In the midst of it all, though, it’s worth trying to find a quiet moment: maybe at the end of the day or at its beginning. Maybe as you’re driving (yet again!) from Point A to Point B to Point C. Maybe if you notice the sunrise or the sunset or the twinkling stars—or even those flurrying flakes. Advent gives your permission to pause, to linger, to look at and for the goodness of God—born for you and all creation.

And so, beloved of God at St. John’s, ready or not, God is already here and God is still coming. A Blessed Advent and a Merry Christmas to you and yours!

Church Council Meeting Highlights, Nov. 14, 2021

The St. John's Church Council met after worship on Sunday, Nov. 14 and tackled a full agenda.

Complete minutes are posted on the bulletin board in the small conference room. Below are highlights of the meeting.

Meeting called to order and opened with prayer. Secretary and treasurer's reports were given and approved.

President's report included an update on memorial monies and possible uses: moving to ELW (the cranberry hymnal), upgrading to LED lighting and adding some trees on the north side were all possibilities. Discussion with congregation will help determine next steps.

Trustees reported that there is a new burn barrel in place.

Pastor reported that she has been teaching, visiting, working on music and worship and also that she's within her range of hours for a part-time call.

Under old business, these items were shared:

1.) Vanco offering system is now in place. This is an online offering opportunity, and there is an active link on the church website.

2) Further conversation about LED lighting; decision was made to start with narthex. (Editor's note: lights were in place on Sunday, Nov. 21. The difference was noticeable!)

3) Copier issues were discussed; will explore options for repair/replacement.

4) Worship updates include starting Setting 10 in the new year and learning the blue book setting of Service of Word and Prayer.

5) Education updates: Christmas Eve planning to start in coming week; Pastor is also thinking about Lenten adult education option.

6) Constitution review team to be established to update SJB constitution.

New items for business included:

1) As part of the idea of getting used to having a pastor again, Pastor Beth addressed the need for healthy communication, to be able to talk directly with each other and the desire to be remembered and/or included in the planning process of parish events.

2) Conversation about outreach and guest follow-up. Deacons to be more intentional about greeting guests.

3) Council had a conversation about Covid awareness and keeping the congregation safe. Part of that will include looking at what the school system is doing.

4) Budget and stewardship meeting to be held in December. Also, "Opportunity for Giving" envelopes to be established for LSI-Bremwood, Lutheran Chaplaincy Outreach at UIHC, and the St. John's education fund.

5) M/S/C that \$700 from Helping Hands fund be sent to NE Iowa FoodBank for their Thanksgiving meal program. Council to revisit distribution of additional HH Funds in December.



6) Newly elected LYO President Izzy Hesse and Vice-president Elli Teisinger addressed council about financial assistance for a sledding trip to Boone. M/S/C providing cost of admission for all attending the event when it gets scheduled. Council also appreciated treats the LYO group shared.

7.) Treat bags will be prepared for 100 for Christmas Eve; Jerry to secure peanuts for treat bags.

M/S/C to adjourn. Meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer. Next meeting is Dec. 19 after church.

Worship Updates

In November, we started learning the blue book "Service of Word and Prayer," a lovely setting for worship on non-communion Sundays. We will implement this setting fully on **Nov. 28**. We will then use it on Dec. 5 and Dec. 26.

Dec. 12 and 19 will be communion Sundays, so we will use the LBW communion setting we're familiar with. On both of those Sundays, we will also welcome our first communion students to God's table. Please keep these students and families in your prayers.


Next steps in our worship life will be to start learning Setting 10 from the cranberry hymnal. The worship team liked how the liturgy songs of that setting have a lot of familiar tunes but with new words. That learning will start in the new year.

That word "liturgy," by the way, means "work of the people." These are the parts that the congregation does, often in response to some part of the service. When it comes to learning new liturgies and songs, though, we'll all be working together, pastor and people.

On December 12, Pastor Beth will officially be installed as the next pastor of St. John's, Bennington. Pastor Brackett will be with the installing pastor, and WELCA will host fellowship.

Christmas Eve worship will be at 6 p.m. The children will tell the Nativity story and share music as part of the worship. We will also have candles, carols and communion. Our older students will also make the candlelight cross.

December 26, we will continue our celebration of Christmas.



St. John's Youth Group News

On November 14, 2021, 11 youth and 3 advisors met to plan events and elect new officers. Elected leaders of the group are Izzy Hesse, president; Elli Teisinger, vice-president; and Alivia Stafford, treasurer. A secretary needs to be elected yet.

The group is currently conducting a toiletries drive for the Salvation Army free clinic and will get those items delivered after the collection deadline of November 21.
