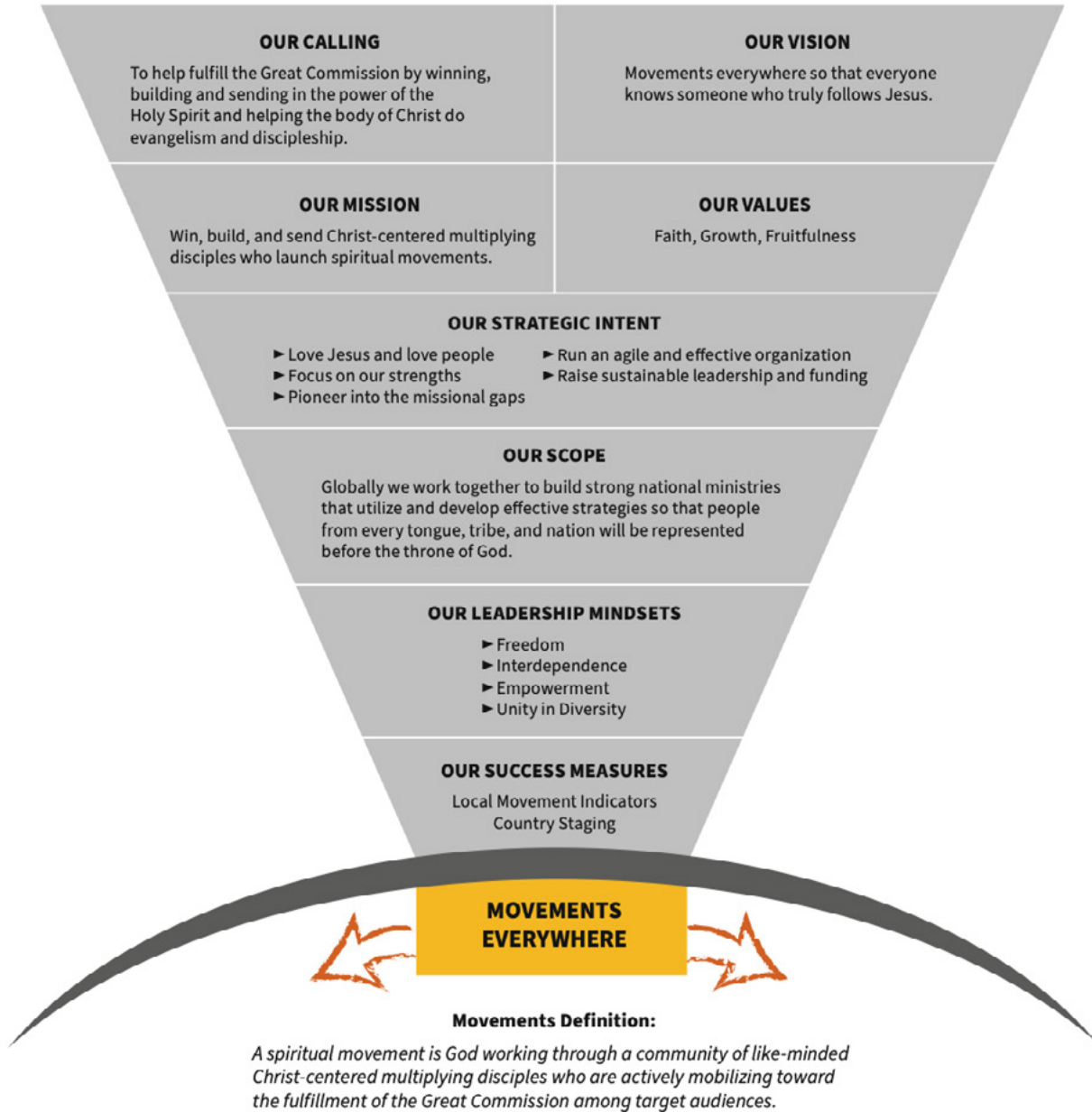

THE STATEMENT OF FAITH OF CAMPUS CRUSADE FOR CHRIST

The sole basis of our beliefs is the Bible, God's infallible written Word, the 66 books of the Old and New Testaments. We believe that it was uniquely, verbally and fully inspired by the Holy Spirit and that it was written without error in the original manuscript. It is the supreme and final authority in all matters on which it speaks.

We accept those large areas of doctrinal teaching on which, historically, there has been general agreement among all true Christians. Because of the specialised calling of our movement, we desire to allow for freedom of conviction on other doctrinal matters, provided that any interpretation is based upon the Bible alone and that no such interpretation shall become an issue which hinders the ministry to which God has called us.

We explicitly affirm our belief in basic Bible teaching as follows:



1. There is one true God, eternally existing in three persons--Father, Son and Holy Spirit--each of whom possesses equally all the attributes of deity and the characteristics of personality. Deuteronomy 6:4; Matthew 28:18; John 1:1-3, 18; Acts 5:3,4.
2. Jesus Christ is God, the living Word, who became flesh through His miraculous conception by the Holy Spirit and His virgin birth. Hence, He is a perfect deity and true humanity united in one person forever. John 1:1, 14; Matthew 1:18-25; Luke 1:30-37; Colossians 2:9; Philippians 2:6-11.
3. He lived a sinless life and voluntarily atoned for the sins of men by dying on the cross as their substitute, thus satisfying divine justice and accomplishing salvation for all who trust in Him alone. 1 John 3:5; 1 Peter 3:18; John 10:17-18; 2 Corinthians 5:21; 1 John 4:10; Romans 3:24-26.
4. He rose from the dead in the same body, though glorified, in which He had lived and died. 1 Corinthians 15:4; 14; Luke 24:36-43; John 20:24-29.
5. He ascended bodily into heaven and sat down at the right hand of God the Father where He, the only mediator between God and man, continually makes intercession for His own. Acts 1:9-11; Ephesians 1:20; 1 Timothy 2:5; Hebrews 7:24,25; 1 John 2:1,2.
6. Man was originally created in the image of God. He sinned by disobeying God; thus, he was alienated from his Creator. That historic fall brought all mankind under divine condemnation. Genesis 1:26-27; 2:15-17; 3:1-24; Romans 5:12-21; 1 Corinthians 15:21,22.
7. Man's nature is corrupted, and he is thus totally unable to please God. Every man is in need of regeneration and renewal by the Holy Spirit. Romans 3:9-20; Ephesians 2:1-7; Mark 7:20-23; John 3:1-21; Titus 3:5-7.
8. The salvation of man is wholly a work of God's free grace and is not the work, in whole or in part, of human works of goodness or religious ceremony. God imputes His righteousness to those who put their faith in Christ alone for their salvation, and thereby justifies them in His sight. Ephesians 2:8-10; Romans 3:21-26; 9:30-33; Galatians 3:1-14; 22-24.
9. It is the privilege of all who are born again

- of the Spirit to be assured of their salvation from the very moment in which they trust Christ as their Saviour. This assurance is not based upon any kind of human merit, but is produced by the witness of the Holy Spirit, who confirms in the believer the testimony of God in His written Word. 1 Thessalonians 1:5; John 1:12; 1 John 5:9-13; Romans 8:14-17.
10. The Holy Spirit has come into the world to reveal and glorify Christ and to apply the saving work of Christ to men. He convicts and draws sinners to Christ, imparts new life to them, continually indwells them from the moment of spiritual birth and seals them until the day of redemption. His fullness, power and control are appropriated in the believer's life by faith. John 16:7-15; Titus 3:5; John 3:5-8; Romans 8:9; Ephesians 1:13-14; 4:30; 1 Corinthians 6:19; Galatians 3:2-3; Romans 8:2-4.
 11. Every believer is called to live in the power of the indwelling Spirit so that he will not fulfil the lust of the flesh but will bear fruit to the glory of God. Galatians 5:16-25; Ephesians 5:18.
 12. Jesus Christ is the Head of the Church, His Body, which is composed of all men living and dead, who have been joined to Him through saving faith. Colossians 1:18; Ephesians 1:22-23; 5:23-32; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18.
 13. God admonishes His people to assemble together regularly for worship, for participation in ordinances, for edification through the Scriptures and for mutual encouragement. Hebrews 10:23-25; Acts 2:42; 20:7; 1 Corinthians 12:20-28; 16:1-2; Ephesians 4:11-16; 1 Timothy 4:13; 2 Timothy 3:16, 4:2
 14. At physical death the believer enters immediately into eternal, conscious fellowship with the Lord and awaits the resurrection of his body to everlasting glory and blessing. 2 Corinthians 5:8; Philippians 1:23-24; Luke 23:39-43; 1 Corinthians 15:12-58; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; 1 John 3:2; Philippians 3:21.
 15. At physical death the unbeliever enters immediately into eternal, conscious separation from the Lord and awaits the resurrection of his body to everlasting judgement and condemnation. Luke 16:19-31; John 5:23-29; Revelation 20:10-15; Matthew 13:40-43.
 16. Jesus Christ will come again to the earth--personally, visibly, and bodily--to consummate history and the eternal plan of God. Acts 1:9-11; 3:19-21; Revelation 19:1-22; 21.
 17. The Lord Jesus commanded all believers to proclaim the Gospel throughout the world and to disciple men of every nation. The fulfilment of the Great Commission requires that all worldly and personal ambitions be subordinated to a total commitment to "Him who loved us and gave Himself for us." Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16; Luke 24:46-49; Acts 1:7-8; Romans 12:1-2; Galatians 2:19-20; Philippians 3:7-21.



KEY MINISTRY STRATEGIES

The strategies of the Ministry serve as a guide for us to build spiritual movements worldwide and fulfil the Great Commission. They aid us in prioritising and achieving our divine calling.

There are six main strategies employed by the Ministry in Ghana.

