EXAMINE THE EVIDENCE

I'm thrilled to have Dr. Frank Turek with us this week to explore the Evidence for Christianity. On his podcasts, Frank often poses the question, "Does truth exist?" When someone claims, "There is no such thing as absolute truth," a helpful response is to ask, "Can that be true?" Similarly, if someone asserts that all truth is relative, we can challenge them by asking, "Is that true for you or true for everyone?" By recognizing self-defeating assertions and contradicting claims, we can demonstrate that both claims cannot be true. If no truth exists, one cannot catch another in a lie. However, if lies depend on the existence of truth, then truth must exist.

Our secular culture has muddled the definition and acceptance of truth. For centuries, the objective truth found in God's Word has prevailed over subjective feelings and opinions. Everyone seeks the truth, yet as Jack Nicholson famously declared, "You can't handle the truth!" In Romans 3, Paul reminds us that our pursuit of truth starts with our knowledge and

faith in God, while also acknowledging that people often resort to lies.



Campers frequently grapple with competing truth claims: Is our biology chosen or given? Where does my identity originate? Doesn't God want me to be happy? Christian apologetics and sound reasoning can help differentiate truth from falsehood. Learning to ask the right questions not only makes a point but also helps win hearts for Christ.

When you love someone, you must share THE truth—not just what they want to hear. As 1 Peter 3:15 urges us, we should share our faith with "gentleness and respect." Jesus never advised us to follow our hearts; He said, "Follow me." He declared, "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6). Truth exists, and it is the truth that will set you free.

Are we equipping our campers to confront these secular worldviews? Are they prepared to provide a reason for the hope they profess in Christ? While faith is foundational, sometimes winning the mind of an unbeliever means demonstrating where our faith is rooted. Let's make it a spiritual goal to train our campers in the proofs and evidence for Christianity. We want the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth. So, help us God.

DR. FRANK TUREK

Dr. Frank Turek is a dynamic speaker and award-winning author. As the President of CrossExamined.org, Frank presents powerful and entertaining evidence for Christianity at churches, high schools, and secular college campuses that often begin hostile to his message. He has also debated several prominent atheists including Christopher Hitchens and Michael Shermer, Founding Publisher of Skeptic Magazine.

Frank hosts an hour-long TV program each week called I Don't Have Enough Faith to Be an Atheist which is broadcast Wednesday nights on DirecTV Channel 378. His radio program and podcast called I Don't Have Enough Faith to Be an Atheist with Frank Turek airs on 182 stations every Saturday morning at 10:00am eastern and is available continuously on the free CrossExamined App.

At the 2024 CCL Conference, the main speaker Will Cooper spoke from Hebrews 11 and how the heroes of the faith were Commended for their faith and obedience. This year Dr. Frank Turek will be discussing the evidence Christianity has on our side as we battle an ever growing secular culture.





