Process of Donation – Normal Mode

Starting of Procedure	Aspiring Donor have to mail to our department head for donation Dr. Amit Kumar at dramitkumar@newlifehosp.com
Getting General Details from the doctor	Dr. Amit Kumar will mail you the relevant details and will ask you permission to start the procedure.
Replying to the doctor's mail affirmatively	Donor Have to reply to the doctor's mail affirmatively
Getting the form to fill details	Donor will receive registration form from doctor in form of text as well as PDF asking few details
Filling the form and mailing back to the doctor	Donor need to fill the form accurately either in text or in the printed PDF form and mail back the same to the doctor for evaluation.
Temporary enrollment of the donor	If doctor finds the donor as eligible then he will automatically upload the details to the hospital server and generate the temporary enrollment number for the donor and send it to him. If doctor finds the donor as ineligible then he will mail back to the donor along with reason of ineligibility.
Mail to Finance Department	Donor have to mail to our hospital's Finance Department at finance@newlifehosp.com with the temporary enrollment number and his choice for enrollment as "Normal Mode".
Donor will get the option for concession	Finance Department will mail to donor the details and options for concession.
Confirmation of Concession Option	Donor have to select any one option for concession and mail that to the finance department along with required document needed in support of the selected concession option (for concession related information please see the 'Concession in Enrollment Fee' section in this manual).

Process of Donation – Normal Mode (Continued)

Getting the Invoice Bill	Donor will get their Invoice Bill along with payment details.
Payment of the Bill	After payment of the bill amount, donor have to mail to the finance department for confirmation.
Getting the Donor's Agreement	After the payment donor will get their agreement within 2-24 hours as per the selected concession option.
Signing the Donor's Agreement	Donor has to make a print out of the Donor's Agreement and read it carefully and sign on the column for second party signature and mail it back to the finance department by scanning the signed agreement along with the ID, Address Proof and Bank details . After sending the signed copy of the agreement you will be treated as enrolled.
Payment of First Installment	First Installment payment will be made within 2 to 5 days of enrollment as per the concession option towards the bank account of donor as per our terms and conditions mentioned in the Donor's Agreement.
Confirmation of receiving first installment	Donor needs to confirm that he has received the first installment by sending his signed copy of bank statement or passbook or signed copy of ATM mini-statement.
Getting the appointment for the operation	Donor will get appointment letter for the operation after confirming that they have received the first installment. Appointment will be given of 7 to 14 days later from the date of receiving the first installment as per the availability of doctor's schedule.

Process of Donation – Normal Mode (Continued)

Payment of Second Installment	Second Installment payment will be made within 7 days of enrollment towards the bank account of donor as per our terms and conditions mentioned in the Donor's Agreement.
Coming to hospital for operation	On the date of the appointment of the donor must come with things mentioned in "Things to Bring on Appointment Date" section
Filling admission & consent form	After coming to hospital donor need to fill up the admission form and sign on consent form then donor will be admitted in the selected room, for rooms details please see "Types of Rooms and Services" section.
Admission and Test	Donor will be admitted and tests will be done on the same day. Attendant could also reside in the room.
Operation	If vitals comes out to be normal then operation will be done on the next day else on third day after normalising the vitals under observation of relevant doctors.
Shifting to ICU	Donor will be transferred to the ICU for 24 hours.
Shifting to Room	Donor will be shifted to the donor's admitted room, till operation and ICU period donor's attendant could reside in that room.
Payment of third installment	If donor comes with attendant then then third installment will be paid to the attendant before taking donor to the operation room, else if donor comes alone then donor will be paid the third installment now in cash or in bank account as selected by the donor.
Discharge and follow up	Donor will be discharged after two days keeping in the room under observation, donor will need to come back after 4 weeks for follow up and few tests to ensure normal functioning of body, this will be totally free for the donor.

Process of Donation – Urgent Mode*

* In Urgent Mode Extra Rs. 1500 is charged along with Enrollment fee so total fee in case of Urgent Mode is Rs. 4000/- Urgent Mode donors gets extra priority and support in donation and release of 1st Installment.

Process of Donation – Urgent Mode (Continued)

Getting the Invoice Bill

Donor will get their Invoice Bill along with payment details.

Payment of the Bill

After payment of the bill amount, donor have to mail to the finance department for confirmation.

Getting the Donor's Agreement

After the payment donor will get their agreement within 30 minutes as per the selected concession option.

