# Courses at IHLA for the Winter term

The **TOELF prepa**ration course, which was offered twice a week during the months of September to December with two classes, will continue once a week in this winter term. Both classes will be joined together in one group that will meet at the IHLA office every

Thursday evening, beginning on January 22, 2004 at 6:30 p.m.

A new course is being offered for the first time to all our members. Dr. Joe Wu of the University of Alberta will instruct the course: **Second Languages Theories and Practice**. We have a full class of registrants and we are sure that all people in attendance will benefit from this very interesting course that looks into the theories of language acquisition while combining practical ideas to integrate such theories with the reality of second language instruction. This course will begin on **January 14**, **2004** and run for eight consecutive **Wednesdays, from 6:30 to 9:30 p.m. until March 3, 2004**.

### Revitalizing Languages for the 21st Century

The International and Heritage Languages Association (IHLA) recently submitted a proposal for funding to the Department of Canadian Heritage for a project called **"Revitalizing Languages for the 21st Century".** If the proposal is approved, IHLA will work closely with the Southern Alberta Heritage Language Association (SAHLA) to involve more ethno-cultural communities across Alberta in developing their language and culture at the community level. The project will:

- help our youth and adults to develop a greater awareness and understanding of the benefits of language learning;
- identify best practices for building international and heritage language efforts within the family and the community;
- develop a resource guide for developing heritage language learning at the community level;
- train community members to revitalize heritage language learning in their families and communities; and
- encourage our youth and adults to use their languages as they participate fully in Canada's community, provincial and international activities.



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IHLA will be sponsoring the Teacher Certification Applications of

more than 10 of our school instructors with Alberta Learning. Each application funded by IHLA cost \$350.00

• IHLA principals, instructors and board members are continuing to meet for the **Curriculum Framework Project**, together with Alberta Learning and in partnership with SAHLA. Meetings are being held during the month of January and February. More information available on the website.
