October 29

Our program today was **Jeff Larsen** from the “American Cancer Society of Great Lakes Bay” region. **Jeff** has been with the American Cancer Society for about 4 1/2 years. He stated that nationwide, donations are down substantially this year due to COVID 19 and many fund raisers having to be cancelled, such as *Relay For Life*. Some golf outings have been held supporting *Making Strides Against Breast Cancer*, but many more events have been canceled than ongoing, but there are many donors that are still willing to donate when asked.

Every dollar raised helps ACS save lives from breast cancer through early detection and prevention, innovative breast cancer research, and patient support. They are currently funding more than \$64 million in breast cancer research grants nationwide. ACS also provide free, comprehensive information and support to those touched by breast cancer when and where they need it. And, ACS helps people take steps to reduce their breast cancer risk or find it early, when it may be easier to treat.

Did you know:

In 2019, more than 268,600 women are expected to be newly diagnosed with breast cancer in the U.S., and an estimated 41,760 women are expected to die from the disease.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer diagnosed in women (excluding skin cancer) and second only to lung cancer as a cause of cancer death in women.

Breast cancer does not just affect women. More than 2,600 men in the U.S. are expected to be diagnosed this year and an estimated 500 are expected to die from the disease.

Breast cancer in men is rare, accounting for less than 1 percent of breast cancer cases in the US. However, men are more likely than women to be diagnosed with advanced-stage breast cancer, which likely reflects decreased awareness and delayed detection because screening mammography is not recommended for men due to the rarity of the disease.

Due to the infrequency of male breast cancer, much less is known about the disease than female breast cancer.

Breast cancer death rates have declined by 40% since 1989, contributing to 348,800 lives saved.

The five-year relative survival rate for breast cancer that has not spread to the lymph nodes or other location is 99%.

During the month of October, the “Real Men Wear Pink” event is being held as in previous years. Men participate by wearing pink each day in October and soliciting donations from friends, family, coworkers, etc. **Paul Gaiser** is participating and we will be sending an email providing a link to donate, if you are interested. 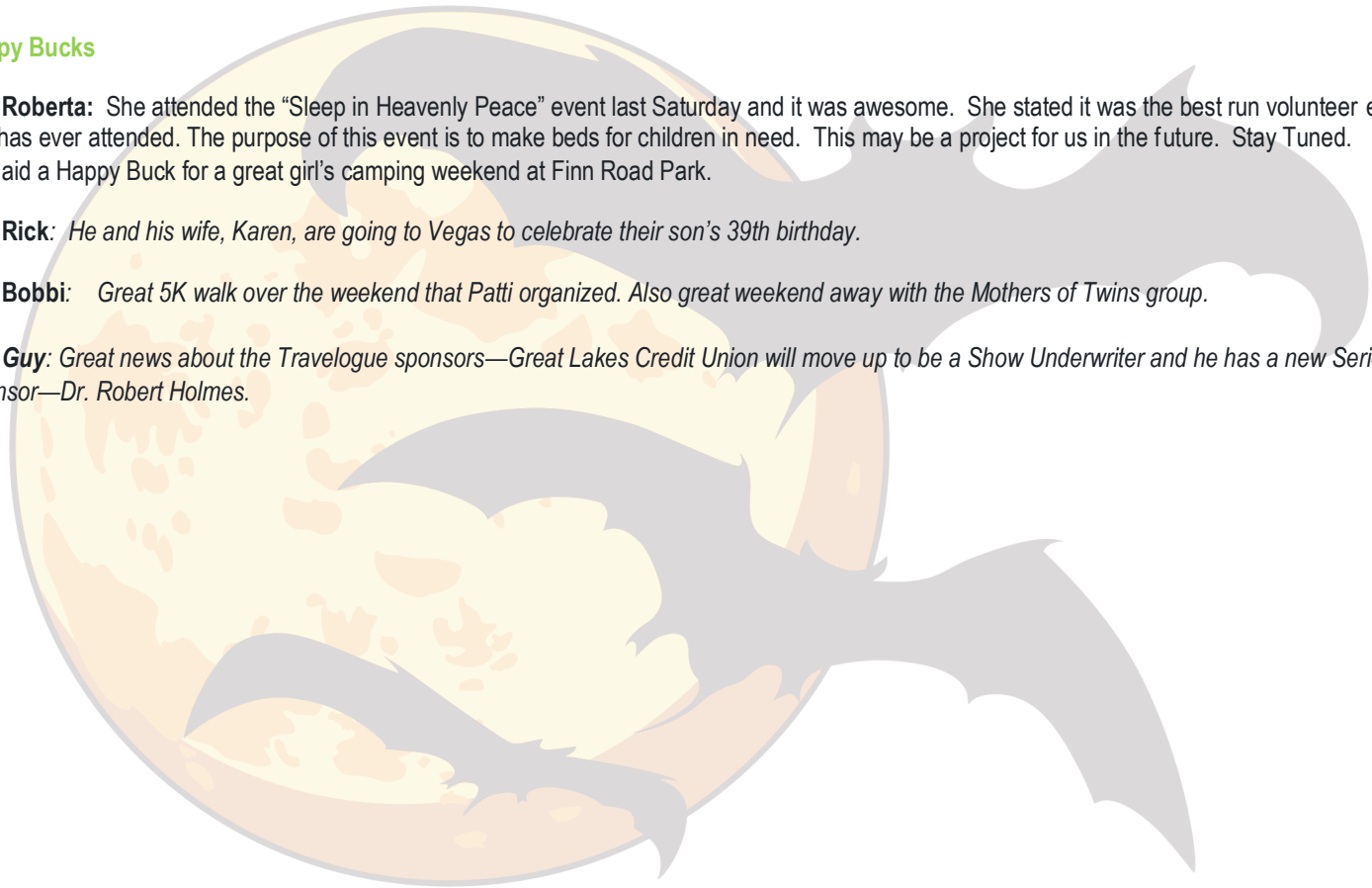
Happy Bucks