Signing the Donor's Agreement

Donor has to make a print out of the Donor's Agreement and read it carefully and sign on the column for second party signature and mail it back to the finance department by scanning the signed agreement along with the ID, Address Proof and Bank details . After sending the signed copy of the agreement you will be treated as enrolled.

Payment of First Installment

First Installment payment will be made within 2 hours of enrollment as per the concession option towards the bank account of donor as per our terms and conditions mentioned in the Donor's Agreement.

Confirmation of receiving first installment

Donor needs to confirm that he has received the first installment by sending his signed copy of bank statement or passbook or signed copy of ATM mini-statement.

Getting the appointment for the operation

Donor will get appointment letter for the operation after confirming that they have received the first installment. Appointment will be given of 7 to 14 days later from the date of receiving the first installment as per the availability of doctor's schedule.

Process of Donation – Urgent Mode (Continued)

Payment of Second Installment

Second Installment payment will be made within 7 days of enrollment towards the bank account of donor as per our terms and conditions mentioned in the Donor's Agreement.

Coming to hospital for operation

On the date of the appointment the donor must come with things mentioned in "Things to Bring on Appointment Date" section

Filling admission & consent form

After coming to hospital donor need to fill up the admission form and sign on consent form then donor will be admitted in the selected room, for rooms details please see "Types of Rooms and Services" section.

Admission and Test

Donor will be admitted and tests will be done on the same day. Attendant could also reside in the room.

Operation

If vitals comes out to be normal then operation will be done on the next day else on third day after normalising the vitals under observation of relevant doctors.

Shifting to ICU

Donor will be transferred to the ICU for 24 hours.

Shifting to Room

Donor will be shifted to the donor's admitted room, till operation and ICU period donor's attendant could reside in that room.

Payment of third installment

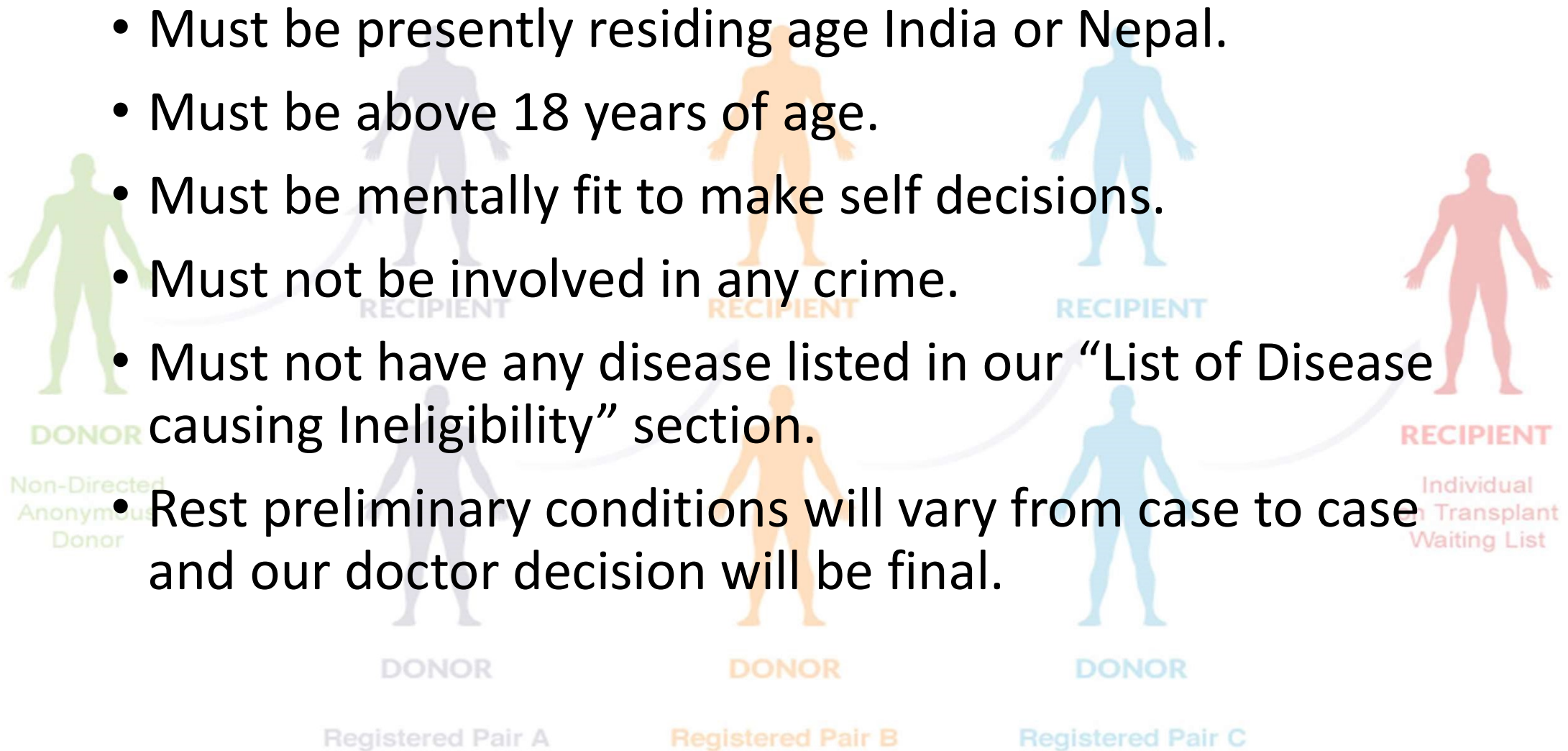
If donor comes with attendant then then third installment will be paid to the attendant before taking donor to the operation room, else if donor comes alone then donor will be paid the third installment now in cash or in bank account as selected by the donor.

