



The original equipment at KN9STH (Novice Class call) was a Hallicrafters S-107 receiver and a WRL Globe Chief 90A transmitter. Antennas during this time were a 40-meter dipole and a 15-meter 2-element home brew yagi.



When I upgraded to General Class in October 1959 I added a WRL 755 VFO and a WRL SM-90 screen modulator. The antennas during this time were a 270 foot long true Zepp for 160, 80, 40, 20, and 10 meters. The 15-meter antenna was the home brew 2-element yagi.



Shortly after moving to the present address in April of 1972 the station looked like this. On the left is a Motorola C53GKB 2-meter FM base station with a separate Motorola 2-meter receiver on top. On top of that is a Motorola Mocom 10 base station that was on the local police department frequency (I was authorized by the police chief to have this station).

On the first level of the console are the antenna switching console; a Central Electronics MM-2 scope; a Collins 516F-2 power supply; Collins 32S-3 transmitter; Collins 75S-3A receiver; Collins 75S-3 receiver; Collins 312B-4 console.

On the second level are a Heath SB-200 linear; Heath VHF-1 "Seneca" transmitter; Johnson Ranger (Ranger I) transmitter; Collins 75A-2 receiver; BC-348 receiver. On top of the 75A-2 is an Allied AX-190 receiver.
