**Did you know?** Ancient and modern hymns pair together today.

**Hymn 295** was written in the 5th century by Marcus Auerlius Clemens Prudentius. He was born in northern Spain. He was well-educated and served as a lawyer, judge, civil servant and scholar. At age 57, he gave all that up and withdrew to a monastery and devoted his life to prayer and writing. His longer poems became the basis for hymns such as 295.

**Hymn 857** is on the modern end of the spectrum. Rick Founds wrote the text to express delight in God. It was the number one worship song in the 1990s. Founds does research and development at a fiber optics company; he has written over 500 praise songs and been a worship leader since his teenage years.