Discharge and follow up

Donor will be discharged after two days keeping in the room under observation, donor will need to come back after 4 weeks for follow up and few tests to ensure normal functioning of body, this will be totally free for the donor.

Eligibility for Registration as Donor

- Must be presently residing age India or Nepal.
- Must be above 18 years of age.
- Must be mentally fit to make self decisions.
- Must not be involved in any crime.
- Must not have any disease listed in our “List of Disease causing Ineligibility” section.
- Rest preliminary conditions will vary from case to case and our doctor decision will be final.



Cancellation and Refund Rules

- Cancellation before receiving first installment:

Full Enrollment fee along with Urgent fee will be refunded deducting Rs. 150/- as fine

- Cancellation after receiving first installment:

No Refund, Full first installment amount needed to be transferred back to the hospital.

- Cancellation after receiving second installment:

No Refund, Full first and second installment amount needed to be transferred back to the hospital, and extra Rs. 10,000/- will needed to be paid by the donor in form of penalty.

Refund Policy

Procedure of Operation

Surgeons almost always perform minimally invasive surgery to remove a living-donor's kidney (laparoscopic nephrectomy) for a kidney transplant, which involves less pain and a shorter recovery than traditional open surgery to remove a kidney (open nephrectomy).

In a laparoscopic nephrectomy, the surgeon makes two or three small incisions close to the bellybutton and uses a special camera called a laparoscope to view the internal organs and guide the surgeon through the procedure.

In open nephrectomy, a 5- to 7-inch incision is made on the side of the chest and upper abdomen and a retractor is often used to spread the ribs to access the donor's kidney. (Only used in case of donor with infection near stomach)

Both types of procedures are performed using general anesthesia, which means you'll be asleep during the entire surgery, and last about two to three hours.

The final procedure will be selected by the doctor as your vital conditions.

Payment and Income Tax Queries

Amount in principle is not taxable itself because it comes under compensation but bank interest over it will be taxation in next financial year. But you have to show this compensation amount via ITR1 to income tax department within 3 months, in this we will help you when you will come here for operation, our CA will help you to file the same.

Things to Bring on Appointment Date

1. Registration Form Filled Properly
2. ID Proof, Address Proof
3. Appointment Letter
4. Daily Medicine (if taking)
5. Past Doctor's Prescription and Test Reports (if available)
6. Original Copy of Donor's Agreement

Legality of Donation

In India donation of organ is governed only by Transplantation of Human Organ Act 1994 and its latter amendments. Donation of organ for non-relative is entertained under section 9 sub clause 3 of the specified Act.

Selling organ is not allowed but compensation against it is allowed as per the calculated compensation of wages lost due to donation, so it is legal from our side but it will not be fully legal from your side as you are declaring your wages wrong, but other than our hospital no one could sue you for this because it is a bilateral agreement between you and hospital, and we don't sue our donors.

