A WIN FOR GHANA

99% of all vaccines in Africa are imported.

- When a worldwide shortage occurs, Africa feels it first.
- DEK VACCINES (A Ghana Pharmaceutical company) is partnering with the government of Ghana and our organization, A Pharmaceutical Solution, to build a vaccine manufacturing facility.

4. GAVI (Global Alliance Vaccine Initiative) has agreed to purchase 30% of their annual vaccine needs from the vaccine manufacturing facility in Ghana.

A WIN FOR GCM GHANA

We have chosen Great Commission Movement (GCM) Ghana as our charitable service organization located in Accra, Ghana.

As this project has taken shape over the last two years, GCM has been instrumental in coordinating activities for us in orphanages, education, and leadership development programs. In addition, they have continued to assist us and volunteer countless hours to help coordinate our project, The Ghana Vaccine Initiative. I have included their annual report on our website.

It is the reason we have decided to invest 20% of our profits from this project to their organization.

ANSWERS TO SOME COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Why do you believe you will be able to find investors and grants?

- Ghana is a country of interest to many African-Americans. In the last two years several notable personalities have traveled to Ghana. It represents the last place many of our ancestors visited on African soil. There is a tremendous desire to partner economically with Ghana.

- In addition organizations like the NBA Players Association, foundations, and pharmaceutical companies have expressed an interest in grants and becoming potential investors in the facility.

2. What will be your role in this project?

- A. As President of APS, I have formulated a Board of Directors to direct me to potential financial investors, grants, and foundations.
- B. Ultimately I will resign from my current job to give leadership to the project.
- C. I have over \$150,000 in personal funds invested in this project.

3. Will you need a salary?

- I will not require a salary but a monthly stipend to help offset reimbursable expenses while traveling for the project. I will reduce my hours at my current job to the exact number needed to maintain our benefits. Ultimately APS will provide benefits of all types.

4. Do you need all the funding immediately?

- No, Our goal is to have all funds in hand to officially start the project on February, 2024.

5. How will you update us on the progress of the project?

- We have Attorneys, Accountants, and a Board of Directors who will assist me with keeping you updated.

6. Are you open to receiving suggestions from us regarding the planning?

- Yes, of course. We believe that we have a solid business plan to gross approximately \$30 million dollars in revenues for the upcoming year. But we are interested in partnering and entertaining additional plans to make this dream a reality.

7. Why do you believe DEK will accomplish the task of building this facility?

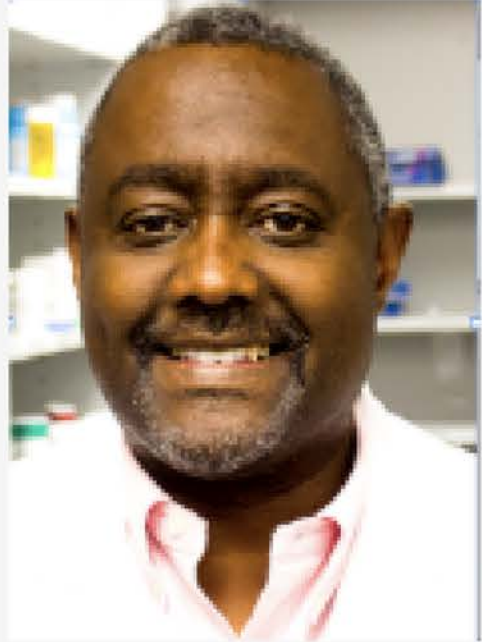
