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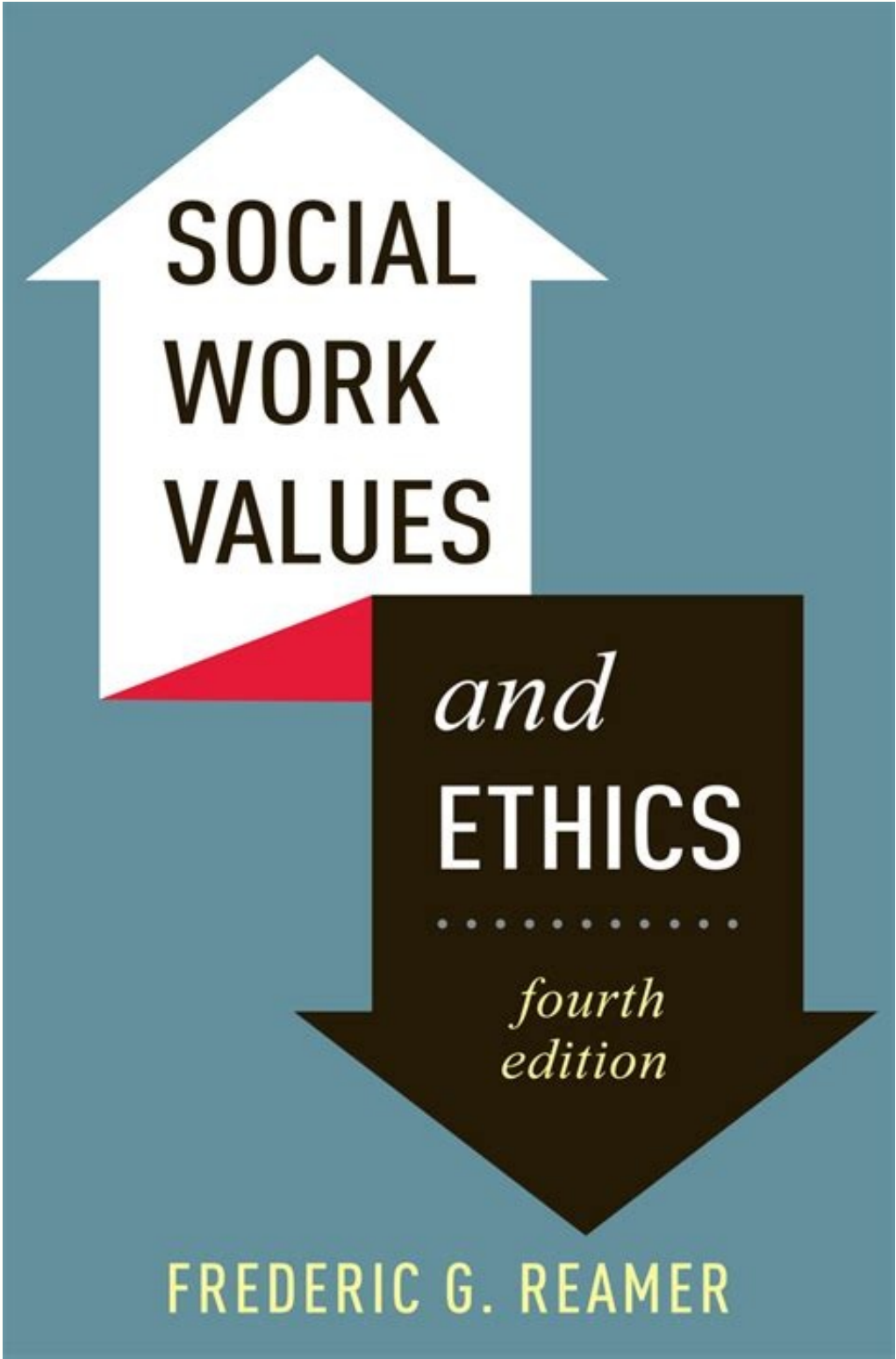

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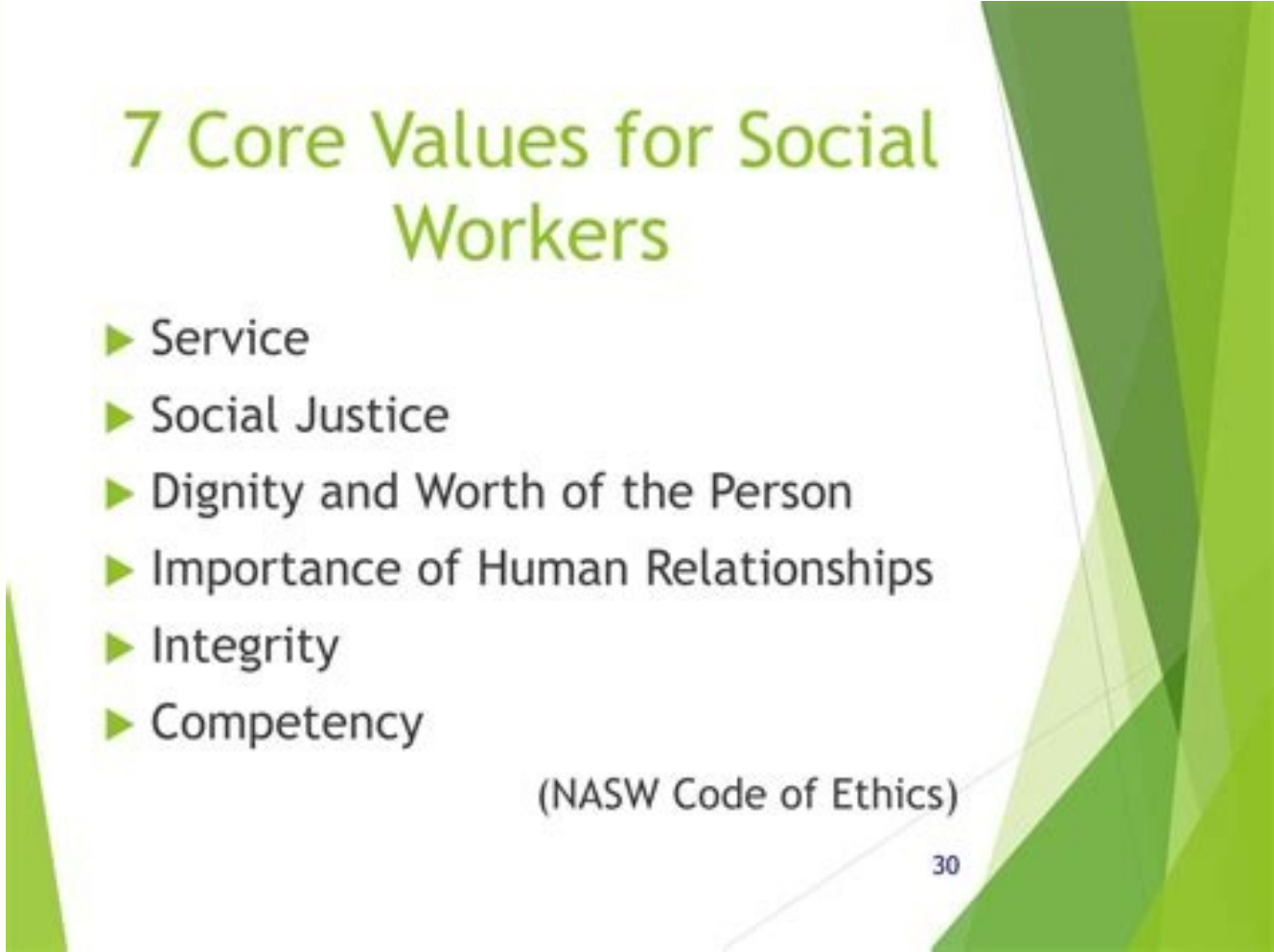

Social workers must be aware of their responsibility both to their individual customers and to society as a whole, as well as look for decisions for their customers, who also support the wider interests of society. Social workers seek to eliminate factors that threaten the dignity and values of people, but do this using a proportional approach, respecting differences and appreciating self -determination. Instead of imposing their own values, social workers rely on the values of their customers and communities that they serve. Social workers associate people in need of assistance with organizations and individuals who may provide appropriate assistance. Social workers admit that the development of human relations can be a useful tool for changes, and they succeed in attracting potential partners who can create, support and improve the well -being of families, districts and entire communities. Difficult social conditions similar to those that arose due to pandemia Covid-19 emphasize the important role of human relations in maintaining health and recovery. Social workers not only develop and maintain strong relations with individuals and communities, but also help their customers identify emergency situations.They are connected and together create the greatest added value for the citizens that they serve.
