In a *surprising and stunning* turn of events, former Deputy U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York (SDNY), Margaret M. Garnett[1], has been nominated for a federal judgeship by none other than Senator Chuck Schumer. However, this nomination raises significant concerns given Garnett's current status of being in criminal and civil contempt of two Brady court orders in relation to the *U.S. v. Ware* cases. Dear Ulysses Ware:

We are currently searching for documents responsive to your FOIA/PA request, and we have reached the two hours of search time provided to you at no charge. Department of Justice Regulations, specifically 28 CFR 16.11(i), provide that our office may collect an advance payment before we continue processing your request if we estimate fees will exceed \$250.00. We estimate that an additional 13 hours will be required to complete the search for the records you requested. Our normal fee for search time is \$40 per hour, thus resulting in a fee for search time of \$ 520.00. In addition, the Southern District of New York has informed us that the search would entail searching through over 15 boxes of records for documents that may be potentially responsive to your request. We do not know at this time, prior to a complete search, how many responsive pages would be found. Although not all of these pages are likely to be released to you, you should note that we charge \$0.05 per page for duplication of documents that are released to you after the first 100 pages, which are free.

Accordingly, an advance payment of \$520.00 in the form of a check or money order, payable to the Treasury of the United States, must be received by this office before we will continue processing your request. Please indicate on the face of the check the above request number and mail it to the above address.

If you wish to reduce your fees, you may reformulate your request by limiting the documents to a specific category or categories. Or, if you specify that you will only pay up to a certain amount, we will process your case up to that amount. Finally, keeping in mind that the first two hours were free, you may direct that we terminate your search.

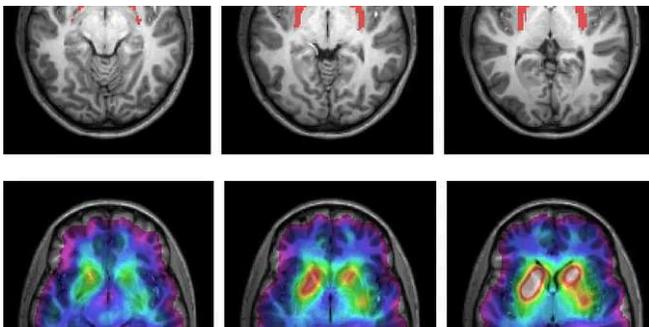

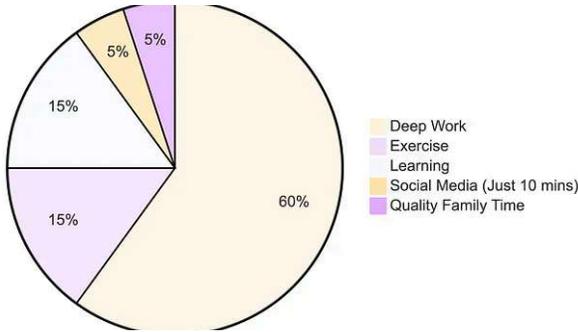

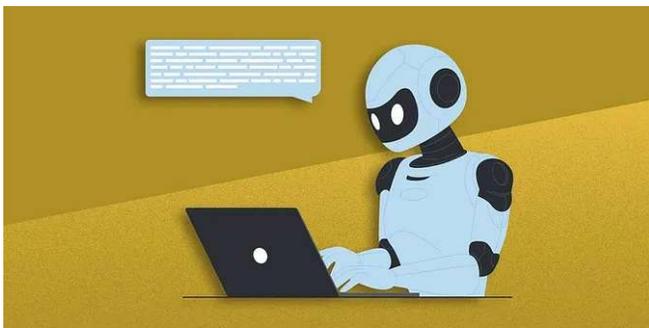

### ABSTRACT

Post-training alignment often reduces LLM diversity, leading to a phenomenon known as *mode collapse*. Unlike prior work that attributes this effect to algorithmic limitations, we identify a fundamental, pervasive data-level driver: *typicality bias* in preference data, whereby annotators systematically favor familiar text as a result of well-established findings in cognitive psychology. We formalize this bias theoretically, verify it on preference datasets empirically, and show that it plays a central role in mode collapse. Motivated by this analysis, we introduce *Verbalized Sampling (VS)*, a simple, training-free prompting strategy to circumvent mode collapse. VS prompts the model to verbalize a probability distribution over a set of responses (e.g., "Generate 5 jokes about coffee and their corresponding probabilities"). Comprehensive experiments show that VS significantly improves performance across creative writing (poems, stories, jokes), dialogue simulation, open-ended QA, and synthetic data generation, without sacrificing factual accuracy and safety. For instance, in creative writing, VS increases diversity by 1.6-2.1x over direct prompting. We further observe an emergent trend that more capable models benefit more from VS. In sum, our work provides a new data-centric perspective on mode collapse and a practical inference-time remedy that helps unlock pre-trained generative diversity.

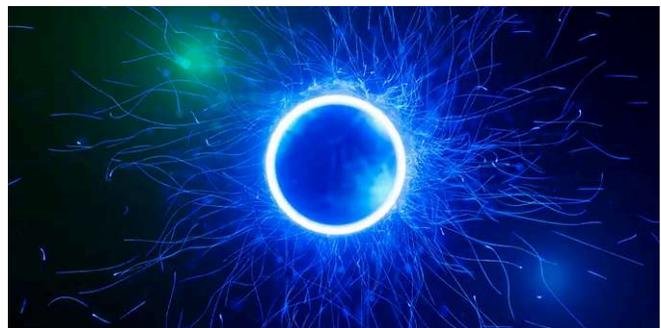