1.Student-led Movements (SLM) – The Ministry employs creative approaches to share the gospel with college and university students, preparing them to be effective leaders with godly influence in their current and future endeavours.



2.Leader Strategies (LS) – The Ministry designs successful methods for evangelism that target executives, professionals, and other influential leaders in society. This is achieved by training, organising conferences, seminars, and facilitating Bible study groups that enable these leaders to make a positive impact for Christ in their present and future areas of influence.



3.Global Church Movements (GCM) – The Ministry provides training and resources for pastors and church leaders on effective evangelism, discipleship, and church planting strategies.



4.Digital Strategies (DS) - Offers multiple opportunities for people to follow Jesus and become multiplying disciples by helping teams and missional communities use online media and digital tools in effective ways.



5.Capacity Accelerators support and accelerate the other Strategies - Consist of Leadership Development / Human Resources (LDHR), Operations Capacity, and Fund Development.



6.Prayer Ministry - Launches prayer-inspired movements by recruiting (winning), training (building), and deploying (sending) spirit-filled multiplying intercessors.

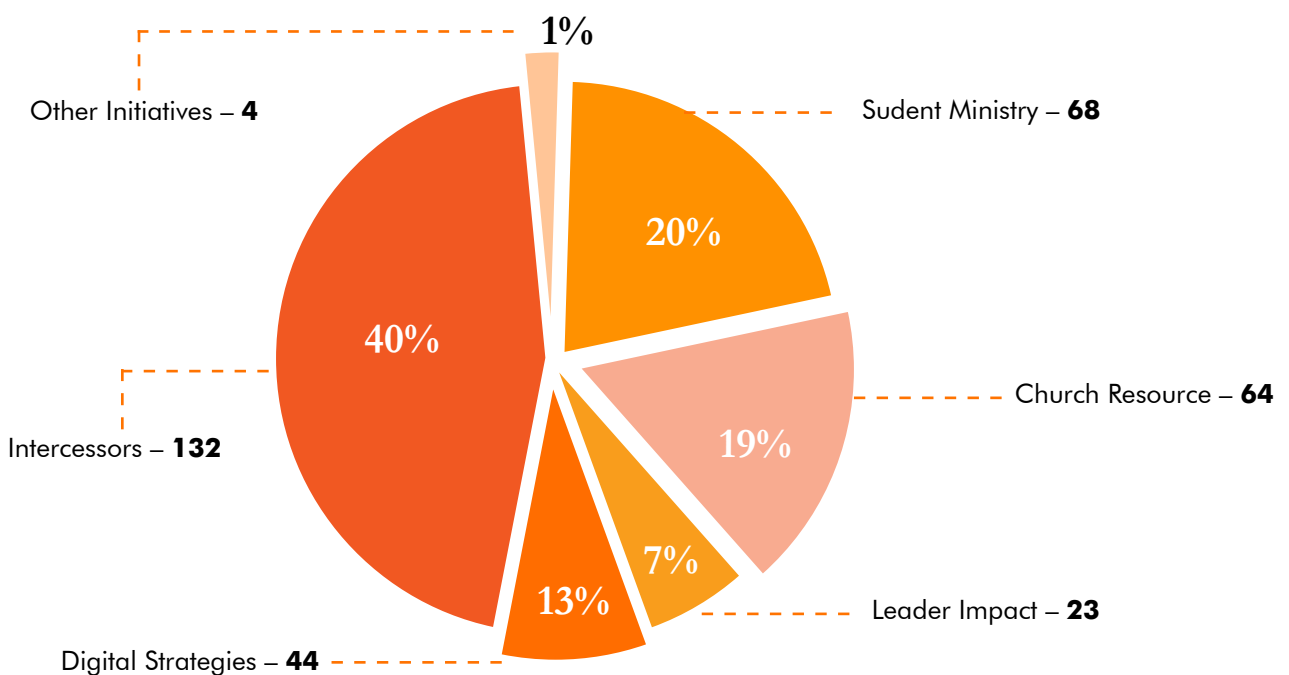
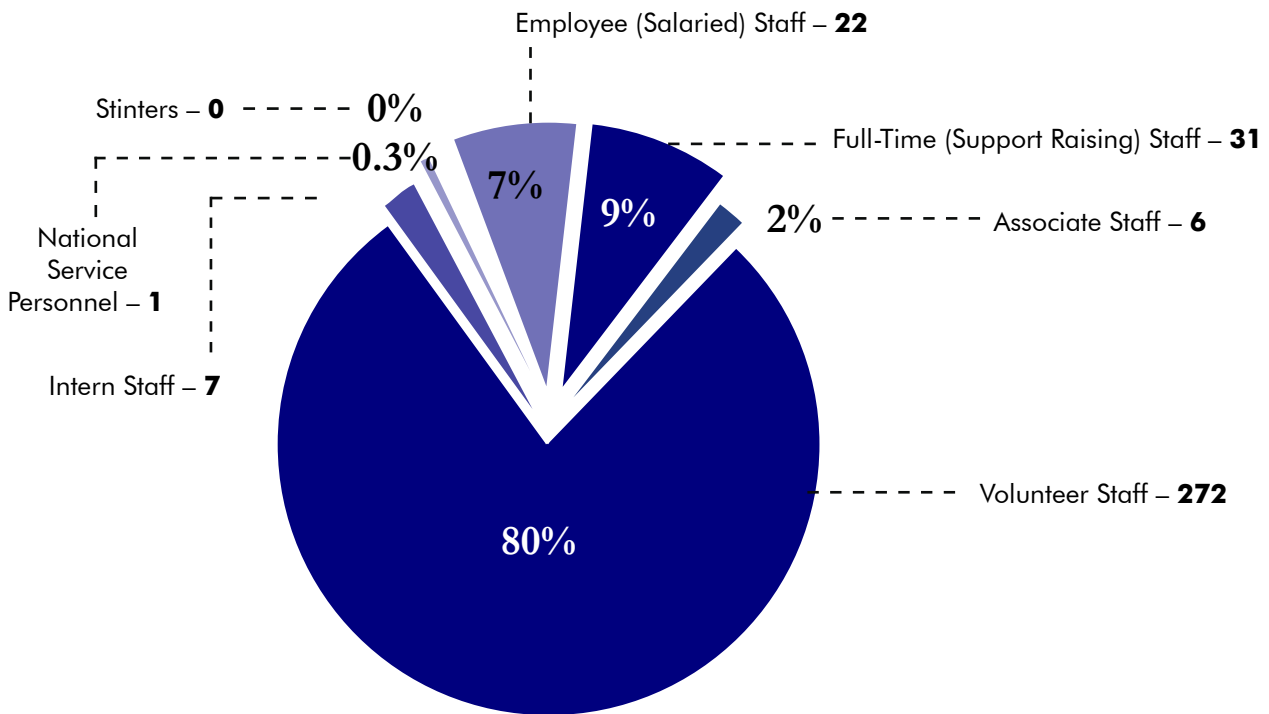

