

<u>Cell Group:</u> Every Monday at 6pm we meet up, eat food, and discuss all things God, Faith, and Life related. For 14+



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## M.A.D

The Make A Difference (M.A.D) Birmingham project is a Sport Birmingham open access youth development programme. M.A.D Birmingham works with community partners, residents, parents and schools to provide a sustainable offer that has evolved from open access youth clubs and outreach services, to

a tailored sports-driven mentoring programme for young people aged 11-16.



The aim of the mentoring programme is to work with young people who face personal and social disadvantage or circumstances that make it difficult for them to cope within formal structures. The referred pupils engage in a 6-week personal development programme that encourages them to reflect on their current and previous behaviours, equip them with life skills to assist their development both within and outside of the school setting and help them to transfer their learning into real life situations. The programme comprises of classroom, scenario-based delivery which is then incorporated within a practical setting using sport and physical activities. Importantly, M.A.D is young person-lead, meaning that activities are informed by the young people and based on their needs and interests.

## The Epiphany People

Supporting families with the emerging challenges of bringing up children in urban communities. By supporting families through the difficult stage of parenting and help aid their child's successful transition to adulthood

## **Our services**

We offer telephone and face to face support. We understand what families go through and offer support and advice with your child and working with professionals.

The helpline provides much-needed support to families impacted by child criminal exploitation during the Covid-19 lockdown. As families impacted by child criminal exploitation during lockdown are faced with increasing pressures. We work with families to support them over the phone and face to face. To provide a muchneeded outlet and a source of support. By providing this community-led academically informed grassroots service to families, this will improve trust on how to navigate social services and the criminal justice system.

**PEERENT**: (Positive Environment Encourages Restorative Exchanges Nurturing Transition). This bespoke 12 week parent programme looks at the realities of bringing up a Millennial child in the UK and the unique challenges that come with living in areas impacted by serious youth violence and criminal exploitation. This brings to the attention contextual safeguarding parenting approaches.

The aim is to move away from solely punitive responses and to consider restorative parenting approaches, safeguarding, building family resilience and safety as important characteristics for families. Through consultation, many parents have acknowledged that their families are under increasing pressure and are desperate for answers, solutions and support.



#### DARREN LAVILLE CEO

Darren is a youth worker and educator who use's his professional knowledge and personal experience to drive forward the mission of The Epiphany People CIC.

In March 2016 he personally felt the impact that serious youth violence can have on families when he lost his own son. Then 6 months later when he lost a young man he cared for, to county lines. This along with the reality of the impact that youth violence and crime are having on many families within the communities he works with and lives in, Darren has made it his personal mission to tackle the problem. and save lives.

Whether their settings are predominantly or all white or extremely multicultural, the aim of these sessions is to ensure that seemingly 'normalised practices' are reassessed, reflected upon and changed to ensure that anti-racist practice is a thread that runs throughout the infrastructure of play.

#### <u>Black boy joy</u>

This course is suitable for parents, carers and Early Years practitioners and will examine the systemic racism within the U.K. and how it disrupts, disenfranchises, criminalises and marginalises Black boys by the time that they are 5 years old.

Liz Pemberton (she/her) is the Director of The Black Nursery Manager Ltd - a training & consultancy firm which focuses on anti-racist practice within the Early Years. With 16 years in the education sector, Liz's roles have included Secondary School Teacher (QTS), public speaker and Nursery Manager. 
