He developed the one-handed running shot (later the jump shot) which was brand new to the basketball world that featured only the two-handed set shot. He was the first player inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in 1959 due to his impact on the game. He played for Stanford Univ. but did not play in the NBA due to a disabling medical issue from his time in the military. FOOD, MUSIC & ENTERTAINMENT

1. What Italian opera tenor was the first to ever sell a million records?
2. A typical Bolognese dish is tagliatelle, invented in 1487 by a cook named Zafirano for the occasion of the marriage of the Duke of Ferrara to what historically infamous daughter of the Spanish Pope, Alexander VI?
3. Handsome, athletic, blue-eyed leading man of Hollywood films, he is recognized by his portrayal of Mafia mobster Henry Hill in Goodfellas.

4. The golden city of Umbria is Perugia. For what is this city famous? (*Per che cosa e famosa questa citta?*)

ART, SCIENCE & LITERATURE

5. This sculptor was born in Florence in 1386 and is considered one of the founders of Renaissance art. He favored a more vigorous style than the serenity of idealized beauty in vogue during the 15th century, and stressed dramatic action and power of expression. His masterpieces include *David*, which was the first life-size bronze freestanding nude since classical times, and the bronze life-size equestrian statue of *Gattamelata*, the first of its kind since antiquity. Also, his bronze plaque of *St. George Slaying the Dragon* was the first time a carved relief made use of perspective. Who was the sculptor? (*Chi era questo artista?*) (a. Ghiberti, b. Brunelleschi, c. Donatello, d. Da Vinci)
6. Cicero's secretary, Tiro, invented what system of rapid handwriting employing symbols to represent words, phrases and letters?
7. What is the Italian word, now a part of the English language, that means small bits of brightly colored paper, usually thrown on special occasions in English? (In the Italian language the word is used to describe hard candies).
8. This Italian is credited with the discovery that chemical energy could be converted into electrical energy. For this great discovery he is considered the founder of electrochemistry. Who was this early 19th century Italian who also is credited with the invention of the battery?

SPORTS

9. This Italian-American baseball player (catcher) hit two home runs his first two times at bat in World Series play. During the 1972 series he hit a total of 4 home runs to tie Babe Ruth's record. Name him and his team. (*Nominate lui e la sua squadra.*) (a. Yogi/Yankees, b. Ray Fosse/Indians, c. Gene Tenace/A's, d. Roy Campanella/Dodgers)
10. The 1965 home run king in the American League, this promising baseball superstar's career was cut short by a devastating injury. Who was he? (*Di chi si tratta?*)
11. What Italian-American baseball manager won five division titles and one World Series in the 1980s?
12. Known as much for his braggadocio as his crackling fast ball, he once promised to strike out Johnny Bench 4 times in a game. Known as The Count, he was National League Rookie of the Year in 1975, hit a home run in his first official major league at bat, and pitched a no-hitter in 1976? Who was this pitcher? (*Chi era questo lanciatore?*)
