MMCAA mission is helping individuals and families become self sufficient, and runs at least 3 programs for the homeless. The first provides homeless assistance to anyone in need. The 2nd provides homeless assistance to veterans, and their families. Both programs include:

Temporary housing
Rent assistance
Security deposits
Case management

The Veterans program also provides:

Utility payment assistance Transportation assistance Moving costs.

The 3rd program is known as RYSE (Runaway Youth Support & Engagement)
This program is broken into two separate programs

The 1st works with youth 12-20 yrs of age. MMCAA works with youth who are contemplating running away, or feel they need a safe place to live. MMCAA then works with both the child and their family, over a 90 day period, in hopes of getting the child to return home.

The 2nd program is for youth 17-20 yrs of age. This program teaches the child in the skills of:

Daily Living

Self care

NEW MEMBER INCENTIVES

During the *Centennial year (2018-2019), Optimist International* does offer us some membership incentives to assist us for the 2018-2019 Optimist year, which are as follows:

Persons under 30 years of age can join for \$50 dues for the first year, with no application fee.

Persons involved in the education system can join for \$50 dues for the first year, with no application fee. This is not only for teachers but is for anyone in the education system, currently working, or retired.

"Homecoming" membership incentive is for former members who would like to renew their membership during this Centennial Optimist year.

Their dues are \$50 for the first year, with no application fee.

On August 23-25, 2019 the Michigan District Optimist Convention will be held at the DoubleTree Hotel and Conference Center in Bay City. Our Club has the honor/privilege to serve as the host Club for this event.

Obviously, we will need volunteers from our Club to help make this a very successful event and showcase our great city. Listed below are the volunteer opportunities and time frames when we will need help. We will appreciate your help wherever you would like to assist and for whatever time frame you are available (you do not have to volunteer for the entire time listed),

Greeters--we plan to have greeters in the lobby and at the doors for the convention center to welcome people and direct them to where they need to go, as well as answer any questions they may have. On Friday from noon - 8:00 pm we will need 4 individuals (2 in the hotel lobby and 2 by the convention center doors). On Saturday from 7:30 - 10:00 a.m. we will need 4 individuals (2 in the hotel lobby and 2 by the convention center doors).

Registration--On Friday we will need 2 - 3 people from 11:30 a.m. - 2:30 p..m and 2 - 3 people from 4:00 - 6:30 p.m. On Saturday we will need 2 - 3 people from 6:45 - 10:00 a.m.

Friday evening there will be a hospitality room open from 8:00 - 10:30 p.m. On Friday afternoon we will need 3-4 people to help with set up from 3:00 - 4:00. During the time the hospitality room is open, we will need 4-6 (or more) people to serve as greeters, meet and mingle, and refill supplies as needed. After the hospitality room closes, we will need 3-4 people to assist with clean up.

On Saturday evening after the dinner at the Double Tree, we will need 2-3 people outside to direct people where to go for the cruise on the Princess Wenonah (the boat will be docked by the Double Tree). Boarding begins at 6:30 p.m. and the cruise will depart at 7:30 p.m.

With the Optimist District Convention in our home town, I'm Optimistic that many of our Optimist Club members will attend the meetings as well as the social events that are being offered. Our Club pays the registration fee for all members that attend the business session and breakout sessions, and this registration fee includes lunch.

On Saturday evening a cruise on the Princess Wenonah is offered as a fellowship event. The cost for this is \$20.00 per person. The Board has generously approved paying \$10 for each member and one guest that participate in this event. The boat fee needs to be paid to the Michigan District by August 10th, so your \$10 payment per person will be due to me when you make your reservation. I will submit one check from our Club to the Michigan District.

I will have registration forms and a sign up sheet for the cruise at our weekly luncheons. If you would like to attend the convention and/or the cruise but are not able to join us on Tuesdays to sign up, please contact me and I will sign you up.

Please feel free to invite guests to the convention and/or the boat cruise; however, the Club will not cover expenses for the guests.