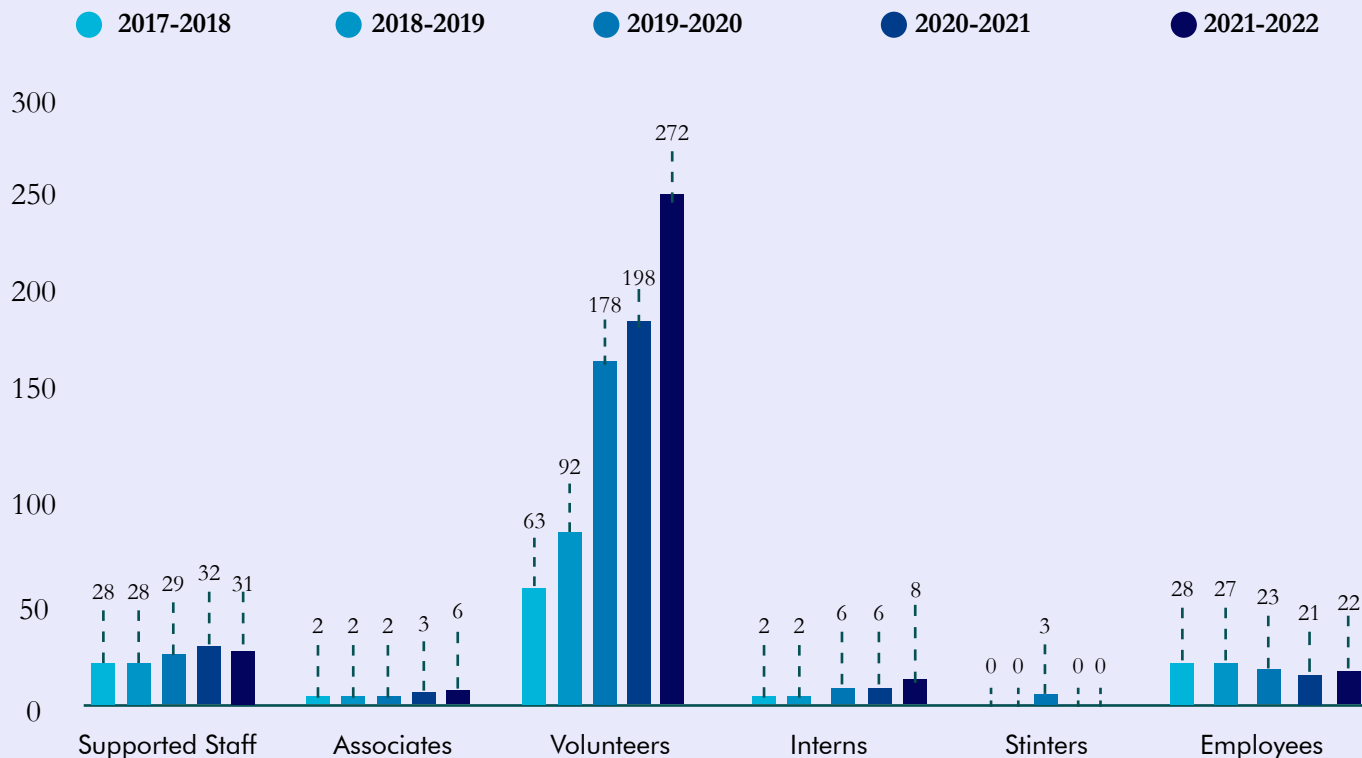

STAFF COMPARATIVE CHART FOR 5 YEARS



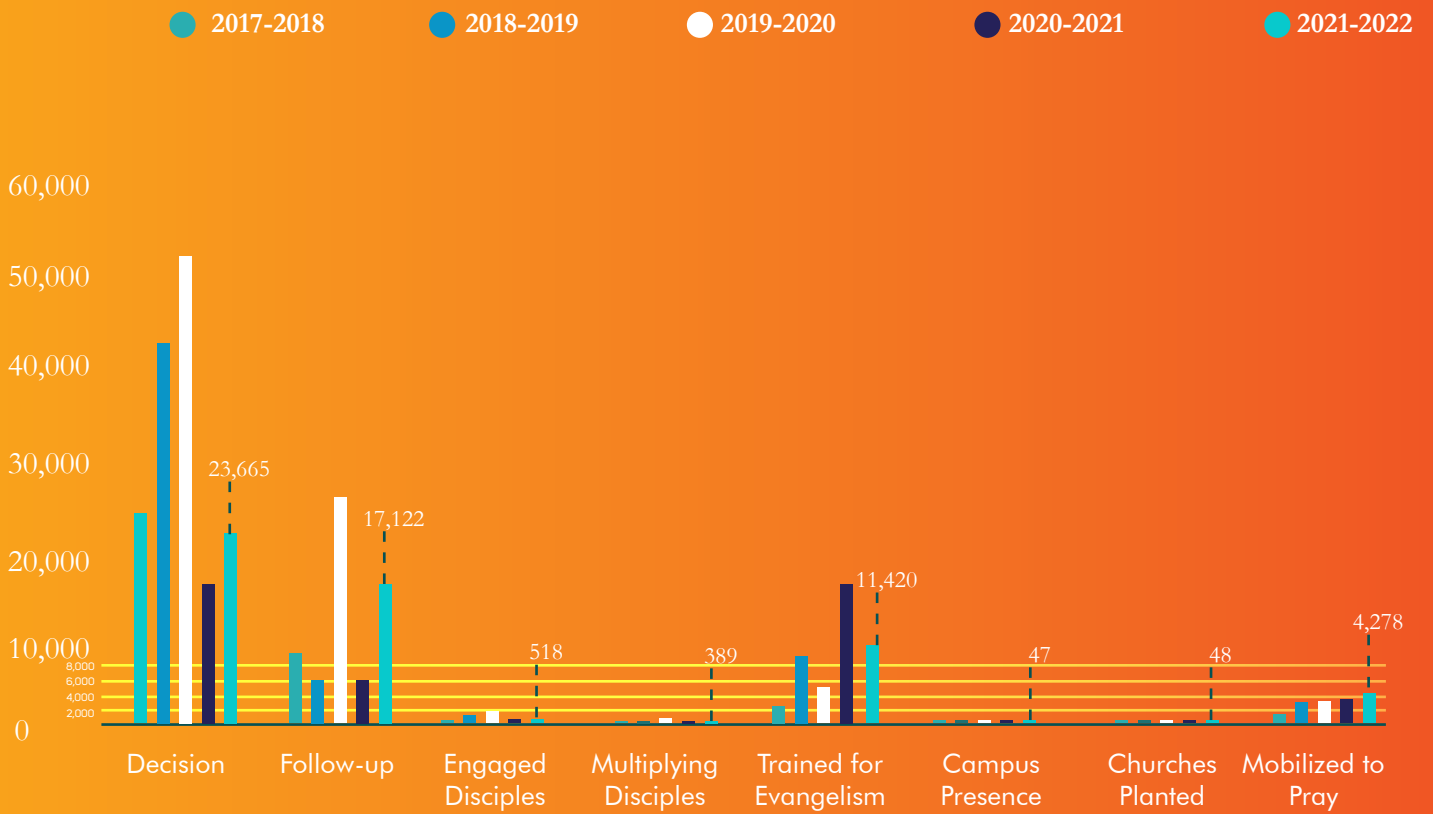

Here is an overview of the ministry strategies and activities that contributed to the National Summary Statistical Results.

B. STUDENT-LED MOVEMENT (Campus Ministry) UPDATES

The campus ministry had a successful ministry within the year under review. Though the academic calendars of most institutions were yet to reverse to the usual trend, ministry was fairly stable, with the effects of COVID 19 substantially lessened.

The Staff and Students had several activities using the **WIN, BUILD, SEND** process to reach many for the Lord and disciple them.

EXPOSE & WIN (Evangelism)

Through various evangelistic activities such as Surveys, Entertainment with a Purpose (EWAP), Lecture Hall Evangelism and Digital Outreaches, **5,056** students were exposed to the gospel across the campuses with **334** indicating decisions for Christ. The booklet on “How to experience the Spirit-filled life” was shared with **128** students. Through the Students Vacation Missions (which is held outside of campus), **7,349** people heard the gospel with **1,011** indicating decisions for Christ. **2,897** people watched the “Walking with Jesus” follow-up video series.

In all, **12,405** were exposed to the gospel with **1,345** indicating decisions for Christ.

BUILD (Follow up & Discipleship)

1. Follow Up & Discipleship

The Building phase was characterised by the development of disciples through small group discipleship meetings, large group weekly meetings, seminars, social events and projects. Some of the materials used included the Spirit-filled Life Booklet, discipleship materials and the New Life Training Curriculum. Multiplying Discipleship was emphasised on the major campuses resulting in a first to third generation discipleship chain (**83—232—456**). We recorded **315** multiplying disciples, exceeding the target for the academic year. Coaching via phone calls was used generally for building on catalytic campuses. However, 30 catalytic campuses were physically visited.

2. Prayer Meetings

Prayer activities such as Students Weekly Prayer Meetings, Staff Weekly Prayer Meetings, retreats, and online prayer meetings were held across campuses within the academic year. The fasting retreats were usually at the beginning of the semester and at major events such as vacation missions. There were over **95** intercessors involved in prayer this academic year.

SEND (Training Disciples to Win, Build Others and Mobilise Resources)

1. Training for Action:

a) Coaches and Student Leaders' Equipping and Retreat (CASLER 2021)

The focus of this year's CASLER was to equip recruited volunteers in basic evangelism and discipleship. For most of the coaches, this was a refresher course to help them practise, coach and teach on catalytic campuses. CASLER 2021 was held online from December 8 – 12, 2021. A total of **72** staff and selected student leaders were in attendance.

The sessions for the Volunteer Coaches included, basic evangelism using the Four Spiritual Laws, basic follow-up/discipleship using the Spirit-filled Life booklet, as well as, other follow-up materials. Others included coaches job description, distant coaching and reporting.

The movements and emerging movements focused on the KNUST Campus Ministry best practices of survey and digital outreach, as well as its variance "Pass-it-On".

All campuses were involved in engaging and praying through the national strategic plan for July 2021 to June 2022.

b) New Life Training Course (NLTC)/School of Evangelism & Discipleship (SED)

About **300** students were trained at various levels of NLTC and Basic Training on the usage of the Pictorial Four Laws Booklet.

Our abridged basic training of PENZA (Pentecost Students and Associates) Ghana this year was done on zoom and recorded for further training of others.

A total of **2,893** PENZA students were trained. During the outreaches, over **1,200** people heard the gospel with **904** people indicating decisions for Christ, and **604** people were followed up. Below are some of the stories from the PENZA:

A headmaster who happened to be an elder of the Church of Pentecost and a teacher in a basic school, helped to mobilise the students for evangelism. A commercial sex worker came to church and accepted Christ on the 20th of February 2022 as a result of our outreach.

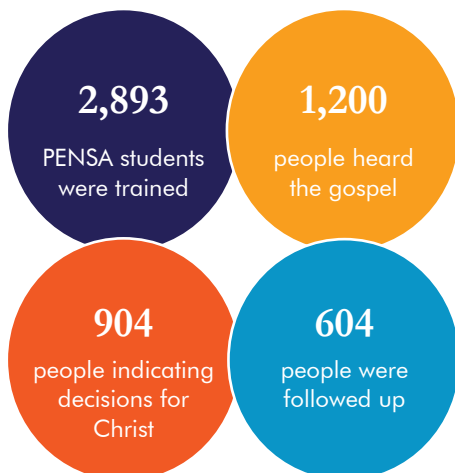

c) "M" Background Evangelism and Discipleship

The "M" background evangelism and discipleship is a West Africa wide project towards equipping people, especially students, to be able to effectively engage Muslims (M) with the gospel. Ghana's target is to have about 1000 "M" believers, through equipping and coaching of 50 students/volunteers by 2024.

