

The Mother Language Day book began 19 years ago to highlight heritage language students' abilities in expressing themselves in their heritage language and to share their culture with friends and family in text, beyond the performances done for Mother Language Day. Since 2003, each year, IHLA Member Schools and their students take on writing (and illustrating) on a different theme, each school and student putting his/her own special and unique perspective.

This year's theme, "How learning my heritage language and culture helps me grow" was chosen to allow students to express, especially in these two years now, who we are at our core—linguistically and culturally. As reading the entries by our students will illustrate, our identity(ies) as a heritage language learners and bi/multicultural individuals are and have been impacted in a myriad of ways: How we navigate and negotiate our daily activities; our relationships with each other, and more acutely, our days with friends and school days. In each of the entries, our students thought about the languages they speak with their hearts with their family to ease them their anxiety and help propel them to be more positive, to the cultures from which their comfort foods come and activities that allowed them to reconnect with those they love and miss. One thing is certain in all the entries is that our heritage language and culture was an *anchor*, helping all of us, each day to ground us and move forward.

Forty – five years ago, back in 1977, educators and leaders from diverse – ethnic communities in Edmonton and Calgary, with myself and others who have passed-on; Sabatino Roncucci, The Hon. Gene Zwozdeski, Fiona Pelech, Jean Kofp, Maria Chrzanowska, Mary Hladyshevski, Krishan Joshee, Charles Pei, to name a few; have decided to establish an association called AELTA (Alberta Ethnic-Language Teachers Association), and then changed to the Northern & Southern Alberta Heritage Language Association, now IHLA (International & Heritage Languages Association). It was a vision to preserve and retain the Mother Tongue of their country of

origin with the next generations through language teaching in their very own community, with a focus on conversational skills development in order to communicate with Grandparents and relatives who were left behind in their homelands.

International Mother Language Day, was proclaimed on November 1999, by the General Conference of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) to annually celebrate language diversity and variety worldwide on February 21 of each year. Just imagine, our founders 44 years ago simply wanted their children to be able to communicate with their grandparents, and now, we are continuously teaching our Millennial Generation not just to say Hello! Hola! Kumusta Po!; but to be able to chat, read, write and sing in their heritage language. What an achievement indeed!

"How does learning my heritage language help me grow?" is the THEME of our 2022 MLD celebration. Research has proven the following results, advantages and benefits of learning a heritage language (HL) in every child/individual:

- HL promotes self-esteem in learners
- HL enhances formation of personal and cultural identity
- HL increases cultural, economic, educational, and professional opportunities both in the present and in the future
- HL prepares learners for living and working in cross-cultural environment, a skill especially useful in Canadian context
- HL augments the ability to adjust to new environments and ways of thinking and behaving
- HL provides opportunities for students to communicate with families. Bridging gaps between generations in both language and culture

For the past four decades, we have witnessed the relevance and importance of these advantages and opportunities of preserving, retaining and learning our heritage language among ourselves and children from one generation to the next. We have to be convinced that Heritage Language Programs do not solely teach a language, they put a high value on identity and culture; for many of our students, this serves as a bridge between generations as they come to realize how different their parents' or grandparents' lives are from their own and make an effort to learn about these differences. This is often a key outcome for many parents. They want their children to have a real understanding and focus on family life and cultural history.



My Heritage Language

"To have another language is to possess a second soul" is what Charlemagne, a French king, once said. Today, I will be telling you about Armenia, its language, and what it means to me. Imagine going to school and starting the day off by playing a game. That game is called Chess. Yes! Chess is part of the curriculum in Armenian schools. Many of the world's great chess players are from Armenia.

Armenia is one of the oldest countries in the world. It was founded 800 years before Christ was born (800 BC), and is considered the cradle of civilization. Bangla School



Multilingual and multicultural societies exist through their language which transmits and preserve traditional knowledge and culture in a sustainable way. Every mother tongue deserved to be known, recognized and given prominence in all spheres of life. With this in mind, Bangladesh Canada Association of Edmonton (BCAE) initiated Bangla School in 1983. Since its beginning, Bangla School has been playing a crucial role in spreading our Mother's language Bangla, and Bengali cultural traditions among new generations. The Bangla School is administered by BCAE Executive Committee and the day to day operations run by the BCAE Bangla School Committee, a standing committee of BCAE consists of members from the executive committee and parents representative.

The Bangla School currently has two programs: Bangla Language Class and Bangla Music Class. Both of these programs have dedicated teachers and academic curriculum. Bangla Language curriculum aims on learning of the Bangla language by learning the culture of Bangladesh. The Bangla Music curriculum is based on the principle of enjoyment of music, musical skills and knowledge, self-expression and creativity, insight into music through meaningful musical performance, and awareness and appreciation of variety of Bengali music

Bangla School enrollment follows Alberta school's academic calendar (September-June) and runs every Saturday and Sunday. Because of the COVID Pandemic, Bangla School is running in an online setting on Google Classroom platform. We hope to return to in-person learning after officially opening the Bangladesh Center in the Spring/Summer of 2022.

The Comitato Promotore della Lingua Italiana (CPLI)





I can eat Italian food. It is very good. I like Italian food a lot but I only know about 2 Italian foods pizza and pasta. I eat these foods on the weekend!




I like learning my language and culture because I can learn about Maria Montessori, famous throughout the world for her educational teaching method.







Enjoying Traditional Food If I learn the Italian language I can go to Italy and enjoy traditional food. It can help me speak more Italian because I can learn the


names of Italian foods and say them. Tasting traditional food also helps me to know the food when someone speaks (about it)!

