# HELP WITH CHILDCARE COSTS

## WHAT YOU MAY BE ENTITLED TO



#### UNIVERSAL CREDITS

- Get back upto 85% of childcare costs (subject to a maximum amount per month £1,031.88 for one child or £1,768.94 for two or more)
- Includes breakfast, after school and holiday clubs
- You pay upfront, then report costs to your Universal Credit account, and they reimburse you after childcare has happened
- You must be in paid work or have accepted a job offer and pay for childcare No minimum number of working hours required
- Claim for children until 31st August after their 16th birthday
- You can also claim if one parent works and the other has a health condition or disability resulting in limited capability to work, care for a disabled person or has been away from home temporarily (I.e. is in hospital).

#### **FLEXIBLE SUPPORT FUND**

- Helps with the first month of childcare costs if this is stopping you from starting work or increasing your working hours
- Must have a Universal Credit account

## TAX-FREE CHILDCARE

- UK Government top-up to help with childcare costs
- For every £8 you pay, the Government adds £2 towards regulated childcare up to £2,000/year per child
- Must be working 16 + hours per week and earn at least the National Minimum Wage Income must be under £100k/vegr
- Can claim until 1st September after child's 11th birthday (under 17 years for disabled children)
- X You cannot claim this if you get Universal Credit
- Self Employed? Your earnings can be averaged over the year You need to set up an account to pay money in where the Government will top up costs. You pay childcare fees through your account.