The initial training took place online from December 17 -19, 2021 for 30 people recruited from 5 campuses in the northern regions which were:



2. SENDING LIFETIME LABOURERS:

1. The Simon Diedong Dombo University of Business and Integrated Development (SDD UBIDS), Wa, Upper West Region
2. The C. K. Tedam University of Technology and Applied Science (CK-UTAS), Navrongo
3. St. John Bosco’s College of Education (SJBCE), Navrongo
4. The Bolgatanga Technical University (BTU), Bolgatanga
5. Zuarungu Nurses and Midwifery Training College (ZNMTC), Bolgatanga

The second training took place in Tamale from June 17 -19, 2022. Prior to this, a survey was done on sustenance of “M” background converts in Christianity. In all, 42 people have been trained so far.

a) Life Objective Seminar (LOS)

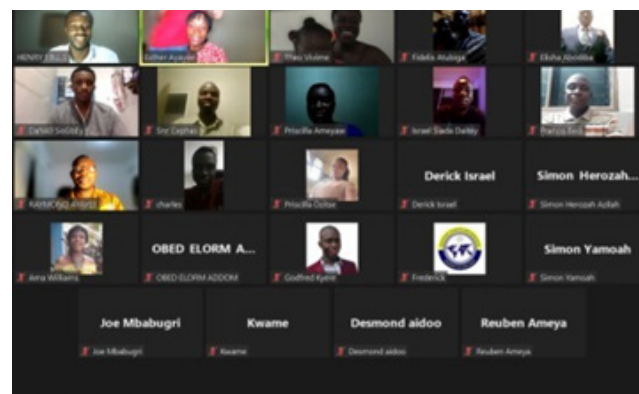
At the Life Objective Seminar, provision was made for final year students to understand and pursue their calling. Some of the areas covered were:

- 1 Living with an Eternal Perspective
- 2 Discerning God’s Will
- 3 Identifying your Calling
- 4 Profession/Entrepreneurship as Ministry
- 5 Q & As on Marriage, Parental Consent for Ministry Involvement, etc.

Over 50 people were challenged for LOS. 48 people registered and 35 participated. Decisions at LOS include: Full Time Staff 5, Associates 6, Volunteers/Coaches 8, and local interns

b) Campus Launch and Sustenance

Catalytic campus work was done on **47** campuses via coaching on phone. Of these, **30** were physically visited. Catalytic work was spread throughout the calendar year, overlapping the 2022/2023 academic year, especially new campus launch schedules.

c) "Go North" Missions

i. "Go North" Vacation Missions

The 2021 project took place in 40 communities, with **7,349 (Upper West 3,518 & Upper East 3,768)** people exposed to the Gospel. **1,011** decisions were made for Christ via the Jesus Film. About **3,000** of those exposed to the gospel were taken through basic follow-up, using the "Walking with Jesus" Video Series. Out of the **40 communities, 10** were in the Upper East Region, with the major towns being: Chiana, Sirigu and Sarpanatinga.

The rest of the **30 communities** were in the Upper West region, specifically, Wa West District. They include: Gojijirii, Kawu, Kpamfa, Kachiau, Bonche, Chabare, Dariwadu, Talewona, Ponyomayiri, Darteng, Kikilapare, Dableyiri, Jaguluu, Kantu, Tokale, Tuole, Kendu, Yuonuri, Baa-objon, Tieyiri, Dekaatama, Dodoma, Dalateng, Tomegyie, Tankara, Dogbalpare, Donye, Mevor, Dompie and Dochere.

The Jesus Film Languages used were mainly Southern Birifor, Wala and Dagare in the Upper West; and Grune, Kusaal as well as Kasem in the Upper East Region.

The project included pre-blitz preparations, blitz, and post-blitz activities. The pre-blitz activities included fund development, training, prayer and fasting, as well as, logistical preparations for the project.

The blitz phase included Film Crusades,

House-to-House, School Outreaches, Community Services, Donations, Trainings, and Church Planting/Strengthening.

The post blitz period was mainly characterised by equipment repairs/servicing, reports preparation, debriefing and logistical redistribution.

We partnered with the Church of Pentecost and the Ghana Baptist Convention in the Upper East. In the Upper West, the churches involved were the Church of Pentecost, Love Community Church Int. and Harvest for Christ.

In the Wa West district of the Upper West region, **51 orphans and 39 widows** in the communities were identified. It was noted that many of the orphans served on farms and did other chores rather than being in school. Many also lacked basic health care. Most of the widows who were “M” background converts had been neglected by their families because of their conversion. Food and basic shelter were among the urgent needs identified. As part of the project, the orphans and widows were served with some basic food provisions. Ten of the widows were in critical health conditions. The project later made provision for **10 acres of land** to be ploughed for these widows to farm and alleviate their hardship.

ii. "Go North Missions" Via the National Service Scheme

Millicent Botwe is currently the only person enrolled to serve as a missionary in Northern Ghana through the National Service Scheme. She is serving in a targeted area in the Upper West Region.

iii. "Go North" International Internship

Preparation is ongoing to send another team from Ghana to serve in the Gambia. The essence of this project is to have Ghana SLM help Gambian students to build capacity to reach their nation, as well as, other surrounding nations with common local languages.

3. DEVELOPING LOCAL RESOURCES

A total of Gh¢38,600 was raised locally through letters, tally cards, offerings etc.

4. PARTNERSHIPS & COLLABORATIONS

Ghana & US Collaborations

The Ghana SLM currently partners with the US Campus Ministry for summer missions and STINT.

"This year's summer mission took place in Tamale and was made up of a team of eleven (11) students and six (6) staff members from the US campus working with both Great Commission Movement of Ghana (GCMG) and International Justice Mission (IJM).

Part of our team worked with an aftercare partner, The King's Village, where our students served as teachers in the basic and Junior High Schools.

About 100 students were engaged with the gospel. 20 were challenged to become key volunteers in sharing the gospel on UDS Nyankpala campus.

CHALLENGES

1. The academic calendar of most campuses kept changing. This was quite disruptive to our plans. We are trusting God for a more stable academic calendar in the subsequent ministry years.
2. In regions where the tertiary campuses were colleges of health and education, access to the students were quite restricted, unlike the university campuses. We hope to make a headway as we keep trying harder and trusting God for the results.



CHANGED LIFE STORIES

1. A Community Closed to the Gospel Now Opens Up

During our mission activities, we realised that a particular community was not included in the list given to us by the Local Council of Churches. We therefore bypassed this community a number of times in our journeys. When we enquired from the Council, we were told that the community had closed its doors to Christianity. There had been a decree by the chief. Everyone was to remain a Muslim.

When we heard this, our hearts were troubled. We sought the face of the Lord in prayer and sent a delegation to the leadership of the community requesting to engage the community with the gospel. By God's grace, this time, they opened up and gave us permission. The response of the indigenes was amazing when the community leadership opened up for us to show the Jesus Film. We had the largest number of viewers at the Jesus Film show for this particular project in this community.

Many received Christ, especially, the women and youth. We also prayed for the Lord's intervention in challenges faced by the indigenes.

On the day of the Jesus Film show, it started to drizzle at a point in time. To our surprise, the regent who was also present at the Jesus Film show stayed in the rain, while even children took cover under shades.

Another amazing thing on that day was that we sought the face of the Lord to stop the rain so we do not lose the Jesus Film show opportunity in this unique village. The Lord heard our prayer and the rain stopped. Guess what! Immediately after we got home after travelling back that night, it started to rain again. This time, it was a storm!

2. Lost for a while, Searching for the Lost

On our way to Dekaatema (Wa West District), we realised that the usual route was destroyed by a river. We therefore had to make our way through the bush with the tricycle. At certain points, we had to cross rivers with no bridges, ending up with the tricycle getting stuck in mud. From around 5:30 pm, we got lost in the bush, until we finally landed in our target community at 10:00pm!

We noticed that the compound we entered had an idol at the centre. That night, some youth came out to meet with us. When we explained our mission, they consulted with the traditional priest, who gave his permission for us to have the Jesus Film in the town. He, however, redirected us to have the final approval from the chief. That night, we visited the chief's palace and by God's grace, got his clearance also. The next day, we came back to Dekaatema and had our film show successfully. A couple of months after the project, feedback got to us by a local pastor that this village where idol worshipping was prominent had experienced a great revival and has become one of the communities in the entire project, with large numbers turning from idol worship to join the church.

3. Salvation through an Accident

At Donye (Wa West District), where the teams lodged for the second phase of the Go North project, there was no electricity and virtually no telephone network in town. Communication was therefore a challenge. While transiting from Donye through Wechiau and Wa to book the transport to Kumasi, I was knocked down by a motorbike and had a shoulder dislocation. At the scene was a man called Yakubu (actual name withheld), who took me to the district hospital in his vehicle. He continued to drive me to the regional hospital, where I was transferred and admitted. When I was discharged the next day to see an orthopaedic specialist, I sought to lodge in a guest house.

However, Yakubu offered to take me home instead of lodging in a guest house. Meanwhile, I was seeking to know from the Lord what He sought to do through this accident. It was then that I realised Yakubu's generosity was unusual. Though a contractor with a big house, Yakubu decided to vacate his own bedroom and offer me that place. In my conversation with him, he mentioned that he was a Muslim. I told him about our mission in the Upper West Region - bringing the saving knowledge of Christ to all. I also narrated the story of the Centurion and Cornelius in the Bible to Yakubu and related it to our conversation, and as I shared with him, Yakubu went on his knees and received Christ as his Lord and Personal Saviour right in his bedroom. Praise be to God!

4. A Policeman Arrested for Christ

During the Go North project in the Upper East Region, the police summoned two of our missionary staff (Georgina and Simon) to the police station for questioning. The two had become witnesses to an issue that was reported to the police. On their way to the police station, Georgina shared Christ with the two police officers who came for them, using the Picture 4 Laws Booklet. At the end of her sharing, one of them accepted Christ as Lord and Saviour.





C. GLOBAL CHURCH MOVEMENT (Church Planting & Resource Ministry) UPDATES

Currently, we have active ministry activities in 13 out of the 16 regions in the country.

