School Kit Supply List

Our July and August mission collection is all about school supplies! Combined with the backpacks provided by our WELCA group, we fill sling-packs with supplies that help kids go to school.

- 4-70 page notebooks
- 1 30-centimeter ruler
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 pair blunt scissors
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens
- 1 box 16 or 24 crayons
- 1 2.5" eraser

In 2024, the 40 kits that SJB provided became part of the 140,117 collected for distribution worldwide, including in the United States.

Other kits collected for LWR include personal care kits, baby care kits and fabric kits.

The quilts that our Monday quilters work on became part of a group of quilts numbering 370,818, also for use both worldwide and stateside.

Behind the Scenes for Dunkerton Days Float








This easy and colorful craft helps kids remember that Jesus is their light no matter where they go!

What you need:





- Tissue paper squares (pre-cut)
- Glue stick
- Markers (optional)
- Stickers (optional)



What you do:

- Use the glue stick to press colorful tissue paper squares around the outside of the cup.
- Add a simple phrase like "Jesus is my Light" or use fun stickers to decorate.
- Turn on the tea light and place it inside the cup.
- Turn off the lights and let your lantern glow!
