From our garden to your doorstep, we create simple yet quality items. We poured our heart and soul into making sure our handcrafted products are something you can be proud to have and to use.

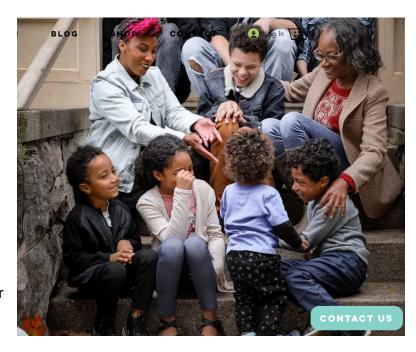