1. PRAYER, PRAYER MOBILIZATION & PLANNING

Each church planting team met to review and plan every week, as well as, pray for the souls, their needs, and other national issues. Staff fasted and prayed every Wednesday. A total of **123** prayer intercessors were raised within the period.

2. EXPOSURE/WIN

Through One-on-One outreach and the use of the Jesus Film Products (Jesus Film, Magdalena, and Walking with Jesus Series) with our partner churches, we were able to expose **35,951** people to the gospel, with **8,681** of them indicating decisions to have received Christ.

3. BUILD/TRAIN & SEND

a. Vision Casting

For the year under review, we used vision casting to expose heads of churches to the benefits of going through the Multiplying Church Communities (MC²) Training Strategy.

The MC² is an evangelism, discipleship and church planting training divided into four modules/phases. It helps to train in church planting, raising leaders in the church, sustaining the church and multiplying by planting daughter churches.

We had four (4) vision casting events for over **134** heads of churches and denominational leaders. The locations were: Takoradi, Koforidua, Konongo, Anyininam and Odumasi Krobo.

b. MC² Training & Picture 4 Laws Booklet Training

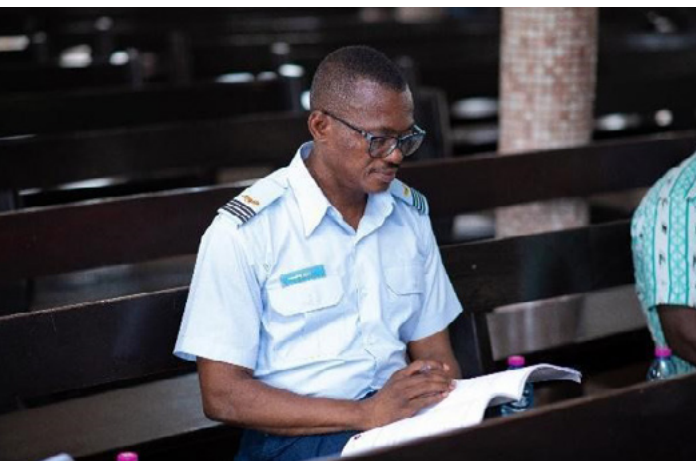
The MC² training was embraced by key leaders including Bishops, Apostles, Evangelists, Pastors and others across the regions. We had **three (3)** Phase One MC² training sessions for **230** Pastors and Church Leaders in Takoradi, Koforidua, Konongo, Anyininam and Odumasi Krobo.

As part of the training for the Apostolic Church in Odumase Krobo, **25** church leaders went for an hour of field outreach. At the end, **39** people heard the gospel with **22** of them indicating decisions for Christ. Out of the **22 people**, **21** of them indicated readiness to join the new church to be planted.

In Takoradi, Bishops took it upon themselves to explain how their churches can support the Ministry using the USSD short code.

One important way to multiply the number of Labourers on the field is to train lots of churches on how to share their faith in Christ.

In all, over **6,438** key leaders in the churches were trained in how to use the Picture 4 Laws Booklet to share their faith in Christ. During the trainings, **458** of the participants prayed to be assured of their salvation and over 1,505 prayed to be filled with the Holy Spirit to experience the Spirit-filled life. The main churches trained within the year included, The Church of Pentecost and The Apostolic Church- Ghana. Others were the Anglican Church, Assemblies of God Church, and some charismatic churches.



Picture Gospel Booklet Trainings

In Accra, the team trained **17** church congregations in the use of the Picture **4** Laws Booklet. The training lasted for 5 Sundays, with one Sunday dedicated to community outreach. Over **958** people were trained. The gospel was shared with **476** people during the outreach and **111** indicated decisions to have received Christ.

Some Comments of Participants from the various Training Sessions

1 *"It was very difficult for me to approach people. This training gave me the opportunity to gather the courage to approach a person to share Christ with him. I am very happy about this." - Vincent*

2 *"I have been desiring to evangelise to some of my fellow market women. But I did not know how to start and even what to say so that they could have the opportunity to receive Christ. This training has not only helped me to lead others to Jesus Christ, but it helped me personally to be sure of my salvation also". -Mrs. Gloria Quow, Galilea Central, Apostolic Church, Kasoa.*

3 *"It is very educational and challenging to me as an individual. It has helped me to understand how important it is for me to go out there and win more souls. I have learnt how to do proper follow-up on the new believers and that it should be done in groups to be effective. I am going to start praying for the souls I have targeted to win for Christ and take the steps of talking to them about Christ."*

4 *"The training has brought to light several things that I had not considered as being factors to consider in evangelism. One thing that was key to me was to include identifying the people of peace and the household of peace in my outreach. I will constitute a strong evangelism and discipleship team in my church and seek to train others with the material and training gained. c. Missions & Projects

i. Madina Missions Project

The Madina Missions Project is a one-year initiative to mobilise, equip and deploy the body of Christ in Madina (Accra) to share the gospel, win and disciple residents within the area.

There are about **245,000** people living within the area with some slums, ghettos, and some unreached people groups. We planned to work with about **150** local church congregations within the area. The project has just started.

ii. Agormenya for Christ

Agormenya for Christ was a partnership project between the Church of Pentecost and the Great Commission Movement of Ghana. The 2- week project covered about **40** towns and villages.

The project began with training in the use of the Picture Booklet for **132** church leaders. This was to help them share their faith and also be able to do initial follow-ups after the Jesus Film/ Walking with Jesus Film Crusades.

At the end of the project **6,871** people were exposed to the gospel with **1,247** indicating decisions to have received Christ.



iii. Missions Project at Dzolo Gbogame, Have, and Kpeve

Thirty (**30**) evangelists from the Northern Accra, Tema and Accra Dioceses of the Methodist Church worked with the Great Commission Movement of Ghana in a one-week missions project that saw a total of **948** people exposed to the gospel with **156** making decisions for Christ.

Both One-on-One outreaches and Jesus Film Shows were used.

At the end of the project, **25** new people joined the Dzolo Gbogame Society, **4** joined the Have Society and **11** joined the Kpeve Society.

iv. Go Month Project

The month of May was declared to be the month of evangelism and church planting. The Church Resource Teams decided to meet with church leaders to share the idea. The churches accepted the idea and we run the projects in **11** regions across the country. At the end of the month of May, **1,447** people were exposed to the gospel, **297** made decisions for Christ and **19** churches were planted.

4. Churches Planted

At the end of the ministry year, a total of **48** new churches were planted with our partner churches.

5. Developing Local Resources

The Global Church Movement field staff have embraced the idea of raising their own support. The staff have been trained and they have started raising support. Most of them are raising their financial support from the poorest part of the country. We gave them up to April ending to conclude their support raising but we have agreed to extend the period for support raising to next year June 2023 because of the slow flow of support. They need us to pray with them.

6. Pastors Training in Leadership (PTL)

Pastors' Training in Leadership (PTL) has been designed to train lay people who may not have the time and/or resources to be able to pursue formal theological training to undergo theological training using smart devices and take classes at their own pace.

Great Commission Movement as part of its church partnership drive arranged with the Mid-Ghana Sector office of the Ghana Baptist Convention in 2018 to enroll the first batch of **38 candidates** who completed level one of the PTL Program.

In the last quarter of 2020, **13 candidates** were again enrolled from the Ghana Baptist Convention and **11** of them completed all three levels successfully and were certified by the Great Commission Movement of Ghana. This batch had their graduation ceremony on Thursday 22nd September, 2022 at the premises of the Trinity Baptist Church, Patasi. The Sector Head, Vice-President Ministries and the full-time Association Heads of the Baptist Convention, together with other Ministers were present for the ceremony. The graduates were charged and commissioned to begin ministries of discipleship in their churches and also train members of their respective churches to engage in aggressive evangelism and follow-up.

The Baptist Church is seeking to explore how this training can be expanded for many more ministers and church leaders to be enrolled in the training possibly on Tablets.



Training Experience

“Shalom, Shalom. My name is Helena Frimpong from Triumphant Baptist church. PTL has helped me to know more about how to deal with the youth and children in my local church. I have started training the Women in the church so they can better appreciate and understand young people and children and how to nurture them. I understood emphatically that, children are the future generation and therefore whatever we give to them now will impact the future, making the world experience a better generation when we are gone. As a church leader, what I learnt from this training has widened my thoughts on practical ways to develop young people and children spiritually for the work of God.

I again find lessons on conflict resolution very helpful and so practical. In fact, I have been able to solve some family conflicts that had persisted for some time now.

Lastly, the lessons on Muslim Evangelism set the pace for me and I have begun engaging in a Gospel conversation with a Muslim woman and I hope and pray that she comes to the saving knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. I am happy that the Great Commission Movement of Ghana organized such a program for us.” – Mrs Helena Frimpong, Triumphant Baptist Church, Kwadaso

CHALLENGES

1. The dwindling funding of our Church Planting teams seriously affected our work. Within this period, we were able to release operational funds for the field staff only for two months and so were not able to resource our field staff to do proper ministry.
2. The dwindling funding also meant that the field staff had to accept the challenge of raising support to contribute to their take-home.



CHANGED LIFE STORIES

1. Photocopy Of My Life

On the 30th of November 2021, our team (Agormanya standby team) was scheduled for a film show at Adormeh, a suburb of Odumase Krobo. After mounting up our screen and assembling all other needed equipment for the show, it began to drizzle, and then it started to rain. Upon the advice of the presiding elder for the area, we decided to cancel the show.

After we had dismantled our equipment and were about to take off, I turned to my wife and said, “We really can’t waste this fine evening. What can we do?” Upon deliberation, we made calls to the other teams to find out if they needed support of any kind.

The Agormanya main team needed help at the Somanya Taxi Rank where they were a few minutes away from the time their film show was supposed to begin. Their generator and horn speaker had developed some fault. By the grace of God, we got there in no time and remedied the situation, and the film show began successfully.