Most Important Terms and Conditions

1. Donor agrees to donate voluntarily, no any type of mental or physical pressure or any type of provocation involved.
2. No selling or trafficking of Organ/tissue involved, only compensation.
3. Donor shall donate one of his/her Kidney to the hospital and after donation donor would not have any claim on his/her donated organ/part of organ/tissue except the compensation claim amount.
4. Total of 50% of the compensation amount will be given to the donor before the donation in two installments of 20% and 30% respectively.
5. Rest 50% of the compensation amount will be given to the donor after the donation.
6. Donor will send a valid proof of identity and address along with the donor's agreement.
7. Donor will follow all the rules and regulation of the hospital.
8. Decision of the Hospital Authority will be treated as final and undisputed.

Why Enrollment Fee is required?????

We need to prepare lot of documents, file and donor's agreement with donors to make the donation legal to avoid any kind of problem to both us and our donor in future, preparation of these documents needs human efforts of our staff and related lawyer, so we need fee from the donor's side because in a lot of cases after preparation of all documents and related files donor just change his/her mind, in such case the hospital only have to bear all costs of preparation of documents, so our policy is very essentially strict to take fee from the donor initially after testing his/her eligibility and also provide them proper hospital invoice bill prior of payment to maintain a trust of genuineness between hospital and donor. So enrollment fee is compulsory.

Precaution and Recovery After Donation

Common Living Donor Concerns Post-Surgery:

1. Surgical Pain. How much depends on the procedure used (laparoscopic or open), and the living donor's personal pain threshold. For the first 24 hours, the living donor will have access to a morphine pump, an IV and a catheter. After approximately 24 hours, the catheter will be removed, the morphine pump replaced by oral pain medication, and the kidney donor will be expected to take her first post-surgery walk.
2. During a laparoscopic procedure, a living kidney donor's abdomen is pumped full of CO₂ (carbon dioxide) to give the surgeon plenty of room to work. This gas will remain in the living donor's body for approximately two weeks. For some inexplicable reason, it manifests in shoulder area, causing discomfort and pain.
3. The pain medications used in the hospital and taken after discharge are opiates, and they can cause constipation. Certain foods can usually alleviate the problem. If not, prescription medications are available. So eat plenty of roughage.

Precaution and Recovery After Donation....

After Discharge:

1. Headaches and Back Pain have been reported in the first couple of weeks following surgery. These are usually the side effect of pain medications, or the unconscious shifting of posture and movement to prevent pain at the incision. This could remain for 1-2 weeks.
2. Some living donors experience fatigue and lack of energy post-donation, manifesting itself in reduced endurance for sports and exercise, lack of concentration for work-related activities, and the need for more sleep than before donation. These symptoms can persist for few weeks, and could be the result of low kidney function. This could remain for 2-4 weeks.
3. Sleep disturbances. Insomnia, inability to sleep, sleep cycle interruptions, waking up in the middle of the night, shortened sleep cycles. This could remain for 1-2 weeks.
4. Thigh pain: Some living donors have experienced limb or thigh pain as a result of the position they were placed during surgery. This should diminish within days.

Important- If you suffer these problems for longer period then mentioned then please contact us on the doctor's personal number given on your discharge slip.

Precaution and Recovery After Donation....

Best Tips For Recovery (up to 4 weeks after discharge):

1. Don't rush it. Your body has been through a traumatic experience. Allow it to heal.
2. Sleep enough.
3. Eat. Your body needs nutrients to facilitate healing.
4. Even small amounts of walking promotes circulation and tissue growth.
5. Avoid alcohol, tobacco and other substances.
6. Don't suffer. Take pain medications if necessary. And don't be afraid to contact the personal doctor whose number is given on your discharge slip, he will be available 24/7.

Operation, ICU, Medicine, Tests & Further Visit:

All Such charges are already included in the package, no extra charge. Donor could visit hospital for free check-up twice in a year for lifetime and any complication if comes out will be treated for free till 25 years after donation.

Privacy Policy

- We don't share the details of donors from anyone except required legal agencies.
- Donors are requested not to share the details with anyone except close family member except fine will be charged.

Need for Total Legalization

The very idea of legalization might sound gruesome to most people, but it shouldn't, especially since research shows it would save lives. In the India there are only about 20,000 kidneys every year for the approximately 80,000 patients on the waiting list. In 2017, nearly 45,000 died waiting.

Bringing the market into the open is the best way to ensure the trade's appropriate activity. Since the stakes would be very high, market forces and social pressure would ensure that people are not intimidated or defrauded. In India, attitudes are not so casual as to allow gross degeneracy. Enabling a process by which consenting people engage in open transactions would mitigate the exploitation of innocent citizens and underhanded dealing by those seeking to skirt the law.

