Trustees: facility usage plan still under development; also discussing the memorial bench placement as part of outdoor worship area.

Old Business: Working on getting church Amazon account for Blink camera system. (Currently using a personal Amazon account for this.) Tabled the county property update.

New Business: Holy Week and Easter schedule reviewed.

Spring spruce-up day discussed. (Later discovered that dates will conflict with graduation, so this is on hold.)