The film for the evening was ‘The Final Account’, a Nigerian movie about a guy, Raymond, who had led a sinful life and died unexpectedly. Upon his death, he was shown all the wicked things he had done during his lifetime and was given a second chance to come back to earth and right all his wrongs.

I asked some members around to go to where the spectators were and talk to some of them. As I did the same, I came to a lady carrying a baby and I went to look for a chair for her to sit down on. As I returned with the chair, I saw a young man coming to stand by an old man who was keenly watching the film. The young man again moved to the lady whom I had given the chair to, stood by her and started conversing with her. I approached them and asked about their subject of discussion. The young man told me he was telling the lady about his life, which was a photocopy of Raymond’s life in the movie.

He requested to talk to me, and I obliged. He said he was Frank Azu, 29 years old and a Krobo. Frank said that he was a leader in one of the departments in his church. He said his life was just like Raymond's, the protagonist in the film. After speaking to him, he prayed to receive Christ, and when the altar call was made, he went forward again and was prayed for. He started telling his story to those with whom he had come up front.

2. God Always Has a Better Plan

Frustrated. Tired. Worn out. These were the adjectives that could best describe us on the evening of 22nd November 2021. After all the teams had been dispatched to start the cinema evangelism in their various zones, we (the stand-by team) were called by the Akrade Zone team leader, Pastor Joshua Safori, that he had problems using his projector though all teams had been taken through the diagnostic use of the equipment. Since it was the maiden showing for the various zones, we quickly moved from Odumase Krobo to Akrade to resolve the situation.

After resolving the challenge at Akrade, we left for our location in Odumase Krobo to show our film. Just as we were about to mount up our screen, Pastor Safori called again to tell us he had a problem with sound. We quickly dismounted our screen and travelled back to Akrade to help the team out. After rectifying the situation, it was too late to move back to our location to show our film. We therefore decided to visit the Kpong team, since Kpong was along the same route.

After a hectic time locating the team, we finally arrived. The film show at Kpong had, however, ended and the pastor, Dadzie, had gone to baptise six (6) new converts; a lady and five (5) gentlemen. After the baptism was over, we fraternised with the new converts. The oldest was twenty-five years old. One of the guys was an Okada rider and the only lady amongst them, Beauty Kaleku, was a petty trader.

Pastor Dadzie said their focus was to do 'Aggressive Evangelism' and so he did not know why he should not baptise them the same night. According to the team, some of these baptised people were smokers who were hanging around smoking and watching the film from afar. They had no idea that they would even come forward to receive Christ.

In an update report from the district pastor for Kpong Church of Pentecost, it was stated that these new converts have started attending church. Though we were frustrated, tired and worn out, we were fulfilled!

3. **Nothing Shall by any Means Hurt You”.**

Indeed, when we’re obedient to His commands, He gives us all the power available in His Kingdom. The Month of May was designated for Film Shows and Church Planting dubbed “GO MONTH”, and the Eastern Region team was able to show the Jesus Film 19 times and planted 2 churches.

On the 30th of May to 2nd of June 2022, we showed the Jesus Film 3 times and planted a church in a community called Dawa- Korlewa under Asesewa District of The Apostolic Church- Ghana. On the first night, some of the women from Asesewa town came to the crusade grounds with three plastic bowls to be used for offering. After the third night, the women kept their tambourines in the offering bowls and sent them to the mission house where I was lodging. They placed the bowls on a chair in front of the entrance to my room and left.

The next morning, I left Asesewa town for Koforidua for my normal radio programme. Upon my return for the next town’s Film Show, I saw two of the guys on our team standing on the compound of the mission house and pointing towards my direction and back to a spot where something was being burnt. I went straight to my room and picked up my equipment and came back to the car. On our way, I overheard the pastor’s wife saying in Krobo, “This man is really a man of God” referring to me.

I was told later on the Sunday at church that there was a Big Snake found dead in the offering bowl that was kept at my door on the Wednesday evening after the crusade. We are indeed serving a Living God. My joy is that in the end, we were able to plant a local

church in the community. 14 people attended the first Sunday service. “And Nothing shall by any means Hurt you indeed” (Luke 10:19). When our obedience is full, His protection is assured. Thank God for His protection.

4. **Healing in Kakra Kura!**

On the 8th of February, at Kakra Kura, there was a woman by name Elizabeth who was regularly tormented by Epilepsy and was prayed for by our Evangelism Team. She was completely healed, and this made the people of the village accept our message and were ready to accept the Evangelical Church of Ghana in the community. We are now making plans to organise a big program and start a church over there.

During our one-on-one evangelism in the Zongo community, the Muslims organised a team to come and fight us because they were accusing us of trying to take pictures and spending time with their wives which, unbeknownst to us, was a taboo to them.

By the grace of God, a Christian Military Soldier came to explain to them that we were missionaries and were not after their wives. Moreover, we were spending time with some of their families only to explain the picture booklet which is similar to the Quran.

We had to delete some of the pictures already taken and change direction.

We are still praying for them, hoping to change our strategies next time we are winning souls in their communities.

5. **Our Lord Jesus is Alive!**

During a Picture Booklet Training at Sawla, we had a miraculous deliverance. Brother Michael is a Muslim convert in the Apostolic Church – Ghana in Wa. As I was leading

the training, we got to the 6th page where I explained saying, "If Anyone hears the voice of Jesus and opens their heart, Jesus comes in the person's heart and sits on the throne of their life. There is a throne in every person's heart and each of us gets to individually decide who sits on the throne of our heart".

As soon as I said that Brother Michael left the room, came back after a few seconds, and listened attentively through the rest of the training.

After the training, Michael came to us and testified that he got instantly delivered the moment I said, "each of us gets to individually decide who sits on the throne of our heart". Michael recounted, "Something shook inside me, and I felt like going to the washroom. So, I quickly rushed out and went to clean up. I am free and delivered from the spirit of the throne from my family gate which has tormented me for so long". Amen.

6. No More Need for Clutches!

Sheiga is a small village in the Upper East Region of the Tongu District. Our Team went to show the Jesus Film and Madam Lamise Boati, a 55-year-old woman who had had an accident 4 years back and could not walk without clutches, came to the crusade grounds.

Lamisi gave her life to Christ after the film show and was among those who came forward to be prayed for.

After the prayer, she shouted that she had been healed and did not need her clutches. To the glory of God, she walked home without the clutches that day!





D. DIGITAL STRATEGIES, DS (Technology for Ministry) UPDATES

The Digital Strategies Ministry persists in pursuing digital initiatives to fulfil the Great Commission and expand its services for the body of Christ.

1. City Teams

Across the country, teams from 8 cities (Accra, Ho, Cape Coast, Kumasi, Sunyani, Tamale, Takoradi, and Koforidua) were equipped to assist churches and groups with using digital devices and the internet for evangelism and discipleship. The country has 44 volunteers serving in this capacity.

2. Prayer

Every month, the leadership team convened for prayer.

The Ramadan Special Prayer took place from April 2 to May 1, 2022. Over three thousand (3,000) Christians from Ghana, Nigeria, Liberia, United States, Kyrgyzstan, South Africa, UEA, UK among others were mobilised to pray in the period for our neighbours as they fasted and prayed.