(a) Second Party agrees to donate voluntarily, no any type of mental or physical pressure or any type of provocation involved. No selling or trafficking of Organ/tissue involved.

(b) Second Party shall donate one of his/her Kidney to the First Party and after donation Second Party would not have any claim on his/her donated organ/part of organ/tissue except the compensation claim as per clause 2 of this agreement.

(c) Second Party ensures that the information provided by him/her is correct, and he/she understands and accepts the terms of Manual of Living Kidney Donation sent to him.

2. First Party commits :

(a) To ensure that the compensation of INR 2,00,00,000.00, which is evaluate by the First Party, will be paid to the Second Party.

(b) Total of 50% of the compensation amount will be given to the Second Party before the donation in two installments of 20% and 30% respectively.

3. Second Party commits :

(a) He/she will attach a valid proof of identity and address with this agreement.

(b) He/she will verify his/her identity and bank account by claiming first installment of advance amount into his/her bank account by proving his/her consent for the transaction.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q1. Is this much details enough to know am I eligible to donate or not?

Yes, doctor will ask the preliminary details, if he thinks that you are fit then we could proceed with you minor illness don't cause problem in donation, if any other vital will be abnormal then we will firstly bring it under limits before operation when you will be admitted here.

Q2.To whom will my kidney go?

To maintain privacy we generally don't give you this detail, doctor will allot the patient internally who will be good match and registered with us.

Q3.What if I give wrong details?

In any point of procedure, if we found that you have given wrong details then your enrollment will be cancelled and enrollment fee would be refunded to you as per our refund rules, for details see "Cancellation and Refund Rules" section.

Q4. Why Urgent mode donor gets everything earlier?

All procedure till the transfer of first installment is done in the priority basis for the urgent mode donor.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) (Continued)

Q5. Why not concession is given to all?

Our main goal is not to charge donor but to keep him/her intact so a reasonable amount of enrollment fee is charged.

Q6. Could I deposit enrollment fee directly in the hospital?

Obviously, but not in cash because organ donation has very rigid regulations from the government so we take amount in form of cheque only at our hospital, that's why we encourage donor for a bank account deposit.

Q7. Could I get first installment in someone else's account?

Yes but for that you have to request to our finance department.

Q8. Could I get my first installment in cash instead in my account?

In general we don't, but if you have any specific problem then you could request to our finance department.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) (Continued)

Q9. Could I meet doctor before getting my first installment?

Yes, for that you have to take his appointment from the reception.

Q10. Will there be any income tax problem in receiving such large amount in my account?

This query has been clarified in our "Payment and Income tax queries" section.

Q11. I want to live few days without tension, so could I get few more days between getting the first installment and operation?

You could request this from our doctor if he allows then you will be given an extended date for operation, it generally depends upon the medical condition of the recipient of your organ.

Q12. Who will bear my travel expenses?

We would provide you and one of your attendant the Air Ticket from your nearest airport to New Delhi Airport only.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) (Continued)

Q13. Who will bear my hospital expenses?

You need not have to pay anything for the hospital expenses unless you choose any upgraded room service, for details please see our "Types of Rooms and Services" section.

Q14. Who will decide the mode of my operation?

Almost 95% donor has to go through laparoscopic surgery procedure, the best for you will be decided by the doctor.

Q15. After discharge could I make physical relationship, if yes after how many days?

Very strange question, but it is asked many times from our doctor, yes you could but better avoid it for 4 weeks.

Q16. Will the scar of operation remain permanently in my body?

No you could go for an scar removal procedure after 2 weeks of completion of surgery through plastic cosmetic surgery, it would cost around 90 thousand rupees in our hospital.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) (Continued)

Q17. Could anyone else know that I have donated my kidney in future?

If you have removed your scar then nobody could know until and unless specific ultrasound or Doppler or X-ray of renal area is done.

Q18. Who is Ujjwal Kumar?

Ujjwal Kumar is our donation and Financial Executive, he is responsible for taking decisions of the donation regulation of the hospital.

Q19. What type of food will be available for donor and attendant?

Donor will get the food as prescribed by our dietitian, attendant could have their food from our hospital canteen if you have not upgraded to Suite category.

Q20. Where will my attendant stay when I was in the operation theatre or ICU?

Your attendant could stay in the room allotted for you at the time of admission.
