Bay City in 1885. Since its inception, individuals from all walks of life have come to the YMCA in search of refuge, commonalities with others, and a drive to further their individual health and wellness.

With the help of generous donations from the Dow Chemical Corporation, as well as thousands of private contributions, the current 96,400 sq. ft. facility opened its doors on December 27, 2011, with the formal dedication being on January 25, 2012. Today the Dow Bay Area Family YMCA boasts a total membership of over 7,000 members.

Although the Dow Bay Area Family YMCA facility is known for its amenities such as a large Fitness Floor with strength and cardio machines, group exercise classes, 4 lane lap pool, leisure pool, spa, waterslide, gyms, paddleball courts, steam room, sauna, and 24/7 Fitness access (18+), the Bay City YMCA is much more than just a "gym and swim." The YMCA's cause is to build the foundations of our community through three focus areas: youth development, healthy living, and social responsibility. The Y provides licensed childcare services on a year-round basis from birth to five, and it provides positive role models for school age children through summer day camp and afterschool programming. The Y also provides opportunities to learn about teamwork, fun, and fair play through a wide variety of youth and adult sports programming, including Youth Basketball Academy (YBA), Youth Volleyball Academy (YVA), Youth Flag Football League (YFFL). It addresses food insecurity in our area through its Free Youth Food Program, supported by the USDA/Michigan Department of Education, and provides emergency food boxes for pick up or delivery to those in need. Dow Bay Area Family YMCA also teaches children and adults to be safe around water and enjoy its healing benefits through aquatics programming and education and supports chronic disease prevention through a life-long progression of evidence-based health and fitness initiatives like the Diabetes Prevention Program and Enhance Fitness. There are also many family programming opportunities, with more to come with a future community kitchen project and outdoor YMCA Uptown Park project currently in the works!

In 2021 alone, the Dow Bay Area Family YMCA provided over 61,630 meals and snacks to youth in Bay County, taught 693 kids safety around water, provided financial assistance for 337 families, provided licensed childcare to over 200 children, and so much more...