Understanding my grandparents helps me to understand what they are saying because they only speak Italian.










How does learning my heritage language help me grow









Hello. My name is Luki. I am happy I learn Czech because I can speak with my mommy. And our grandma from the Czech Republic reads Czech stories to us through the phone.



Edmonton Marathi Shala is a brainchild of Mrs Anupama Deshpande. She has started this school in the year 2017. This school has been registered under Alberta Province on the no profit no loss basis. The motto of the school is to provide best mother language education in Canada. The kids are encouraged through various activities. The classes have unique names like Maitri means Friendship, Drishti means vision, Kaushalya means skill, Naipunya means expert.

Edmonton Marathi shala started with 8 students and now in 4 years we are running with 78 students. Yes, this language is a Pride. India is the land of culture. It has the golden history of different events. Marathi is an Indo-Aryan language predominantly spoken by Marathi people in the Indian state of Maharashtra. It is the official language of Maharashtra, and a co-official language in Goa and the union territory of Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu. It is one of the 22 scheduled languages of India, with 83 million speakers as of 2011. Marathi ranks 10th in the list of languages with most native speakers in the world. Marathi has the third largest number of native speakers in India, after Hindi and Bengali. The language has some of the oldest literature of all modern Indian languages, dating from around 600 AD. The major dialects of Marathi are Standard Marathi and the Varhadi dialect.

Marathi Language Day (मराठी दिन/मराठी दिवस transl. Marathi Din/Marathi Diwas is celebrated on 27 February every year across the Indian states of Maharashtra and Goa. This day is regulated by the Ministry of Marathi Language. It is celebrated on the Birthday of eminent Marathi Poet Vi. Va. Shirwadkar, popularly known as Kusumagraj.

Essay competitions and seminars are arranged in schools and colleges, and government officials are asked to conduct various events.

Edmonton Marathi Shala emphasizes the culture, love and respect towards Marathi Language. This school is run by a very creative and unique lady Ms. Anupama Deshpande. This school is her brainchild. This school not only gives the knowledge of language but it tries to inculcate the culture of mother tounge. Here every child enjoys Marathi class because it's not teaching but it's all about experiencing the language in a very innovative way.

Edmonton Marathi Shala kids appear for the BMM exam too. Recipe making, drawing, stories, songs, dialauges, acts and many other activities are done by the kids in this historical language.


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Filipino Language and Culture School of Edmonton



The Filipino Language and Culture School of Edmonton was established in 1983 under the leadership and sponsorship of The Filipino Canadian Saranay Association of Alberta, and a proud member of International and Heritage Language Association (IHLA). The school received accreditation from Alberta Education for Grade 4 to Grade 12 in 2006. Completion of 3 High School (Grade 10 – 12) Courses have a total of 15 Credits.

Filipino Language and Culture School offers classes to kindergarten to Grade 12 on Sundays and classes to adults on Wednesday evenings. Along with the language courses, students are also introduced to the Rondalla indigenous instruments and cultural dances.

Filipino languages came form the country called Philippines in an archipelago of over seven thousand islands subdivided into 17 regions. Among those regions, there are over 175 living languages originating and spoken by various ethno-linguistic groups on the Philippine archipelago. Most Filipinos can speak at least three languages in the Philippines: their mother tongues - from the regional areas they were born and

live in, Filipino - the national language and English which is commonly used in urban settings for business and educational delivery.

Filipino is the National language designated along with English as an official language of the Philippines. Filipino language is based on the TAGALOG language with other borrowed or loaned words from other sources such as: Spanish, English and Malay languages. It is also influenced by Japan, China, Borneo, Sumatra, Thailand, Cambodia, and the Islamic Sanskrit.





A language is the way to connect and exchange knowledge with other people, and learning more languages increases that! It would give us a "window" to a new perspective, through broadening our knowledge on history, gaining cultural appreciation, and helping us with other languages. 




In addition to the Polish language our program includes elements of Polish history and geography.


are: Teacher's Day, Saint Nicholas Day, a

The team was ranked 10th out of 53 participating countries. The team total was 100 out of a possible 200 points. Our student, Mine Kara, was awarded the bronze medal among thousands of participants.

Another goal is to help newcomers to adapt faster to their new life.

The Centre is maintained by professional teachers and dedicated community members. In our Centre students learn not only Russian language, but also rich Russian Literature and History. We deliver courses for school students and adults as well.

We believe that the ability to understand and communicate in different languages is very important in Canada where Multiculturalism is one of national policies. Поддержание вашего родного языка имеет решающее значение для вашей личности и способствует формированию положительной самооценки. ... Знание языков также помогает иммигрантам сохранять культурные и языковые связи со своей страной, а свободное владение другим языком помогает иностранцам легче адаптироваться к новым культурам.

How does my heritage language help me grow?

Language is one of the most important parts of any culture. It is the way people communicate with each other, build relationships and create a sense of community. I go to a Russian school. I learn to communicate, I study literature, Russian grammar, history and culture. Russian culture is rich and it is important to learn about it. Maintaining your native language is critical to your identity and helps build a positive self-image. Knowing languages helps immigrants maintain cultural and linguistic ties to their country, and fluency in another language helps foreigners adapt more easily to new cultures.

Telugu School of Edmonton is primarily established to teach Mother Language skills to keep the young generation connected to Telugu Culture. Children of all ages are introduced and encouraged to learn Telugu through Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing. This school is open not only to the young children but for all ages.

Our Telugu School was originally started more than twenty years ago and after a brief lapse in between it was reactivated by some enthusiastic members of Andhra Cultural Association in 2005.
