



Our Policies

We shall not have a cat euthanised, unless our veterinarian advises otherwise.

Cats are placed in an isolation unit upon entry until they have passed the vet's medical check, received full vaccinations and spaying/neutering*. This also allows time for any underlying disease to present itself.

After being inoculated, the cats are then moved to the rehoming area, known colloquially as 'the middle' and 'the top-lot' where they are routinely treated for worms and fleas.

It is our belief that the cats should be allowed to socialise and integrate with each other, and are therefore allowed to roam around the larger spaces.

"Oldies" and long-stay residents are accommodated in the caravan, with its own run with the intention of making it as much like a home as possible.

All adult cats are neutered/spayed before they leave us, with the exception of kittens until they are six months old.

Cats to stay at the sanctuary until the right home is found. A home-check will be carried out to ensure that the home is suitable, sometimes with a follow-up visit once the cat has had a chance to settle in with their new family.