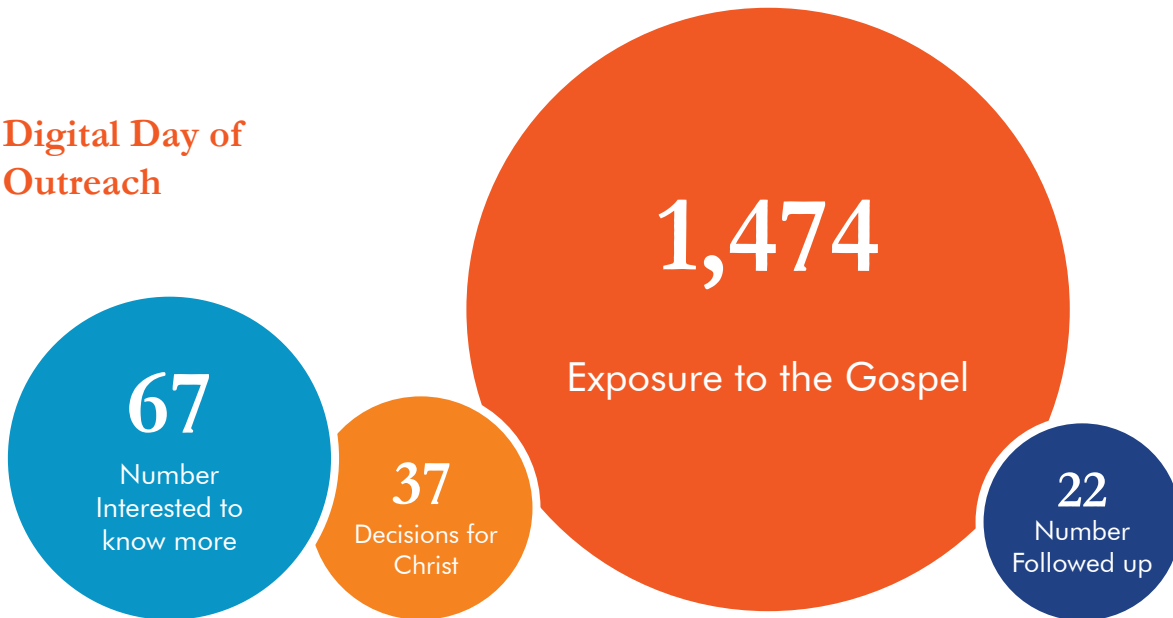

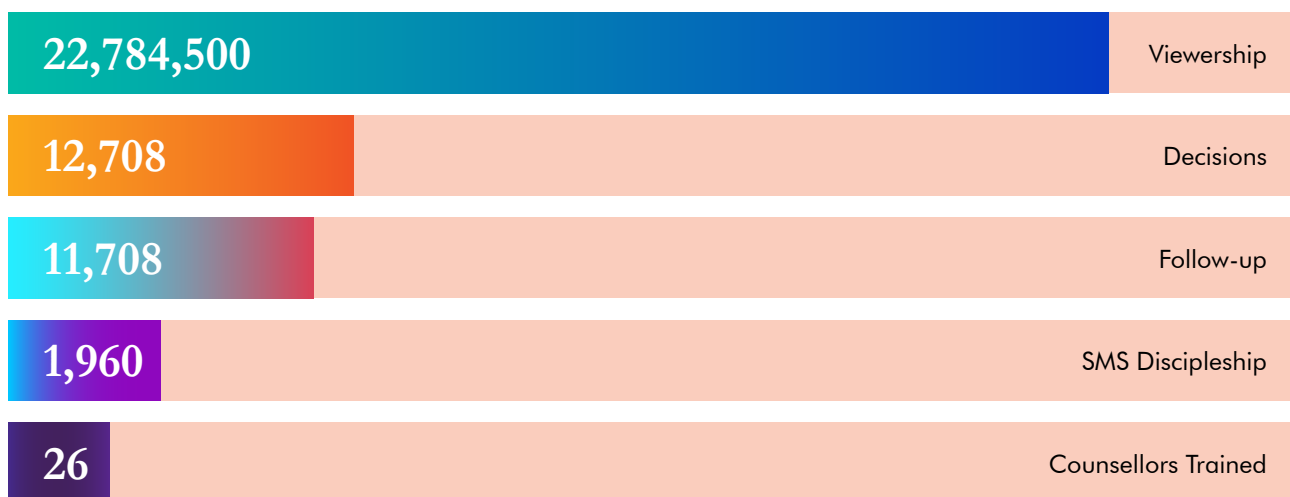
3. Win-Build-Send Initiatives

Various methods were employed for evangelism and discipleship, including Digital Day of Outreach (DDO), Short Films on Tablets, WhatsApp, Telegram, as well as strategic TV broadcasts of the Jesus Film, Magdalena, and Walking with Jesus (WWJ) series.

CHANGED LIFE STORIES

1. I will Use My IT Work to Support the Cause for Christ

My name is Gideon. I am a pastor and a developer in word press and also code in python and JavaScript. I have been a teacher in programming for kids. Until the training today, I didn't know there were so many people online. I did not also know that sharing the gospel online will come with such instant and positive responses. But based on what I have witnessed today about how many people are spending their lives online, I'm determined to make life changing decisions, especially with the kids I teach. I am going to create an environment that will let the kids see Christ in what I do. I have decided to strengthen and focus more on my IT work to support the cause of Christ and His kingdom.

2. I have Resolved to Make Use of Social Media

After going through the digital ministry training on how people are using social media and the unlimited potential for ministry, it dawned on me that I can't do away with social media in effective ministry this dispensation. Whether I like it or not, that is where I can most likely find many of my church members and so I need to make use of it as a pastor.

3. Jesus Really Heals! My Fibroid Disappeared!!

I am 39 years old and I'm a Christian. In January, I was diagnosed with fibroid. I was confused. During Easter, I watched the Jesus film on Kessben TV and felt I needed help in prayer. I called the number on the screen, and a lady picked the call and connected me to a counsellor. The counsellor prayed with me and asked me to go for another medical test and that the fibroid can't be with me. I went for a medical scan and the results showed that I had no fibroid. Thanks be to God for my healing. I am grateful to the Jesus film team who encouraged me and prayed with me.

4. There is Growth in Christ!

I used to struggle in my walk and growth in Christ, though I am a Pastor. After watching the "Walking With Jesus" video on one of the Ghanaian TV stations in Cameroon, I felt this video had answered all my questions on how to grow in Christ. I went to the short code *800*18# and was assigned to a counsellor who really helped to answer the questions I was struggling with. The counsellor also helped me to download the "Walking With Jesus" videos in French. I have started using it in my church and I have seen massive results in the church. Thank you. I am grateful to the producer of this life changing video series.



E. PRAYER MOVEMENTS UPDATES

1. Annual National staff Retreat

We had our Annual Staff Retreat with 21-days of fasting and praying.

The theme was, "Keep the Passion for the Call" (Romans 12:11, TPT). The focus was to help staff be reminded of the things that affect the passion for the call to ministry and how to sustain it. As part of our annual book review, we reviewed "A Heart Ablaze".

As to what steps to take to keep the passion going, one staff member commented, "To remain consistent and fervent in prayer and Bible study. To also become conscious and intentional about the company I keep as that is very critical to increasing my passion or otherwise".

2. Worldwide Day of Prayer: October and April

The two Worldwide Days of Prayer were all virtual. In October, the theme was 'God is Our Strength based on Psalm 18:1-2 and 2 Corinthians 12:9-10. The focus was on our strategic intent, "Focus on Our Strengths." Our greatest strength is our dependence upon the Holy Spirit to empower and lead us to places beyond our capabilities.

In April, we considered The Lord is Faithful as the theme with the Verses: 1 John 1:9 and 2 Thessalonians 3:3.

3. Intercessors

Sixty-one (61) new intercessors started receiving SMS requests. Also, eighty-four (84) pastors received topics mainly on the Unreached peoples to pray for them. In all 1,060 received SMS prayer requests on ministry activities.

4. Missional Gap

The Igniters designed a strategy to raise intercessors, hence, Bridging the Missional Gap (BMG). This is to help intercessors to pray for the hard-to-reach places. Launching this strategy took time and still at the initiating phase.

Two 24-hour prayer chains were organised in November and March focusing on ministry issues and staff/family respectively.

5. Women in Prayer (WIP)

Physical meetings resumed in December 2021. Meetings were held on the 2nd Friday of each month while prayer topics were made available on the WIP WhatsApp platform. In all, there were forty (40) intercessors.

6. Prayer Training

There was a 7-week virtual training in July and August for nineteen (19) leaders including pastors from Nigeria, UK and US. Faith Life International Church replicated the training for their mid-week services for a month for 120 of their church members. They also planned using the content for their school of ministry training for the church

workers. Below is a message from a Pastor of Faith Life International Church:

"Our prayer meetings are becoming more effective because we are having more people come on board for prayer. I am personally using the slides for my teaching. The whole of August was very fruitful. And we are seeing the ripple effect on the entire church"

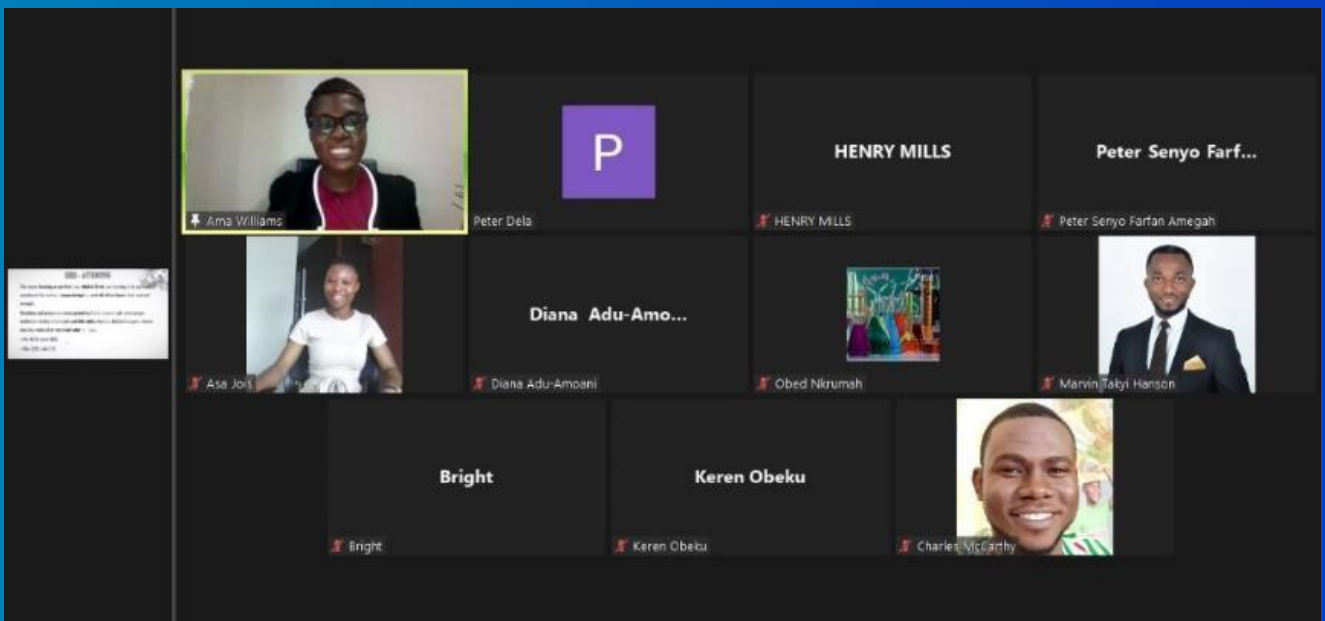
7. Prayer Communication

Prayer Diary:

Throughout the year, the prayer team prepared and distributed all four quarterly prayer diaries, containing updates on ministry strategies and capacities, to encourage strategic praying. They also shared monthly focused prayer topics on the staff prayer group for regular prayer information.

F. LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND HUMAN RESOURCES (LDHR) UPDATE

For the year, the LDHR team focused on the following areas:

1. New Staff Training (NST)

One staff member (Henry Mills) completed his training in Cape Coast and has been reassigned to Accra Campus.

2. Member Care Training

In Partnership with Ghana Evangelical Missions Association (GEMA), we organised a hybrid trauma awareness workshop on March 2, 2022. The sessions were led by Dr. Akintotun Merino (Prof. of Psychology and CEO, Jars Education Group).



3. International Leadership University, Ghana (ILU-Ghana)/Institute of International Leadership, Management and Theology (IILMaT) (www.illmat.edu.gh)

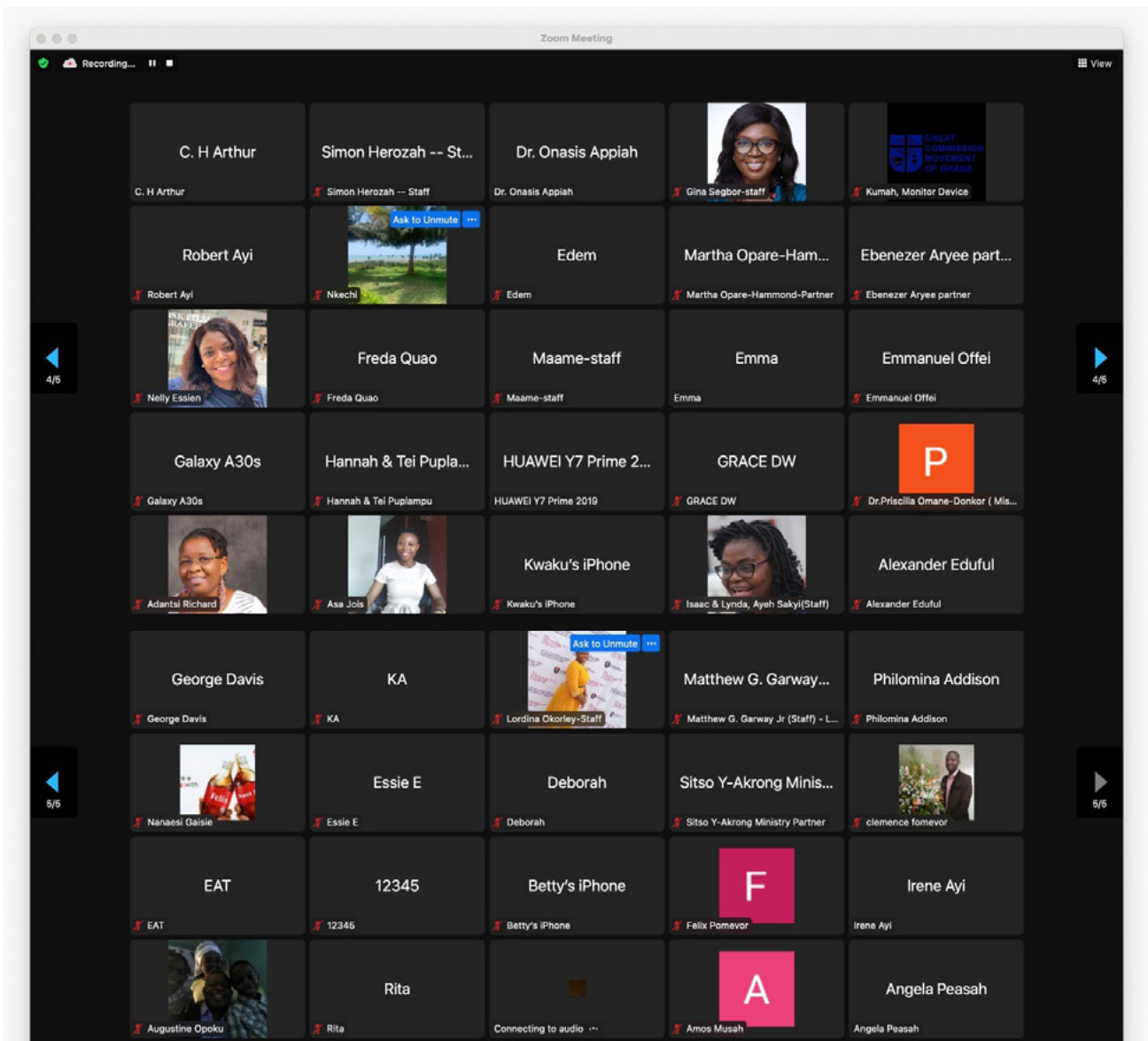
IILMaT, a graduate-level Leadership School, is part of the ILU Consortium of Schools under the Campus Crusade for Christ. Its goal is to train visionary leaders with integrity to initiate transformation in all aspects of African societies, and is currently undergoing the accreditation process.

a. IBS (Institute of Biblical Studies) November 2021

The IBS serves as mandatory theological training for all GCMG Staff, aiming to equip them with a strong theological foundation that will support their personal lives, ministries, and leadership. From November 8-19, the 2021 edition was held online and administered from the IILMaT Campus.

There were 33 students enrolled in two courses as listed below:

1. Nov. 8-12: Transforming Leaders in the African Context (Prof. Eric Anum) 3 Credits.
2. Nov. 15-19: Strategic Leadership Development (Prof. Mike Wicker) 3 Credits.



b. Executive Diploma in Leadership (EDL)

On September 7, 2021, a pilot Executive Diploma in Leadership was launched. This was through a collaboration between IILMaT (ILU Ghana), ILF - the International Leadership Foundation and AATEEA - All Africa Theological Education by Extension Associations. The programme concluded successfully with a commemoration on April 9, 2022. This pilot edition had 10 leaders of the AATEEA enrolled.

The completion of the pilot program was commemorated on Saturday, April 9, 2022, with an impressive and colourful event. In attendance were the AATEEA executive body, ILF board members, GCMG board members and staff, the president of the Good News Theological Seminary, IILMaT faculty, the graduating students, and friends of the Great Commission Movement of Ghana. The program was streamed live for others who joined virtually.

G. FUND DEVELOPMENT

The Fund Development department focuses on both individual staff support and organisational support.

Staff Support

In the past year, the objective was for every staff member to generate an extra 20-30% of their budget. As of June 2022, only 25% of staff achieved this target, and around 30% of the staff are still below 50% of their financial requirements. While Church Planting Missionaries are striving to increase their support, they are encountering difficulties in meeting their goal.

Organisational Support

The board of directors and the organisational fund development team continue their 3-year sustainability plan to secure 1,000 ministry partners who will donate Gh¢200 per month. As of the end of the ministry year, there were 15 fervent partners, giving a total of Gh¢7,392 per month, excluding one-time donations. These partners receive monthly newsletters.

We provided sustainability training to all team leaders to assist them in driving corporate fund development.

We initiated the creation of a partner relations software, www.partnershub.org, with the confidence that it will aid us and other organisations in managing organisational support efficiently.

1. Forum of Bible Agencies (FOBA)

We are an active member of FOBA Ghana. This is a group of Para-Church Organisations focused on Scripture engagement.

2. Ghana Evangelism Committee (GEC)

We are currently an active member in good standing.

3. Ghana Evangelical Missions Association (GEMA)

We are currently an active member in good standing.

4. Partnerships

3. Trainings

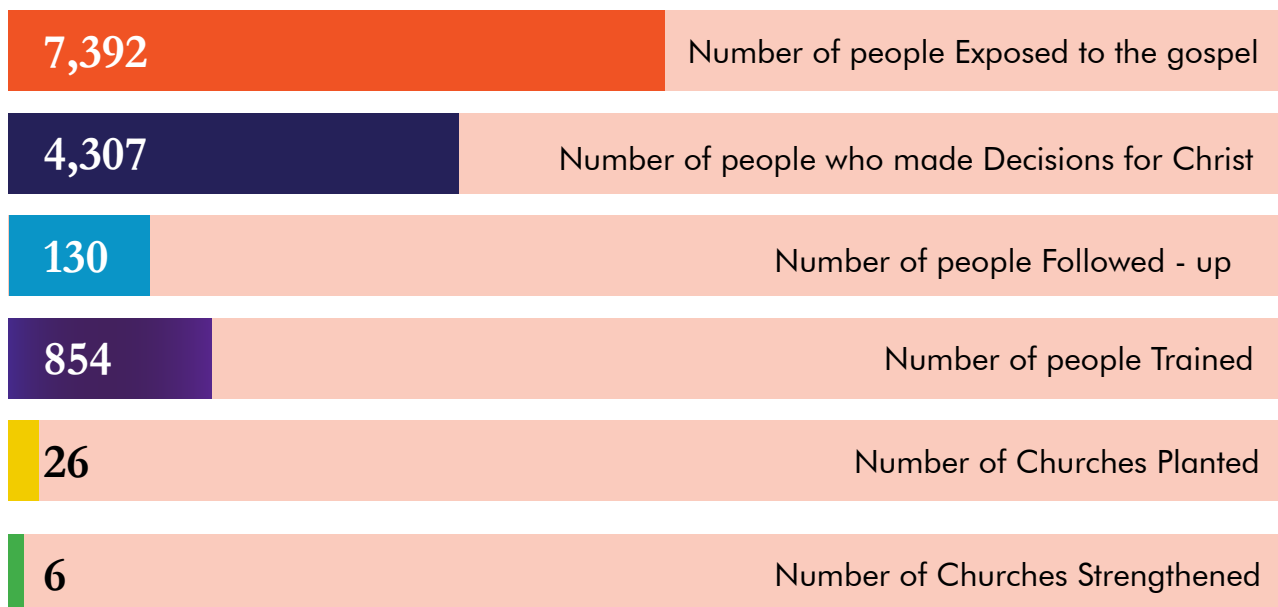
